couldn't help but notice the obscene amounts of gratis alcohol that were being loaded on the bus. Surely this wasn't all for us? Oh, but it was, it was.

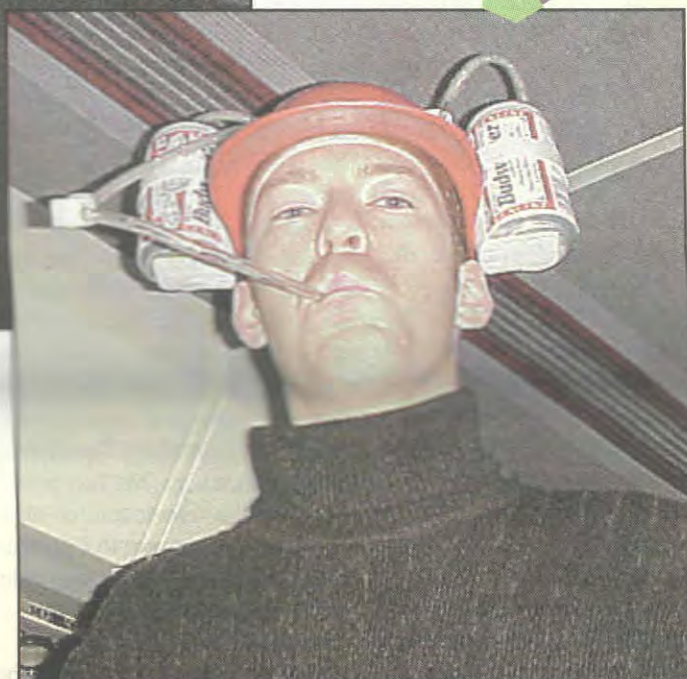

This Hour Has Twenty Two Minutes

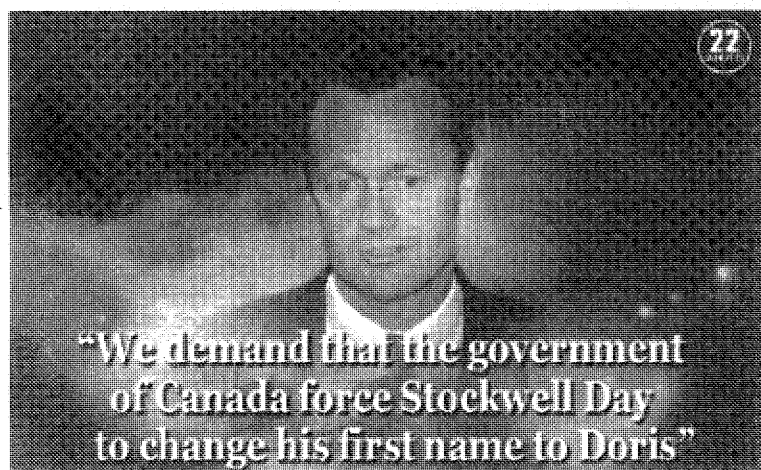

A Hospital Straight Out Of A Horror Movie

Alder Hey Hospital in the Netherlands is under investigation yet again. This time, they were being accused of storing 400 fetuses without the knowledge of the parents. stroyed by the expansion of an industrial park. They dug up 105 bodies in total with only one corpse being positively identified to-date. They also maintain that each body they discovered was reported to the local authorities, who established an official record of evidence of the objects found on the corpses. The British defence ministry, however, states that this was not the case and that the archeologists stole personal items from the soldiers and displayed them at local exposition. In response to this allegation, "The Diggers" state the objects displayed were not from the graves but had instead been found in the surrounding area.

Big Band Wallace Belts It Out

"60 Minutes" anchorman Mike Wallace is adding another notch to his lengthy and varied career by making his debut as a singer on a new CD entitled "Pat and Mike Wallace." Wallace, who is a veteran of radio, TV acting, game show hosting, and broadcast journalism, teamed up with CBS employee Pat Harris to make the CD, which has been recorded in big band style and mixed by Grammy winner Al Schmidt. The first single being released from the CD is "The Girl (She's Mine)."

