Fan-Flipping-Tastic! Gizmo says Goodbye

The crowd at Commonwealth Stadium was quite divided last weekend, as the Saskatchewan Roughriders faced off against the Edmonton Eskimos. Fans from both Alberta and Saskatchewan were in the house, and each side was quite vocal in cheering for their respective teams. Come half-time though, everyone in the building became an Eskimo fan... even if for just a moment.

In front of 44,480 fans, the Edmonton Eskimos honoured Henry "Gizmo" Williams, adding his name and number to the hallowed Eskimo Wall of Fame, making him the 22nd player to receive the honour.

Williams, 38, was an Eskimo for 14 seasons, and in that time earned the reputation of being the greatest attraction the Eskimos have ever had. Always electrifying, the Giz has been called the "greatest kick returner in the history of pro football", boasting a career combination of 23,927 yards. Williams played his last game on October 28, 2000, leav-

ing behind a legacy that will be hard to mirror.

As part of the festivities, the Edmonton Eskimos handed out 2500 limited edition Bobble-head dolls of the legendary player, and sold another 500 at the game. The dolls were in such high demand, fans were lining up as early as

five and a half hours before game time, and in some cases were still denied the collectable.

During his induction ceremony, Williams couldn't help but break down, thanking former team-mates, colleagues, and of course, the fans for continued support. Following his speech, Henry Williams was not going to leave the crowd disappointed.

The mystery of why Giz was looking a little heavy came bursting out in the open, as he pulled off his sweater to reveal an Eskimo Jersey sporting the celebrated number 2. The pants came off next, and before everyone knew it, The Giz was charging towards the end zone. After catching the pass from Jed Roberts, Williams executed one of his patented end zone front flips, as a final thanks to all his fans.

"That's the first time I had to do a flip without stretching, I didn't know I had that much height in my legs still! I did a flip in here, and I flipped my way out of here."

When asked how many

bobble-heads he has, Williams laughed, "I got about twenty of them right now. I'm going to send them back home to the family."

Following the flip, Gizmo had one more treat up his Green and Gold Sleeve, as he boarded the famous Eskimo Fire truck and passed out hundreds of miniature footballs to eager fans.

Now officially retired from the game, Williams continues to devote great portions of his time to charities, as well as inspirational speaking across the country. One of his most notable contributions is continuing to spread the message of the importance of education and staying in school.

