After about 20 minutes of watching the bar I went back up there to ask about the progress of our meals. Oh, was all the bartender could say as our meals had been in the back for some time. Although the Nest was a terrible venue because of poor service, inflated prices, and poor seating and viewing area, Gordie Johnson and Kelly Hoppe were fantastic. I can't imagine how much better they would have been if it was in a venue where every seat is a good one and where one could hear the entire show.



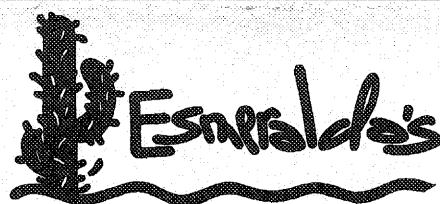

"We must remember. If we do not, the sacrifice of those one hundred thousand Canadian lives will be meaningless. They died for us, for their homes and families and friends, for a collection of traditions they cherished and a future they believed in; they died for Canada. The meaning of their sacrifice rests with our collective national consciousness; our future is their monument." – Veterans Affairs Canada.

On November 11 every year at 11:00 AM, Remembrance Day ceremonies take place all across Canada. This day is an official way to remember and honour the Canadians who died in the First and Second World Wars and the Korean War. The first Remembrance Day was held on November 6th, 1919.

Unofficially, it is also a way to remember Canadian soldiers that died while serving Canada after the World Wars and the Korean War. Although unbeknownst to most Canadians, hundreds of soldiers have died during peacekeeping operations. Only recently has this possibility become realistic to the Canadian public with the

friendly-fire death of four Canadian soldiers on April 18, 2002. These soldiers were Sgt. Marc Leger, Cpl. Ainsworth Dyer, Pte. Richard Green, and Pte. Nathan Smith. Eight more soldiers were injured during this incident. Although a ceremony was held for these soldiers, the deaths of many other soldiers are kept quiet by the

federal government and no appropriate ceremonies held for them. The red poppy is the official symbol of Remembrance Day. The red poppy drew attention during the Napoleonic Wars as the mysterious flower that bloomed over the graves of fallen soldiers. In 1915, infamous poet John McCrae, then a doctor serving with the Canadian Forces Artillery during the First World War, recorded this phenomenon in his famous poem *In Flanders Fields*. Wearing the poppy near and on Remembrance Day shows your commemoration of the soldiers who have died for your freedom. When you buy the poppy pin, the donation you make helps

war veterans and their dependents in financial distress. Their injuries and disabilities were caused by the Wars and peacekeeping duties. Financial aid is needed for medical appliances and research, home services, and care facilities. The Poppy Campaign helps raise the money needed.

Enjoy your freedom. Constant reminders are always there for us to be grateful for our freedom, such as the recent terrorist actions. Remembrance Day is a way of thanking the soldiers that died fighting for our freedom, and the soldiers that died fighting to keep our freedom.

