Cocky, self-assured, we're sure he will be a great addition to NAITSA for voicing our concerns (among other things).



A 15-year-old former middle school student pleaded guilty last week to

The niece, 33 years of age, has also been charged with first-degree murder.

A Miami girl suffering from Roberts Syndrome (to be born without shoulders and arms) who was told she would never be able to use prosthetic arms due to the lack of shoulders and shoulder muscles to support them, was permanently given her first set of artificial arms last week. These arms, instead maneuvered by a person's back and chest muscles, were given to the 11year-old four months ago to practice with. She reports she has had to use muscles she has never used before, but that it is not hard to do at all. The money for the arms, which cost \$90,000, was raised by both the club who invented the arms and by a local television station. The 11year-old reports she is looking forward to finally learning how to ride a bike, play with her cousins, and get around the house on her own. The first thing she did when she permanently received her new arms? Give her mom a hug.

Coveting The Muppets

German media company EMTV, who bought the Jim Henson Company in February 2000 for \$680 million, is how considering selling the company. EMTV went on a buying spree last year that left it saddled with a high level of debt. There is no word on how much the price

> 2. Should NAITSA continue to require students to enroll in a mandatory health plan?

> You will have your chance to either keep or turf the health and/or dental plan by marking either a "Yes" or a "No" beside each question. When you go to the polls to do this, however, please remember to bring your student ID cards to prove you're currently enrolled at NAIT. No substitutions will be accepted.

The results of this referendum will be announced at the General Council meeting on Tuesday, April 3, as well as in that week's issue of The Nugget. What it will basically boil down to is either the health and/ or dental plan will be turfed from NAIT, or else if the majority of the vote is to keep the health and/or dental plan, NAITSA will work on improving communications with students regarding this plan.

Crime Stoppers Tip of the Week

Apartment and Condominium Safety

s students, many of us are living in an apartment or condominium far away from home. For some, this is a first time adventure that may be full of unwelcome surprises. When it comes to safety in your home, you must rely on good judgment. Here are some *Do's* and *Don'ts* supplied by the Edmonton Police Service to help make your new adventure a little safer:

DO:

- **Do** make sure all doors are locked after entering or exiting your building.
- **Do** ensure that the parkade car entrance door closes fully when entering or exiting, this will keep others out.
- **Do** notify the resident manager immediately when you notice suspicious people or vehicles in the parkade.
- Do ensure all valuables have been taken out of your vehicle and that the vehicle is locked when parked.
- Do confirm whom you are allowing into the building, especially through the intercom.
- **Do** pay notice to people inside your building if they look out of place or suspicious. Say "Hello!" and ask if they live in the building. Thieves hate attention.
- Do report suspicious people in or around the building property to the resident manager or call police if warranted.
- Do record all serial and model numbers and engrave all your prop-
- Do make sure parkades, hall-ways, and entrances are well lit. Notify the building manager if lights are burnt out.
- Do get to know your neighbors. Learn whom you can trust and let them know when you are going to be away. Keeping informed and watching your neighbor's apartment is a great safety feature.
- **Do** be aware of your surroundings, especially in the laundry rooms, parkades, and elevators.
- **Do** change the locks immediately when moving into a new residence. The residence manager should be able to assist you.
- **Do** use your through-the-door viewer (or peep hole). If there is not one on your door, have one installed. A viewer with a 180 degree angle is the best


- Do have your key ready as you approach the door. <u>Do not hide</u> spare keys.
- Do have emergency phone numbers listed on or near your phone.
- Do have an escape plan that allows you to leave your residence quickly.


DO NOT:

- Do not allow access to anyone you do not know or do not recognize. If you feel uncomfortable or impolite closing the door on a stranger when you enter the building, please consider it is for your own safety and the safety of your property.
- If a stranger comes to the door asking to use your phone, offer to make the call for them. **Do not let** them in.
- Do not give personal information to telephone solicitors or to wrong number callers. Ask, "What number did you dial?" and just tell them, "You reached the wrong number."
- Do not get on an elevator if there is someone on it you do not feel good about. Wait for the next one. Always stand near the elevator's control panel. This will allow you to get off on the next floor or sound the emergency alarm should you encounter a problem.
- Do not allow trees to block the view of your windows. Let people see what is going on outside your windows or patio doorways. Always close your curtains or blinds after dark.
- **Do not** put your name beside the apartment number at the entrance. Use "occupied" or nothing.
- Do not leave the opening to your mailbox uncovered, so no one can see if there is an accumulation of mail. Consider asking a friend or neighbor to take in your mail when you are away. In an apartment situation, you may ask the rental office to collect the mail until you return.
- Do not leave your lights on all night when you are away. This draws attention to your apartment especially if all other apartments in the area are dark. Use a light timer set in different rooms with different start/stop times to give your apartment an appearance of being occupied
- **Do not** assume your apartment is safe from unlawful entry, even on the higher levels. Always lock your balcony doors and/or place a

wooden stick cut to fit the slide area at the bottom of the door thus preventing it from being opened from the outside.