Dreyers Does Dalmatians

In celebration of Disney's latest brainchild, "102 Dalmatians," opening in theatres November 22, Dreyer's Grand Ice Cream has created two new flavours. The first new flavour is "Chocolate Dalmatian Sensation," which is chocolate and vanilla ice cream with fudge swirls and candy dalmatian puppies. The second new flavour is "Spotacular Vanilla," which is chocolate spots swirled through fudge-striped vanilla ice cream. Dreyers will feature these two new yummy flavours in your local grocery store until the end of January 2001.

Farewell, Sweet Prince

Fred Rogers is hanging up his sweater on TV for the last time. The soft-spoken host of "Mr. Rogers' Neighbourhood" will be retiring at the end of the 2000-2001 TV season after a 33-year run on the air. Rogers is the creator-host of the longest-running children's program on public TV, and while he may be retiring from being behind the screen, the 71-year-old has plans to continue his brand of quiet education on websites, through publications, and through his volunteer work with museums across the world.

Unique Operation Saves Woman's Life

Joanne Minnich is Mahopac, New York is resting comfortably at Methodist Hospital after doctors removed three cancerous tumors from her heart last week. What makes this operation so special, however, was, for the doctors to remove the tumors from Minnich's heart, they had to physically remove her heart from her chest, repair it, and then replace it back in her chest. Dr. Michael Reardon, who led the surgical team, commented that Minnich only had weeks to live prior to the operation, which has only been performed three other times across the United States.

The First Of Its Kind

Doctors at the No. 202 People's Liberation Army Hospital have performed a first of its kind surgery after they replaced a man's esophagus with a 40-centimetre section of his own colon. The recipient of the newly constructed esophagus was 37-year-old E Aiquo of Shenyang, China. He commented that, after undergoing the operation, this would be the first time in 13 years he had been able to eat food through his mouth instead of through a tube in his stomach. The need for the tube came after he accidentally drank half a bottle of caustic soda and permanently damaged his esophagus at the age of 24.

The XFL games will be telecast Saturday afternoons and evenings from February 3 to April 8, and will feature the teams the Birmingham Thunderbolts, the Chicago Enforcers, the New York and New Jersey Hitmen, the San Francisco Demons, the Las Vegas Outlaws, the Memphis Maniax, the Los Angeles Xtreme, and the Orlando Rage.

National Born Killers

A 17-year-old girl and her 20-year-old boyfriend were arrested in New York this week after strangling the girl's parents for disapproving of their relationship. The two are scheduled to be arraigned this Friday on murder charges. Police said the body of the girl's father was recovered from the East River. He was apparently strangled by his daughter with a raincoat belt while he was watching television. The body of the girl's mother, of which divers are still trying to recover, was also strangled, to which the couple admitted then putting in a laundry bag and then a shopping cart before pushing her into the river. Before this incident, neither the 17-year-old nor her boyfriend had a criminal history.

Dedicated - And For What?

When 72-year-old Margie Knake checked into the hospital in Nashville, Tennessee for open heart surgery, no one expected to find her gone from her bed an hour before her surgery was scheduled to be performed. When nurses came in to prep her, they instead found a note on her bed that said, "Gone to vote, back in 30 minutes." It was election day, and an election official in Knake's district confirmed that, yes, an elderly woman had come in to vote, complete with IV tubes coming out of her arms and all. The surgery went off fine, however, and even on schedule.

Montreal Protestors Released on Bail

After spending more than two weeks in jail, three Quebec youths, charged with armed assault on a police officer following a G-20 demonstration (they allegedly threw rocks and chunks of pavement at riot police) have been released on bond.

Robert Scalia of CUP paper *The Link* reports that Superior Court Justice Claire Barette Joncas released the three men, Kevin Spillane, 25; Daniel Carriere, 22; and Stephane Blais, 18; providing that they stay

away from public protests and submit to a curfew until their trial, which could be up to a year away.

The three men were initially incarcerated after Crown Prosecutor Normand Chenier argued that they represented a threat to society. In their November 7 appeal hearing, however, Chenier spoke briefly, stating that he felt it would be unfair punishment to keep the three men imprisoned until their preliminary hearings on November 17

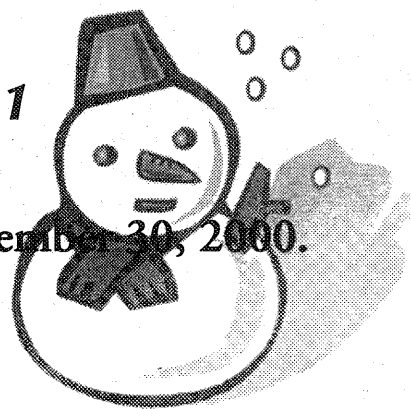

Moi: What is the next stage in the Strength Training program?

