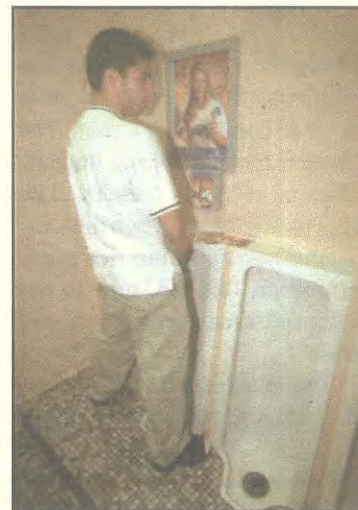

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FOR FULL-TIME STUDENTS

If you are a full-time enrolled student in a day program at NAIT we have some extremely important information for you about the Student Benefits Plans, namely the Health plan and the Dental plan. **You absolutely need to know the following:**

1. These plans are NOT adminis-

tered by NAIT, they are NAIT Students' Association plans.

2. The plans are **MANDATORY** unless you bring proof of comparable coverage to Room E-133 before October 8th.

3. If you don't have comparable coverage you are **automatically enrolled**... BUT you must still go to Room E133 to give your per-

sonal information to the Plan Administrator before you can get your Prescription Drug Card and use the rest of your benefits.

4. MOST OF YOU DID THIS AT REGISTRATION, but if you didn't please don't wait until October 8 (the opt-out deadline). You may need some time to get proof of comparable coverage if you are

eligible to opt-out (e.g., Your existing policy numbers).

5. If you want to get spouses or family members on the plans the deadline is also October 8, 1999. To do that you must also go to Room E133.

As you can see, Room E133 is an important office to know. It's the Student Benefit Plans Office oper-

ated jointly by NAITSA and the Canadian Student Health Network (CSHN). If you have time to surf the web go to www.cshn.com and click on the "Members" link to find out what you get for your \$191.00 (this will appear as a NAITSA fee on your tuition invoice). You will be surprised at how much you're covered!

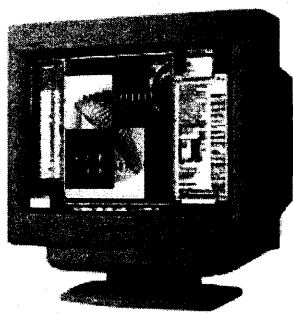

Saskatchewan NDPs Promise Free Year of Post-Secondary Education

Prior to last week's Saskatchewan election, Roy Romanow announced that a free year of post-secondary education would be given to all first year students studying within Saskatchewan. 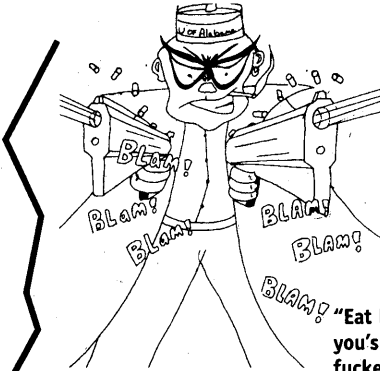

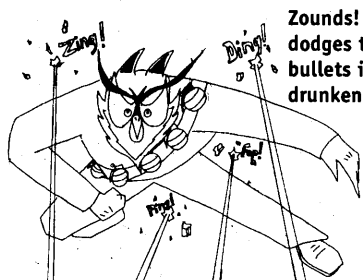

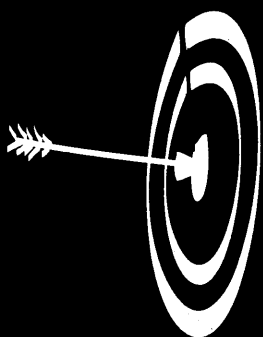

The organization continued to grow until 1976 when CADS was officially formed. The organization now has almost 3,000 voting members across Canada.

CADS main objective is the promotion of skiing to persons with a disability in order to promote full integration into society. They provide instruction from qualified instructors and volunteers who adapt Canadian Ski Instructor Alliance teaching techniques and ski equipment to suit the needs of each individual. Local CADS divi-

sions across Canada coordinate with ski hills in order to provide instructors and programs for disabled skiers.

One of CADS major events is the "CADS Disabled Ski Championship & Festival." Since 1974, the event has blossomed into a major international event that include Instructor Certification courses and alpine events which include Downhill, Super G, Giant Slalom, and Slalom. The Festival is designed to give skiers the opportunity to improve their abilities through five days of continuous instruction.

CADS belief, or "The Bottom Line" as it is stated in their literature, is that skiing is for everyone. They have set out to improve peoples' lives through skiing and give them the opportunity to compete with their friends on an equal basis. cliché "practice makes perfect," however, I have always been taught that that is not always true — *Perfect practice makes perfect.*



Decor: The decor is vintage Edmonton and otherwise, with arti-
