Coldspot Rocks the House

Coldspot played another show at The Nest last Thursday, November 28th, but this time it was an electrified show. The week before, they opened for The Watchmen with an acoustic show.

The show was excellent. This time around, there were less technical difficulties, although some still remained, and Floyd Cole recovered from his sore throat from the previous show. The drums and electric guitars were very refreshing and welcomed. Coldspot's musical diversity that everybody raved about shone through. Basically, the boys sound bigger and better when they do a full-out rock show.

Last week, I did not give Coldspot a rave review. One thing I learned is that new and old fans of Coldspot are fiercely protective of the group because they are captivated by their music and are loyal. While sitting and watching Coldspot's show, people expressed their displeasure to me over my review.

"They're a good band. They need good support," said Mike Penny, a NAIT Construction Engineering Technology student. "You have to support the local bands that are good. These guys are doing their own thing - they're really good... I enjoy their company and I enjoy their music."

Penny was impressed with the fact that the three lead vocals can harmonize while playing their guitars. "It's hard to deal with three lead vocalists - hard to get it right." His own experience of being in a band has shown him that it's hard to play guitar as well as they do while singing.

"They're the best original band that I've seen so far from Edmonton," said Penny. He admires the musical ability of Coldspot.

It was unfair of me to do a review of Coldspot from their acoustic show alone, so I will do a re-review of Coldspot based on their rock show last Thursday.

Coldspot played many of the same songs as their acoustic show. Most are from their album The Curve. They played songs from their upcoming album and also a

few cover songs (Tragically Hip, John Mellencamp). The rock versions of Coldspot's original songs show the full competence of Coldspot's songwriting; it shows the band's ability to turn pure poetry into exciting, aggressive music.

Guitar playing by both Jeff Machin and Floyd Cole was once again proficient. Both were able to show off their talent with some solo guitar playing. The bass player, Dennis Easton, was able to give more action in the electrified show, and fulfilled his role very well. He and the drummer, Barry Rakewich, worked well together to bring about the rhythm essential for performing good songs.

Though drummers often go unnoticed (because they're usually at the far back of the stage), if you paid attention you would've noticed that Rakewich was a powerhouse that night. He did it with such ease that it almost seemed he was dancing.

Coldspot's rock show stage presence was more of their style - it worked better for them than a sit-down acoustic show. Cole, Machin, and Easton rocked the stage. The three vocalists did really well with the coordination of their voices, especially Cole and Easton. Once again, Machin's singing was

very impressive as he did a nice rendition of their original song, Hyperspeed.

The band's musical diversity showed with the different musical instruments brought on stage (bongos, tambourine) and through Cole's intuitive knowledge of music. Cole's intuition was shown through his judgment on which guitar effects to use and when to use them. It was a nice touch when Cole played the bongos while Rakewich played the drums.

Most of the music Coldspot plays is classic rock, and some of the songs have soul and funk influences. Coldspot likes to call their music "Canadian rock". Many of the band's musical inspiration come from Canadian bands such as Wide Mouth Mason, Tragically Hip, Big Sugar, Blue Rodeo, and the artist Matthew Good. Other musical influences include Led Zeppelin and Lenny Kravitz.

Coldspot is hoping that their new album will be out next spring. Barry Allen will produce the second full-length album. The album should be a high quality album because the band has been taking their time in choosing the right songs to put on the album. When asked if he was getting impatient about getting the album

out there, Cole said, "Oh, totally. We've been working on it day and night." Demos for the new album from Homestead Records can be heard on Coldspot's web site at www.coldspotrocks.com. This is also the address to check for upcoming Coldspot shows and other band information.

My Mind Just Went Blank

Overcoming Exam Anxiety

With "final exams" only a few weeks away it is worthwhile to consider one of the most common problems among NAIT students, exam anxiety. The purpose of this article is to provide some insight into why exam anxiety exists and to share some methods for counteracting exam anxiety.

Exam anxiety can occur for many reasons. For the purposes of this article we are not looking at exam anxiety caused by inadequate preparation for an exam. Our focus is the exam anxiety experienced by a student who has attended classes, has developed effective study skills and is genuinely confident in their knowledge of the material but does not demonstrate their knowledge on

Exam writing is a stressful activity. The goal is to maintain an optimum level of stress. Too little stress is not desirable, nor is too much stress. Optimum stress actually promotes success. Exam anxiety is an example of excessive stress.

