City Unveils New Display

The City of Edmonton has unveiled a new display honoring everyone who has served as a council member since the incorporation of Edmonton in 1892.

Deputy Mayor Allan Bolstad, Councillor Robert Noce, former mayor Ivor Dent and others were on hand for the unveiling, along with a group of sixth grade students from ParkAllen School. Also present were numerous former council members.

The display, which is 14 feet long, recognizes the 248 people who have served on the City Council. It is located on the second floor of City Hall, near the Mayor and Councillors' offices, and cost approximately \$16,000 to build. Grants from the

Millennium Bureau of Canada and the Alberta Historical Resources Foundation made up about half of the cost.

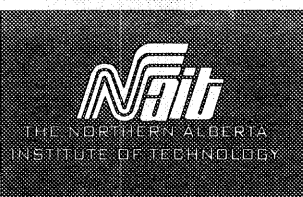

Tattoo You

Superior Court Judge Barbara Rose has overturned a long-standing state ban against tattooing in the state of Massachusetts. The decision comes after tattoo artist Stephan Lanphear was forced to move to New York City to practice the art of tattooing. The ban, first enacted in 1962, was placed to protect the public from the spread of blood-borne diseases and allowed only licenced doctors to administer tattoos. In her ruling, Judge Rose stated that tattooing is a fast-growing retail business in the county and is popular among middle-class suburban women.

A Heavyweight Indecision

Anamarie Martinez-Regino is going home this week after an Albuquerque court judge refrained from ruling whether the state's intervention in taking her away from her parents was justified, or if the parents were guilty of abuse or neglect. The three-year-old was taken into state custody at the end of August after her family doctor filed a complaint of medical neglect, stating the child's life was in danger because medical care was not being properly managed at home. Anamarie, who is 3 1/2 feet tall and weighs 120 pounds, is three times as much as she should weigh. Her parents deny mistreating her and claim she is suffering from undiagnosed medical condition.

Dumping It On The States

The city of Toronto has signed a five-year contract with Carleton Farms landfill, located in a suburb just outside of Detroit, to dump their garbage on them. Carleton Farms has agreed to accept 2.1 million tons of Canadian industrial and commercial trash - 300,000 tons for the first two years, and then 500,000 tons annually for the last three. The township of Sumpter, where Carleton Farms landfill is located, will receive a royalty of \$1.50 US per ton.

This past Monday, twenty-five Make-A-Wish kids and their families boarded a Boeing 777 for a six-day vacation to Walt Disney World, Florida. The vacation comes courtesy of American Airlines' 5th Annual Wish Flight, of which everything from the flight to the crew's time on the flight, is donated. This year makes the 20th anniversary of the Make-A-Wish Foundation, which grants wishes to children suffering from life-threatening illnesses.

He'll Be Back

Filming for Terminator 3 is reported to begin in spring 2001. Financing is finally in place for the movie, and it looks like Arnold Schwarzenegger will be signing on to film the next installment, joining already committed castmates Edward Furlong and Linda Hamilton. James Cameron, the director of the first two Terminator movies, has confirmed that he will not be involved in the picture.

Are There Martians Among Us?

A new analysis of the Mars meteorite found in Antarctica in 1984 shows it stayed cool enough on its 15-million-year journey to Earth that any living organisms that were on board could have survived the voyage. The meteorite, named ALH84001, made headlines back in 1996 when a team of scientists claimed it had markings resembling fossilized micro-organisms. The latest study conducted still does not prove that there were living organisms on the meteorite when it landed. Previous studies using computer models have shown that billions of small chunks of rock may have travelled from Mars to Earth over the past 5 billion years. If some of the meteorites contained living organisms, the possibility that life on Earth was "seeded" by material from Mars has been raised.