John: The third stage in resistance or weight training is called the Maximum Strength phase. The blend here is three weeks of Hypertrophy training and then three weeks of maximum strength training. You could carry this on for up to 18 weeks before you would switch to power or endurance training.

It is characterized by a load of

85 to 100 percent of 1 RM max. The number of exercises that you would do in a workout is only 3 to 5, mainly because the rest period between the sets is 3 to 6 minutes.

Make sure you don't duplicate the muscles used when planning the exercises that you will work at each training session. The muscles need lots of time to recover after each set of reps, so don't shortcut on the rest period if you want to make significant gains.

The number of repetitions per set is only 1 to 4, so do this workout with a friend. The number of sets per session is only 6 to 10 with a maximum of 12. The frequency per week is 2 to 3 with a maximum of 4. These are tough workouts, but worth it if you are building strength and mass.

The Ooks basketball team had a tough weekend series against the Concordia College Thunder. The Thunder are a stronger squad than last year, and that made for two close games.

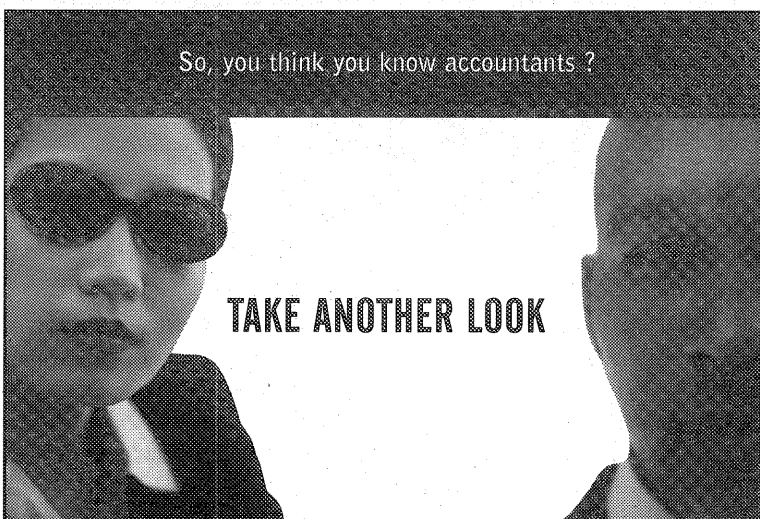

The first game went on Friday night in Calgary at the Centennial Arena. This game was a special one because of the fan bus that attended. good, but that was as good looking as it got.

