The new mega-corp will be known as AOL Time Warner Inc. and is being billed as, "The world's first fully integrated media and Internet century."

It is a web-based system, so students can check their email from anywhere in the world. Some instructors have already begun using the system for mailing marks and such to their classes, and more uses are being discovered by the day.

It is also expected that marks will be given out using Ookmail, and satellite campus students will hear about NAIT and NAITSA events that they usually wouldn't have.

During the testing phase, NAITSA ran some contests to promote the new student email. Mick Beale, VP Communications for NAITSA, spoke to a few of the classes that were involved with the piloting. "I tried to get students excited about the system. Almost

every other post-secondary institute in Canada has an email system, but few have one that you can check online. That is one of Ookmail's advantages. We also gave out Oiler tickets and

movie passes to try to get traffic up. We have contest information in our messages we put out to everyone every couple weeks."

Check out some of those flashy posters around campus, and log into Ookmail. Right now you can use the library computers or the computers in any of your labs that have internet access to log in. You can even check it out at home. Ookmail kiosks will also be popping up around campus in the near future, so you can use your email in the hallway or in the NAITrium between classes. 
NAIT Admin Approves Imaginary Friends




The Lost Art of Streaking

The Microwaves Are Here




A Retrospect of Resolutions





Had I been informed about the generous free ride service before, I wouldn't have drove, but I soon found out that dining at the Pacific Fish Co. was well worth any drive. At first sight, one can easily see that the interior of The Pacific Fish Co. reflects an elegant, cozy atmosphere. The dim lighting is an excellent feature that adds to the relaxed ambience.

Although most people enjoy eating in private, The Pacific Fish Co. gives its diners the option to choose between tables or booths, either of which can be found in an open or secluded areas.

Rather than having our server choose our meals for us, we decided to make a change in the routine and choose our own meals. Milo, however, did suggest that we try the salad bar with our appetizer. The salad bar was not a disappointment; in fact, it was a delightful surprise. It featured over 30 items, including fresh shrimp and oysters.

Our main appetizer consisted of Pacific Fish Co.'s signature appetizer, Crab Stuffed Mushroom Caps covered in a light, melted cheese. The Crab Stuffed Mushroom Caps were excellent to say the least.

The entrees we chose were, again, both delicious. The first entree was a medium-rare Sirloin steak with a stuffed baked potato and fresh steamed veggies. The Sawmills are famous for their steaks because they choose only use AAA Grade beef which is, by far, the best beef available on the market.

"Along with the AAA Grade beef, our chefs use what is called a baseball cut (a thicker cut of meat)," said Milo, "The baseball cut makes the meat thicker, allowing the juices to stay in thereby making it taste much better."

The second entree was the fresh Seabass in a zesty seasoning with freshly steamed veggies and a baked potato. To ensure that the fish is always fresh, the Sawmill spares no expense and flies in all their fish.


"Frozen fish just doesn't have the same taste as fresh fish does — that's why we fly ours in," said Milo.