Exam anxiety can be defined

- · excessive worry about upcoming exams
- fear of being evaluated
- apprehension about the consequences of writing the exam

Exam anxiety is:

- experienced by many NAIT students
- manageable

Symptoms of Exam anxiety

- · sweaty palms, shortness of breath, racing heart
- difficulty concentrating and organizing thoughts
- difficulty physically focusing on the words
- feeling of panic, confusion

- nausea and/or fainting
- negative self-thoughts e.g. "I can't even remember the stuff I
- mind going blank (even on material you know well)
- · can't understand exam ques-
- · correct recall after the exam

Many dynamics (aside from ineffective learning strategies, inadequate study habits and inadequate exam taking strategies) contribute to exam anxiety.

Some of those dynamics include:

- fear of failure, success, the future, and the reactions of others e.g. family.
- · unhealthy academic self-esteem. lack of confidence, unrealistic expectations of self (e.g. academic goals set too high)
- · high stress levels, depression, not feeling supported in your educational pursuits (by loved ones), negative and irrational thinking and habitual worry.
- financial pressures from family or financial sponsor
- family or relationship pressures (e.g. everyone is counting on me to do well)
- time or age pressures (e.g. this is the last chance for me to make a better life for myself and my
- health issues such as illness, inadequate sleep, nutrition and sleep, consumption of coffee, alcohol or
- · lack of recreation or social time

What can you do to reduce exam anxiety?

- develop effective exam prep and writing techniques
- get adequate exercise, nutrition
- and rest · reduce overall stress by deep

breathing

• use progressive muscular relaxation by alternately tensing and relaxing your major muscles

Too little stress is not desirable, nor is too much stress.

Optimum stress actually promotes success.

groups from head to toe


- use mental imagery- create a relaxing in your mind place using all your senses
- · identify and remove sources of anxiety
- · practice thought control by planning a positive script e.g. " I will use my relaxation techniques and calm down. Then I will carefully read the question. I will approach one thing at a time."
- practice thought stopping e.g. say "stop" to yourself when anxiety producing thoughts come into mind then reinstate a positive script
- manage external sources of stress e.g. pay bills on time, contract with family and friends re: your need for uninterrupted study time
- · seek medical or counseling assistance if you cannot manage your anxiety using the above sug-

gestions

- focus on a object that produces a calming effect on you
- daydream both daydream and focus take your mind off your anxiety producing thoughts
- · visualize yourself being success-
- praise yourself- talk to yourself in a positive manner
- put the exam in perspective

If exam anxiety is a problem for you may want to make an appointment with a counsellor in O117 or by calling 471-8921.

Note: Remember that an exam is simply an opportunity to show what you know and to get feedback on that knowledge. It is not an evaluation of your worth!







EVERYBODY SALSA!

NAIT Student Damara Lopez Brings Home the Gold!

Salsa! That's Damara Lopez's expertise as she recently was part of Team Canada (First Salsa Rica Dance Company) that won the World Team Salsa Championships in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, that took place November 1-3, 2002.

How did Damara Lopez, a NAIT student taking Marketing, find the whole experience? "Amazing! So much fun! We met dancers from Europe and from all around the world... Every country has their own style of salsa." It was the exposure to all the different styles of salsa that Damara enjoyed the most about the competition.

The winning performance was choreographed mainly by the directors Kelly Lanan and David Joseph, but the entire team put it together. The performance consisted of three routines: the Introduction (to Michael Jackson music), L.A. style salsa, and Cuban style salsa. Damara's dance instructor, Usukuma Ekuere, was in charge of the Cuban style salsa section.

People from around the world, even Canadians, were shocked that Canada won such an event. In fact, the dance team found it hard to find the community support needed to fund its participation in the World Salsa Championships. The expenses included such things

as transportation and accommodations. But now, the support will be abundant if the team decides to go next year.

Practicing for the Championships was hard work. The team consisted of dance members from both Calgary (13 members) and Edmonton (seven members), and every Sunday, the dancers commuted back and forth between the two cities. The practices were three hours long. During the week, there would be one or two practices with the dance partners. Damara's partner was Leo Bolanos, a student at University of Alberta. The team prepared for almost an entire year.

Azucar is the name of Edmonton's team. Many people in this group teach lessons.

When the Championships rolled around, the team was ready to proudly represent Canada. They even wore bright red, flashy outfits to show how Canadian they were. "They were uncomfortable," recalls Damara.