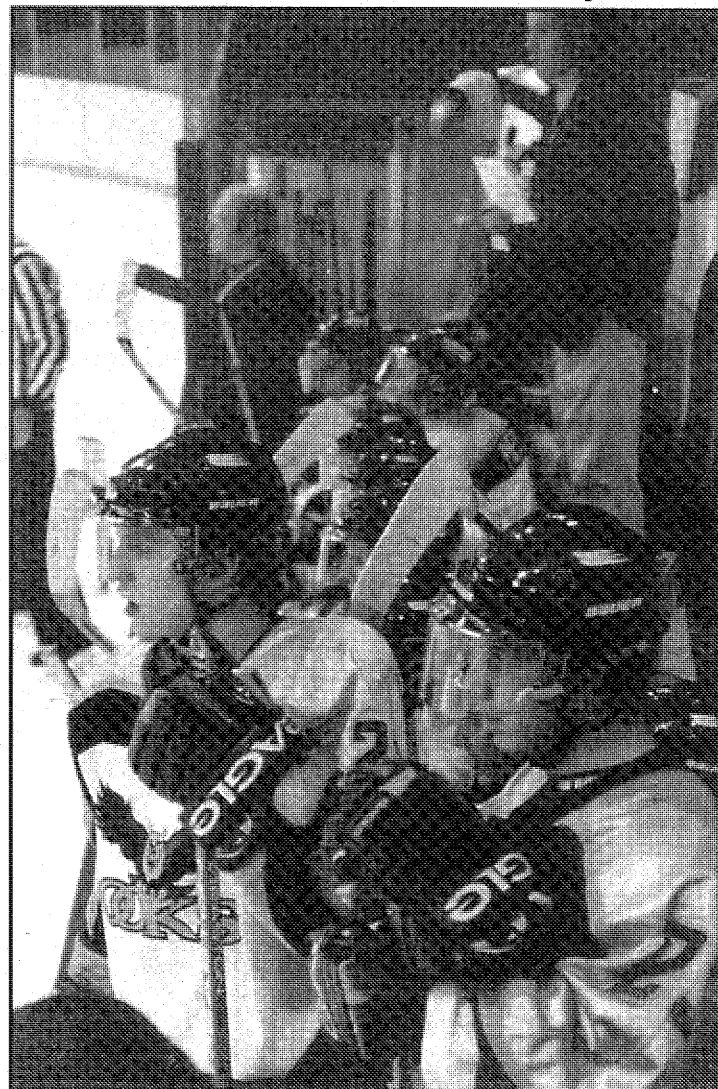

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I believe in a Canada where everybody wins.

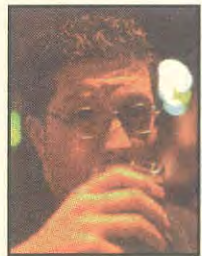
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Investigating: Which head do guys use?

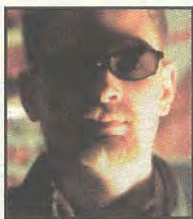
be able to pick what suits them."

