Canadian Government Finally Balks



ast week, the word leaked out in the Ottawa Sun that the federal government was about to make public its plans to save hockey in this country. On Tuesday, Industry Minister John Manely announced that the government would be providing Canadian NHL teams with \$20 million dollars in an effort to alleviate some of the financial woes of Canada's teams.

up amongst the six remaining Canadian NHL teams who meet requirements as set out under the plan. The new guidelines would ensure that the federal government would not be the only level of government granting tax concessions to prevent the Canadian teams from flying south. Both provincial and municipal governments must also show that they are willing to take on some of the burden from the teams.

As of Friday, both Alberta teams would be eligible for some of the handout from the government under a grandfather clause that gives credit to the Alberta government for past efforts in keeping both of its teams.

The Senators would also immediately qualify for the money since owner Rob Bryden has secured \$3.9 million in tax breaks for the team from the city. The same deal was offered to Ontario's other team, but Toronto mayor Mel Lastman has shown no interest in giving any breaks to the Maple Leafs, who are one of the only teams in Canada to be "flushed with cash" (they did steal Cujo away from us, after all). The cash The \$20 million will be split strapped Vancouver Canucks may be SOL on the deal, however, with neither the provincial nor municipal governments showing any interest in helping out the team.

The deal will also ensure that the teams are bound to their city — at least for a while. Any team that receives money in the package must agree not to move out of Canada. Should a team move to the States after receiving the money, they will have to repay some, if not all of the money.

Wrigley's Canada really gets something to chew on



The battle for celebrity rights L comes to Canada and brings with it some old grudges — a hair cut and a pair of goggles.

Last fall, Wrigley's Canada decided to promote that they hadn't raised their prices since 1984. They hired an ad company called BBDO Canada that came up with a "timeline" concept to show a visual account of years past when Wrigley's still cost the same as it does today. (FYI: a double pack of Wrigley's can be had at Reads 'N Needs for \$1.35)

Being that the ad was made for the Montreal subway system and

buses, they chose gold-winning Olympic athlete Myriam Bèdard to represent the year 1994. The caption on the photo reads, "1994 — Ouebec suddenly falls in love with the biathlon. Ah! The Olympics..."

The problem was that BBDO (the ad agency) didn't ask Bèdard or the Canadian Press news agency (who took the picture) for permission to


use the photo. Then BBDO had the photo altered.

"I look like a man," Bèdard said of the picture. "It isn't complicated. All that's missing is the beard."

Bèdard has refused BBDO's out of court settlement offer of \$4,000, saying the offer was "ridiculous and vexing." She announced Friday that she is suing Wrigley's and BBDO for \$725,000.



Plutonium Enters Canada from US



n snap decision last Friday by the Canadian government, a shipment of bomb grade plutonium was flown by helicopter to a research reactor in Chalk River, Ontario.


Despite safety concerns over the air transport of nuclear material, 119 micrograms of plutonium and uranium was delivered over Northern Ontario skies by Atomic Energy of Canada Ltd. (AECL)

by air. Not only did AECL ship the plutonium by air, they did so in a manner that many believe put communities in the flight path of the helicopter in danger.

Steve Shallhorn, a representative of Greenpeace, claims the container that the nuclear material was moved in is unsafe for air transport, and is only cleared for an impact of 45km per hour.

"Flying plutonium is just irresponsible and reckless, "said Shallhorn.



Province's Plan for Technical Boost Doesn't Phase NAIT's Court Reporting



he Klein government's recent decision to install stateof-the-art digital recording equipment in provincial courts isn't sending shock waves through NAIT's Court Reporting program. While graduates of the Court Reporting program in the past have found employment in the courts, the vast majority work in freelance reporting, doing pre-trial civil litigation that is not affected by this government decision; in fact, the government has hired only four graduates over the past ten years.

Furthermore, realtime writing and closed captioning for the heararea in the field today and is expected to continue well into the future (see Letters to the Editor). To provide realtime captioning services, a court reporter, using highly developed skills and special training, monitors newscasts or television programs and uses stenographic keystrokes upwards of 225 words per minute to capture every word. The stenotype machine is connected to a state-ofthe-art computer with special closed captioning software. The software then translates the strokes into English sentences and is sent to the viewer's television screen in a matter of seconds.