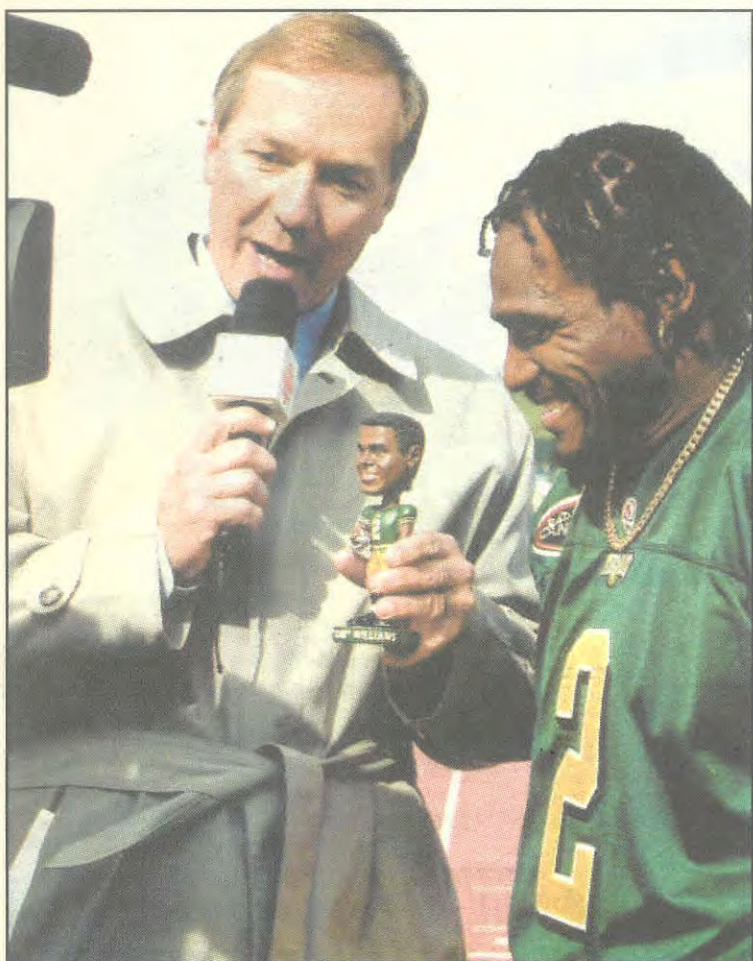

The first NAITSA General Council meeting was held on Tuesday, September 17, at 4:30 PM. There was an admirable turn-out of technology representatives for the meeting. Also present were Diana McCall (President), Cameron Baker (VP Operations), Wade Babiuk (VP Academic), Jeremy Coules (VP Communications), Chris Chelmick (General Manager), and Mike Anderson (Entertainment & Marketing).

The agenda included a brief appearance by the NAIT president, Dr. Sam Shaw. After handing out candy and NAIT 2010 pins to all the students, Dr. Shaw reminded them that this year is the 40th anniversary of NAIT. Forty years ago, Ernest C. Manning created this institute.

Dr. Shaw plans to be part of the agenda in future General Council meetings. He told the technology representatives that for the next meeting, he wants to know what issues there are for him to address.

Also on the agenda, Athletics Promotions Coordinator, Marc Dobell, explained about the first NAIT Athletics Tech Challenge of the year. It will take place on Friday, October 18th at our home volleyball game against the King's University College Eagles. Dobell

hopes that each technology can produce at last one team (of five people or more) to come and compete for the Tech Challenge Championship.

will be the first Thursday of every month starting in October. The meetings will run from 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM. More members are needed for this council. If inter-





What is the E-Learning Fee?

Looking at the new e-learning fee on their account statements got a lot of students angry. Especially with the new HP Centre for Information and Communications Technology just newly erected, there has been, and still is, a lot of confusion of what the e-learning fee exactly pays for.

Students have been saying things like, "It (the e-learning fee) is a total rip-off. We get the same stuff as last year that we got for free but with one or two more things for \$50 a semester." Another student said, "It is a way to make money from students. They want to expand the new building."

Jeff Zabudsky, Dean of Technology and Curriculum Innovation, had quite a bit of explaining to do. What does the e-learning fee pay for? Does any of the money from the e-learning fees collected go toward the new building? What about the students who feel they won't be using any of the services, but must pay the e-learning fee anyway? Is it fair for the present students to pay for some of the services that only future students will be using? The list of questions go on and on.

So, with these questions handed to him, Zabudsky helped clear the mass confusion.

The dollars for the e-learning fee are going toward supporting the infrastructure for e-learning servers, people who run the servers, and its connection to the Internet. This is also known as Information Technology (IT) development. Because NAIT doesn't have the money to develop the new infrastructure, students help pay through the e-learning fee.

Half of the money from e-learning fees goes toward developing the infrastructure, and the other half goes back to the programs in which the students are enrolled.

"The number one priority for the investment of the e-learning fee is to build more Learning Outcome Guides (LOGs)," says Zabudsky. E-learning fees will help courses increase in quality as instructors begin to go online to enhance the material they teach. Pressures on students are changing. Demographics show that students have less and less time than ever to study their courses. The new infrastructure helps in this perspective as well.

Zabudsky explains that industry needs technology skills from

potential employees. NAIT is helping to meet these demands through its IT development.

