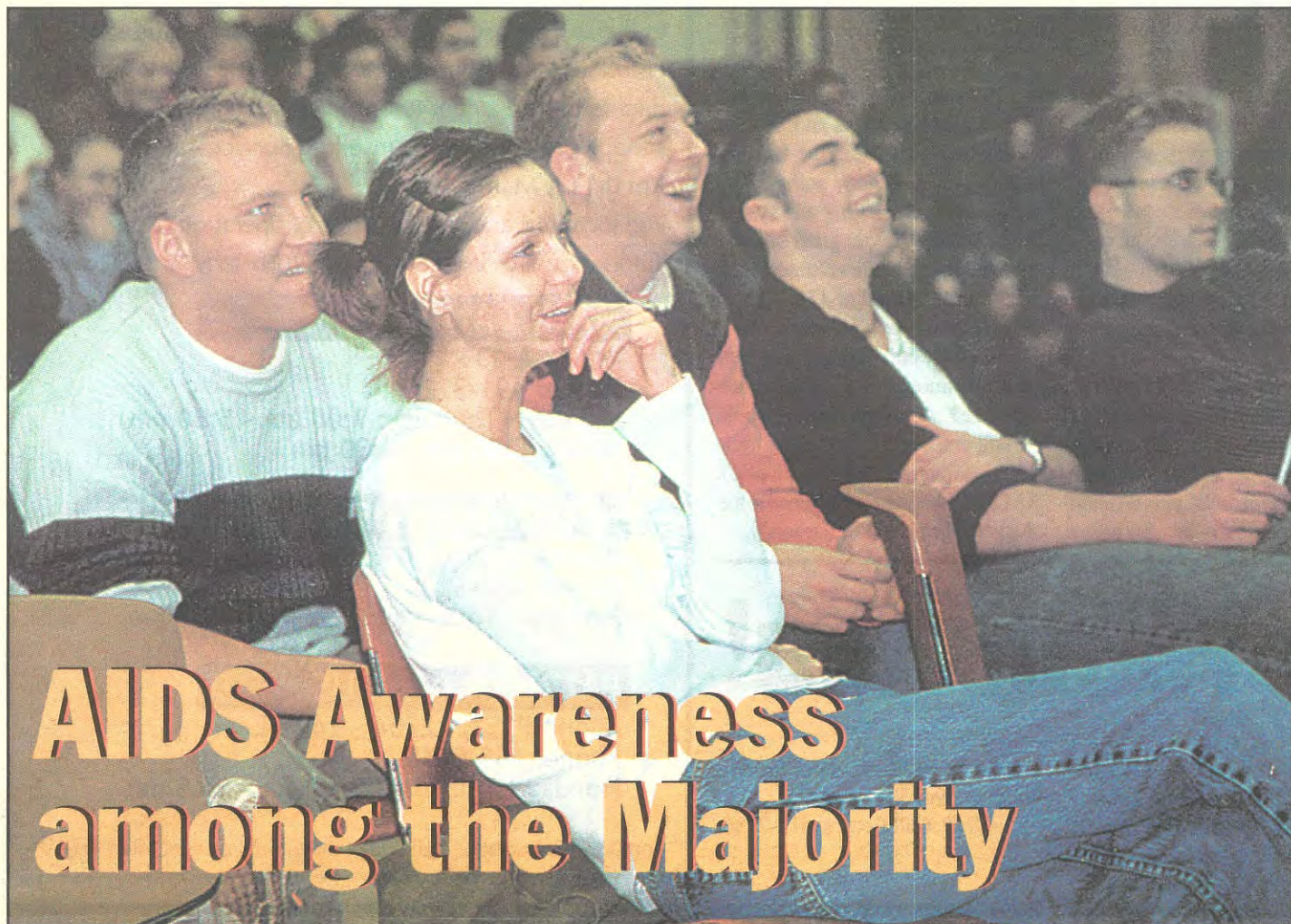

According to a 1995 study, only 22 percent of Canadian men use condoms. That gives

Canada the lowest rate of condom use in the industrialized world. And we thought we were smarter than the Americans.