These few Do's and Don'ts could spell the difference between an enjoyable and a painful experience.

First of all, whereas I am aware that a great many deaths and injuries are caused by car accidents, you have made a very serious accusation regarding my (as well as 165,000 other drivers') intentions. To be proven guilty in this country of murder or even attempted murder, we need to see proof beyond a reasonable doubt of both the acts which perpetuated the crime as well as intent.

You see, mental state is a very important element to any crime, and I doubt very much that drivers who may be exceeding the speed limit by 15 or 20 kilometres per hour are out trying to kill people. To accuse them of such is a criminal offense called slander.





First Date:

PREPARING FOR AN INTERVIEW

emember the last time you had a first date with someone you were really, really attracted to? Remember that stomach churning, nerve wracking, what should I say/wear/do feeling that became the focus of your existence for the 24 hours leading up to that date? Remember how some of those first dates turned out?

Well, people, that's exactly how you're going to feel when you go for your first job interview.

How long did it take you or your date to decide if this new love interest was going to be a loser or a winner? It will take the employer the same amount of time or less to make a similar decision about you! So, are you going to crash and burn, or is it going to be the beginning of a beautiful relationship? A positive, knock-them-dead first impression takes a lot of research, planning, and strategic maneuvering.

RESEARCH:

Read the ad carefully again and go over the research you did for your cover letter (information you collected from their website, written materials, etc.). Go over your list of the employer's needs and review/write down how your skills, personal qualities, training, education, and experience meet these needs.

In Job Outlook 2000, employers said the top ten personal qualities they looked for were: communication skills, motivation/initiative, teamwork skills, leadership skills, academic achievement, interpersonal skills, flexibility/adaptability, technical skills, honesty/integrity, work ethic, and analytical/problem solving skills.

What industry buzzwords do you need to know? Create a list of questions you might be asked and how you would answer them. Know what your salary expectations are in case you are offered the job during the first interview. Refer to our website at http://www.nait.ab.ca/careers under student employment, job search tips and look for interview/salary negotiation suggestions.

Be prepared to answer situational or behavioral questions such as "Tell me about a time when you..." Also, be prepared for the ever-popular: tell me about yourself, what is your weakness (always, always state something that you've already improved upon or focus on

what you think the employer is concerned about and stress how your strengths negate this concern), and why do you want to work for us.

Don't bring up your history of doomed experiences; focus on your strengths and on convincing the employer that you are the right person for the job. Interviewers always ask if you have any questions so prepare a few questions beforehand. Check our website for ideas. A lack of questions will show a lack of both research and interest in the company, so write them down and have them ready to refer to in the interview. You can even use a question to enable you to bring up a strength that you didn't get a chance to talk about during the main part of the interview!

PLANNING:

In many ways, getting ready for your interview is just like getting ready for a date. How are you going to make them fall in love with you at first sight? You're probably going to be worried about what you should wear, how you should act, what you should say, what time you should get there, and what you should do while you wait for them call you in. Is your stomach churning yet?

The way to effectively manage

most interview-related stress and make a great first impression is all in the planning you do before the interview starts.

How long did it take you or your date to decide if this new love interest was going to be a loser or a winner? It will take the employer the same amount of time or less to make a similar decision about you!

It's always a good idea to have your full interview battle dress ready to go in your closet at all times. This includes having a shiny pair of shoes to wear with your outfit; you'd be surprised how many employers look at your shoes when they first meet you. The state of your shoes and

what you're wearing tells them a lot about you. So, make sure your outfit says good things about you!

A friend of mine shared that once she wore a blue blazer to an interview that she hadn't worn in a long time. When she tried to shake hands, she couldn't, because the blazer's shoulders were too tight! Get a haircut if you need one, go light on the perfume/cologne (a lot of people have allergic reactions to scents), make sure your hands/nails are in good shape, and make sure your pearly whites are ready to be flashed.

Plan to take several copies of your resume, a copy of your reference list, a day-timer/notebook (with your questions written down and the place marked with a pen), and any certification/documentation you think you might need in a professional looking attaché case or file folder. Being able to give an extra interviewer a copy of your resume will demonstrate your ability to be proactive and resourceful.