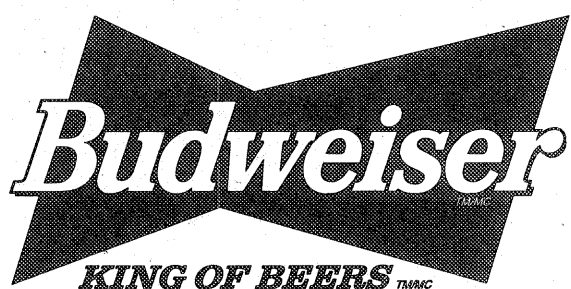

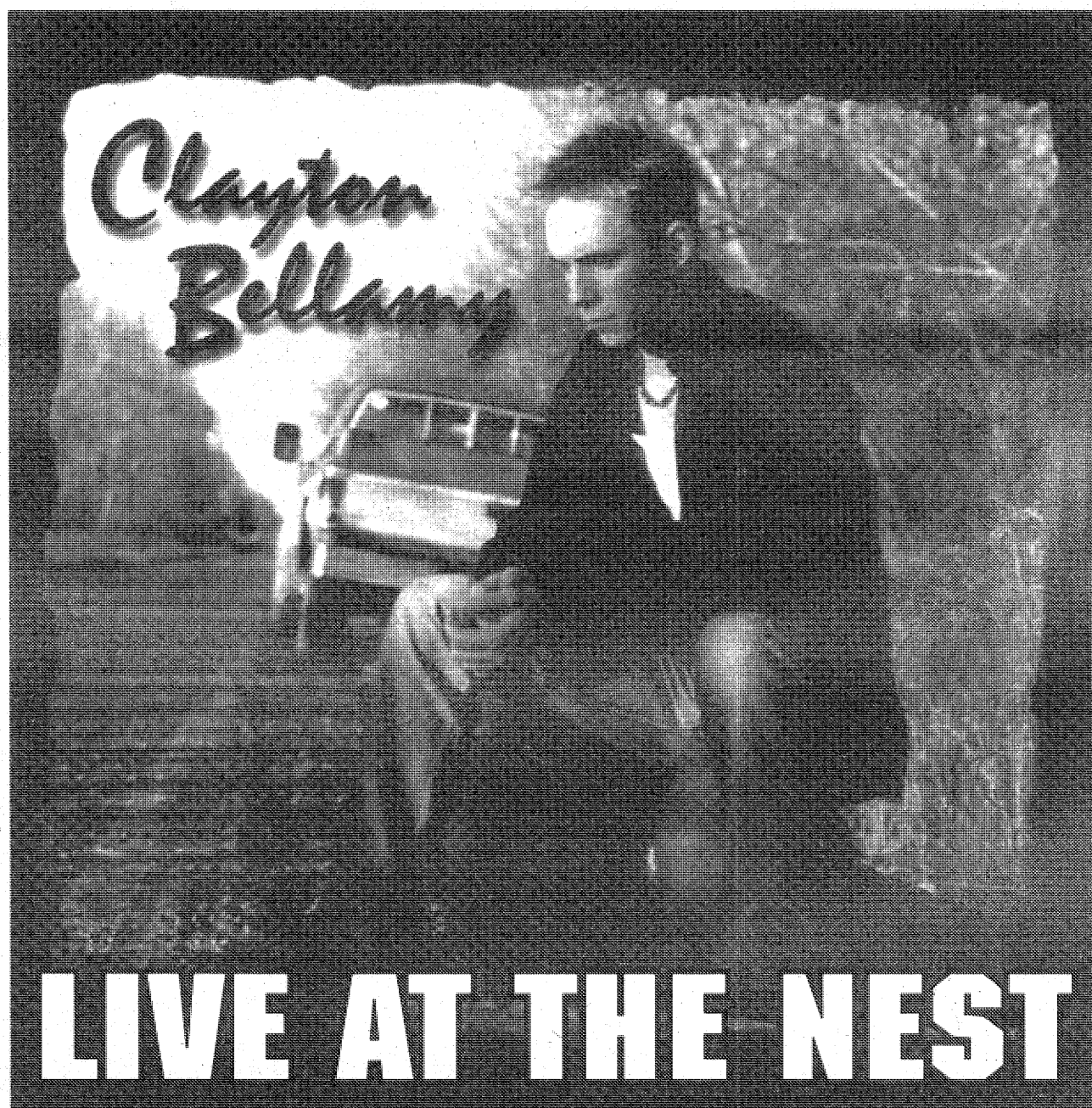

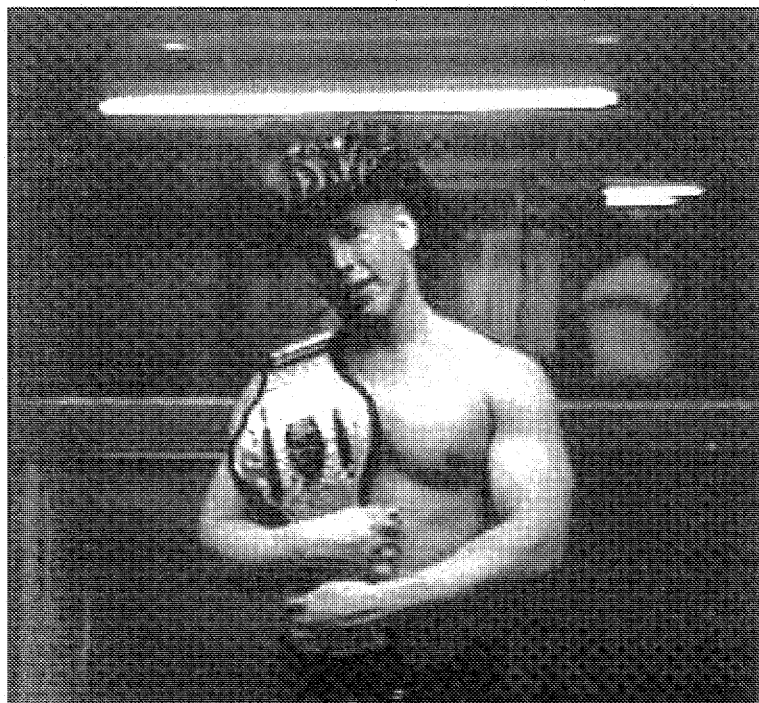

alley-oop pass. Defying gravity, Damery caught the ball and crammed it through the basket, bringing the NAIT bench to its feet. Then, Mike LeCavelier hit two shots from the top of the three-point line, widening the lead even more.

In the end, the Griffins were no match for the Oaks, who went on to win