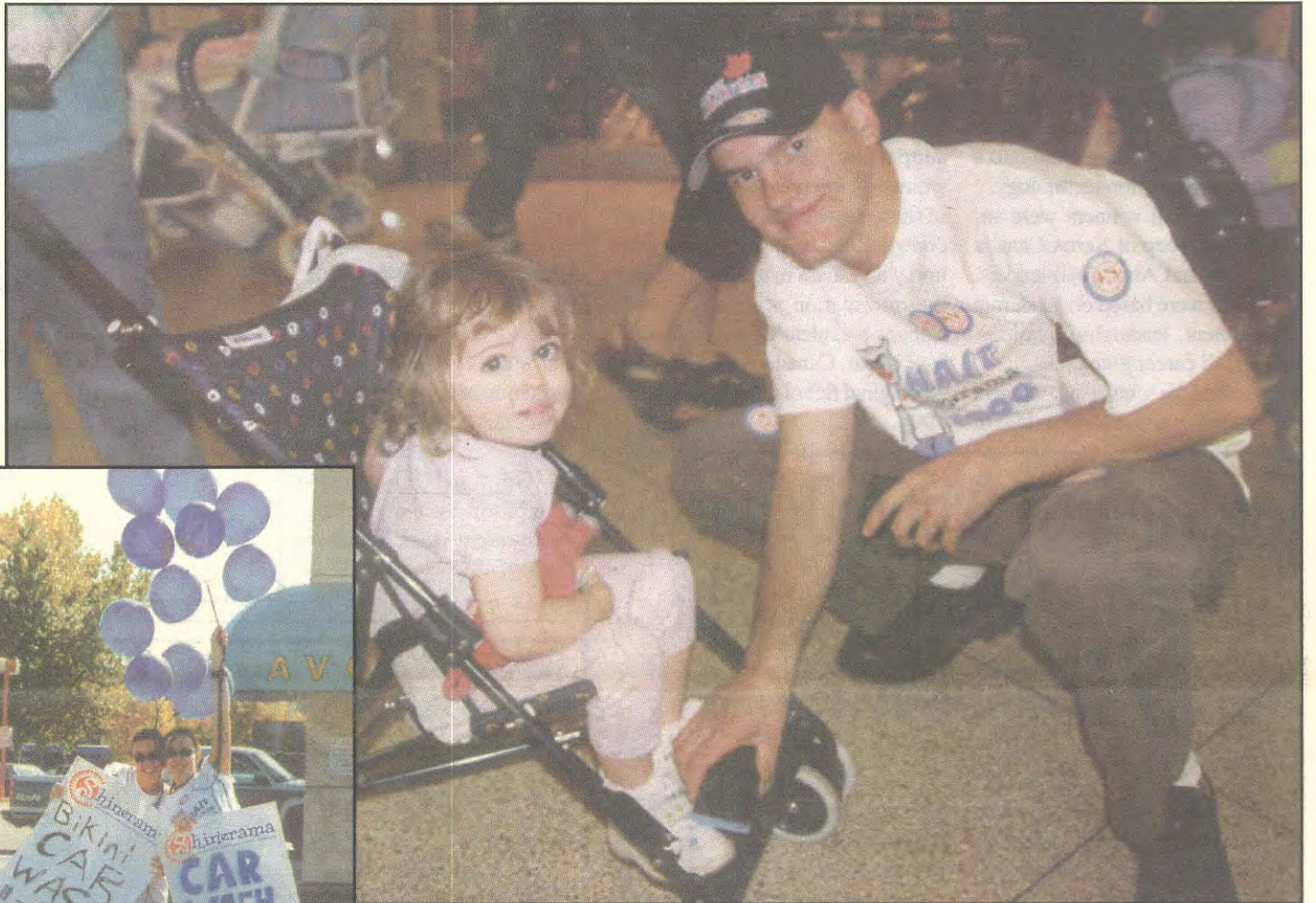
Shiny, Happy People

Xerox Canada Awards Scholarships

A group of students were honored last Tuesday as part of Xerox Canada's Canadian Aboriginal Scholarship Program. Eight winners were given \$3,000 awards, leading them into a career in information technology. The scholarship winners were selected by a group of Xerox Canada executives and Aboriginal leaders. Selections were based on academic achievement, leadership qualities, and overall career potential. Among the scholarship winners are three Albertans: Darin

Hopegood of Radway, Marc Lapointe of Bonnyville, and Cole Nychka of Beaverlodge. All three students are of Métis Heritage. "[Xerox Canada Ltd's] goal in supporting Aboriginal men and women is to create a talented pool of students who will become valued contributors to our nation's economy and share in the prosperity of the information age," said Xerox Canada president Cameron Hyde. Xerox Canada established the Aboriginal Scholarship Program in 1994.

