

EgyptAir Flight 990 Crash Baffles Investigators

ince the crash of EgyptAir Flight 990, the search for the plane's flight data recorder has been the focus of the investigation. That data recorder was recovered late last Saturday night with the help of a remote-controlled robot.

But the cause of the crash remains a mystery.


The voice recordings of the pilot and co-pilot reveal only that a problem developed and got continually worse until the plane finally descended into the ocean. The recorder provided 31.5 minutes of good recording and thennothing.

"Alarms go off. Both [pilot and co-pilot] work to fix it. It [the problem] gets progressively worse. And the[n the] tape stops," a source close to the investigation said Sunday.

Flight 990 crashed off the coast of Massachusetts on October 31st, killing all 217 people on board, including 22 Canadians. (source: The Associated Press)

Lest We Forget




did not do that sort of thing.



I don't know about the rest of you, but I had a blast. For those of you that didn't make it out, make sure you do next time. Until then remember these words to live






One Hell Of a Tea Party!





thenaeus once said, "We may live with out poetry, music, and art; we may live without conscience and without heart; we may live without friends and we may live without books; but civilized man cannot live without cooks."

The interior of Yiannis is modelled after a contemporary design of a 1930's Greek Taverna. In actuality, the word "Taverna" describes a specific style of a restaurant that is fun and festive.

And what do I mean by fun? Well, on any given Friday or Saturday night, it is not uncommon to see all the servers join up and do what they call the Zorba line

dance. The diners must pay attention when the servers are doing the Zorba, because once they have finished, it's the diners' turn.

"Everyone in the restaurant gets up and joins in on the line dance. It's a lot of fun for everyone," said manager Tammy Anast, "However during the week, we usually don't do the dancing, because the crowd is a little more quiet."

Yiannis offers a wonderful assortment Mezethes (appetizers) and Apto Furno's (meals from the oven). "Greek food is rich in history," said our server, George

> Kourouniotis (a native of Athens, Greece), "Its roots date back thousands of years." Since our server was, in fact, a native from Greece. we asked him to choose for us, some of the more common meals that we might have if we lived there.

"Many of the Greek dishes are made specifically for sharing," commented George, "As a result, the Greeks tend to eat off small sharing plates very similar to little appetizer plates."

On that note, he then brought us a huge platter of food that introduced us to many exotic items. Some of my favorites on the platter were the Dolmades (sea-

soned meat and rice wrapped tightly in grape leaves) and the Spanakopita (a light pastry layered with spinach and creamy feta cheese). Greek salad was also a favorite of the many interesting items that we tried. The tomatoes, onions, peppers, cucumbers, and feta cheese do a fine job in hiding the fact that traditional Greek salad contains no lettuce.

Although we did not indulge in any Greek wine, the story behind it's origin is very interesting: Thousands of years ago, Athens was taken over by the Turks. In an attempt to spoil the Greeks's wine reserves, the Turks contaminated all the wine with pine resin. The Greeks ended up enjoying the bitter tasting wine, however, and as a result, claimed it as their own. "Retsina," as it is now called, is, in fact, patented by Greece.

To close out our remarkable evening, we were given the opportunity to try Yiannis's special dessert — the Ek Mek. Once again perfect for sharing, the Ek Mec is a layered dessert with fresh whipped cream and vanilla pudding.

As for Athenaeus's poem, I think that he was right in saying that we cannot live without cooks; however the cook's food tastes much better when it is eaten in a fun and lively atmosphere such as Yiannis.