Plan how you will act/respond in different interview locations/situations. Ever embarrassed yourself on a date by spilling your food/drink on yourself or heaven forbid, on your date? Think now about how you will handle a restaurant or coffee interview: what will you order, should you bring money, who sits down or stands up first. What if the interview is in a hotel or at the airport? What if it is a teleconference or on the Internet?

Be sure you know the address and how you are going to get there. Always take the address, phone number, and the interviewer's name along with you just in case something happens (ie: running into some of Edmonton's famous construction zones) and you need to contact them. Study your resume and practice answering the questions you might be asked. Make sure you get a good night's sleep and that you eat something before you leave. Fainting or yawning your head off while you're shaking hands won't make a good impression!

Plan to arrive ten minutes early. If your hands get really sweaty or clammy, either put some tissues in your pockets to wipe them off or go to the washroom to freshen up and warm your hands under the hot water tap. Try not to bring too much stuff with you, it's too easy to leave something behind after the interview and then you'll feel pretty silly when you have to go back for it.


It is sickening to see some of the stuff on the Internet. Hate groups have made it their weapon of the future and, if they have their way, it will be a very grim future indeed.





What do you feel is the easiest or fastest route for beginners at the gym to get educated on creating a workout program?

Being an educator of Personal Fitness Trainers, I would say to get yourself a personal fitness trainer to help you. You can actually do this for free by applying at the Student Services office (Room E-134). A first year PFT (Personal Fitness Trainer) will look at your goals and help you develop a plan for now and for the future. We are still short of clients; therefore, it is not too late.

If you don't have time or are off campus or don't want to access this opportunity, there are some other things that you can try. First you have to establish what your goals are. Are they to lose weight, increase muscle mass, or a combination of both. How much time do you have, and are your goals realistic with the time you have available? You have to have the time if you want to develop a plan.

A fitness plan is a lifestyle change plan, not just a fitness plan for a short period of time. There are lots of plans available in books in the library, Reads and Needs (Personal Fitness Trainer Section), or in magazines, so availability of information is usually not the problem. The problem is starting.

Make some small changes in your lifestyle as far as fitness is concerned. Go for a walk every night or morning for 30 minutes. Go to the fitness centre and do a small resistance training workout. Start with the machines. Do a push exercise a pull exercise for the upper body and the legs and some abdominal work. Do 15 to 20 reps on the weights and enough situps so that you feel the difference the next day.

Develop a plan that is sustainable for you. If it is not sustainable, work on something that is. You have to make time for fitness, there will always be things that will fill in your time or that will take the place of a fitness session but, for once, be selfish and take some time for yourself and keep that time for yourself for 3-6 days per week.

Other areas we don't consider as fitness opportunities are taking more stairs, walking to school or getting off the bus sooner, riding your bike more, using the swimming pool, walking in the area and adding some stairs, doing some push ups and situps when you get bored with your homework, gardening, snow shovelling, and cutting the grass. These are all activities that increase your fitness level because they make you more active.

There is no easy or fast way to get fit - the important aspect is just doing it. The information is available from a lot of different sources. The professional resources cost money and, sometimes, an outlay of some money will make you motivated to continue. Information that is cheap is probably not he best information. Develop a plan or get help developing it, make the time, then just do it. There is no time better than now to begin. Start small then look at sustainable growth for your fitness plan.


And what happened to the idiot who slashed the tires? Well, he was chased out of town, never to be seen again.




The costumes, on the other hand, were not boring. Over \$700,000 worth of costumes from

As it turns out, what I had heard on Napster were some songs off of an earlier EP. When I put this album into my CD player, I have to admit, I had to eat my words. "L.D. 50" is a solid metal album that deserves attention.

While Mudvayne's influences are easily heard on this outing, they aren't heard to the point of a blatant rip off, although I'm sure some people would like to challenge me on that. Mudvayne's singer, Gurrg, combines harsh, throaty vocals a la Pantera with a very melodic sound that mirrors the combined styles of Maynard from Tool and Chino Moreno from the Deftones. 1959. That was the year that Barbie made her toy market debut (and I must say she still looks good 40 years later). Dressed in a less-




than-revealing white and black striped bathing suit the first ever "teenage fashion model" (that's what she was called) instantly became a huge success.

significant change," says Barbie collector Margaret Anderson "The Twist and Turn Barbie now featured a major point of articulation - the bendable waist!"






The 70's and 80's, dubbed by many as the pink years (because the