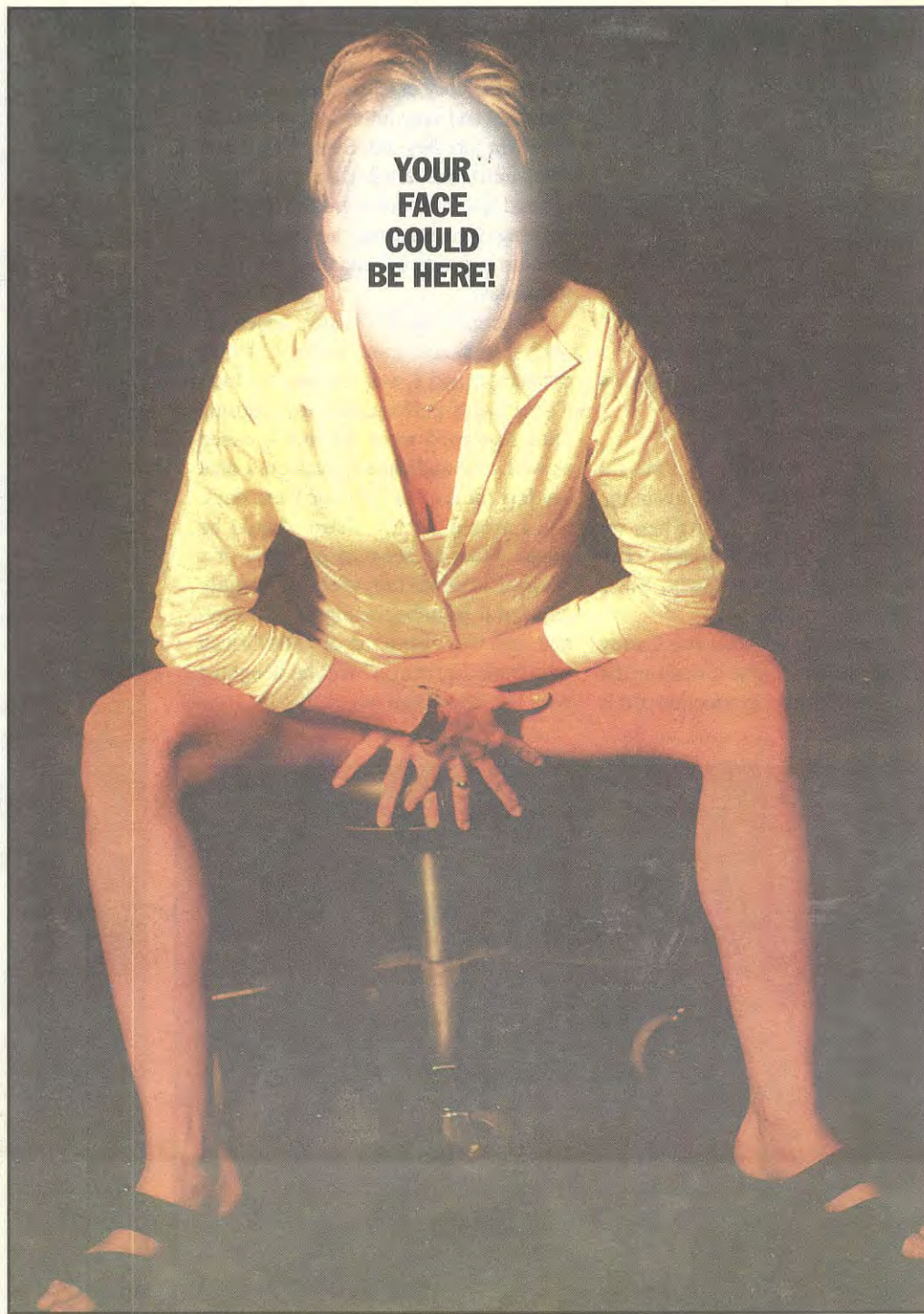

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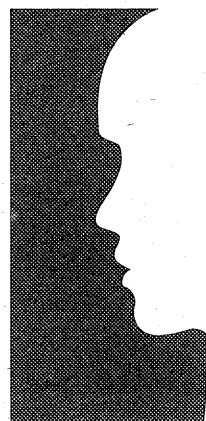

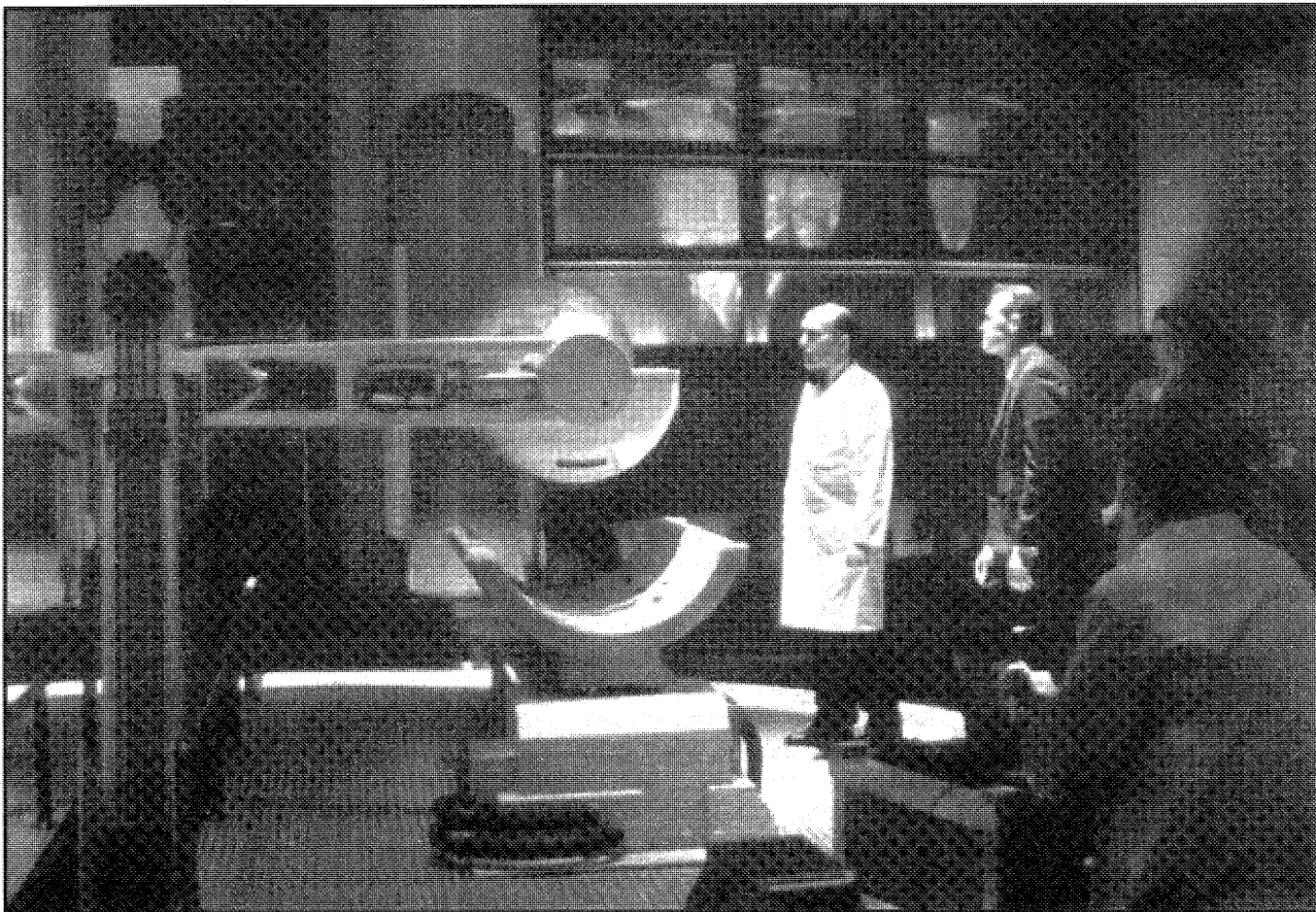
The 6th Day:

nal and the reprise are found on the Selections CD).

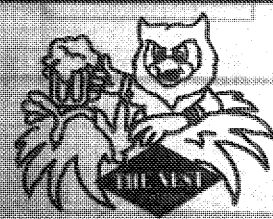

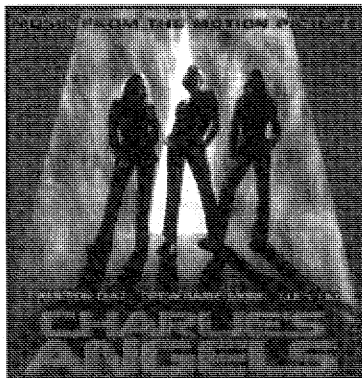

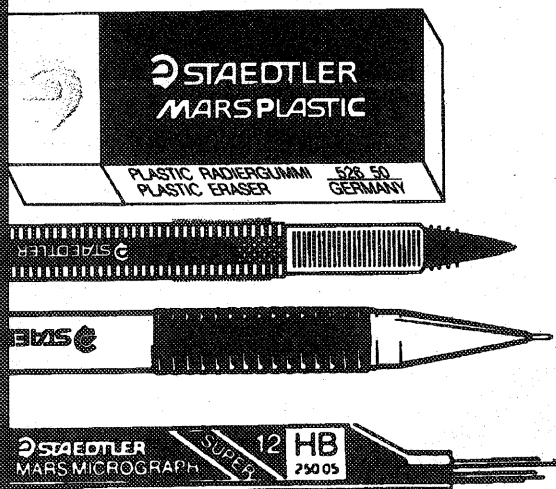

Overall, this is one the best soundtracks I've seen come out in a long time. Basically, it is something for everybody, and I'm glad that I got the chance to review this one.

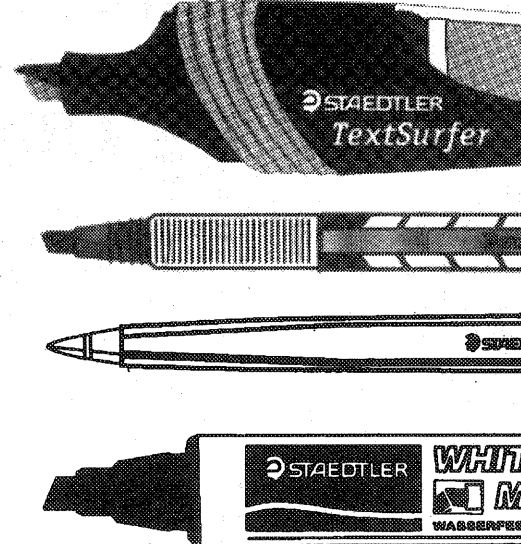

Overall, this is one the best soundtracks I've seen come out in a long time. Basically, it is something for everybody, and I'm glad that I got the chance to review this one.



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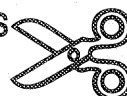

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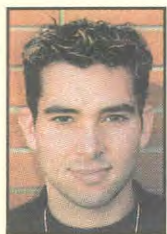

dipping sauce. Once your appetizer is finished, it's time to choose an entrée. This may be easier said than done, however, because choosing

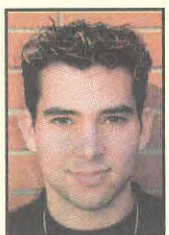


only one item from a list of several pizzas, pastas, salads, burgers, pitas, and special dishes is extremely difficult.