The Largest Blood Donor Recruitment Campaign in History Continues...

Canadian Blood Services launched Phase 2 of their highly successful "If you knew... would you?" campaign at a press conference last Wednesday. Since launching the first phase of their \$3.5 million media campaign last year, there has been a 9 percent increase in the amount of Canadians who donate blood. "We are optimistic that this phase of the campaign will build upon the encouraging results we have experienced over the last year," CBS Centre Director Pat Eldershaw said in a press release. Canadian Blood Services operates 14 blood centres, 2 plasma collection centres, and more than 10,000 blood donor clinics annually.

The new phase of advertising features the stories of real-life blood recipients. The spots are now airing on television and will begin showing in Cineplex Odeon movie theatres this December.

Queen Of The Olympics

Despite protests, Olympic organizers in Sydney are going through with their plan to use drag queens in the Games' closing ceremonies. The cross-dressers will appear on a float commemorating Australian cinema - in this case, the 1995 movie "Priscilla, Queen of the Desert." Australian newspapers are supporting the plan, noting that cross-dressing is a part of the nation's culture. Of course, the triathlon has already ran its course in Sydney with no Jaws incidents and a Canadian winning the gold for the men's competition.

Pillitteri Estates Wines in Niagara Falls, Ontario, are whining this week after their establishment fell victim to a huge overnight wine draining. Workers arrived last Monday to find a tank of Baco Noire and a tank of Chardonnay completely emptied, totalling a 30,000 litre loss of the liquid.

While the loss only represented about 5 percent of the winery's total production, the scenario is similar to an incident that occurred at Stoney Ride Cellars in Vineland, Ontario, just last month. Vandals ended up emptying over 45,000 litres of award-winning wine, tallying a \$700,000 loss for the company.

The Boy Who Failed Home Economics

A 15-year-old boy in Jacksonville, Florida, was arrested last week after putting 25 grams of Talon-G (rat poison) in the cafeteria's food at Paxon Middle School. In the United States, poisoning someone's food or water is a first-degree felony that carries a maximum 25 year prison sentence. Authorities are reporting that 34 students had to be taken to the hospital for nausea, headaches, vomiting, and stomach aches. The boy, who cannot be named because of his age, has told investigators that he had no motive for his act other than he thought it would be "fun."

A Caesar Of Giant Proportions

Fresh Express, creator of retail-packaged salads, teamed up with Raley's supermarket chain in Sacramento, California, last weekend to create a salad of Olympic-sized proportions. Wanting to get in the "Guinness Book of World Records" and raise awareness for National 5-A-Day Week (commemorating that people should eat five servings of fruits and vegetables every day), the two chains set out to fill a wooden bowl measuring 16 feet in diameter and 4 feet deep with the largest caesar salad in the world. The salad contained 1,600 heads of romaine lettuce, 800 cloves of elephant garlic, 900 wedges of cheese, and 30 croutons the size of loaves of bread, and tipped the scales at nearly 3,000 pounds. In the end, the two companies achieved their goal and donated more than half of the salad to a local food bank.

Living Dead Man

Meet the first living dead man - literally. Peter Houghton of Britain is the first person in the world to be fitted with a thumb-sized electrical heart. The \$75,000 mini-machine propels blood through the body via rotor blades that spin 10,000 times a minute rather than the thump-thump of a normal heart. As well, because of the way this electrical heart works, it means that Houghton does not have a pulse. The 62-year-old man

told news crews on Friday that, only three months ago, he was planning his own funeral as he lay dying of chronic heart failure. Now, however, he is planning a second honeymoon with his wife.

Chocolate Is A-Ok!