the game by a whopping 29 points. The series has now left NAIT tied for 1st place in the north division with the Griffins.

Last week, the Oaks swept the Red Deer Kings in both games. The scores were 103 to 84 and 74 to 66.

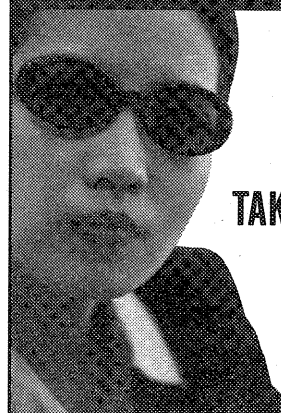

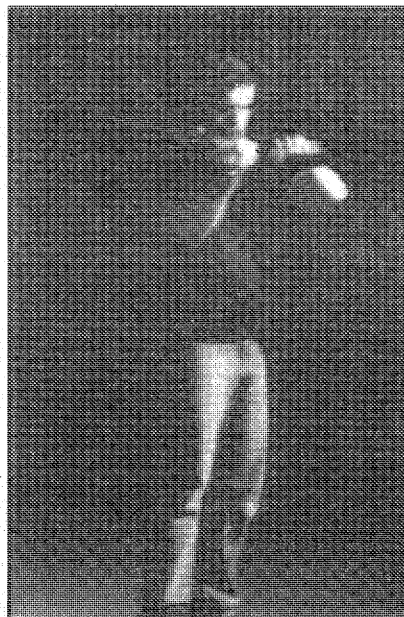
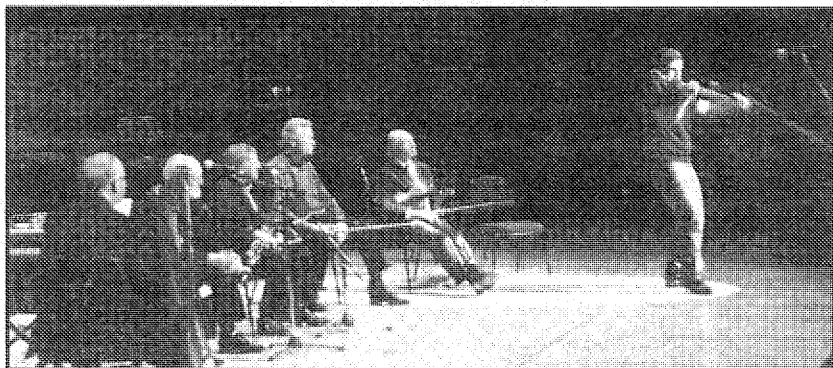
ing fiddles, flute, tin whistle, harp, piano, bagpipes, and the list goes on.

