

"We want to help people see the limitless possibilities for the expression of their talents."


The webzine, which is slated to premiere in November, will



Seems Like A Silly Study To Me

In this month's issue of "Annals of Internal Medicine," Dutch researchers have wrapped up a 40-year study on the health benefits of moderate wine consumption. Researchers concluded that wine drinkers who consume one to three or more glasses a day have a lower risk of death from heart disease than nonwine drinkers do. It was also concluded, however, that wine drinkers have a lower risk of death from cancer than non-wine drinkers - but only if the wine drinkers consume less than three glasses a day.

According to a survey conducted of 7,800 people between Chicago, Atlanta, New York, San Francisco, and New Orleans, 60 percent of them were observed to not wash their hands after using a public bathroom. Man Wins A Year's Supply Of Viagra

A 52-year-old Hong Kong man was awarded a year's supply of Viagra as part of a court settlement this past week. After being struck by a motorcycle, the man claimed to have problems getting it up. He originally asked for a 10 year supply in his settlement, but the judge ruled there was no reasonable evidence to support that finding. The year's supply of Viagra (which costs \$550) was part of a \$320,000 compensation package awarded to the

Estrogen in Iran

Farah Khosravi, a 41-vear-old woman. has decided to run for president in Iran next year. Khosravi holds a master's degree in management and planning and is currently the secretary-general of the Iran-e Farda society, a right-wing political group. This will be Khosravi's third time running for a seat in Iran's parliament, having lost both in 1992 and 1996. The current Iranian president, Mohammad Khatami, was elected in 1997 in a landslide victory. He appointed a woman, Masoomeh Ebtekar as his vice-president. There has never been a female president in Iran, however. Khatami has also announced that he will be running for president again [against Khosravi].

The US government has named 15year-old Johnathon Lebed has the voungest person to ever be charged with stock fraud. Lebed is accused of using the internet to pump and dump stocks for a profit of \$272,826. Lebed has admitted to investing in the stock market since he was 12, learning about the trade by watching CNBC and CNN as well as by reading various websites. Lebed has not yet entered a plea, but he has turned over \$285,000 so far to the Securities and Exchange Commission. The SEC says Lebed would buy large volumes of stock that were sparsely traded and then pump them by posting false messages praising the stock. 






Fall Into Fitness

FITNESS FAQ

ell, I've gotten some rave reviews, and it seems that this section is very popular. I have decided that I will do a Fitness FAQ every week. Those that feel that I should devote more time to the other sports can discuss it with the fans of this article. For the people that like this column, I encourage you to keep submitting your questions to my E-mail at Dukes365@collegeclub.com.

Let's see what my first question of the week is for John Reeves, our Fitness consultant and head of the PFT (Personal Fitness Trainer) program.

Moi: For the students that have those hour-long spares and want to workout on cardio, what would you recommend for the best training with that limited time allotted? John: The best workout for cardio, when given such a limited amount of time for a workout, would be running. The fastest way to burn calories and get an excellent cardio burn would be running. As this is a fast way to attain your cardio goals and is easy to prepare for. I would highly recommend starting with running. If running is not the best option for you, then any of the other cardio machines in the NAIT gym will be a close second to substitute for running. Any of the treadmill, stairmaster, or rowing machines will work fine.

Moi: John, what would you suggest for students who want to hit the gym in the morning and are looking for an energy boost or a decent workout?

John: If it were me, I would go to the NAIT Fitness Center and get on one of those cardio equipment machines for 10-15 minutes. The next step would be to do a circuit, which is like what we talked about last week (a single set on each of the major body part: legs, arms, chest, back). Finish with five minutes of cardio and a little bit of stretching. Try to get all the body parts in a single workout. You should be able to

get one circuit in the time allotted. The effective diet required for a morning workout is your basic breakfast, and the important thing about breakfast is carbohydrates. They are considered your brain food, the brain can only use glucose that are attained from carbohydrates, so it's important that we get this nourishment into the system for our morning workouts and for class. That's the most important part of having a well-balanced breakfast. The brain doesn't function well if you don't feed it. You want to focus on carbs such as cereal, toast your traditional breakfast. Avoid bacon and egg breakfasts as they are high in fat and will slow you down and waste time you don't have. Fruits and fruit juice are always a good idea.

