## That's One!

### Basketball Women Hope for "New Season"

Following what has been an anything but spectacular early season, the Ook Women's Basketball squad were in a must win position against the King's Eagles on November 15.

Scoring stayed close during the start, with the Oaks carrying a tight two-point lead. Solid defensive plays by NAIT's Amy-Jean Easton and Nichole Fessier began the upswing, and a long shot for two by Lorraine Stelck displayed dominance as the Oaks gained twelve unanswered points.

It appeared as though the Oaks were finding their game, as coach Fabio Marcucci let his team play their own style, calling only one time-out through the first half.

Game play would resemble

the kind of back and forth style that Lady Ook fans have been accustomed too over the past season. The difference this time was the commanding lead NAIT held, finishing the first half 41-28.

The relay continued through most of the second half, with a fifteen point lead resulting from

a quick hook shot by Ashley McNeill.

Scrambling to recover, the Eagles' offence couldn't capitalize on several opportunities presented by the Oaks.

With only 2:40 remaining in the game, NAIT's eleven point lead seemed like enough to play

out the clock, but some quick steals reminded the Oaks of the importance of playing the full forty. In the end, play they would, and the jinx that has been the 2002-2003 season was finally broken.

Coach Marcucci was ecstatic about the result for his team - a team who had yet to taste victory this season. "They deserved to win. I was really proud of them this weekend."

The thought remains as to whether or not this will be a piv-

otal point in what has so far been a less than memorable season for the women. Marcucci responds, "I think we understand where we need to go from here. In terms of what it takes, in terms of preparation, and playing as a team. One fourth of our season is done, and we failed the test. Now, we embark on the second quarter of our schedule."

The Basketball women finish a home and home series against RDC here at the Main Gym on Saturday November 23rd at 6:30 p.m. As always, admission for NAIT students is free.

It was a veteran showcase for the Oaks in the beginning, headlined by some great offence by Leif Puffer and Loren Balon. The pair contributed greatly to an early 13 point lead before Puffer would pass the opportunity down the bench.

In his absence, strong defence by King's allowed only 3 points for the Oaks, allowing them to maintain the lead.

Eagles' Shane Smith managed to land the 3-pointer but back-to-back deuces by NAIT's Slav Kornik and Loren Balon stopped the visitors' momentum quickly. As time wound down in the first half, the Oaks were up 50-24. With such a commanding lead, it appeared as though NAIT was turning the game into a working practice. Play fizzled, and Oaks

coach Marc Dobell called a full time out with only :17 remaining. Experimentation continued through most of the second half, with several new plays undertaken. Mistakes during these tests did allow the Eagles to close the deficit, but 19 points were as close as the King's squad would get to the Oaks.

Following some amazing air by Mark Dorado, a dunk by NAIT's John Pilz served as the signal that NAIT was returning to established plays.

The Eagles managed to pour on the offence towards the end, but with the Oaks concentration returned, there simply wasn't enough time or opportunity left before NAIT would take the 22 point victory.

Slav Kornik, NAIT's player of the game for that night, managed 12 points that night. Despite the commanding win, he admits that consistency is an issue. "We get big leads in the first half and then we let the teams stay with us or come back. When we notice they're cutting the lead a little bit, then we start to play harder. We're getting in the routine of doing that, we just have to play for forty minutes."

Coach Dobell concurs, "The guys have to start getting used to playing in some different defences. We changed defences, and we're just not good at the other defence right now."

Nevertheless, the formula the Men's team has this year seems to be working. As the undefeated streak continues, the

Ooks continue to rise in both the provincial and national standings.

The next Oaks home game is on Saturday November 23rd, as the Red Deer College Kings enter the main gym at 8:30p.m.