Damara started salsa dancing two and a half years ago. It was easy for her to learn because of her Latino background. She has always been exposed to salsa. Learning the basic dance techniques was harder to do, but Damara was able to master them

"The most interesting part (of salsa) is that you're dancing with someone... but you look around and you see that everybody is doing the same thing," said Damara. "It's a feeling you just

Damara frequents the local Spanish night club, Mezzaluna, which is Edmonton's only all-Latin night club. This is where Damara met the person that changed salsa dancing in Edmonton to what it is today.

It was in London that Usukuma Ekuere, a scientist at University of Alberta, first became exposed to the salsa scene. He traveled to Cuba and learned Cuban style salsa. "He's probably one of the best Cuban style salsa dancers in the world," Damara attests. Finally, Ekuere ended up in Edmonton, and it was at Mezzaluna that Damara met Ekuere. Ekuere was teaching people to salsa casually. A few Cuban exchange students put a salsa group together, and Eukere joined them and learned from them. After the exchange students left, Eukere began teaching people. Later, an interested group at University of Alberta asked him to teach them

Damara wishes to acknowledge Ekuere for bringing his influence to Edmonton. She wants to thank him for all his patience and determination, and for the increased self-esteem resulting of his teaching. "He brought salsa to Edmonton," said Damara. She believes that it wasn't for him, salsa wouldn't be as popular in Edmonton as it is today.

Other than salsa, Damara learns different styles of Latin dance, such as merengue, cumbia,

Damara even does belly dancing. To help learn, videos are brought from L.A. Dance instructors come from L.A. to teach dance workshops. The next workshop, the third in Edmonton, will be at the end of March. Damara enters the open dance competitions at Mezzaluna. Once a month, Mezzaluna has a "salsa party" at which there is all salsa dance, which Damara also likes to attend.

Damara is on a break dance right now, but not for long. Dance season starts soon, and Damara will be teaching salsa. If you're interested in taking lessons, classes start in the second week of January. The classes run for six weeks. For more information, e-mail dillyd15@hotmail.com. For convenience, dance lessons are held at different locations all around Edmonton.

Of the future, Damara says, "I would like to open a studio. I hope this style of dance will grow

in Edmonton because it's small... My goal is to get more people interested in salsa."



What the hell was that all about?



The really weird thing about the whole incident was that after he discovered he had a ride-along-










Health and Dental Dismay

Dear Nugget Staff and Readers:

I'd like to bring to your attention a problem which has been troubling students who have previously opted out of the NAITSA Health & Dental Benefits.

Student who have opted out and later wish to opt in aren't always made aware of this, but the Cash Office doesn't automatically take the fees with your tuition if you've previously opted out and the Health & Dental Benefits Office doesn't always tell you that in addition filling out a "Personal Information Form", you also have to formally rescind your previous "Waiver Form(s)". This procedure is all well and good, however is not made public knowledge.

This problem recently affected myself personally. I am a recently married student who had opted out of the benefits plan for the past two and a half years prior. I went to the Cash Office thinking that they would do what they had done very other year prior, which was to deduct the fees from your Student Loans automatically unless you specified otherwise. So, this year I did not tell them to take of off of my loans. The Cash Office however thought that as I had opted out previously, that I was opting out again this time, therefore they didn't take off the

As a result of this, I thought the fees had been paid, even though they had not. After that, I went to the Benefits office to opt in. I explained that I was a returning student who had previously opted out and that I wished

to opt in this time. They told me to fill out a "Personal Information Form", so I did. Two months after this, I tried to use the paper card to get a prescription, which I normally get, and low and behold the card didn't work. I was told that the number was in use by somebody else, and the only variable part of the number is your personal NAIT student ID number.

I therefore went to the Benefits Office to find out what had happened. They told me that there was nothing that they could do and that basically due to all the circumstances involved in this, that I have no benefits coverage for this semester. I just wish to draw attention to this process for those students who have previously opted out who are needing to opt in. Again, the process is: let the Cash Office know that the fees need to be deducted, fill out a "Personal Information Form" and formally rescind your previous "Waiver Form(s)".

Editor's Note: The problem that Mrs. Washburn experienced was one of a kind. The main reason behind the paper trail and delay was the change of her name. As a note to students, if any of your personal information changes, inform the registrar's office as soon as possible. A reminder as well that the Health and Dental Office is independent from NAIT and only has the information on file of which you have provided them with. If you have any comments, questions or concerns do not hesitate to contact the staff at the Health and Dental Office.






Laura Gjesdel as the Blue Fairy.


Most of the period remained a NAIT defence game. Lady luck was on the Ooks side as a powerful slap shot snuck by Wood, but bounced off the crossbar.






Ook Loren Balon reaches for two as the men's basketball undefeated streak continued last weekend against Grand Prairie.