Winnie Comes Home

The Pavilion Gallery Museum in Assiniboine Park, Winnipeg recently purchased the only known original portrait of Winnie the Pooh for \$176,920. The price the gallery paid for the painting was seven times more than it's worth. The painting depicts Winnie the Pooh holding a large pot of honey and was painted by Pooh illustrator E.H. Shepard himself. As for how the Museum managed to pay to acquire the painting, they were aided by donations from Winnipeg school children who emptied their piggy banks to contribute to its purchase.

A Topeka, Kansas woman who flubbed up a suicide attempt by trying to shoot herself in the head, dialled 911 for help and then passed out. When rescuers arrived, because the woman was passed out on the floor, assumed she was dead without even checking for a pulse. The ambulance

was cancelled, and the rescue workers, who were firemen trained as medical technicians, went outside to sanction the house off as a crime scene. In the meantime, the woman regained consciousness and called 911 again. The firemen outside of the home were told of the call and rushed inside to provide medical care. The woman is currently listed in fair condition.

Prostitutes Of The World Unite

The first conference on prostitution in the Asia-Pacific region was held last week with a call to legalize to profession and ensure the rights of sex workers. Prostitutes from Australia, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Hong Kong, India, Japan, Laos, Malaysia, and the United States attended the 5-day meeting in Bangkok, Thailand. The main issue focused upon was examples of countries with discriminatory laws and attitudes toward prostitution, citing the United States, Burma, Cambodia, Hong Kong, and Thailand for examples. Attendees of the conference complained that police followed some of them to make sure they did not ply their trade. Currently, prostitution is illegal in Thailand, the site of the conference, but the trade is booming.



not usually a big concern to me, but I feel the student population should be privy to some info.

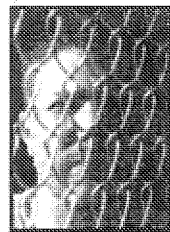

Even our very own paper has had a number of political based articles.