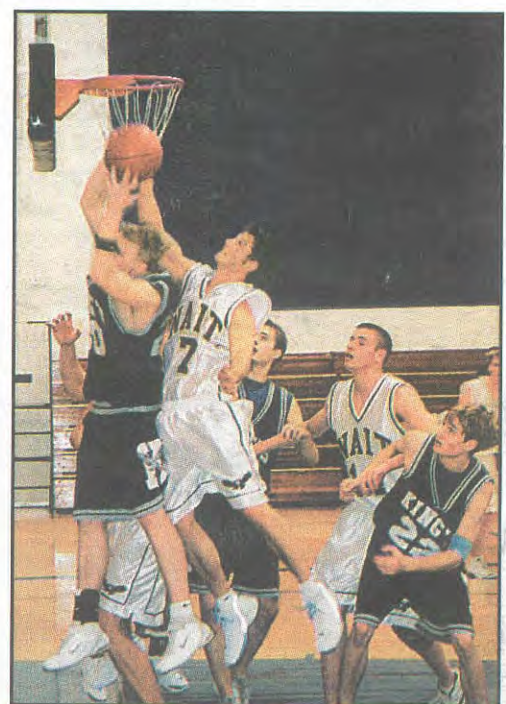

# Date Rape Prevention

Date or acquaintance rape is defined as being forced or pressured into having sex against your will and without your consent by a person who is known to you. It includes new acquaintances or ongoing relationships. The best defense against date rape is to become informed and to minimize situations that put you at risk. Here are some suggestions:

- Don't keep your head in the sand. Recognize that date rape or acquaintance rape could happen to you. Between 10 to 25 percent of college women report being raped by men they knew.
- Know that it is your right to set limits and to defend them, and to tell your partner if/when you do and don't want to make love.
- Firmly discourage any unwanted contact, even if it is casual.
- Be assertive in setting relationship boundaries. Think about your limits in advance and communicate limits and expectations clearly (e.g. how much touch is okay). If you are clear in your own mind about your limits it is easier to communicate them.
- Passivity may be interpreted as permission, so say 'No' in a tone that relays that you mean it. Don't hint or expect anyone to read your mind.
- Be wary of acquaintances who are excessively jealous or possessive, get hostile when you say no, ignore your wishes or opinions, act in an intimidating way, or attempt to make you feel guilty if you say no to sex.
- If you are uncertain about the person you are with avoid alcohol or drugs.

If you do get into a situation where you feel uncomfortable or are forced:

- Try to stay calm. Think about your options and how safe it would be to resist.
- Stay NO strongly.
- If you have a safe option to resist act quickly.
- Try to get away. Use self-defense tactics. You may be able to hit, bite or kick to gain a chance of escape. However realize that fighting back might cause the offender to become violent so appraise the situation.
- Yell for help.
- Buy time with talk. Try to convince or persuade the offender. Flatter him. When he thinks he no longer needs to use force, he may ease up his guard and give you a chance to break away.
- Be as non-seductive as possi-

ble. Tell him you have a sexually transmitted disease, your period, or that you are pregnant. Do physical things to turn him off (e.g. urinate on the floor, pick your nose, pass gas, belch or vomit).

- Remember that giving in is not consent. It may be the only survival strategy.

If you are raped get medical attention as soon as possible. Do not shower or bathe until you

have been examined at an emergency department. Go to a friend or family member who will be supportive. Report the attack to police. And remember rape is not your fault, it is an act of violence.

## **Men have the responsibility to prevent date rape too:**

- Listen carefully to what the woman is saying. If you feel like you are getting a mixed message, clarify what she wants.
- Be sensitive to women who are unsure whether they want to have sex. If you pressure a woman into sex, this is classified as force.
- Do not let your desires control your actions. Think about whether you really want to have sex with someone who doesn't want to have sex with you.
- Remember that date rape is a crime and that it is never acceptable to use force in sexual situations.
- Don't make assumptions about a woman's behavior. Because a woman drinks or dresses sexily does not mean that she is inviting you to have sex.
- The fact that you were intoxicated is not legal defense to rape. You are responsible for your actions, whether drunk or sober.
- Just because a woman has had sex with you previously does not mean you have the right to have sex in the future. Date rape is a crime even if there has been past sexual involvement.

- Don't assume that a woman who consents to kissing or other sexual intimacies is willing to have sexual intercourse.

- If you have sex with a woman who is drugged, intoxicated, incapable of saying no, or unaware of what is happening, you may be guilty of rape.

- Get involved if you believe someone is at risk. Don't be afraid to intervene - you may save a woman from assault and a man from criminal prosecution.

- Recognize that uncaring or forceful treatment of women will affect your own relationships. Women who have been raped or faced an attempted rape will likely have difficulty feeling trust in relationships.

# Sue Speaks About Sexual Responsibility

Renowned sex education expert Sue Johanson, R.N., came to NAIT to speak about love, relationships, and sex. She was guest speaker for Sexual Responsibility Week at NAIT, which is November 18-22. As you may have noticed, there were displays and many activities on campus throughout the week. Sexual Responsibility Week's purpose is to make students aware of health, emotional, and physical consequences of reckless sexual behavior.