University of Illinois researchers are proclaiming that chocolate really is good for the body and soul. After surveying 1,005 consumers, it was found that women prefer chocolate and cookies for comfort food while men like to consume soup, pizza, and pasta for their woes.

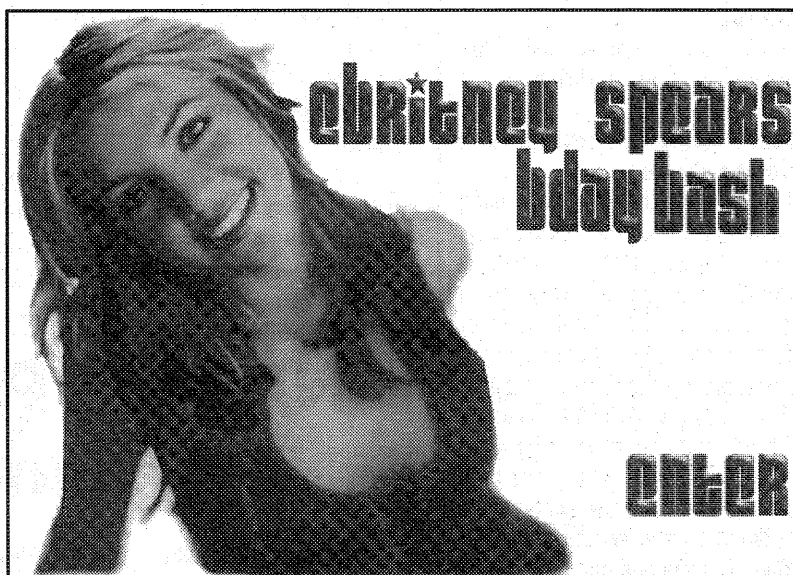

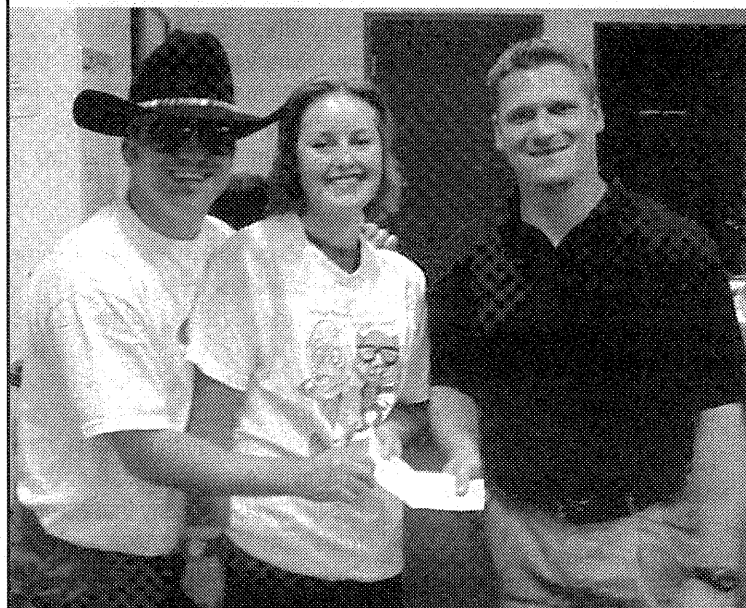
the world.

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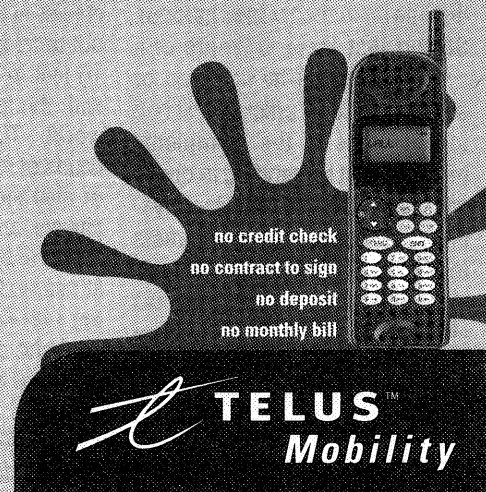

When the final exams had been written and the marks had been compiled, last years' Intercollegiate teams established a new record for numbers of athletes on the honor role (> 80% avg.). Thirty-nine Nait student-athletes achieved honors status and will be recognized by the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference with Academic Athletic Awards.