Being the number one priority, what are LOGs? In essence, LOGs are an eventual replacement of textbooks. If you're familiar with course packs, then you probably will have a better understanding of LOGs. Basically, they are course packs online. Right now, students who have courses that come with course packs pay around \$8-\$15 for each course pack. Had the instructor chosen to make the textbook a requirement for the course instead of developing course packs, the textbook would cost anywhere from \$60-\$150. LOGs come as part of the e-learning fee. In the future, the student would not have to pay for a textbook or a course pack. If a printed form of the LOG is preferred, only the costs of printing are involved. NAIT plans to make this option available for a very low price. Lower, that is, than you would find if you printed the LOGs yourself or had them printed at an office-supply store. In preparation for the volumes of printing that NAIT will likely have in the future, "tune-ups" in the printing department are presently being made.

Zabudsky says the idea is to reduce general costs to students significantly. Being "frustrated with publishers", his goal is for students to buy fewer textbooks in the future.

The digital environment is cheaper. It's just a matter of getting there that requires the main expenses. "The start-up is hard," said Zabudsky. Zabudsky acknowledges the fact that the students who are here now may not be part of the system, yet still pay the e-learning fee. Unfortunately, this is the requirement for NAIT to change its infrastructure at this time because the funds are absent. On the other hand, students may decide or need to upgrade at NAIT in the future. Zabudsky believes that students who do come back will see the value of their investments.

Why does a student who is in baking courses have to pay the same amount of money for e-learning fees as a person who is in computer networking courses? The need for the use of the system varies greatly between the two. NAIT's philosophy is that when students are registered at NAIT, everybody pays the same fees no matter what program they're in. Currently, almost 7000 fulltime students are paying \$50 a semester

for e-learning fees. Yet more part-time students are paying \$5/course in e-learning fees.

The wireless environment will be another asset to students at NAIT. For example, students can access LOGs on their personal digital assistants (PDAs) or laptops and have a quick study before exams. Being shown a few examples of LOGs, it is easy to see that they will become very useful and significant. PDAs are not widespread now, but they are expected to be in the future.

Although the IT development is a long-term plan, instructors are required to complete their LOGs this year.

The information from textbooks will still be there. Instead of buying the entire textbook edition (of which you use only a few chapters for your course), instructors will have the opportunity to go online to publishers such as McGraw-Hill Ryerson or Pearson

and buy only the chapters they need at a much reduced cost, and include the information in their LOGs and lectures.

The rumor that part of the e-learning fee everybody pays is going toward the new HP Centre can be quashed. The building is paid for. The budget is fully expended while staying within its value of \$50 million. No e-learning fees are going toward the new building nor the open-access computer labs within the building and in the tower basement. Along with the SMART classrooms, these are NAIT's investments. NAIT has found money in its budget to pay for these. The opportunity for all students to have free access to computers is important regardless whether the students decide to use the service or not.

In the long run, Zabudsky hopes these developments will

reduce the costs to students extensively. He recognizes another problem of education costs. Federal and provincial government funding is hugely inadequate. This is where the true problem lies.

Alcohol is everywhere. We see advertisements for beer and spirits on television, and hard liquor ads in magazines. But is alcohol becoming a problem amongst the student population?

Frequent binge drinkers are more than twenty times likely to miss class, fall behind in schoolwork, be hurt or injured, engage in unplanned sexual activity, or drive a car after drinking. Frequent bingeing has been described as bingeing three or more times in a two week period. Binge drinking also affects those around you. Many neighbors can blame noise and property damage on binge drinkers. Students and family end up taking care of binge drinkers, seeing an increase in serious arguments, and have also suffered acts of violence towards them.

Binge drinking is even

tougher for females. Many females try to keep up to their male counterparts which is difficult. Women have less water in their bodies, more fat, and fewer alcohol-processing enzymes. As well, estrogen and the birth control pill can also have a major effect on the way the liver breaks down alcohol.

One Hour Photo

"People take pictures of the happy moments in their lives... no one takes a photograph of something they want to forget."

I finally saw One Hour Photo this weekend. This review was supposed to be about "Four Feathers", but I was passed out in my bed from the cold medicine I was taking the night of the premiere. I figured that I could see it this weekend, granted that would mean (heaven forbid), paying for it. But after the premiere, word spread that the movie, well, sucked. And I decided that I wanted to see a movie that had, at the least, a glimmer of potential. I mean, twelve bucks to see a movie that would most likely cause me to stab my straw into my eyeball is not worth it. (Yes, I do judge a book by its cover). I already have to see "The Tuxedo" next week, and I didn't really want to write two crappy movie reviews in a row... so, this is where the review comes in.