On Wednesday, November 20th, Sue Johanson spoke to NAIT students in the NAIT gymnasium. Better known as Dr. Sue or "The Sex Lady", Sue Johanson lectures to over 30,000 Canadian university and college students annually. She is the winner of several

Canadian Organization of Campus Activities (COCA) Speaker of the Year Award and was inducted into the COCA Hall of Fame in 1998. Johanson is an activist of responsible and safer sex. In 1970, she opened the first birth control clinic in a North American high school, in Ontario. In 1974, she started teaching sex education.

In addition to lecturing across Canada, Johanson works on the Women's Television Network (WTN) with her show, Sunday Night Sex Show. She also writes regular columns for a variety of newspapers and magazines, including the Edmonton Sun, Toronto Star, Campus and MENZ magazines. Johanson has authored three books: Talk Sex (Penguin, 1988), Sex is Perfectly Natural, But Not Naturally Perfect (Penguin, 1993), and Sex, Sex, and More Sex (Penguin, 1995).

Johanson's best attributes have been described as her ability to listen, to be non-judgmental, and to be frank, yet humorous.

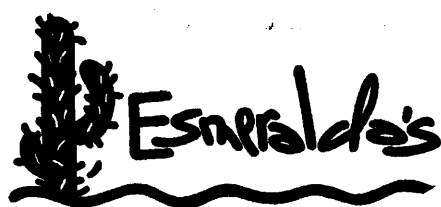

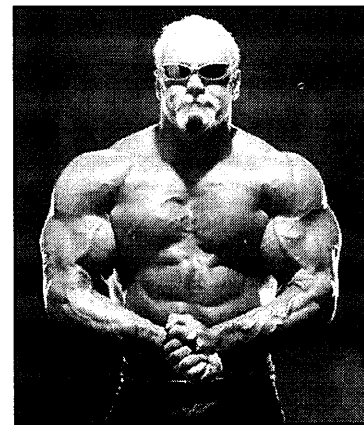
Speaking of ol' Trips, it appears that he may be missing

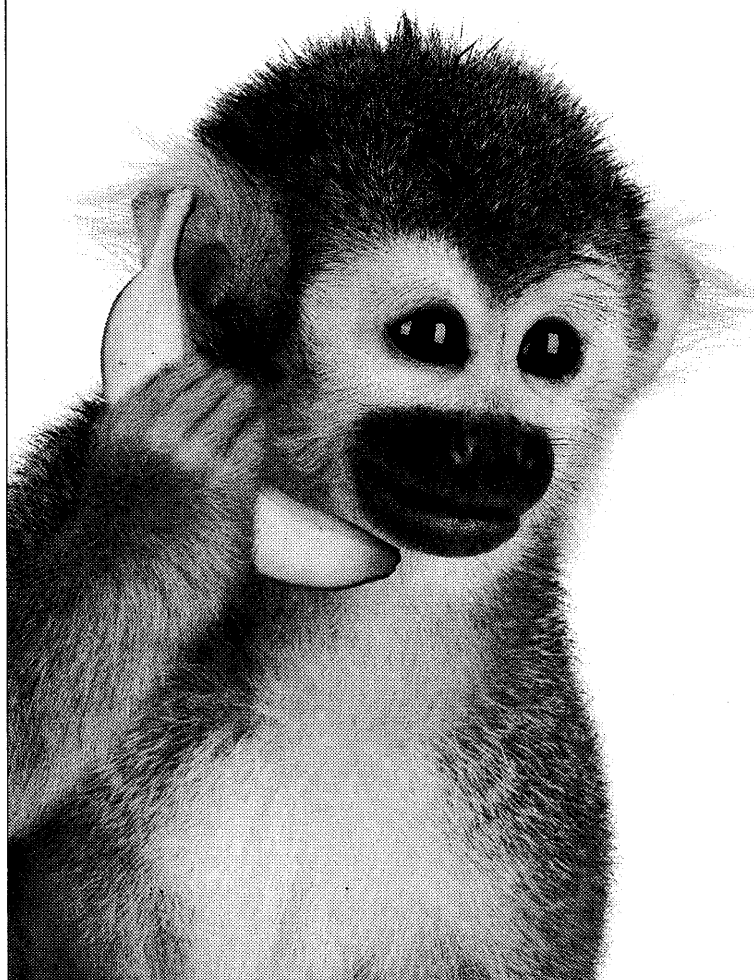

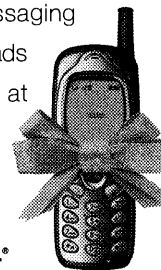

# WINTER DRIVING TIPS

It's that time of year again --- no, not Christmas! Swirls of snowflakes fluttering to the ground, painting the world white. Sound charming? Maybe if you're building a snowman on a sunny winter afternoon -- but there's nothing charming about slipping and sliding in your car through a winter "wonderland". There are some winter driving care tips that you should be aware of.