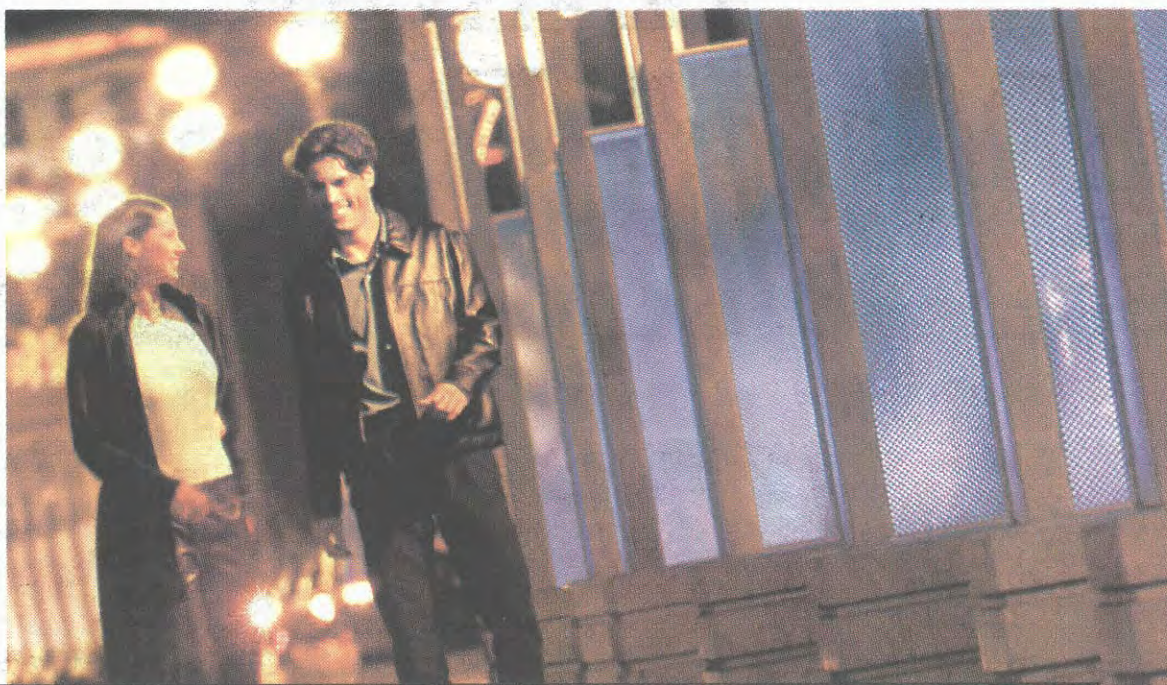

Men's Basketball Head Coach Marc Dobell has every right to be beaming. After capturing the conference championship last year, the Men's Basketball Oaks have entered this year with a genuine "come get some" attitude.

It's as plain as the black and white on the stats page. Holding

the conference title immediately placed the Oaks in the slot of being the team to beat. Knowing that they were top of the hit-list, the men have answered back with utter defiance.

The men would start early in the preseason. Undefeated in exhibition, the Oaks set the bar at the King's University College Invitational Tournament last month, running a sweep against all comers.

While there is little disputing the Men's success this year, games like the one against G-Mac keep Dobell and the Oaks humble. "We played with no passion in the first and were down 22 at half. Effort and team play was lacking. MacEwan also played very well, knocking down a lot of tough shots. The second half saw us rally as we tied the game up with 3 minutes left. Key players in our run were Slav Kornik, Nat Schaefer, and Leif Puffer. In the end we made some key plays and won a game we really had no right winning."

With a missed buzzer shot by Grant MacEwan that game, Dobell may be correct, however he knows the ability and talent in his arsenal

this year. "This year it has been a great experience for these guys. The thing with our team this year is that we're so balanced. We've got so many players in each position that can provide what we need for us to be successful."

This season, the Oaks welcomed seven new players, but with players like Leif Puffer, Matt Burton and Slav Kornik, education from experience is a factor which is quickly spreading throughout the NAIT locker room. "Certainly our returning players have been big guys for us, but they've been working with our young guys a lot and helping them understand what is required of them. The new guys have developed at a great pace."

The next game for the men is on November 15, as the Oaks welcome King's College to the gym in what could quite possibly run the streak to 7. Game time is scheduled for 8:30 p.m. at the NAIT gymnasium. As always, admission for NAIT students is free.

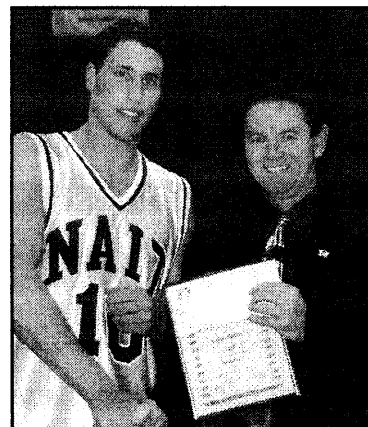

Two foul singles by Concordia's Rachel Vachon would serve as final blows in what was otherwise a competitive game.

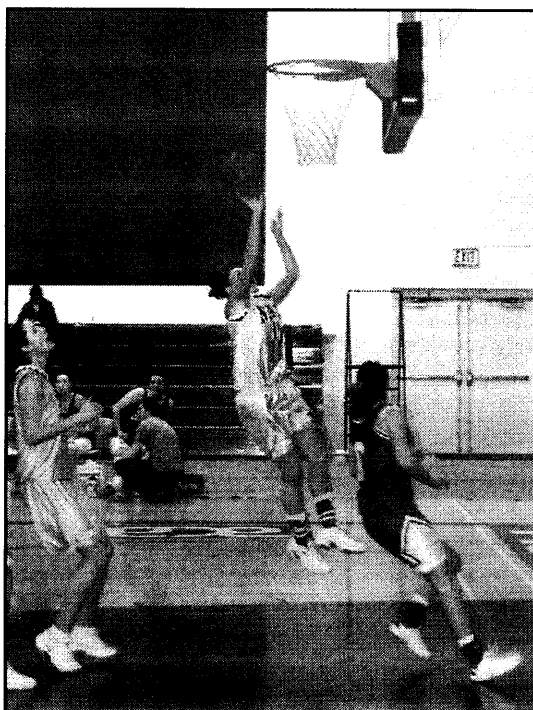

# THE COMEDIAN

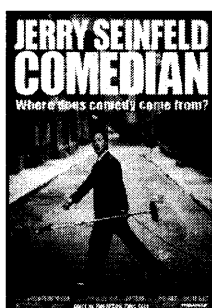
