The scientific team also believes that it will be

able to reprogram male cells into producing eggs so that men can be both a father and mother of children.

The producer of the pornographic Christmas album entitled "Rated X-mas," has agreed to settle several copyright infringement cases. The producer's parodies apparently went too far, and the copyright holders of such songs as "Rudolph The Red-Nosed Reindeer," "Winter Wonderland," and "Frosty The Snowman," all sued. Most of the X-rated songs were distributed via the Internet.

Carey McWilliams, a Fargo, North Dakota man whose eyesight is limited to only being able to tell the difference between day and night, has been granted a permit to carry a concealed weapon. Sheriff's deputy Pat Healy says he does not have a problem with a vision-impaired person carrying a concealed gun. He states that McWilliams passed the same tests required of anyone else applying for the permit, including a shooting test where he had to hit a black target from seven yards away.

so that you can answer coolly and confidently. Keep notes if you must. Don't let the Man get you down.



The party took place at the hotel's hall, and partiers included students from NAIT, the University of Alberta, the University of Calgary, and friends. The soiree ended at


berta more worried about making the first night a gong show than braving the mountain at Big White the following morning.

and watching movies. We were sore and tired, but content. That night was pretty tame for most, but there was entertainment in the hotel pub, and the hard-core party animals were up late again.





Stankonia (Leface Records/Arista)


ell, well, well. I am back to do some mo' reviews for yo' ass!

This CD was probably the most exciting CD I have reviewed in a long time. The Atlanta natives, Outkast, have probably been one of the most original and lasting duos in the hip-hop world so far.

Now, in the year 2G, Outkast has released their fourth album, "Stankonia," which is a far more complex effort than the critically acclaimed "Aquemini." The 24-track interlude album keeps the listener interested throughout the whole thing, FOR REAL!

"Stankonia" has got more featured artists then Outkast has ever used before. Artists such as Gangsta Boo, B-Real from Cypress Hill. Erykah Badu, Goodie Mobb, Killer Mike, and J-Sweet. However the featured artists don't make the album good at all. Outkast's madd skillz, great production, and originality makes "Stankonia" what it is!

Most songs have a deep meaning hidden within the track on "Stankonia." Every issue from the STEREOTYPE THAT HIP-HOP IS



ONLY DOPE SMOKING AND A \$50,000 MERCEDES to the disintegration of male-female relationships.

"Stankonia" starts off with an Intro explaining the meaning of Stankonia, which is FUNK! After the intro, the album abruptly breaks into "Gasoline Dreams," featuring Khujo Goodie from Goodie Mob, in which Dre and Big Boi rap about a developing political consciousness over a very hardcore beat.

"Ms. Jackson" is Stankonia's second single. The track uses melancholic beats with story telling type lyrics which to tell the story of the disintegration of male-female relationships.

Next is "Xplosion," in which Outkast master the mic over a deep, head bobbin' beat. In this track, B-Real criticizes XXL magazine for the article they did on Eminem. "F—k XXL/you're a size too small/I should hire Eminem, so we can kill you all," he says.

If you wanna hear a track with an Atlanta upbeat sound, tune into

"Spaghetti Junction." The song is straight up dizzope!

"I'll Call Before I Come," featuring Gangsta Boo, uses very unique beats and a very jazzy type of sound to it. However, Outkasts mc'n skillz mixed with Gangsta Boo's bitchy voice really help the song stay in your head all day.

The best track on da whole album has to be "Bombs Over Baghdad," which is also the first single released on the album. If you hear this song, you can straight up say ORIGINAL. I have never heard the type of beats in this song before in my life. The fast, hard hittin' beats compensated wit da fast mc'n skillz of Outkast help make this song da shiznit!

Other very insanely good tracks are "We Luv Deez Hoes" featuring BackBone and Big Gipp from Goodie Mob, "Gangsta shit," and "Humble Mumble" featuring Erykah Badu, which sees Outkast proving critics wrong on Hip-Hop stereotypes. Outkast's "Stankonia" has a combination of Funk beats with dope mc'n skillz. Their niche for funk music is shown throughout. Unique beats, meaningful lyrics, and heavy production take this album to another level.

So, all in all, I think this album is breaking da boundaries of what Hip-Hop artists can create in the new millenium. The jam packed, hit tracked, album "Stankonia" gets 4 OE's outta 5 on a funk tip.



Stoned Immaculate: The Music of the Doors

They've had an amazing influence in the past thirty years on music, proving this numerous times such as in Oliver Stone's hit movie "The Doors", and more recently with a number of releases of original material which are amounting platinum sales and establishing a new generation of fans.

Things got even more exciting with this project from Ralph Sell of Bulletproof Recording Company, Inc. Ralph took one of the greatest rock bands of all time and re-recorded their hits with some of the most prolific bands of our time. He made a point of finding current art-

Woman and The End" re-recorded by Days Of The New.

My overall critique on this CD is two thumbs up and five out of five stars. Most Doors fans will enjoy hearing these current musicians help bring the Doors music into the new millennium. Rock fans who are unfamiliar with the Doors music should also enjoy the new mixes and modern sounds apparent on this disc.


Breach (Universal)

Insane Clown Posse — Part One




