



NAIT turns 40 years old this year! To acknowledge the monumental birthday, there is going to be a weekend celebration on Friday, October 18th to Sunday, October 20th. Class reunions, tours, alumni hockey, basketball, and volleyball games, a gala banquet and dance, and a President's brunch for the first NAIT graduates from 1963, 1964, and 1965 are all part of the NAIT 40th Anniversary Homecoming. It is said to be the largest homecoming in NAIT's history.

Starting Friday evening, classmates and faculty from the classes of 1963-65, 1967, 1972. 1977, 1982, and 1992 will be able to come together once again to remember their years at NAIT and to see the old classmates and friends they haven't seen in years! NAIT graduates are coming all the way from such places as Texas and Australia for the event. There will also be many interesting alumni, including some from the first class of graduates 38 years ago. There is no formal program that night, but the event takes place at The Nest.

Saturday will begin with alumni and faculty registration in the morning. It is also the Sports & Wellness Open House, which includes all the Ooks alumni games with hockey, volleyball, and basketball.

Also on Saturday will be the campus tours. Undoubtedly, campus has changed for the alumni since—they attended classes at NAIT, and this will be a chance for them to refamiliarize themselves with the campus they used to know, and get acquainted with the additions to NAIT campus over the years, including the recent construction of the HP Centre for Information and Communications. The HP Centre opening program and reception will take place in the afternoon.

Saturday night is the gala banquet and dance, and Sunday morning is the President's Brunch with Dr. Sam Shaw for the graduates from 1963, 1964, and 1965.

This should be a fun weekend for the NAIT alumni and a momentous way to celebrate NAIT's 40th birthday.

NAIT 40 Years Ago a summary from 1959 to 1965

1959

The Government of Alberta, under the direction of Premier Ernest C. Manning, announces the decision to build a technical institute in Edmonton. The province shows a need for more trained apprentices and workers for other occupations. Previously, the province's apprenticeship and vocational training was being handled solely by the Provincial Institute of Technology (PITA) in Calgary.

1960

The new technical institute is to be called the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology (NAIT) as of December 14th. PITA is renamed the Southern Alberta Institute of Technology (SAIT).

1961

Jack Mitchell, the appointed Principal of the new technical institute, decides NAIT should be built near the municipal airport. The 21-acre site was purchased through Alberta Public Works in October.

1962

Construction begins in early January with Phase I, which includes two buildings – the Mortar Trades Building and the Industrial Building. Phase II then begins with the building of the General Offices, Library, Food Services Department, Welding Building, and Services Building. NAIT's very first class (29 Communication Electrician apprentices) is enrolled. Training begins on October 1st.

1963

On May 27th, the institute is officially opened by Premier Manning where the blue and gold of the draperies are adopted as the school colors. The \$16 million institute has 80 staff, 53 shops, 39 labs, 77 classrooms, 109 offices, and 155 service areas (cafeteria, library, gym, auditorium, student activity areas, power plant, and mechanical

equipment room), all on 15 acres of floor area and under one roof. In September, the first full-time students register for the 1963/64 school year. NAITSA is established, and the first student year-book and newspaper are published.


1964

The institute's first Open House is held on March 11th-13th. Estimated attendance of local and regional high school students was 20,000 and proves so popular that visitors continued to show up throughout Friday evening even though the event ended in the afternoon. At a special ceremony, federal Minister of Indian and Northern Affairs presents NAIT-SA's president with an ookpik. The Ook becomes NAIT's mascot.

1965

The second Open House is held March 17th-18th, where it becomes even more popular with an estimated 24,000 in attendance! NAIT begins expansion beyond the original campus with the construction of an outdoor track and seven-storey building (The Tower) and Industrial Annex. The Tower cost \$2.5 million to build while the Industrial Annex cost \$627,000 to build. The first graduation ceremony is held with 326 graduates of diploma and certificate programs.

My name is Tereza Demain. I am a full-time student studying computer system technology. This is my third semester and I want to start getting involved in more activities. I want to explore the school spirit.



of other nations, to say nothing of the moral and ethical reasons for opposing such things as genocide, which at least three of the examples listed are guilty of.



CORNUCOPIAS



1/2 cup light corn syrup 4 tablespoons water

Melt caramels in top of double boiler (or use the microwave). Add corn syrup and water, and mix until smooth. Slowly pour mixture over warm popcorn in large bowl or pan, mixing well. Shape into balls when cool. Makes about 30 small balls.


So I did what every snow blooded Canadian would do. I begged all my friends and family for spare change for a ticket home.

THANKSGIVING HISTORY

The history of Thanksgiving in Canada has not always been clear. It has been celebrated for many different reasons such as a victorious battle, religious reasons, cessation of disease as well as the celebration of an abundant harvest.

The first Thanksgiving was celebrated on Thursday, January 10th, 1799, to celebrate the victory over the enemy. From 1921 until 1930, Thanksgiving was actually called "Armistice Day". It was consistently held on the second Monday in November and Thanksgiving was a statutory holiday. It was proclaimed as a holiday in 1931, and was generally held on the second Monday in October. Until 1957, Thanksgiving was almost random holiday, falling anytime of the year, sometimes more than once, and for any reason. It was proclaimed in 1957 that Thanksgiving would become an official annual holiday falling on the second Monday of October. The reason for this holiday was to be "for general thanksgiving to Almighty God for the blessings with which the people of Canada have been favoured."


- ficult to enjoy your meal. Also a knife works better.
- Feel free to smoke at the dinner table. If you need an ashtray just use the glass of the person sitting next to you. Preferably when he/she is looking the other way.


Always pass the food to your right. Even if there is no one on your right and in doing so you would be dropping food on the floor. Remember, etiquette first.

Soon after his arrival, we were called out. This man, this great figure in the WWF was right in front of me, turned to me and said, "Here we go... let's have some fun!". I was game, and after getting told by the WWF official that if we played on the ropes we would be kicked out of the show, we began down the aisle.

The scenario for the contest was simple enough. Four or five contestants, one of which looked like he didn't quite belong there. Of course, that was the REAL Paul in the mysterious gear. The others who came back with me went first, and then it was my turn.

I jumped into character, even being sure to mimic him down to his ring entrance. I remember the middle rope hitting me in my "stuff" as I did the entrance. Ouch. Nevertheless, this was my first time in a WWF ring, and it was something I was going to treasure... and still do treasure to this day. After letting out my best "OOOOOOOH YESSSSSS", I won the contest, and that was that... my WWF/E win/loss record remains at 1-0-0.


The Trews