Justice Minister Dave Hancock made the announcement about the replacement of government court reporters in Alberta with the digital recording equipment earlier this month. He says this change will mean Albertans will pay less for transcripts and more money will be pumped into

ing impaired is the major growth the court programs aimed at improving efficiency and service within the justice system. He says, "The old technology has been in need of upgrading for a long time and simply could not support those goals."

The government claims that some of the advantages in digital sound recording include improved sound quality, electronic transmission capabilities, quick court access to recent testimony, reduced storage needs, and computer compatibility.

What the government is not taking into account, however, is the possibility of such unpredictable things as power outages, people arguing over each other (and thus making the sound recording inaudible), the fact that the typists they would hire to produce the transcripts could not certify them, among other things. Case in point, Jeff Harris, vice president of the Manitoba Bar Association, stated that he was told of one case when

the (digital) tape got screwed up, they lost the evidence completely, and the charges against the defendant were dropped. Has the Alberta government taken the seriousness of that possibility happening into

If the government were to assess what the primary concern of judges and lawyers is, they would find having accurate transcripts that they can peruse in a quick and efficient manner produced by the latest computer technology as opposed to listening to hours of audio recorded testimony, is at the top of their list. NCRA studies have shown that transcripts produced by qualified court reporters who were present at the proceedings and were able to apply the knowledge and expertise they have in reporting and transcribing the proceedings, is more accurate than those produced from sound recordings.

In addition, turn around time for transcripts produced from sound recordings could be weeks

as compared with instantaneous realtime translation that highly skilled reporters can provide (and produce in two days or less if need

Stated in an article appearing in the Edmonton Journal this past Monday, January 17, trial lawyers are lobbying to keep court reporters. They are worried that without the reporters, they will see more delays in the justice system. "There are still things people do better than machines, and court reporting is one of them," states Jim Murphy, past president of the British Columbia Trial Lawyers Association. And you know what? He's right. The NAIT Court Reporting program is going strong, turning out some of the best court reporters in Canada for the past 26 years; and it shows no signs of slowing down -- no matter what may happen.

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

Teach, and you will learn.


Show your best face to the mirror,

why people join a martial art school: 1. To attain a wellbalanced fitness


2. To gain useful self-defense skills. 3. For sport and competition.

many martial arts schools around Edmonton to find an art that would completely meet these three requirements, and surprisingly, I only found one -Kanzen Kenpo (otherwise known as "The most complete martial art in the world"). Although Kanzen Kenpo is relatively unheard of, the art itself has been around North America for quite some time.

American Kenpo was introduced to North America in 1954 by Mr. Ed Parker. What many peo-

> ple don't know is that in 1956, Parker also introduced the first-ever commercial Karate school in North America. Unfortunately, in 1990, Parker passed away; but his ranks have since been filled by 7th degree black belt senior instructor Mr. Joe Foster.

Joe Foster is now the acting president of the World Kanzen Kenpo Federation and currently the highestranking Kanzen Kenpo black belt in the world. In 1993, one of Foster's students and former NAIT instructor Vern Gorman, opened up a Kanzen Kenpo school here in Edmonton. Holding the level of 3rd



I decided to visit Mr. Gorman's Kanzen Kenpo School over the holidays and see what it had to offer. However, I had to wait until after January 2, because they were in the middle of doing some renovations in the training area.

Once I arrived at the school, I met up with Mr. Gorman and his wife Enza, who is also one of the head instructors at the school. Enza has a reputable background in Tae Kwan Do and holds the level of 1st-degree black belt in Kanzen Kenpo.




degree black belt, Mr. Gorman is the owner and senior instructor at his Kanzen Kenpo School.

In effect, through Foster, Gorman holds a direct lineage to the Senior Kenpo grandmaster Mr. Parker. "The direct lineage that Mr. Gorman has to senior grandmaster Mr. Parker is very important to me," said Kanzen Kenpo student Kalvin Koch, "I feel that my training will be of higher quality because of Mr. Gorman's credentials."

