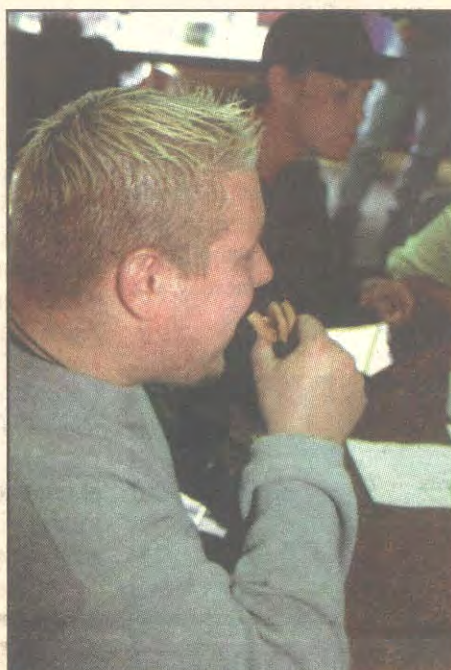

In last week's paper, I told you about a little one act play called FOIP. Well, it actually isn't a one act play... it's actually got a whole lot more to do with privacy and information — but you get the picture.

Because your personal information is covered under the FOIP act, your personal information is inaccessible to anyone other than yourself. This information includes account history/balance, attendance, and your grades to name a few.

What does that mean?

It means that if you apply for a job, your prospective employer cannot get any information about you from NAIT. It also means that if mom and dad want to check up on you or pay off a bill for your broke ass, they can't.

What if I want mom and dad to pay my bills?

If you want someone to have access to your information, you must provide a written and signed release letter to the appropriate department (ie: the registrar's office for your grades). This letter must be specific: Who is to have access to what information and for how long?

The good part about this is that mom and dad will never know how much you slept in and how badly you actually did. Sweetness.

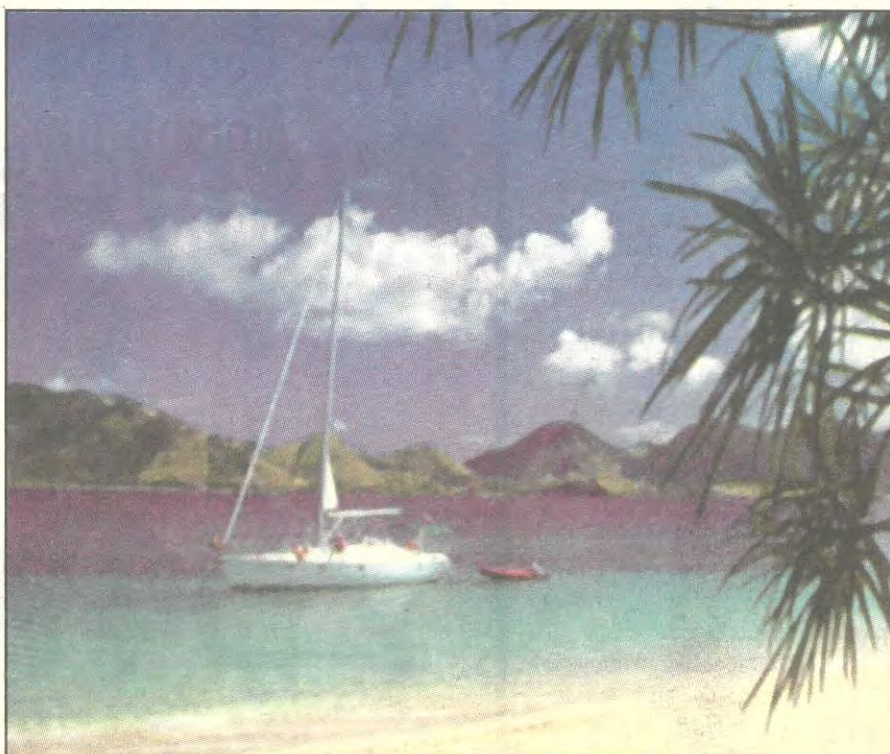

Campus Crime Stoppers Student Awareness Regarding Parking & Conduct Unbecoming of a NAIT Student