Local Hip Hoppers Raise Food Donations for Hungry During Christmas Break

Local independent urban music labels Tuff House Records and Music For Mavericks Ent. will be hosting a charity hip hop concert this December at The Rev (10030 - 102Str). Dubbed, Hip Hop For Hunger, the event is an effort to raise food donations for the Edmonton Food Bank for Christmas. Scheduled for Thursday, December 19th, 2002, the event will be the first of its kind for Edmonton's urban music community.

Patrons attending Hip Hop For Hunger will receive a lower cover charge with the donation of a non-perishable food item. The cover charge, which is set at \$8, will be reduced by two dollars with the donation of a non-perishable food item. With the help of Universal Urban, who is one of the events sponsors, Hip Hop for Hunger will award the patron who donates the most non-perishable food items with a prize pack.

The show will consist of performances from local hip hop celebrities Darkson Tribe, Poli Live, Tuff House, CV's Finest, Holy Ghost, and Kahdija & Shy

Guy - all of whom jumped at this opportunity to show they are not only talking about crucial issues, but doing something about them. Hosted by Ms. Trish of CJSR's Urban Hang Suite and Diamond Kutt, the show's main draw will be the 8 MC Freestyle Elimination sponsored by Foosh. The Eliminator is a freestyle competition that will feature up and coming MC's like Black Blaze and Proveli Paragon.

I had an opportunity to chat with Music For Mavericks Ent. recording artist and Urban Hang Suites own, Arlo Maverick, about Hip Hop For Hunger and what him and other local hip-hop artists are trying to achieve from this event.

1. You've been involved before with Hip Hop For Hunger, what does it involve and what do you and other artists want to achieve?

Hip Hop For Hunger has been a huge learning experience for us. Fortunately, we've learned from the mistakes that occurred when we originally hosted it in BC this past summer. The whole process can be summed up to acquiring a venue, sponsors, and performing acts, and then promoting the event through various mediums.

It is the hope of Tuff House, MFM, the performing acts, and all those associated with Hip Hop For Hunger to generate awareness. The acts that are on the bill can relate either directly or indirectly with poverty. Some have been homeless themselves and have overcome and some have come from low-income families. What we're trying to show is that Christmas time is not the only time that people go without food and Christmas time should not be the only time we donate to the Edmonton Food Bank. We hope that with all the publicity that arrives from this, people will begin to make donations throughout the year.

2. Who else is involved in Hip Hop for Hunger besides the local artists?

Hip Hop For Hunger has acquired the sponsorship of Universal Urban, which is the home to acts like Jay-Z, Eminem and Dr. Dre. They will be preparing a prize pack for the patron who donates the most non-perishable food items. We also have the support of Foosh, who is sponsoring the MC Eliminator. The Winner of the freestyle contest will receive a prize pack from Foosh. As well throughout the night we will be giving away gift certificates from Out Back Steak House, and T-shirts from DV8 Records and CJSR FM88.5.

Many people have showed an interest in the event and have offered their help. From CJSR's Minister Faust - to student groups like SAACH. This is the first of its kind, and it's truly remarkable how positive the response has been. We've had minors, who despite the fact that they cannot see the show have asked how they can donate.

3. What is your goal for Hip Hop for Hunger?

The goal for Hip Hop For Hunger is to (1) generate awareness that despite the wealth of this province there are plenty of people who go without food on a daily basis, and (2), generate food donations for these people who have been forgotten, or that we may have simply been unaware of. The event is also a great opportunity for Hip Hop acts to show that they're not only talking about critical issues, but they're putting their money where their mouth is and doing something about these issues. Many times the media focuses on the negative in urban music. We're challenging them to have the decency to show the other

4. When/Where is HipHop For Hunger?

Hip Hop For Hunger takes place Thursday December 19th, at the Rev (10030 - 102 str). For anyone wishing to get there early to donate, the doors will open at 9 pm. We also intend, if granted by the Rev to do so, to have someone

collecting donations earlier that day during the sound check. At that time will we will also take blanket and winter jacket donations. It might be warm outside right now, but this is Canada (laughs). Although dubbed Hip Hop For Hunger, we're trying to make as much of difference as we can make.

5.What will the show include?

The Show includes an 8 MC Eliminator, where there will be 8 MC's who pair up in freestyle competitions then advance on to 4 who pair up later on. Then after those 4 compete there will be a final 2 to see who is the Final Voice. We're refraining from calling it a battle, as most Hip Hop heads would, in order to maintain a positive vibe.

6. What artists will perform?






