Money, Goods, and the Powers That Be


do we need these men to price our commodities? Why should they have this authority? Why doesn't the Bank of Canada issue our own credit? Why is it that we need to borrow money?

He was trying to get away from the current financial system which saved many farms during the depression. How? The other Albertan school papers have been writing about lack of government funding. As far as I'm concerned, the other school's just have problems with their budgeting.



This past weekend, the OOKs went up against the Augustana Vikings — the only team in the league we haven't beat. Game 1 went on Friday in Camrose. In the



From Your Personal Fitness Trainer

Tips for a Fit Millennium

Recently, we received a letter here at the Nugget office from a student requesting tips on how to stick to a fitness program. In order to provide our loyal reader with some sound advice, we sought out the help of Randy Bachmier, who is currently completing the NAIT Personal Fitness Trainer program and is also a Certified Fitness Consultant recognized by the Canadian Society for Exercise Physiology. Below is what he had to say to this letter:

Dear NAIT Nugget,

I am a first year Business student who would like some tips on how to stick to a fitness program. I enjoy running, but I know I should also be doing some weight training to achieve great results in body composition and health. I want to get into the best shape possible with the new millennium looming just over the horizon. If there is anyone with expertise in this area, I am all ears.

Thank you, Amina Sleiman Dear Amina,

Know specifically what you want to achieve from your program. For example, losing 5 pounds of fat in four weeks or 20 pounds in five months is measurable and can provide meaning to the participant shooting for those goals; however, whether that goal is healthy or realistic, depends solely on the individual. Choose two to three benefits (end goals) you wish to attain from your program, set flexible time frames, and use the best means possible to fulfill your unique vision. (e.g.: Internet fitness sites or speaking one-on-one with a personal trainer)

For those just starting out and wanting specifics, I recommend the following general fitness guidelines:

- Always start a workout with a warmup, such as performing an easy-moderate level on the bike or treadmill for ten to twelve minutes.
- Condition your heart's ability to distribute blood and oxygen throughout the body by performing aerobic workouts three to five times a week for periods of 15 to

30 minutes. The intensity you train at should be 4/10 to 6/10 on your personal scale of difficulty.

- Two to three times a week you should do some weight training. Focus on the large leg, back, chest, and shoulder muscles for a duration of 30 minutes.
- In order to increase and maintain your flexibility, following your workouts you should always stretch at least 8 to 12 minutes, giving priority to the lower back, legs, chest, shoulders, and muscles you commonly use.
- Finish all workouts with a light aerobic activity such as biking or walking for 5 to 10 minutes,

as this will reduce the toxicity in your blood.

Start thinking about what negative impact not exercising can have on your life. For example, the Surgeon General reveals that inactivity is equally detrimental to your health as smoking. Do you smoke and not work out? For your sake, I hope you have some impressive genetics.

Here are some tips to follow for getting fit for the millennium:

Guys

When you are weight training, check your ego at the door. Lifting heavy weights at the expense of form looks silly, and the muscle does not benefit nearly as much as it would if you would use a proper technique and lighter weights. If you are doing barbell bicep curls and bringing the weight down fast to help bring it back up, you are actually taking the workload off the muscle and allowing the speed of momentum to assist you in the lift. This makes it easier and thus takes adaptive stress off the targeted biceps. The bottom line in doing this is it will be less

potential muscle growth for you, as well as a greater risk of injury.

Girls

The most frequently asked question I hear from females is, "How do I get rid of this pouch?" (the fat around the stomach area) Well, ladies, doing exercises with solely an abdominal crunch machine is not going to cut it. Getting in your best shape in that area depends on a number of factors: your lifestyle, your eating habits, and making the most of your time when working out. When you maximize all of the factors within your influence, you will most likely see marked improvements throughout your entire body, as well as your life. Also, your unique genetics partly dictate what your body should look like and will look like, so accept your body unconditionally and do not compare it to cover models. (they're all airbrushed, anyhow)



Point to the south wall, at the large oxidized copper plate on the wall. "That looks like an old map of Europe etched in the 15 or 1600s.