Since the inception of the ACAC Academic Awards, Nait athletes have established a "tradition of academic excellence". The thirty-nine students-athletes on the honor role improved from the previous record of thirty-seven established in 97-98.

The Nait Curling Team led all others placing nine members on the honor role followed closely by eight from the Women's Volleyball Team. The highest overall average of a Nait student-athlete went to Marlene Alexander, enrolled in the Personal Fitness Program. The team with the highest average was the Women's Volleyball with an overall average of 81.81%. Nait Intercollegiate athletes had a combined overall average of 71.41%.

Athletic Director, Gregg Meropolis acknowledged with pride the latest accomplishments of the program. "All the same qualities that make one a good athlete such as personal commitment, discipline, time management and a strong work ethic can make the student-athlete a success in the classroom as well as on the field of play".

FITNESS FAQ

Well, the polls are in, and I've got the go ahead to continue giving you weekly tips and insights on the wonderful world of fitness and nutrition. So, as long as my faithful readers keep sending me questions and there is a demand for this information, I will give of my precious time to help my fellow students in need (has anyone else heard the rumors of a "Travis, greatest sports writer in the world fan club?"). After hours of reading through Email, I finally decided on an appropriate question for our second Fitness FAQ.

Moi: My most common question, John, was, "What advice do you have for someone just starting to Weight train?"

John Reeves: In most programs, you go through an area called the preparatory period. This is when you are preparing the muscles to take on a new load of weights it usually lasts between four and six weeks. It involves choosing the weight room activities you want to use (ie: bicep curl, flat bench press). There's usually 6-10 different activities that cover the whole body.

Next, set up a circuit training program. This is where you go from one activity to the next, alternating upper body with lower body during the same workout. Go through your ten activities, and if you have time, go through them a 2nd and, if possible, 3rd time. The number of reps should be 12-15 that set up a circuit. For example, you do a shoulder and tricep workout, then you go to quadriceps (upper front

leg) then a chest activity, hit the hamstring group (upper back leg). You also add biceps, calves, and can add an exercise for your back (which also targets triceps). There's a new ab/ad workout machine in the NAIT gym that's a good workout for hips. Then finish with abdominals. Cardio can be at the start of your workout, or at the end, or even split it. When you get to the point that 12-15 reps is getting easy, just add more weight.

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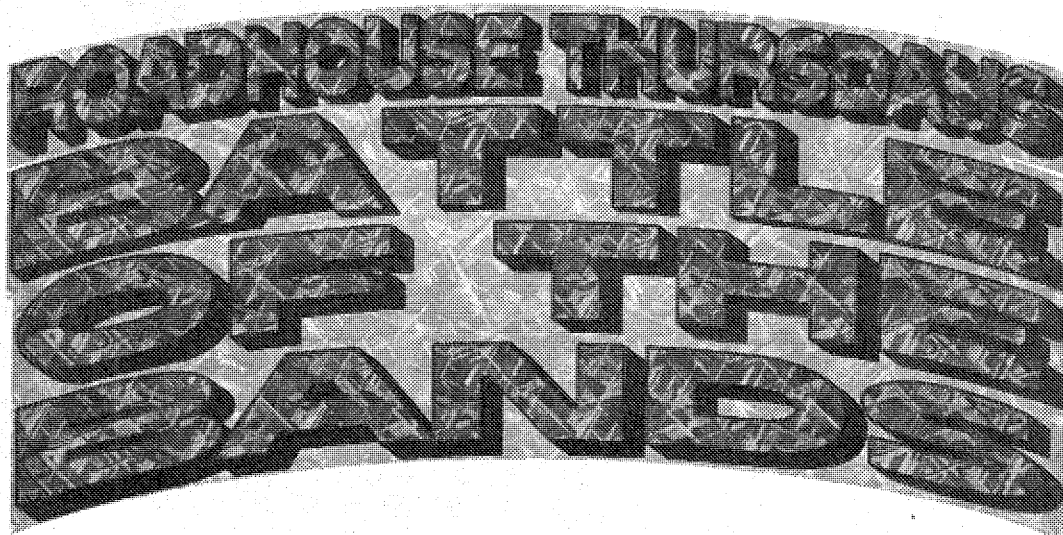
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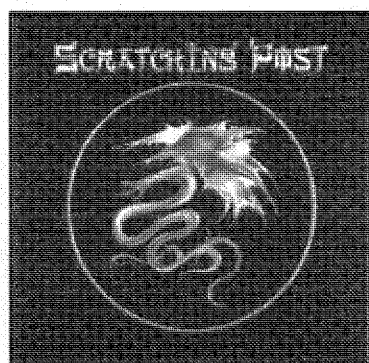

