

Judge Judy Takes On Miss America

To spice up the ratings for the 79th Annual Miss America Pageant, which airs on September 18, the pageant is spicing up its panel of judges. This year's panel will consist of US Women's Soccer Team goalie Briana Scurry, actor Michael Badalucco of "The Practice," actress Tia Carrere of "Wayne's World" and "True Lies" fame, and Judge Judy Sheindlin, star of TV's "Judge Judy."

The General Hale Affair

US Army Secretary Louis Caldera has demoted Major General David Hale down to a Brigadier General following Hale's court martial earlier in the year on charges of conduct unbecoming of an officer. The demotion will cost Hale \$800 US per month in retirement pay, which will amount to over \$500,000 over the next 25 years. He also must repay the government the difference between his Major General grade pay and his new rank since his retirement, which comes to approximately \$14,000. He is now also considered a convicted felon. In March 1998, Hale had retired from the Army — months before any charges were brought against him. He initially pleaded guilty at his court martial and was fined \$22,000 for coercing the wives of junior officers into having sexual affairs with him. Hale's conviction is currently under review.

Of Mice And Dinosaurs

In a discovery bound to rattle the prevailing theory of mammalian evolution, a team of paleontologists found the teeth of a mouse-sized furry critter that apparently ran underfoot of the dinosaurs. The discovery that one of man's ancestors roamed Earth during the Middle Jurassic period over 165 million years ago more than doubles the age of the oldest known mammal.

Dentist and lecturer Roger Freeman from Encino, California, wants to start an epidemic. His new company is pushing a line of neckties with magnified pictures of diseases from microscope slides. Although the band does have an extremely busy schedule, school is still their main priority. "We have tutors, so our teachers don't mind when we leave for a couple of days,"


said Dennis, "When it comes to school, we aren't slackers.'