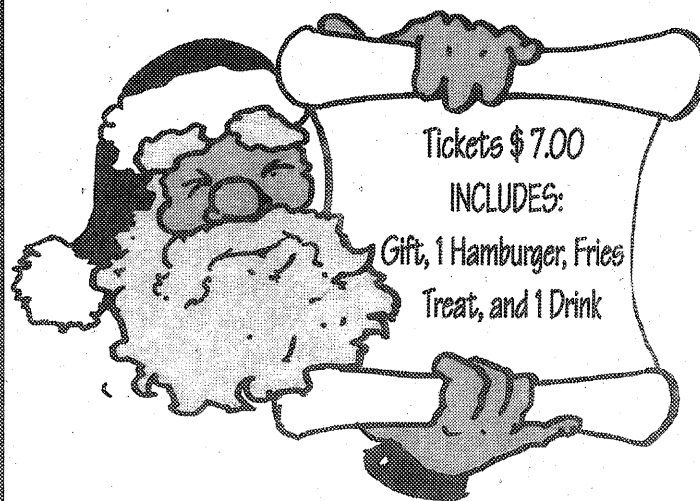

Marijuana Party Wins Election

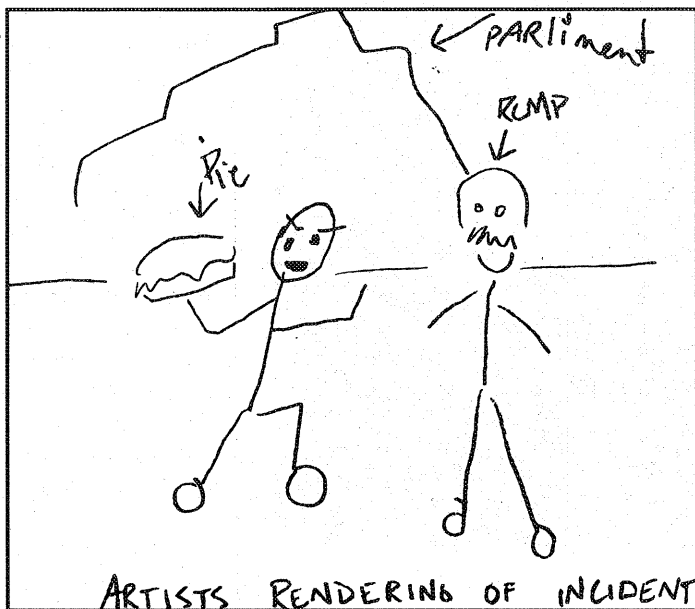

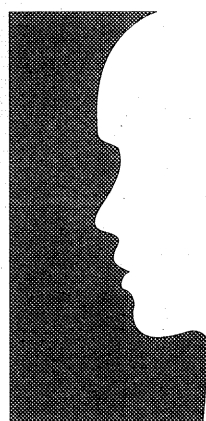

For this tour, the Hip has managed to find a female vocalist to sing

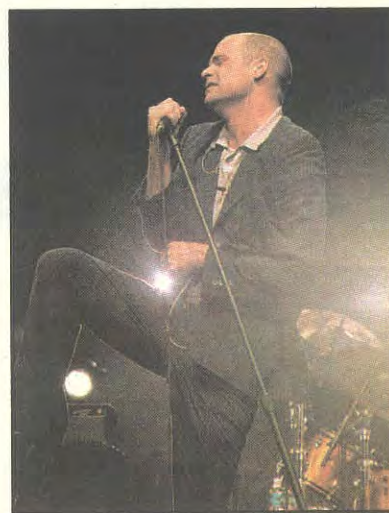

I have to give kudos to the girl in the 2nd row on the floor who



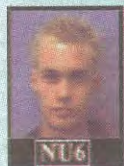
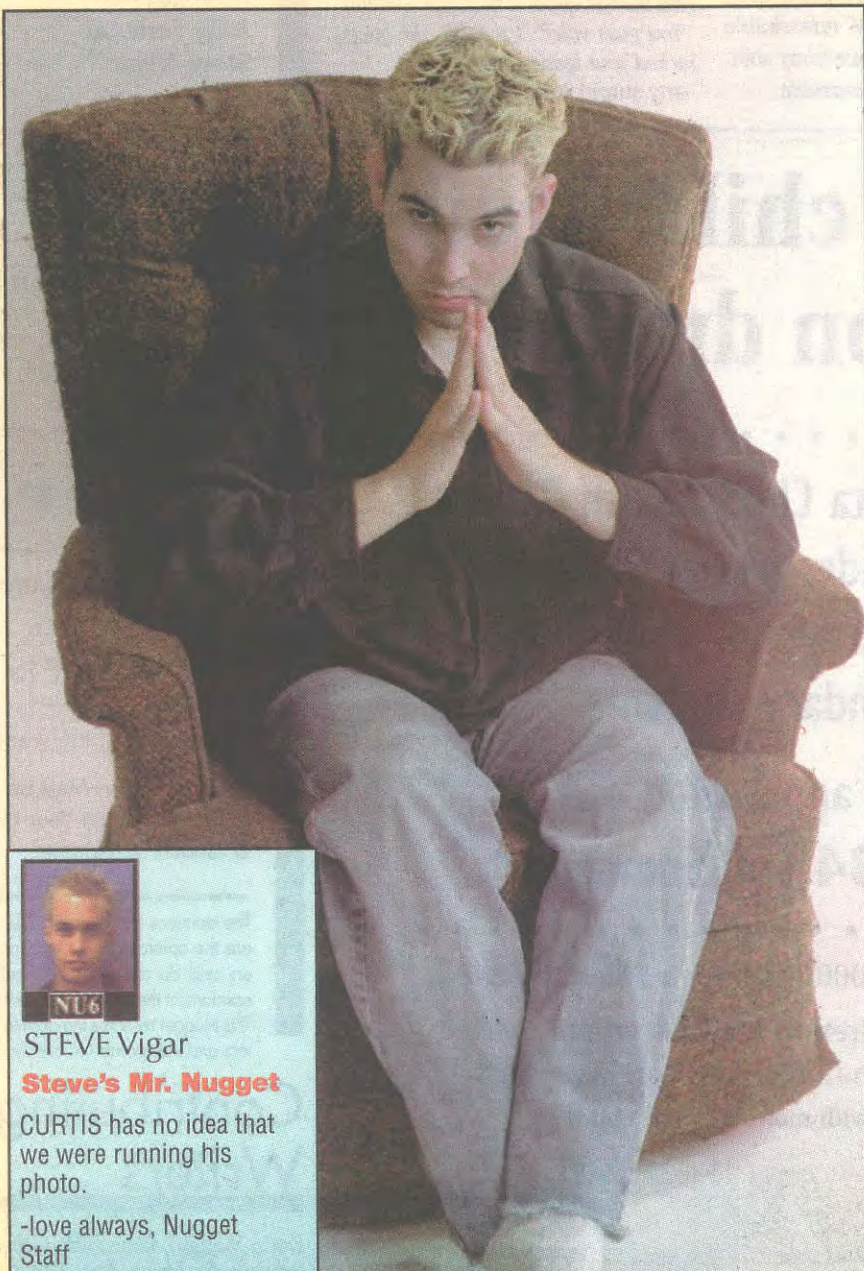