Toy Line of The Week: The Love Boat



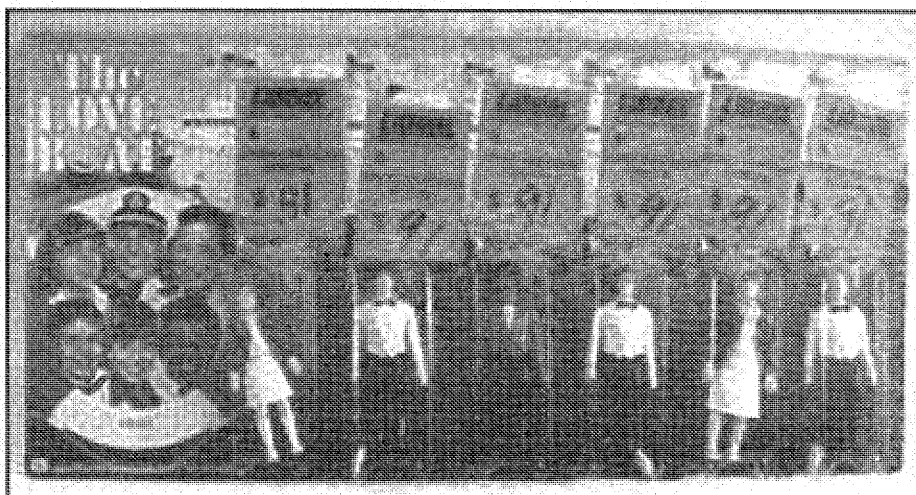

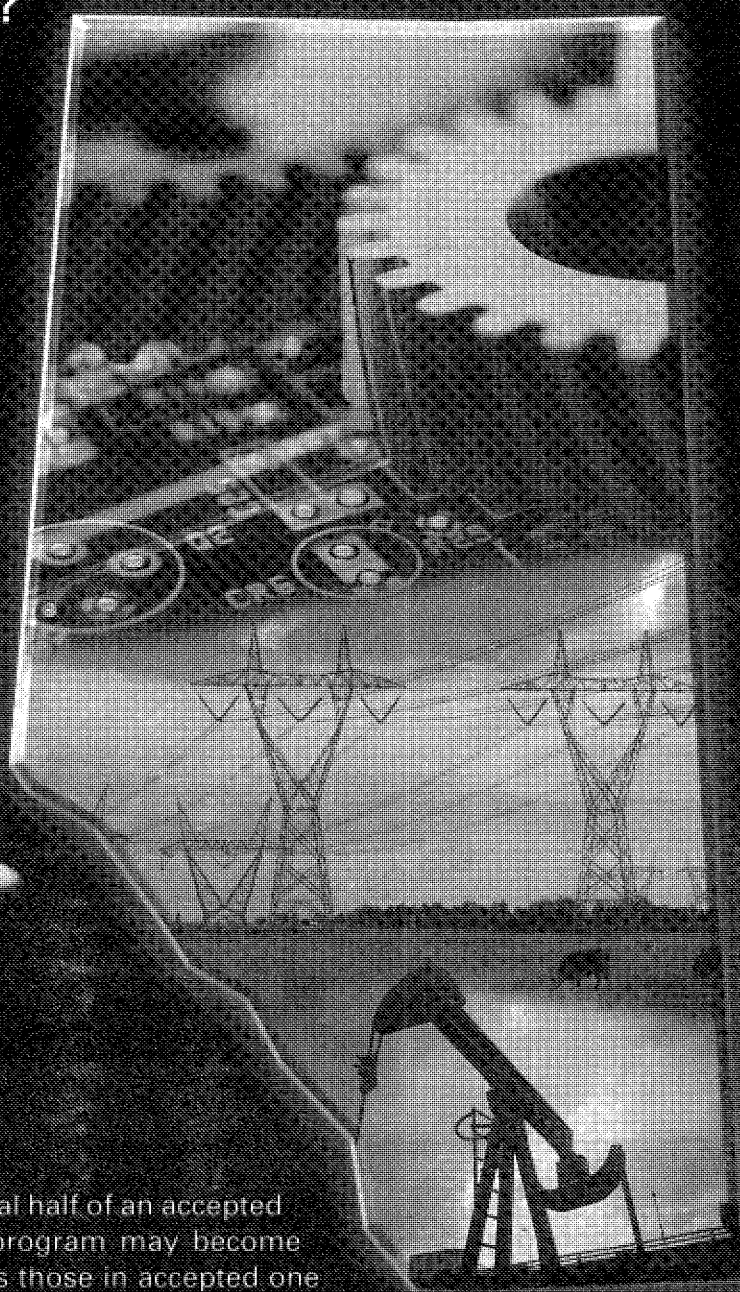

"Brown-Eyed Girl" every time you go to the bar, but that isn't really him.

Early in his career, Van Morrison played in the band Them, which was part of the resurgence in blues music. They played a style of Rock N' Roll similar to the likes of the Animals, and early Led Zeppelin. Now, Van Morrison has hooked up with Linda Gail Lewis to put out an album of mainly old blues covers.

The song which I loved off You Win Again the most is "Boogie Chillen." This was originally recorded by the legendary blues man John Lee Hooker and was a big success for him. Well, generally, I am not too fond of cover songs because they usually turn out like crap, but this doesn't. Van Morrison, although



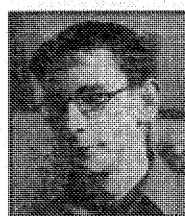
he picks the pace up a bit, keeps the original feel and style of the song. By style, I mean the catchy blues riff and feeling the song puts right in your soul. You just want to hop into the driver's seat of a '74 Cadillac, roll down the windows, crank up the 8-track, and drive way slower than you should.

This good, old, rhythm and blues feeling remains present through most of the CD with nice horn section pieces and blues piano in the background. And what blues album would be complete without the harp? Well, it's there, too, and having all of these elements in this record is a good one. Even the country songs covered are of the old-school of country, like when your 18-wheeler left you on the side of the road - not like the so-called new country about leather pants and pierced belly buttons.

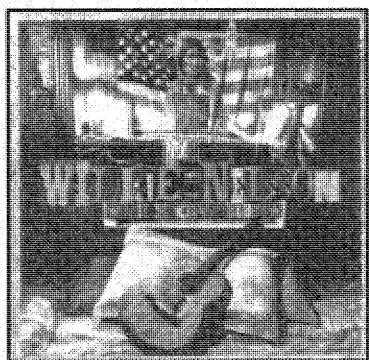
Anyway, if you are a fan of music that actually has something to say and expresses some honest feeling, don't miss out on picking up Van Morrison's You Win Again.