- *Assault with a vehicle / dangerous driving*

On September 3, 1999, a NAIT Commissionaire was checking parked vehicles in the 5-minute zone at the Business Tower. This zone, as stated on the sign, is a 5-minute / no unattended vehicle zone. The Commissionaire noted an unattended vehicle was parked in the zone, and after 15 minutes, he began writing a ticket at which point the driver returned to his vehicle. The Commissionaire then asked the driver to please read the sign, and the driver responded with foul language. The Commissionaire continued to write up the ticket, collecting the necessary information while standing at the rear of the vehicle. The driver started his vehicle, placed it in reverse, and backed into the Commissionaire's legs. The Commissionaire did not suffer any serious injuries from this incident, and although possible, no criminal action will be taken against the NAIT student. The parking ticket was instead completed and forwarded on to the driver.

The primary role of the Commissionaire here at NAIT is to protect NAIT property, staff, and students.

Their secondary role is to enforce the City of Edmonton Parking Bylaw (#5590). NAIT does not receive the proceeds from any issued tickets, and the fines are contributed directly to the City of Edmonton; however, the administration of the issued ticket is of cost to NAIT. The bylaw is in place here at NAIT so as to deter illegal parking and prevent utter chaos; otherwise, it would be impossible to park or to drop someone off/pick them up. Prior to the first week of classes this year, NAIT Security took it upon themselves to develop a warning tag for new students arriving at NAIT; and during that first week, 300 warning tags were issued and placed on illegally parked vehicles. That is 300 x \$50, so you do the math. This is an obvious saving of extra cash for you, the student. Please appreciate the job the Commissionaires are doing here at NAIT because they are here for your benefit.