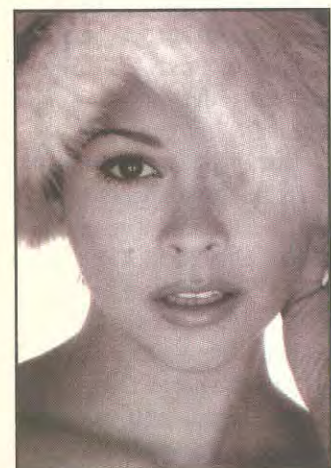
Episode 4 "The Cindy Margolis Show vs. Wild On"

John: It's time to take a look at your program, have you tried to periodize it at all or do you do the same activities or lifts session after session? You may need to increase the weights and decrease the reps, try some new exercises for the same body part. You may not be getting enough rest to let your body recover in other words you may be

overtraining. You may be doing too many exercises for the same body part. You may not be doing enough training to challenge the body to make gains. You may not be eating enough or your diet is not balanced in order to make gains. Our genetic background is always a problem, perhaps you don't have the bone structure or body type to get any bigger. Supplements are usually not the answer and steroids are definitely not the answer. Steroids are short term gain for long term pain and health problems. The general solution is to change your program and sometimes that requires some informed help from a qualified Personal Trainer.

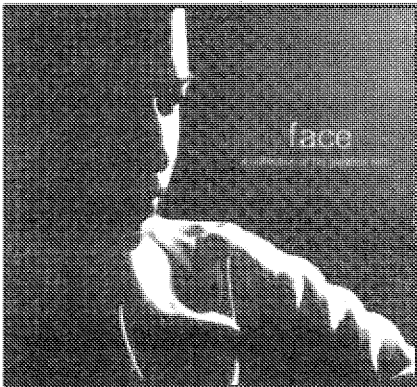

THE MUSE #1:
In Search Of
Holden Caulfield

ANNOUNCER: To muse is to ponder and meditate. Here's K. Joseph Kijek on a quest for Holden Caulfield, the narrator of the classic and somewhat controversial novel "Catcher In The Rye" written by its enigmatic author J.D. Salinger.