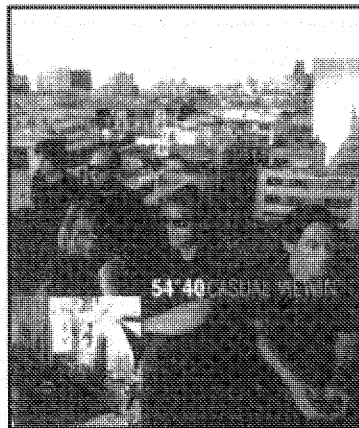
54 40

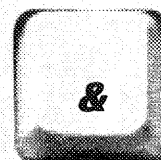

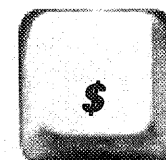

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NAIT Deals a Blow to CF

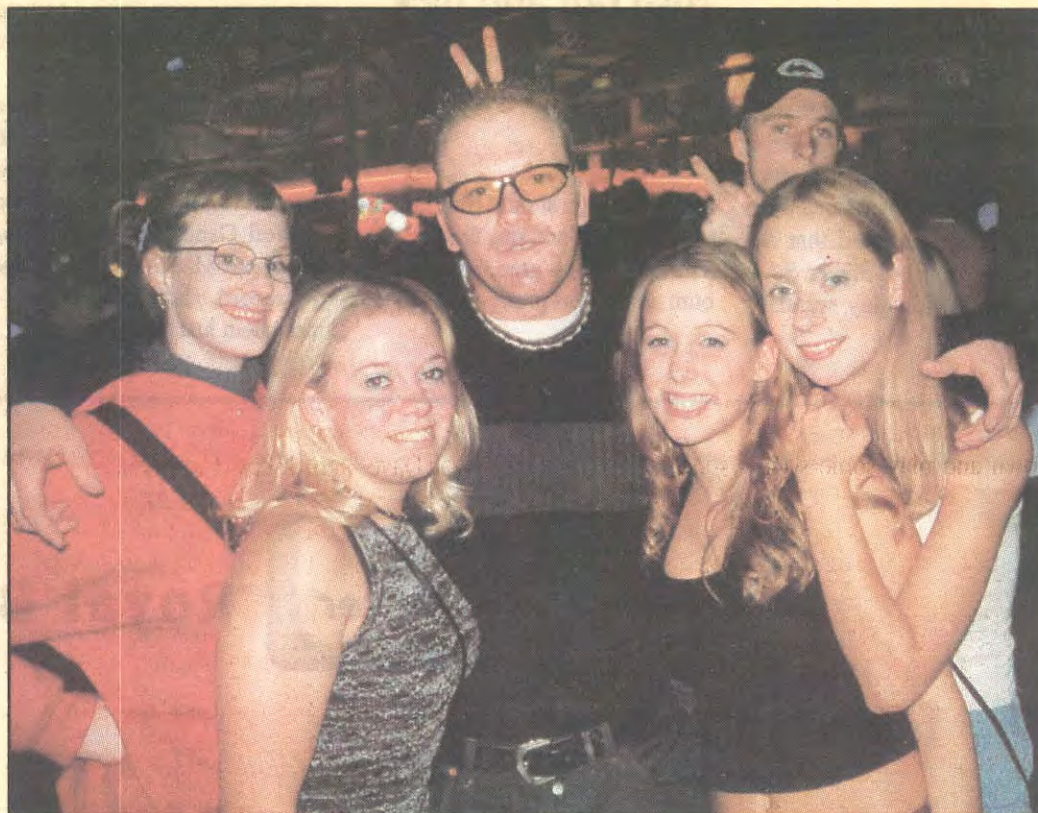

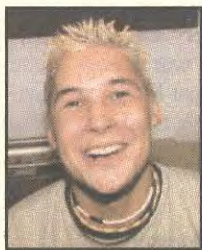
opportunity for students to get involved and learn more about this disease, and that they make a huge difference by contributing their time.