If your car needs servicing, don't procrastinate. Faulty parts can leave you stranded. Ensure that your battery is up to par. In the winter, on those freezing days, it takes more power to start your car. Check your cooling system to make sure the antifreeze will protect your car. A 50-50 mix of coolant to water is sufficient for most cars. You can check it yourself with a device you can buy in the store -- but if you'd rather not be bothered you can get a mechanic to look at it for you. If you have any leaks in your cooling system, make sure that you have them taken care of. If you have no coolant, or it's low, you could just find yourself with no heat.

Your windshield wipers should be in tip-top shape, as well; your windshield washer fluid should be full. The last thing you need on slushy days is trying to drive peering through a dirty windshield. If you find yourself in a bind though, you can always pull over and find some clean snow in the ditch to try and clean it off. A full tank of gas is a good idea also because if you do get stranded, the engine will be a good source of heat. Just be sure to open the window a crack to avoid carbon monoxide asphyxiation. (We at The Nugget wouldn't want to lose any readers).

Make sure that you know what your car can and cannot do in snow. This will minimize accidents. Get some good tires as well. In case you do get stranded, make sure that you've prepared a winter survival kit. You should have a lighter or some matches; a candle, blankets, snow boots and winter clothes, as well as lots of snacks and anything else you think might be of use to you. And last, one of the most important tips is to go slow! You don't win any points if you're the first one there, but you'll sure lose a lot if you don't make it there at all.

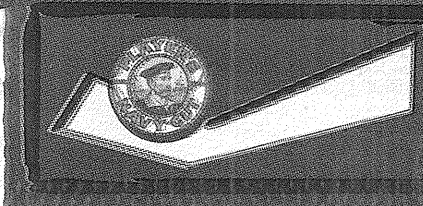

# 34,322 Bring Esks to Grey Cup

At last weekend's Western Final, over 34,000 Eskimo die-hards did their absolute best to ensure that the Home team would be the first team in the Prairies to host and play in the Grey Cup Final.

As things began to get tense against the Blue Bombers, a number of Eskimo players were seen cheerleading, some near tears, believing that the desires of hometown fans would come true.

"I just want to thank them with all my heart. Without them, I wouldn't be going to the Grey Cup," says ten-year veteran Bruce Beaton, one of the first players to work the Edmonton crowd into a wild frenzy. "I know that there's a lot of people that are going home hoarse today and really, were the difference in this league. I would love to get them a Grey Cup." Ricky Ray credits the fans for helping the Eskimos defence. "It was huge. I don't know if fans understand how difficult it makes it for opposing offences when they're

trying to bark out calls. Playing in front of our home crowd is just awesome."

The crowd marveled Coach Tom Higgins that day. "Absolutely fabulous. I'm very proud of our fans, and I hope they're proud of our football club. They sure make a difference when they're being as excited as they were today."

Dan Comiskey, who was seen "I think the fans play a huge part in home games. Our fans came together and they took care of us. They cheered when we needed cheering, and they made our defence roll. I just can't wait to go out and play the game (Grey Cup)".

Still, on a day that saw beautiful temperatures and regular season ticket prices, 630 CHED sports-caster couldn't hide disappointment in such a low gate attendance. "You should have 50,000 plus - I'm not happy with 34,000. They had two games here where they had a total 105,000 back to back. One of the games was 62,000 people. This is a championship game, this is our home team, we haven't been in a Grey Cup since 1996, and we wind up with 34,000 people. If you're a season ticket holder like I am, you have your tickets to this championship game already included. If