K. JOSEPH KIJEK: (reading an excerpt from J.D. Salinger's "Catcher In The Rye") "Besides, I'm not going to tell you my whole goddamn autobiography or anything. I'll just tell you about this madman stuff that happened to me around last Christmas just before I got pretty run-down and had to come out here and take it easy." Thus begins the tale of sixteen-year-old Holden Caulfield, who recounts his three-day journey in New York City previous to telling his parents that he was expelled from Pencey Prep, an esteemed Ivy League school in Agerstown, Pennsylvania. Alienated from the rest of his surroundings and trying to grasp the meaning of his adolescent life before he succumbs to the unavoidable corruptions the Adult World promises to have, Holden Caulfield in some respects, sums up the thoughts and feelings of all teenagers. Here is Michelle Husak, a sixteen-year-old high school girl who told me her thoughts on "Catcher In The Rye" and protagonist Holden Caulfield.

MICHELLE HUSAK: I really liked it, and what I liked about it was that it was told from the perspective of someone around my own age. It deals with issues that is sort of related to what people our age go through; like the feeling like you don't belong, loneliness, and he was always trying to find somebody to talk to or sit with. He seemed like a decent person and just sort of had the reoccurring theme that he just didn't really know sort of where his place is. Maybe he wanted to save people. Like be some sort of... I don't know... being the "Catcher In The Rye" he'd have an important title, and people would acknowledge that, and he'd get acknowledgement. I wanted to know what happened to him. There wasn't enough closure.

What do you think? K. JOSEPH KIJEK: Paul Gauthier, an aspiring writer of surrealistic fiction with a masters in English, thinks the "Catcher In The Rye" is an overhyped and unwarranted timeless work of literature.

PAUL GAUTHIER: I thought it was essentially an immature, purile novel, basically. I found the sort of rebellion and attitude to basically be that of a spoiled sixteen-year-old brat. I tried to read it and I wanted to like it, but I think I got 50 pages into it and couldn't. I was bored and annoyed. I didn't find him a compelling anti-hero either. And besides, John Lennon's dead, and for that, I'd like to give J.D. Salinger a little bit of credit. For the inspiration for that, one down three to go.

K. JOSEPH KIJEK: After assassinating John Lennon on Dec.8,1980, Mark David Chapman sat down on the curb and started to read over his copy of "Catcher In The Rye."

CLINTON CAREW: When people think that-o.k.- you can be someone you can do something, I mean, um, there's two ways to look at it. One, you look inside yourself, and you find the strengths that you have and you build on that. The other thing is you look inside yourself and find out that your empty and have to make yourself be someone. He fell for the whole trap that I think in many ways "Catcher In Rye's" about. He fell for the social kind of thing. He wanted to be famous. He figured that in order for him to be someone, to be an individual, he had to be recognized by the mass media and that was his whole goal. His goal was to become somebody. But he didn't want to become somebody by being somebody. He didn't want to become somebody by taking personal steps. He wanted to become somebody by being affirmed by the rest of society as somebody. By having his name in the paper. I think he read it wrong, but people read things wrong all the time.

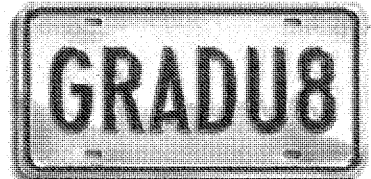





Just a few months ago, Joey Tomato's on Jasper Avenue said good bye to their old warehouse gone mad interior. Out with the dark hardwood flooring, checkered tablecloths, and various eclectic decorations, and in with carpet flooring, new table settings and hand blown glass chandeliers!

In fact, now the restaurant is barely recognizable. The most noticeable improvements include a



tilled entrance followed by a spacious dining room that is highlighted by a lovely stone fireplace. Warm tints to the dining room lighting and well-set cherry wood tables do a fine job of reflecting the restaurant's new take on conveying a more relaxed ambiance.

Wall booths designed specifically for two are also a nice option for couples.