The Ooks Women's Soccer team was up next to challenge the Red Deer Queens. The game started right after the men finished and was

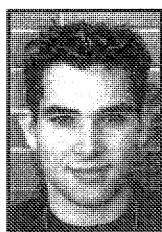

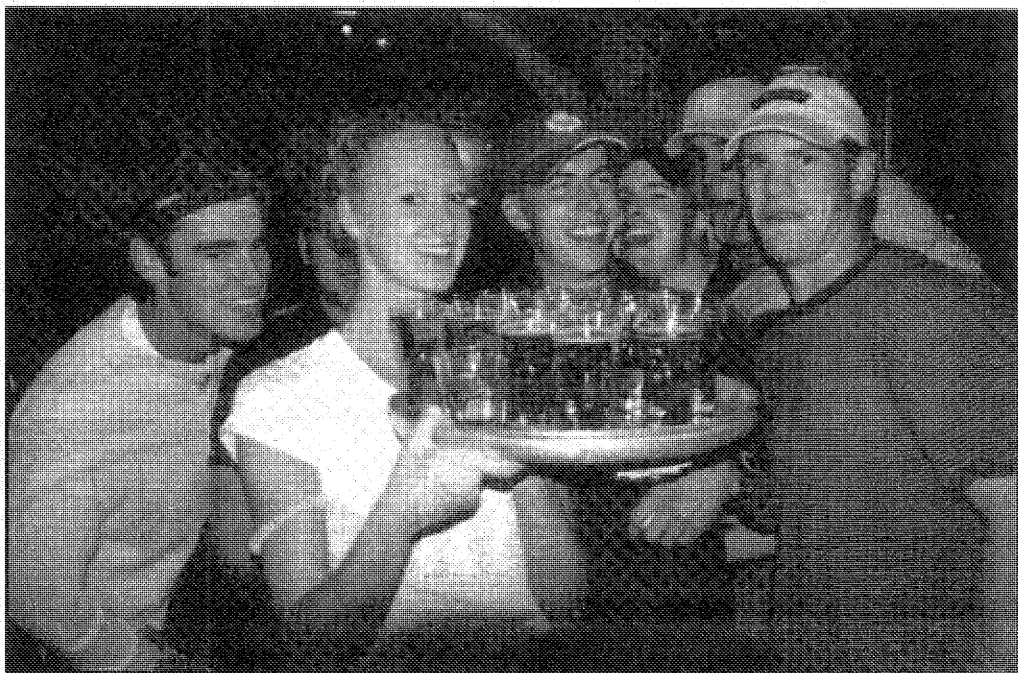

The Rap-A-Lot trio has released their third album entitled "Victory" produced by J Prince, also the producer of Scarface, the Outlawz, and Yukmouth. 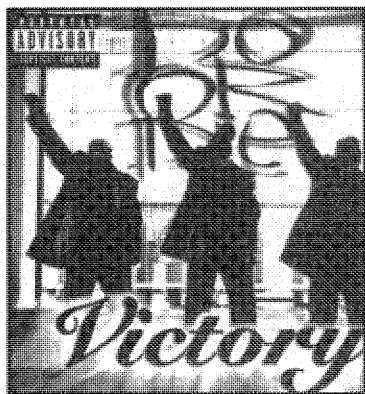

The main problem with this album is the production. The beats throughout the majority of the album were very whack! A handful of songs on the album contained some dope beats and good production. If Do Or Die actually sat down, wrote some original lyrics, changed their production team and that whack name, they might actually be effective in selling some records.

How much must it have cost for that new, state of the art human tracking device? Or the 24 hour surveillance team?) but Bait is still an awfully fun ride. Foxx shows a surprising amount of acting ability, and Doug Hutchison (The Green Mile, Con Air) is wet-your-pants creepy as rampaging-psycho-kind-of-looks-like-Chad-Lowe bad guy Bristol.

In short, things blow up, people drive fast, and our hero even gets some nookie. But be rest assured that Bait isn't going to change your life, make the world a better place, or offer anything in terms of spiritual/emotional growth. But then, isn't that what "The Last Boy Scout" was for?