This movie was good. It freaked the crap out of me. I know that next time I walk into Wal-Mart to develop my pictures, I sure won't look at the poor guy behind the counter the same way again. Director Mark Romanek knew how to make Sy Parrish, (Robin Williams) realistic. He probably told him to just act, well, normal. Granted, most people aren't as creepy as he is, but if you were to see this man walking by you down the street, you probably wouldn't remember him. You probably wouldn't have noticed him in the first place.

Sy Parrish was sad. His character was disturbing because he had this obsessive nature with one family, the Yorkins, who came in to develop their pictures. He knew them. For the past ten odd years, he had developed their pictures and made an extra copy for himself. He was living vicariously through them. One wall in his apartment was completely devoted to this family, in chronological order, from a pregnancy, to the latest ones, the little boy's ninth birthday.

Sy's keen interest with the family escalates to stalking, with one excruciatingly disturbing scene with the little boy. The film follows the life that Sy has created, by placing himself (unbeknownst to the family) in their life as "Uncle Sy." This movie isn't so much scary, as is startling. And you don't hate William's character; you feel this unbearable sorrow for him.

Cinematographer Jeff Cronenweth (Fight Club), creates a beautiful film. From the sterile aisles of the value store to the hissing of the fluorescents overhead, you feel as uncomfortable as Sy. Through this, it's so intuitively revealing that you feel a sort of privilege to be able to look in at his darkened soul.

Beyond the cleverness, the oddities and the pristine camerawork, One Hour Photo is a sobering look at why we take pictures. A photo, Sy says, is a stand against the flow of time. It not only freezes a moment but insists, "I was here. I existed. Someone cared enough about me to take my picture."

TuffHouse Records has been known for their hard work and ethics in the urban music community in the Edmonton area. The independent label promotes primarily R&B, Hip-Hop and Hip Rock performers in the Edmonton area as well as across Canada. In addition, TuffHouse promotes many hip hop and sporting events in the community, such as Hip-Hop Wars 1 & 2.

The 4-year old label has already released two full length albums, “Streets”, by Wayz, which sold nearly 500 copies within the first two weeks of its release in December 2001; and most recently “Letters On Paper” by Reason, which is expected to push 500 copies locally and 3X Nation Wide.

Beats wise this album is on point, as always Stress does a good job to capture the sound of what the artist, in this case Reason, is trying to portray. Every track on

“Letters On Paper” is produced by Stress of Smashtbenz Studios (www.smashtbenz.com).



Reppin Duggan on the Southside, Reason is known for his fast reggae sounding flow, and his lyrical ability, and when you hear this album you’ll know what I mean. Being the most talented emcee on TuffHouse, the album sees him reflecting on his life experiences, spoken in first and third person. Most of the album’s tracks explore interesting topics, and see Reason

sharing thoughts on specific things he has seen.

“Letters On Paper” has a very professional look and sound to it. Right there and then the listener can tell that the label and the artist have put a lot of time and effort into this album. The album is known for earlier tracks “Things I See” and “Adopted” featuring Wayz.


At times Reason gets very lyrical, and you have to hit the rewind button on your cd player to get on the same level as him, now that’s talent. In “Court Paintings”, Reason gets political talking about low-income housing, poverty, and politicians. Then he goes on to say “You need to move like the water, they can’t control the water, only try contain the water, they’ll never crush the water....”, now that’s some deep stuff to talk about. When you listen to the track you’ll see how that line plays in with “Court Paintings”. And don’t think this is the only track like this,

the majority of Reasons lyrics are high caliber and very interesting to listen to, they make you think which takes talent.

