# Poor Performance in Nationals Not a True Representation of Season

e here at NAIT have been very lucky this year; we have had a great basketball team all year. In fact, one of the best this place has seen in a very long time. And last weekend, that basketball team headed into Nationals, representing our school against the best basketball teams across Canada.

"We were in tough," said head Coach Marc Dobell, "We were playing some pretty good teams." With the Ooks going into the tourney ranked seventh out of the eight participating teams, they were going in as the underdogs against the finest teams across Canada.

Thursday night saw the Ooks doing battle with the Humber Hawks from Ontario in what turned out to be a humbling expe-

rience for NAIT as the Hawks made it look easy and walked over the team to a 79-48 victory.

"We started off cold (on Thursday) and we managed to bring it back there for a bit," continued Dobell. It was turnovers that killed the team though as NAIT turned over the ball thirty times to the Hawks, which continued to be a problem for the team throughout the tourney.

Game two went Friday, and it didn't look much better for the boys as the Montmorecy Nomades downed the boys 104-80. The Nomades had three players with over twenty points, and with the Ooks disheartened from the previous game's loss, the Nomades were in control of much of the game. The sole highlight of the game for the team was Sean Wrobel's 17-point effort, who led the Ooks' offense for the game.


Saturday's seventh place game saw the Ooks take on the godless Trojans from SAIT in a game that neither team wanted to be in. SAIT, who only two weeks ago had stood between the Ooks and the promise of a gold medal in the ACAC finals, now was the opponent in a game that would decide what ranking the teams would take, seventh or eighth in the Tournament.

"They didn't want to play, and we didn't want to play," said Dobell on game three. "We tried to get fired up for the game, but it was pretty tough"

The game saw both teams shooting under 38 percent from the field, and with NAIT turning over the ball twenty-two times, SAIT was able to walk away with the win by a score of 74-64 and the seventh place spot across Canada.

"Going in there (Nationals), all we wanted to do was play as well as we could have," Dobell replied when asked about the tournament as a whole, "It wasn't the fact that we lost, it was more that we didn't play very well."

The team shouldn't sell itself short though; they had an outstanding season, and with the possibility of up to nine players returning next season, the future looks bright for the NAIT basketball program.


It may take weeks for investigators to ascertain the number of men, women, and children that have died, but preliminary estimates indicate the number at 470.

# Odds ends Combating Exam Anxiety Marlene Marean

nxiety before exams is a normal state. It motivates you to stay alert and do your best. Exam anxiety, however, is the state of being so nervous during a test that you don't do your best, and you lose marks even though you know you've studied and are well prepared.

#### HOW DO YOU KNOW IF YOU HAVE EXAM ANXIETY?

Severe exam anxiety has physiological, behavioural, and psychological effects.

Physiological reactions may include rapid heartbeat, muscle tension, stomach upset, headaches, nausea, faintness, dry mouth, sweaty palms, or perspiration.

Behavioural reactions may include difficulty reading, concentrating, and understanding questions, organizing thoughts, or retrieving key words and concepts. You might also experience feelings of panic, confusion, or mental blocking, which means going blank on questions and possibly remembering the correct answers as soon as the exam is over.

Psychological reactions may include feelings of apprehension, uneasiness, upset, and self-doubt.

#### HOW CAN YOU REDUCE **EXAM ANXIETY?**

While studying:

- Allow yourself plenty of time to accomplish all the things you have to do before the test. Set up your study goals and take one step at a time to not overwhelm yourself.
- Build up confidence by reviewing the material frequently. Over-learning is the best insurance against going blank on an exam.
- Spread review over several days rather than cramming. Intensive review should be done a few days before the test.
- Make sure you are "really" studying. Most students prepare for a test by reading their notes or textbooks. As you read along, you may feel that you know (understand) what the author is saying. Understanding what you are read ing at the moment does NOT mean that you know it well enough to remember it for a test when the book isn't there to help you. By just reading to study, you may find yourself going "blank" when trying to answer a test item. Study actively by thinking of potential exam questions and the correct answers and by making sure you can recite or jot down key concepts with your textbook closed.
- Devise a system for practicing rapid problem solving as part of your review for the test. Usually, homework problems are solved at

a leisurely rate while tests require rapid problem solving. Being experienced at working under time pressure can help alleviate exam anxiety.

- Continue your regular exercise program.
- Get sufficient rest.
- Take care of external sources of stress, such as paying bills.
- Learn relaxation techniques to use while studying and taking the test (ie: deep breathing, progressive muscle relaxation, visualization, positive self-talk). One technique is to breathe in slowly and deeply through your nose and feel your stomach (not your chest) extend. Hold for a few seconds. Pull in your stomach, forcing the air out and think, "relax." Repeat 2 or 3 times. If you become good at this technique, it is easy to use during an exam. See a counsellor if you need help learning relaxation techniques. Prior to the test:
- If you have problems with anxiety, do NOT drink caffeine. Caffeine mimics and escalates the symptoms of anxiety.
- Arrive early so you can sit where you are most comfortable. Get organized and avoid people who are anxious and might cause you to doubt your knowledge, but don't arrive so early that you have a lot of time to let your stress build up.
- Do not let yourself get into a negative mindset such as, "I always panic on exams" or "I blanked out last time, so I will blank out again." Instead, think thoughts such as "I know my material," I can stay calm and relaxed," etc...
- When you receive the test, look it over, read the directions twice, and then organize your time efficiently. Don't rush through the test, but work at a comfortable pace and don't worry about how far along classmates are on the test. During the test:
- Look over the questions to familiarize yourself with the test. Underline key words or phrases in the test directions. Many students

- with exam anxiety make errors because they don't read the question thoroughly.
- At all times, try to focus on the process of answering the question rather than on the end result.
- If you go blank, skip the question and go on. Find some questions you can answer.
- Regard a lapse of memory as perfectly normal; do not let it throw you into a panic. If you block on answering one question, leave it for a while and return to it later.
- Don't panic when you don't know an answer. Eliminate options you know are incorrect and then make an educated guess.
- Some of the exercises you can use while studying for a test will also be helpful during the test such as deep breathing, visualization, and muscle relaxation. Thinking of something humorous can also relieve anxiety.
- Utilize positive self talk. Come up with positive statements which help you keep calm such as, "This is only one test," "I am familiar with this material," "I can do it, etc...
- Distraction techniques such as saying the alphabet backwards, thinking of the birth dates of your siblings, etc... can help bring your focus back if you are experiencing
- Sipping water or chewing gum can relieve tension for some stu-
- Changing positions can help
- Don't panic when students start handing in their papers. There's no reward for being the first done.

Don't forget to give yourself a part on the back for what you have done well - and, remember, the counselling staff is available to assist you with techniques to overcome exam anxiety or with any other academic, career, or personal issues that may be affecting your success at NAIT. #### A Big Hand for Wonderboy **Shoreline Records**

Direct from our nation's capital, Hydrofoil exhibits the essence of alternative pop-rock. In the footsteps of many huge Canadian bands like Our Lady Peace and I Mother Earth, Hydrofoil demonstrates how to be on the brink of mass explosion. With the backing of a larger label, air-time on



Much Music, and appearances on late-night talk shows, if you've never heard of this band before, you soon will. With this amount of exposure, all the band will need are some kickass songs.

This record comes through in that department as well. From the opening track, "Bright Idea," I was very impressed. The first track which struck Tokio, Otis Clay," which is full of looped drums and vocals. Kind of



There is no real action, all you have are these lame lifeless, non-animated characters dressed in khakis, standing there, swatting at a little white ball...(ooohhh what a lot of fun that is)...