One thing to keep in mind is that Kanzen Kenpo belts are not cracker-jack prizes — the students have to train very hard to earn them. They must commit a minimum of 4 1/2 years to reach the black-belt level.

After the introductions, I took a tour of the school and saw their newly renovated training area along with the trophy decorated practice area. However, I was utterly shocked when I found out that






under a motto of: Any attack justifies an aggressive response. There was simply no middle ground. It's a simple philosophy, really — if someone attacked you, you could hurt them. This motto gave Kenpo a title of being an exclusively aggressive martial art. To most of us, an aggressive act would be a punch or kick. To a Kenpo student, an aggressive act would consist of an arm break or a punch to the throat.

However, under Mr. Foster, this motto has changed slightly. "Kenpo still contains its aggressive aspects, but now it's more versatile," said Gorman, "Our students are now taught that control and escape are also options when dealing with an attacker, not only striking. They now have the option to act in either an aggressive or passive manner, depending on

ner, depending or the situation."

Along with a very well structured selfdefense program, Kanzen Kenpo students are also trained to use weapons as well as in techniques or patterns which are used in competition, giving it the recognized title as the "most complete martial art in the world." "Our students do very well in open martial arts tournaments, simply because they are so well trained in all areas," said Gorman (Editor's note: See trophy picture).



So, if you are considering taking any martial art, then I think that it is definitely well worth your time to head down to Mr. Gorman's Kanzen Kenpo School and talk to him or Enza and see for yourself what Kanzen Kenpo can offer you. "Kanzen Kenpo is an art which models itself to each individual student," commented Gorman.



Mr. Gorman had installed a complete fitness area upstairs. It was literally a complete gym.

"Weight training is very important for the older students," said Gorman, "but I don't feel that my students should have to pay for two separate memberships — one for here and one for a gym. So, we provide them with a gym here; this way, they can do their weight training before or after their class and this way, they can save money and they don't have to bounce from one place to another."

Once I finished the tour, I decided to sit in on a few of the adult classes. I quickly found out that much of Kanzen Kenpo's training

is based around self-defense techniques. "Kenpo's forefront is in teaching individuals practical self-defense that can be used in today's world," said Gorman. What is very unique to Kanzen Kenpo is that it's selfdefense skills are intertwined with simulated scenarios." Anyone can be taught skills, but when the skills are taught in situations, students will be better prepared to react if a real situation arises," commented Gorman.

Under Mr. Parker, Kenpo students were trained

ince their humble origin as a New Yorkpost-punk hardcore act circa 1981, the Beastie Boys have grown into renowned pioneers who have not only innovated and evolved their own sound and visual style, but are also the face of popular music during the late 20th century.

One has only to listen to the recently released 2-CD anthology "Sounds Of Science" to fully experience the genre-swapping diversity and awe-inspiring rhythms and rhymes conjured within their mind-boggling body of work.

The latest gem added on to the Beastie's noble roster is "Alive." Once again, our adventurous aficionado's of audio amazement have created a marvel of vast proportions.

With a catchy-trancy-groovyvideo gamesque backdrop, King Adrock, Mike D., and MCA smoothly oscillate in delivering their cleverly crafted rhymes throughout the entirety of the track.

The theme expressed in the lyrical content focuses a great deal on remedying social ills and offering a solution where, "If you learn to love, you're in for a surprise;" and thus, "Ain't it nice to be alive." As well, I sense that our heroic trio are acknowledging moments from



their reputable career (ie: "Bring it back, that old New York rap"; "We got rhyme selections in a wide array"; "Use the microphone like Picasso's used clay"; etc, etc.).

On the flip side is an amusing adaptation of Mr. Billy Joel's classic hit, "Big Shot." Designed to meet the requirements of acing the Minor Threat school of songwriting, the Beasties return to their early harcore roots and race through a frenzied — scissors beat drumming galore deconstruction of the Piano Man's suave yet spiteful number.

In conclusion, this vinyl 45 single is a feel-good keeper which made me berate myself for not possessing the Anthology to complete my collection.


House of Bad Touch Alternative Tentacles Records






