The NAITSA executive stood tall as a crowd full of giggling drunks gathered around the dance floor to watch their unforgettable



Mixed News for **Technology Students**

Entry-level Salaries in Alberta are Declining, says survey

he Alberta Society of **Engineering Technolo**gists has released its salary survey for the year 2000, and the news for soon-to-be graduates is

Recent graduates' expected salaries have seen a slight overall decline. Technicians/technologists in training in the fields of electronics, petroleum, and telecommunications saw their average total income fall between \$1,500 to \$10,000 a year from 1999. The largest salary increase in 2000 went to instrumentation, which saw its Alberta Society of **Engineering Technologists**

average total income rise by approximately \$2,000 dollars.

3,500 members of the Alberta Society of Engineering Technologists completed questionnaires this past spring. Among trends noted in the 2000 survey: Fort McMurray is the highest paid area in the province overall, with Lethbridge being the lowest. There are fewer contractors/self-employed mem-

bers, and salaries for the former have dropped by between 2 to 10 percent.

The Fish Bowl That Saved The Day

Two robbers were recently thwarted with a new kind of weapon in Winnipeg, Manitoba, last week... a fish bowl. They are hoping to make this discovery available to the public within three years but are moving slowly, however, as they want to avoid backlash from environmentalists. The development of the glow-in-the-dark lawn has been hailed as a great step forward by the association representing golf course managers. He feels the prospect of fewer summer weekends preoccupied with the lawnmower would appeal to millions of suburban households across North America.

A Bird's Eye View

A tanning salon in Kelowna, British Columbia had quite the shock last week when someone kidnapped their pet parrot. After the parrot was reported missing, the lady who took the parrot - reported to be a large,

- called CrimeStoppers and demanded \$2,000 for the parrot's return. When CrimeStoppers explained to the woman that they do not pay for the return to property but rather only for information that leads to an arrest or charge, she got very angry and hung up. She later called the police, however, and told them they could come and pick up the bird. The tanning salon did not press charges against the woman. Instead, they offered free tanning all weekend long to celebrate Kiwi the parrot's return.

Oops They Did It Again

The state of Minnesota is asking 17.000 children to return the \$95 they were accidentally sent when this year's tax rebate cheques were mailed out. Already, 11,000 of the cheques have been cashed. The state has given out rebates for the past two years because it had a budget surplus, getting its information on who is eligible by people who receive a minimum Social Security cheque. United States law does not allow people to receive a cheque if they were ineligible. The tax department included postage-paid envelopes with the letters they sent out to the 17.000 children, promising that if the child does not return the \$95, it would be taken out of a future tax refund.

Where The Hell Was The Father Then?

Sibling rivalry in Boston, Massachusetts, took a deadly turn when a 13-year-old boy was stabbed by his 12-year-old brother in the heart. The two brothers were fighting over the volume control of the stereo when their father, who heard the stereo blaring. called them and told them to turn it down. The boys were the only ones home at the time. After the boys hung up with their father. the 13-year-old turned the stereo down. The 12-year-old then grabbed a kitchen knife and plunged it into his brother's chest. He was operated on at the Boston Medical Centre where authorities are saying he is lucky to be alive.

Another Way To Dump Your Kids

The Mothers for Mothers Association opened a "Mothers Moses Basket" to the public in Antwerp, Belgium, last week. It's the first of its kind in Belgium and similar to the ones that was opened in

red-headed woman on a scooter Hamburg, Germany, earlier in the vear. The "Mothers Moses Basket" is an electronic hatch that mothers can put their babies into and have a quarantee they will be looked after instead of abandoning them in a restroom or a garbage bin. Since opening its hatch in Antwerp last week, already two babies have been left.

The Frisky Truth

Chilean officials were shocked this week when statistics revealed that, for the first time in their country's history, a majority of births occurred outside of marriage. According to Chile's Civil Registry, only 44 percent of all new babies born in the first 8 months of this year were born to married couples as opposed to 69 percent in 1999. Chile is known to be one of the most conservative countries in the world due to the heavy influence of the Catholic church; divorce is not allowed, abortion is illegal, and the use of the morning after pill is expressly forbidden.