Willie Nelson

Milk Cow Blues

The man in braids has returned, but this time with a blues album. You might be thinking that he is just an old pot-smokin' country boy, but no, he is a blues man now, too.

This is the first blues album for Willie Nelson, and since he isn't really experienced in recording the blues, he called in some of the big guns. These big guns include Dr. John, B.B. King, Jonny Lang, and Kenny Wayne Shepherd.

The record is a collection of songs Willie wrote himself done up with a blues feel as well as some standard blues covers to fill out the album. This was a really good move because I didn't want to hear a blues version of "Always On My Mind" so, with the addition of songs like "The Thrill Is Gone," and "Kansas City," it gives the record some superficial credibility and still lets you know it's a Willie Nelson record.

It's kind of funny just thinking about how many times B.B. King must have recorded "The Thrill Is Gone." I can recollect six different versions of the song, with his sound every time because of the special guest recording is with him each time. On this particular recording of it, "The Thrill Is Gone" keeps true to itself and sounds just like it's supposed to. There is nothing new and inventive about the Willie version, it just provides a catchy number for a guy new to the blues to listen to.

Although Willie is a country

artist, the style of country which he is accustomed to recording isn't that far off from the blues. So, it isn't that far-fetched that he did a blues album. For example, on "Crazy," a song written by Willie but made popular by Patsy Cline, the song actually sounds good as a blues

song. The only difference in the sound of the song is the deep guitar sound and the drums. Other than that, it isn't a far jump from the old-time country hit.