Joey's executive chef Chris Mills (member of the Canadian Culinary Arts Team) introduces customers to a menu that offers a fine blend of Mediterranean cuisine with an Asian and Canadian influence. Some select dishes from the Mediterranean choices include; *Hummus with pita bread* (6.95), *Bruschetta*

(4.98) and a *Souvlaki wrap* (7.98). The Asian influences can be found in dishes such as the *Chinatown Lettuce Wraps* (7.45) and *Kung Fu Wontons* in a chili sauce (6.95) whereas the Canadian fare comes with choices like *Maple Glazed Salmon* (12.99) and *Sirloin Steak* (11.98).

A wide range of innovative pasta choices are also available, all of which are unique to Joey's. Take for example, the *Michelangelo*, a nice blend of garlic chicken, sundried tomatoes and fresh peas in a rich chicken broth served over pasta!

Another favorite item from their menu is their forno baked thin crust pizzas. Chef Chris Mills experimented a little with one of the

pizzas and introduced one that is exclusive to Joey's *The Tandoori* – a hot egg plant relish sauce pizza topped with sweet onions, green peppers and garnished with cilantro topped a cool yogurt swirl! "It's more of a love it or hate it type of pizza," laughs Night Leader, Tina Nightingale.

Because the menu, is designed for sharing, my guest and I decided on The Oriental Platter – a mix of three appetizers – *Ginger Beef, Lettuce Wraps and Wontons*. Once the platter arrived we noticed that it could have easily fed four people let alone the two of us. Although we had our work cut out, we managed to finish most of the platter. Unfortunately, this meant we had left little room for our main course.

Feeling a bit overwhelmed at the size of our last item, we decided play it safe and order light. I chose a *Margarita pizza* (sun-dried tomatoes, basil topped

with provolone cheese), and my guest went with a *Ginger Sesame Salad*. Both of our choices came out promptly and like the former, offered sizable portions of food. In fact, neither of us were able to finish what we had ordered. "People are constantly "wowed" at how much food they get when they come here," says Tina.

Unlike the old Joey's, this newly renovated one is a great place for a first date – not too romantic, and yet not too energetic. Keep in mind that there are no reservations,



so give yourself a bit of extra time. Also make sure to dress semi-formal as to not feel out of place.

The Dance Of Passion

was made respectable by Parisian travellers in the 1920's. Ever since, the Argentine tango has maintained a higher status. Danced at weddings, funerals, celebrations, or just for social pleasure, there is a tango for every occasion.

The original Argentine tango is dissimilar to all common conceptions of tango. The dance involves complicated foot work and a steady, rarely changing embrace. Two bodies come together as one to perform intricate movement that is tantalizing to the eye of the observer.

Unlike other ballroom or partner dancing where the man and the woman simply follow each other in a mirror image, the Argentine tango accommodates a variety of unique steps for both the man and the woman. To the eye, the upper body motion appears stiff and steady as there are no turns. The man rarely lets go of his partner but leads the woman with great power. Every move made stems from the motions of the upper body, and the intricate footwork is performed at such a close range that the legs are almost always touching.

A single piece of tango music encompasses more than just the heavy tango beat we are all familiar with. A good tango piece is slow and sensual, conveying feelings of passion, drama, and sometimes sadness and melancholy. The composition of tango music began just over a hundred years ago in the cultural melting pot of Buenos Aires. Beginning with an African drum beat, Spanish and Cuban habanera music was incorporated, and finally guitar and violin were added by the Europeans to produce tango music.

Since then, it has evolved to include singing and many more instruments to embrace the feel of the tango. As each tango is different, the dancers must feel the music to know the dance. They attempt to dance steps that match the music, whether it be strong, sad, or fun. The steps can be

accommodated to suit every style or emotion. The dancers are another instrument in the orchestra that performs the tango.

Today, the tango is again making headlines, with Argentina currently attempting to adopt the tango as its official cultural dance. In a way, the tango is a folk dance that is done in a close embrace that is equally at home, on the street, in the ballroom, or on the stage. With stage productions such as the ever-popu-

lar "Forever Tango" (show tango, of course), the tango has spread worldwide. Countries such as Finland, Japan, and Turkey have adopted the dance. Revived in movies and performed for royalty, the Argentine tango has certainly made its mark in the world. Almost more certain is that it will never disappear. And although the Argentine tango differs greatly from the Americanized version, it can still conclude with the traditional dip!