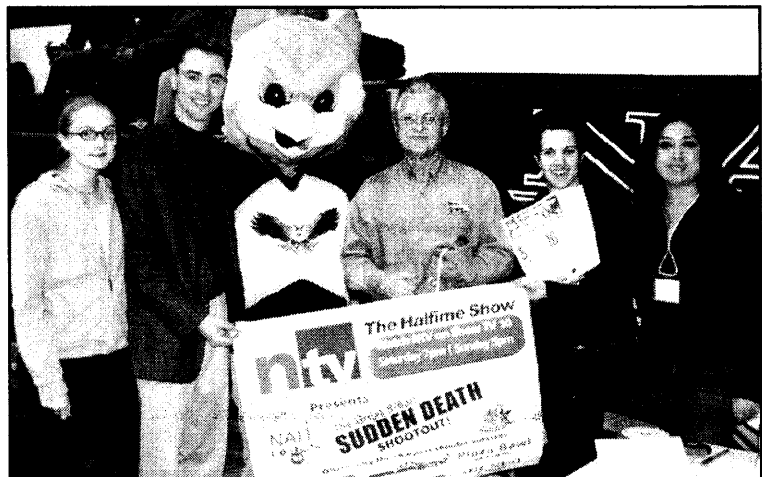

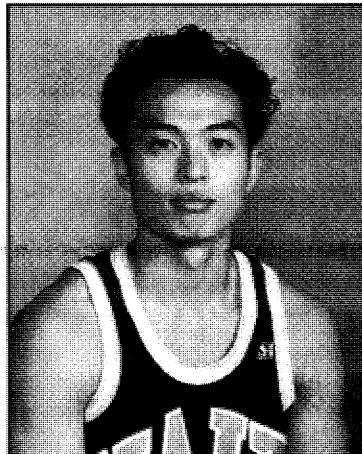
## POWER PACKED

NAIT Alum "Marky Mark" Comes Home



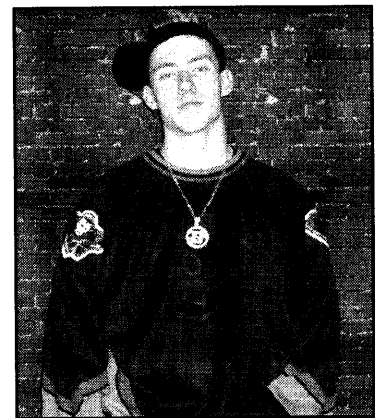

**Mark:** We met at Hercules Ayala's camp. He had already been there for about a month. He liked the fact that I was a small guy like him,

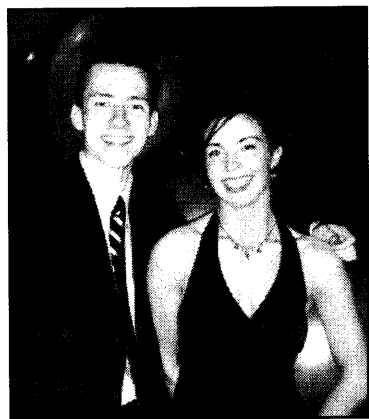


so we could do a bunch of moves on each other that we wouldn't be able to do on other people.



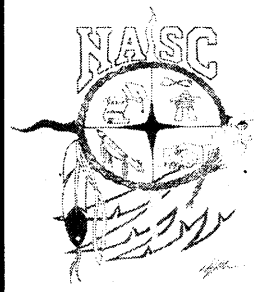

# Proof Proves All

Proof proves to be another great production at the Citadel Theater this year. The play takes place in Chicago on the back porch of Catherine's house. It tells the story of different relationships between Catherine and her father, her sister, her suitor Hal, and herself. Her father, Robert was a brilliant mathematician who went mad when Catherine was twenty. For the next five years Catherine gave up school and her life to look after her father. Robert dies a week before Catherine's 25<sup>th</sup> birthday and his death brings her sister Claire back into her life, as well as Hal her father's former student. After her father's death, Catherine begins to question her

own sanity, for if her father went mad she believes that she may have inherited the same disease. She suffers from depression, which is made worse as she has no friends to help her. This is a result

of her giving up everything for her father. Claire her older sister comes home from New York. She escaped there when her father was ill, and although she did not physically take care of him, the financial burden was on her. It is because of this financial aid that she feels she has the right to take care of Catherine, without giving Catherine the opportunity to express her own feelings and concerns. Catherine believes that her sister thinks that she is crazy and this brings much tension between the two. On the other hand, there is Hal, who is working through her father's workbooks to see if

Robert discovered any mathematical proofs during the five years that he was mad. While he works through these books, he and Catherine develop a relationship. This relationship is shattered when she gives him her mathematical proof, and he doesn't believe her. In fact no one believes her until several people look over it and prove that it is not her father's work. This lack of trust creates even more tension between Catherine and her sister and looks to put an end to the relationship between her and Hal. Throughout all of this, Catherine is trying to discover if she is crazy or not.

The play is very interesting, fast paced, and well acted. The character Catherine is a very strong female character that overcomes

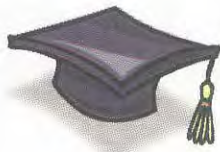
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