Considering that old Willie isn't your traditional blues kind of guy, the album is pretty good. It focuses more on the early hardcore blues rather than the up beat style of blues of the mid to late 60s. The only thing that is hard to get over is hearing Willie Nelson's voice on these songs in this style. He sounds very basic and kind of lacks the soul of the traditional blues. If you don't mind the voice, I suggest you consider getting this record.

Now There's Kink!

What is a pin up queen, you ask? For the answer to that, investigate

Paul Morgan Donald's new musical "Kink," starring Kimberly Carroll as Nashville born pin up queen sensation Bettie Page. The story is about Page's career as a model - not just any model, however, but one whose erotic persona was inspired by fetish and bondage photos.

Page was one of the first models to ever pose nude for Playboy magazine. She was also one of the only ones to have more magazine appearances than Marilyn Monroe and Cindy Crawford combined. She reached the height of her career in the 1950's, only to be stopped by a US senate investigation in 1957, which lead to her disappearance for 40 years.

"Kink," back for a second time since last year's debut at the 1999 Fringe Festival, features new songs and a revised script in the hopes of attracting the large crowds that attended last year's performance. This musical has a cast of seven to fill the shoes of all fourteen major and minor characters. It tells the story of Bettie Page's modeling career, from her high times in the 1950's when she was one of the most famous pin-up girls around, to her downfall in 1957 when she is put under investigation by the US senate for indecent exposure. By centering our attention on Bettie's days at Movie Star News (a movie still shop owned and operated by brother and sister Irving and Paula Klaw), we are introduced to the kinky side of Bettie.

"Kink" is a particularly memorable musical because it displays an intriguing true history of a mysterious pin-up girl. Kimberly Carroll, who plays Bettie, does an admirable job of portraying the character. Her vocals were strong, one of the most engaging, and thankfully carried the show. In spite of her Tennessee accent disappearing a few times, her character maintained its strength throughout the entire show.

Other notable characters are June King, played by Carmen Davison; and Roz Greenwood, played by Sharla Matkin (who also

plays the part of Sylvia). The duo did an excellent job as Bettie's photo friends and comedians of the stage in such songs as "I Want to be Spanked by Somebody" and "Dominance and Submission in the Behavior Patterns of Higher Primates." Aside from Carroll, these two were the most entertaining of the supporting characters.

Also noteworthy is Ben

Trovato, played by Lodewyk Bredenkamp, who adds romance and irony to the show as Bettie's old flame rekindled. Did You Get Your Shot?

Meningitis Clinic at NAIT a Success

Did you get your meningitis shot between October 19 and 24? Well, 60,000 people between the ages of 2 and 24 did - and if you didn't, what was your excuse?

Meningitis is an infection that

causes inflammation to the lining of the brain and spinal cord. Symptoms include severe headache, fever, and sore throat that may progress to a stiff neck, vomiting, and a purplish rash.

The most common ways meningitis is spread is by sharing cigarettes, lipstick, kissing, or other close contact that involves the exchange of saliva or other secretions.

Meningitis can also be fatal and has already taken the life of one stu-

dent at our school this year.

Between October 19 and 24, various clinics were set up by the Capital Health Authority around the city for anyone between the ages of 2 and 24 to get a free meningitis shot. In total, 60,000 people in Edmonton and surrounding areas took advantage of this and got vaccinated.

For two of those days (October 19 and 20), clinics were set up at NAIT, Grant MacEwan, and the University of Alberta, for the post-secondary students between the ages of 20 and 24. While the University of Alberta campus was the most popular, 2,127 NAIT students took advantage

of the clinic and got the shot.

The meningitis clinics that were set up on the post-secondary campuses last week came as a breath of relief for some students over the age of 20. Last year when the clinics were set up on campus, students over 19 were turned away from getting the shot.

If you missed out on getting vaccinated at one of the public clinics, don't fret - the Capital Health Authority is taking appointments right now for the meningitis shot. Again, it is only free to those aged 2 to 24. If you would like to make an appointment to find out more information, call 408-LINK (5465).

When you arrive to get your meningitis shot:

- Be prepared to show proof of age.
- Be prepared to answer questions about past medical history.

After you receive your shot:

- You will have to wait 15 minutes to make sure you don't have a reaction.
- The most common after effects are fever and a sore arm.