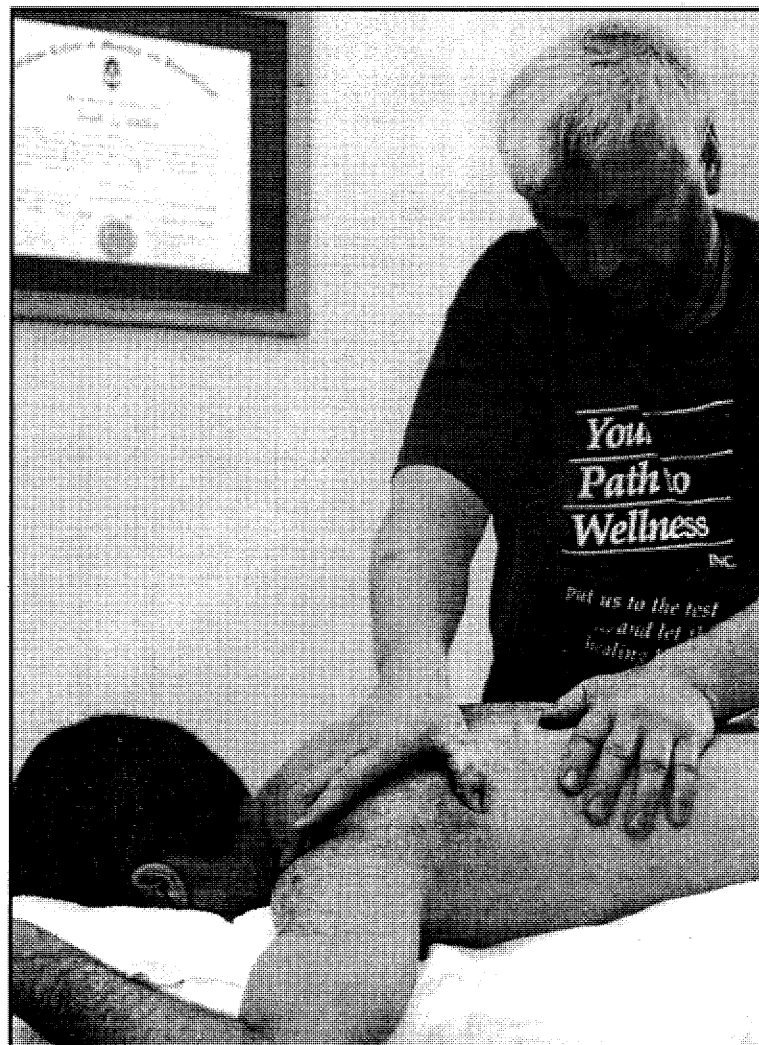

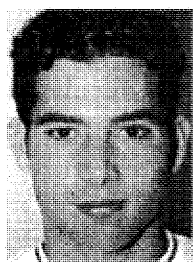

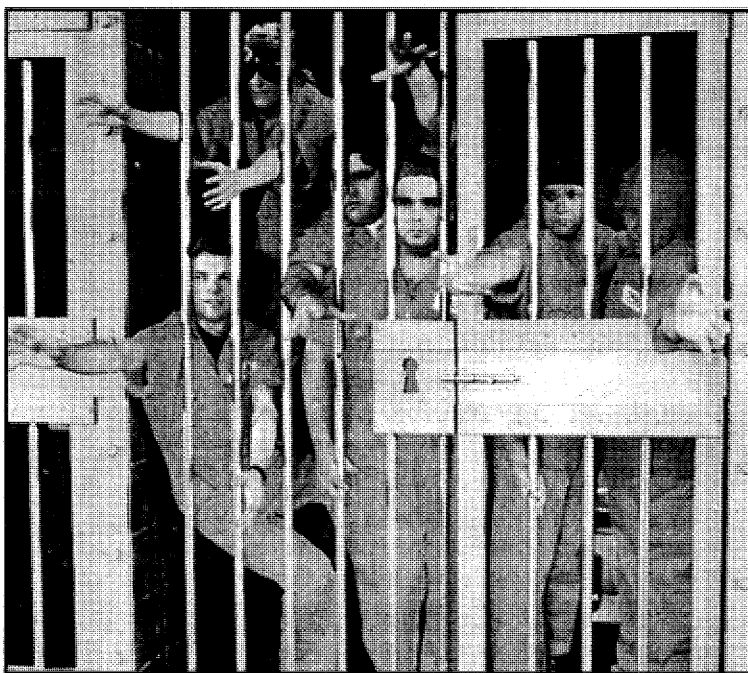

If you have any room left after that, you can choose from a traditional pecan pie or an Italian tiramisu for dessert.

Theater (Play): Jubilations's goal is simple: they want to introduce a unique and energetic play that is completely interactive with the audience. As for how they balance a dinner and theater for your entertainment, each play is divided into three acts, and before each act commences, the food and beverages are served. Risk opens up with a great

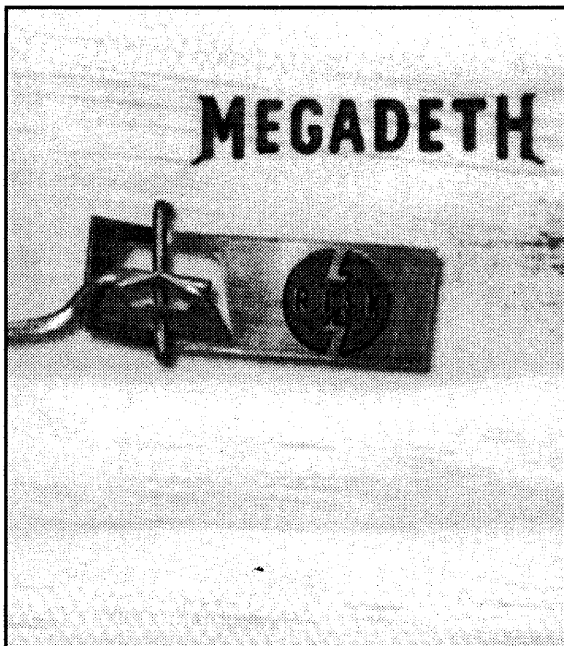