Talking to Reason, he let me have a better insight on the most popular tracks on the album. “Things I See”, sees Reason talking about the government and the bad things he saw when he was homeless. “Letters On Paper” has Reason talking about what he has drawn from his family and how fighting and violence has changed his perception on writing lyrics. “Till They Claim Me”, is basically a collabo with two other TuffHouse artists, singer Legacee, and emcee Rusty Brown. “Adopted” is basically a metaphor, about how the street almost took him when he was kicked out of his home”. In “Papa Papa”, Reason talks about how his father wasn’t around, and the first verse of the song was written when he was 13, and the last verse was written when he was 16,

so it shows how his perception of his father has changed.

The future looks bright for Reason, his album is getting madd airplay for the first single “Things I See” in T-Dot courtesy of CIUT Flow FM, out west with The BEAT, locally with CJSR, CJSW, and CKUL. Also, “Things I See” will be the first video for “Letters On Paper”, shooting will commence in approximately 1.5 months. You can also check out Reason in the live atmosphere 8pm this Saturday at Backroom located on Whyte Ave, tickets are sold at the door. The best trait about Reason is that his style and the way he depicts his stories are original. “Letters On Paper”, by Reason can be picked up through www.indiepool.com, Lay-Up, Foosh, and ColorBlind. Eskies Provide Rough Ride for Saskatchewan

Despite a shaky start, the Edmonton Eskimos continued their record breaking season, and tasted revenge against western rival Saskatchewan Roughriders last Saturday at Commonwealth.

On a day dedicated to Henry "Gizmo" Williams, things started out grim for the Green and Gold. Saskatchewan took the early lead of 7-1 following a touchdown by fullback Chris Szarka. 1:03 after a single by Paul McCallum, the Riders managed to capitalize on a fumble by Edmonton Quarterback Ricky Ray, as Saskatchewan linebacker K.D. Williams would get the 19 yard return for the touchdown. At the end of the first quarter, Edmonton was down 15-1.

The second quarter saw some major adjustments on the Edmonton bench, modifications that would revamp the Eskimos' game. Following a 31 yard pass from Ricky Ray to John Avery for a touchdown, kicker Sean Fleming added another six points including

one conversion, two singles and a field goal. When the shot at half time rang, the Eks had narrowed Saskatchewan's lead to two, with a score of 15-13.

The second half of the game started completely opposite the first, as Edmonton continued the offence. It was a difficult push, but Ricky Ray managed to drive through the Rider defence and score the one-yard touchdown. Fleming would continue to raise the count, as the Eks took the lead, 21-15.

Edmonton's Terry Vaughn would score a touchdown from Ricky Ray's 11 yard pass. Vaughn would cross the 1,000 yard receiving mark that day, his eighth season in a row to do so, setting a new CFL record.

Also surpassing the 1,000 yard mark was running back John Avery, who managed 157 yards in front of the 44,480 in attendance. Former Eskimo, now Rider QB Nealon Greene's game total of 167 yards and one touchdown pass would prove frivolous. As the clock wound down, his attempts at play were halted by Albert Reese, causing the final turnover of the game on downs, and cementing the 31-25 Eskimo victory.

"Today was their day on the scoreboard. I'm disappointed we ended the game on a sack. That really upsets me, especially against a four man pressure. That shouldn't happen in pee-wee ball," said Saskatchewan Head Coach, Danny Barrett.

Edmonton's Elfrid Payton broke the tie for second place in all-time sacks, scoring three against the Riders, and taking his total to 145. When mentioning his chase for first on the list, Payton stated, "That's one of my goals, but more than anything it's the Grey Cup. My team's goal is more important than any individual goals."

Avery noted his accomplishment a little more buoyantly, "I do what I can when I'm able to do it. When the opportunity comes, I'm able to get out there and do what I do, which is what I did."

Edmonton's record is now 10-3, with 7 undefeated at home. Head coach Tom Higgins summarizes, "To come back from 15-1 says a lot. I can't say enough about all of the athletes that continue to just believe in one another, another opportunity for us to grow as a football team." The next Eskimo home game is Monday, October 14 against the Montreal Alouettes.