Moi: That was very informative, John, and thank you.

So, people, hopefully John and I have helped you a little in your quest for success, and I'll see you next week with some more answers to your questions.

The Medicine River Wildlife Rehabilitation Center is a sanctuary for all species of injured animals. Currently, it is home to several great horned owls, bats, chipmunks, some eagles, and a partridge in a pear tree!

They care for creatures from bear

at the chance. Why not, right? Uh,

right. So this is what we learned:

cubs to beavers, coyotes to cats, and everything in-between. It's a sad fact that 90 percent of these animals wouldn't need urgent medical treatment if it weren't for us stupid humans invading their natural habitat. When asked what the most common cause of injury was, the response

was unanimous..."Red-Tailed Hawk plowed by car."

"People need to understand wildlife. What we don't understand, we criticize, persecute, and fear. People don't think that they are a part of nature, too." Carol Kelly, the Executive Director of the Center, offered us some words of wisdom. She spoke about some of the many creatures that are commonly regarded as pests, such as coyotes, crows, and ground squirrels. "Nature is a balance. Just because there is a lot of something today, doesn't mean it should be disrespected."

The "patients" brought to the Rehab Center are first taken to the

> the appropriate attention. This could be anything from mild sedatives to setting and bandaging broken limbs. We had the opportunity to witness this process first hand while the center staff attended to our little buddy, the Red-Tailed Hawk. After the initial treatment, the animals are settled into small cages to rest and recover. When they have regained enough strength, they graduate to much larger contained areas in which they can exercise and rebuild atrophied muscle tissue. Finally, after rehabilitation is complete, the animals are released back into their homes in the wild.

> We also learned that the Rehab Center stays open only through donations and kind-hearted volunteers. We asked about government funding, and the response we got was that government involvement would be



more of a pain in the ass than a benefit. Big surprise. The result would be more restrictions, more regulations, more red tape, and therefore, less help for the animals. Some funding comes from major corporations, often with a history of wreaking havoc on the environment (a little guilt involved, perhaps?). The Center relies on these hefty donations as well as smaller, more personal donations from concerned and compassionate individuals. Despite the generosity of donors and volunteers, the Center constantly struggles to keep its head above water with the threat of closure looming overhead every year. All proceeds from the gift shop go towards medical supplies for the animals and efforts to educate the ignorant masses on wildlife issues. The Center also offers care and support to troubled youth, encouraging respect of animals and our environment.

Visiting the Medicine River Wildlife Rehabilitation Center and speaking with the warm, dedicated people who make the Center tick was quite a wake up call. Observing first hand the damage caused by our own ignorance and in-

sensitivity made us realize how much we can and should be doing

to help protect our environment and all its inhabitants.





T.J: What?


K.J: Classic rock and roll. I don't like ROCK. It's gotta have roll or it just don't - you got it - roll.

he world's first wireless virus has made its debut according to McAfee.


The virus affects wireless hand held computers, or personal digital assistants, that connect to the Internet or computer net-

The virus, which attacks the increasingly popular PDA's that run with the Palm OS operating system, simply changes the PDA's screen to a dark gray box. It can be remedied by turning off the device and then erasing any files called Phange.prc.

Another wireless virus called

"Liberty" was reported in Sweden in early September, but was of no real concern because it did not spread by attaching itself to other software the way the Palm OS/ Phange virus does.



Parachutes (Advance Music)



The most memorable part of a Plantiers experience is that every item on the menu dawns a high level of culinary flair, making any choice a feast for the eyes. "The French like their food to be well represented the better it looks, the better it will taste," comments Plantier.


