Nothing Solved in Battle for Third Place



Not only was the Nugget newspaper recognized by many of the post secondary newspapers as being



If you thought that cell phones were rampant in Canada and the United States, think again. New statistics show that 96 percent of British adults own one or more cell phones.


How Not To Smuggle The Goods

General Council Meeting January 23, 2001

The first official reading of the new revised constitution was done. If it is approved after it's second official reading, which is at the next general council meeting, it will become official. We wait with baited breath.

The Nest furniture is falling apart, so we need new stuff. The "people" shopped around and are going with the new version of the present NAIT chairs. Things like durability, wear to the carpets, and price were looked at. (105 new chairs at \$185.95 = \$20,891.48 + GST.)

Unfortunately, only \$8,000 was budgeted for new chairs (because no one did their research previously on how much a chair actually costs), so there was a vote to increase the budget. They should've let me buy the chairs. I furnished my entire home for \$38.49.

A new committee was formed to review student fees. Currently, our NAITSA fees (\$97) are some of the cheapest anywhere. That's half

of what SAIT charges, and the U of A charges \$400+. The committee is not necessarily changing the fee, they are just going to discuss the possibility of changing it.

NAITSA receives \$20,000 from NAIT for not selling books, (U of A does it as well). They've proposed to us to put the \$20,000 into a bursary fund for students. The bursaries would be distributed according to student need. There would be no even distribution between programs and it would not be decided by grades - JUST BY NEED. Eventually, the money for this fund would hopefully come from campus revenue - advertisements, video games, etc. To start off the fund, we took \$20,000 from General Operations. Because of that, our budget will no longer have a surplus.

FITNESS FAQ

The interviewee for this column is John Reeves. He is the current head of the Personal Fitness Program here at NAIT.

Moi: John, what are your thoughts on the whole vegetarian versus meat eating debate in regards to fitness?

John: People become vegetarians for various reasons. Some of them are the concern for fat in the diet with meats, environmental concerns, the impact of agriculture on the envi-

ronment, animal welfare/animal rights, or religious/cultural restrictions. The thing that we have to remember is that vegetarian diets, like mixed diets, can be healthy or unhealthy. It depends on the foods you choose and how often you choose them.

About 3 percent of Canadians are true vegetarians with about 30 percent of the population choosing meatless meals on a regular basis. The health benefits of vegetarianism, if the diets are well planned, are that they enjoy lower levels of heart disease, cancer, stroke, and diabetes. Vegetarians tend to include more of a mixture of veggies, fruits, and whole grains than typical meat eaters do. Vegetarians also tend to be more physically active, non-smokers, at a healthy weight, and limit the use of alcohol and drugs.

All of the above looks pretty positive, but vegetarians have more rules to follow than the typical meat eater. The problem with vegetarian eating is that plant-based protein sources do not have all the essential amino acids that meat contains. Therefore, vegetarians need to combine various sources of plant proteins on a daily basis in order to get the entire essential amino acids required by the body. Meat eaters get all the essential amino acids from each piece of meat they eat. Amino acids are what protein is all about. The essential 9 amino acids must be taken in from a food source,

and meats contain all 9 of those amino acids while plant sources do not. Protein is the building block for maintaining and repair of tissues of which our main concern is muscle tissue. Other important functions of protein include the immune function, blood, enzyme, and hormonal functions and an effect on vision.

If you wish to become a vegetarian, you first must choose a wide variety of foods and ensure adequate energy intake. Every food that is eliminated should be replaced by another vegetarian choice. It is best to move gradually towards a plant-based diet. Vegetarianism is a lot of work and planning if you wish to balance your diet. Meat eaters should look at their diets every once in a while to see if they have an established balance as well.





Facts for Fun and For Pleasure



Local vs. National Banks: Keep your student loan account in one of the big national banks, but don't put any of your money in it. Telephones = NO: Do not register a phone in your own name. Don't sign any leases. Stay off the record as much as possible. The





Red Deer Mayhem!








CD review

"Salival" Live CD/DVD Box Set



I hate live albums, I truly do. When I heard Tool was coming out with one, I wasn't at all interested, even though they have been one of my favorite bands for almost ten years. However, I had the opportunity to hear a couple of tracks at a friend's house shortly after its release and there was only one thing to be said: Holy fuck! There is very little audience noise on the disc and the recording is the best I have ever heard come off of a live performance.

Being that Tool is a highly original and creative band, they decided to stray away from traditional live CDs that focus only on previously released material. The disc contains eight tracks, but it is over 75 minutes long. Of the eight tracks, five are previously unreleased. Highlights of the album include a beautifully redone version of "Push It" and a cover of a Led Zeppelin's "No Quarter."

If that wasn't enough to entice you, the set also includes a DVD of all their videos, many of which have been banned from music stations. Both discs are set in a full colour book that comes laid in a slipcase drawer box.

If you are a die-hard Tool fan or a fan of heavy melodic music, definitely try to track this set down. But therein will lie the real trick as its release was very, very limited.






Well, rejoice ye fans of Sublime, for the original sound has risen again with the release of "Right



As fate would have it, once again this week I would wander outside of my comfort zone and feature another unlikely candidate for Comeau's Cuisine. As many people know, both from my "Where Magazine" restaurant features and my Nugget section, I rarely feature chain restaurants. For one reason mainly - in most cases, service and food quality is often under par.

This past Monday, however, a friend of mine, Jamie, took me out for lunch to Dezio in the Westmount Shopping Center. To say the least, I felt that we were treated to a dining experience that is not often had at any chain restaurant. Both the food and service was of top notch, and I say this as our server had no idea



(as did I) that I was going to be writing a feature on this particular dining experience.

Their menu offers a surprisingly wide selection of several different pastas, pizzas, salads, sandwiches, and entrees, not to mention a well thought out Feature Menu, which also offers eight other signature dishes including Oven Roasted Moroccan Pork Chops (\$11.95) and a Thai Chicken Salad (\$8.45).

As for our lunch, I decided to put their pastas to the test, choosing a Baked Chicken Tortellini in a tomato cream sauce (\$8.27 half order),

while Jamie remained undecided on whether to get a Pasta Jambalaya (\$8.47 half order) or a Cajun Chicken Poorboy (\$7.97) sandwich. Finally, Jamie went with the Cajun Chicken Sandwich.

Our meals were served to us in no time at all, which again came to me as a surprise considering we were dining during the busiest time of the day. Both my chicken tortellini and Jamie's Cajun chicken sandwich offered sizable portions of food and were filling as they were tasty.


The most notable part of our lunch at Dezio was the fact that the

manager came to our table just to see if we were enjoying our meals - something that rarely happens, even in private specialty restaurants. "We just want to see that our guests enjoy their stay when they come here," commented manager Kari Bennett.

Well, we did enjoy our stay, so much so, that I decided to put off another restaurant just to write this feature. I have to admit that, at times,

as in the case with Dezio, chain restaurants do offer an excellent meal and a high level of service.

A meal for two should run you around \$30 before tip - not too bad considering the service and food quality. On weekends and evenings, make sure to phone and make a reservation just to ensure that you have a table set aside. After all, it would be a pity if you had to miss out on dining at a place like this.




Toy Line of The Week: TRON