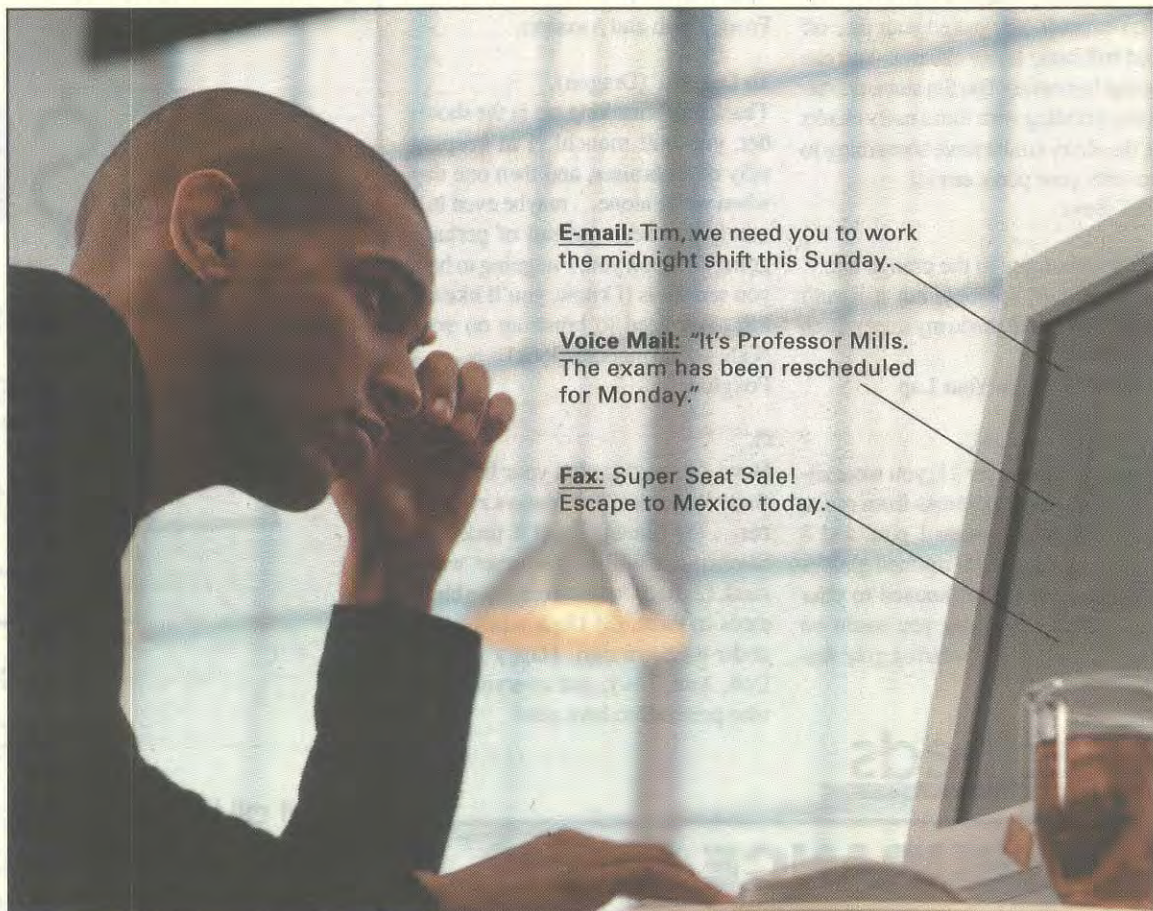
Think tango. What is the first thing that comes to mind? It is likely a red dress, a rose, and a young lady being dragged from one end of the room to the other with arms stretched out.