Another Senseless Shooting

Police in Sacramento, California, arrested a 13-year-old boy for shooting another 13-year-old boy to death. The two friends had apparently skipped school with a group of other people and ended up at a friend's apartment. The two 13-year-olds then started to argue over who would get the first puff of a cigarette when one of them left the room and returned with a handgun. Upon further argument, the boy pulled the trigger and killed his friend. He then returned to class at Brannan Middle School where sheriff's deputies subsequently picked him up.

Future Of Mir Still Up In The Air

MirCorp, the company that owns the leasing rights to space station Mir, are looking at the possibility of still having to bring her down. This is much to their chagrin as they would prefer to keep the station operating. It already has a deal to fly Dennis Tito, the first space tourist, to Mir. Plans are also in the works for "Destination Mir," a real-life series similar to "Survivor" in which a group of people will train for a mission to the station with one person finally being selected to go.

BAB Ain't No Bunny

Parents and students of Gahanna Lincoln High School in Gahanna, Ohio, are fuming over a decision

to ban a student-designed sweatshirt bearing the initials "BAB" on it. High school officials say the decision came after some 90 girls who purchased the bright green sweatshirts told them that the initials did have a double meaning to them. Originally, "BAB" was designed to stand for "Bold and Beautiful" whereas other students have come to interpret its meaning to be "Badassed Bitches."

College Students Face Death Sentence

As of last week, under Burmese law, caffeine has now been declared a narcotic. Officials have not yet declared whether coffee drinkers would be prosecuted under the law or what penalties they would face. It is also unknown if the penalties for being caught with a narcotic will be changed as the maximum penalty under Burmese law currently carries a sentence of death.

A Horrifying Discov-

Doctors in Ravenna, Ohio, say a baby cut from his dead mother's womb and stolen last week is doing well, despite the circumstances. Theresa Andrews, age 23, was nine months pregnant when she disappeared on September 27. Her body was found a week later in a garage with her abdomen sliced open and the baby removed. When police attempted to question the owners of the garage, a Thomas and Michelle Bica, Michelle Bica killed herself. Authorities speculate that Michelle pretended to be pregnant and passed the baby boy off as their own. Thomas Bica remains at large as the investigation continues. The baby, who was named Oscar, has been returned to Jon Andrews, Theresa's husband.

Playboy Has FBI Ties

According to FBI documents released on APBnews.com, FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover had a great interest in Playboy during the 1960's. A 213-page dossier reveals that FBI agents started to pay attention to the magazine in 1955 after an article was published about government agents checking out the solar system. Then, in 1963, after founder Hugh Heffner wrote a scathing article about J. Edgar Hoover, Hoover ordered bureau personnel to read each issue carefully and summarize it for him. When asked to comment on these recent revelations, Heffner replied, "I knew somebody was buying it for more than the pictures.'

A Slimy Situation

An apartment resident in Medina, Ohio, got quite the shock last week when she walked into her bathroom to find a five-foot boa constrictor half in and half out of her toilet bowl. The landlord of the apartment building ended up pulling the snake out of the toilet where police subsequently grabbed it and killed it. No one is sure where the snake came from, though police suspect it may have been a pet who got loose in the building. The landlord is refuting this speculation, however, saying he would evict any resident who kept reptiles in the building.

Yes, Master

An individual calling himself "The Master" is demanding \$37,000 in random money for the return of a stolen Enigma code-breaking machine that helped the Allies claim victory in World War II. The machine, considered irreplaceable, is worth \$150,000, and was stolen from the Bletchley Park Museum in Buckinghamshire, England. In a letter to the museum sent by "The Master," he claims he is acting on behalf of another person who originally bought the machine on good faith, only to discover it was stolen. He claims the buyer is not a thief and only wants to get back the full amount of he paid for it. Museum sources have said they will pay the money because destruction of the machine would be an act of historic vandalism.

"Loud Rocks" gets 1.5 bottles of O.E. outta 5 all day everyday! Peace. Sharmz iz out like da Blue

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
