Bolton, Ainsworth Shine as NAIT Awards Athletic Best

It was quite possibly one of the best shows on campus this year. The 39th Annual NAIT Athletics Awards were held April 4th to showcase the absolute finest this year's Ooks had to offer.

Talk about a year. National championships, national medalists, record breakers, and some of the best coaches and athletes Alberta ever lay claim to, all flying under the Ook banner.

The event kicked off with an amazing video put together by NAIT's D3 Team. Set to Slim Shady's "Lose Yourself", the video was so well done that it even inspired M.C. and new NAIT even-bigger-wig Al Morrison to "send a shout out to all his peeps".

NAIT broke its initial record of 39 honor athletes this year, awarding 40 individuals for maintaining above-eighty percent averages while participating in intercollegiate athletics.

Each team presented awards to their best players. Besides the hardware and trophies that were handed out, the all-conference and academic awards honored were initial record of 39 honor athletes

An Inspirational Speech





Test Taking Strategies

Look over the following tips and see if there are some pointers you can use to maximize marks on your upcoming exams.

Use your time effectively:

- Skim the entire exam first
- Know exactly how much time is allocated for the test; budget your time and check periodically to make sure that you are on track
- Answer the questions you know best <u>first</u>
- If you are unable to work out a question, go on to the next one and come back to it later if time permits
- Use any extra time to review your answers. When you review them more slowly you may eliminate careless errors or find that there is a better answer
- Don't be disturbed about other students finishing before you do.
 Take the time you need to put in your best effort

Stay calm during the test:

 Arrive early enough to be organized and ready instead of in a panic, but not so early that you have a lot of time to sit and worry. Try to go into the test alert and calm instead of tense and anxious

- Don't talk about the test with classmates immediately beforehand. This usually raises anxiety levels
- Regard a lapse of memory as perfectly normal; do not let it throw you into a panic. If you block on answering one question, leave it for awhile and return to it later
- Activity reduces anxiety. If you go blank and can't think of anything to write, go on to another question or another part of the test
- Use relaxation techniques such as deep-breathing, visualization or tensing and releasing exercises before and/or during the exam
- Don't waste energy worrying, doubting yourself or wondering how others are doing. Pay attention to what you can do now

Make sure you are answering the question:

- Make certain that you fully understand the test directions before attempting to solve problems or answer questions
- Read each question carefully

and completely before marking or writing your answer. Re-read the question if you are not totally clear on the meaning

- Try not to read more into the question than is there, or to expect trick questions
- Check to make sure you have all the questions done before you hand in your exam.
- Ask your instructor for help in interpreting a test question that is unclear or ambiguous. He will probably want to clear up the misunderstanding for everybody if the question really is confusing or misleading.

For Problem/Formula questions:

- Write down hard-to-remember formulas, equations and rules before you actually begin working on the test problems
- Identify the type of problem to be solved
- Think about the process needed to solve the problem and outline your method
- Underline key facts and then plug them into the process
- Cross out facts once you have used them
- Do your calculations carefully
- Check to see that you have answered the question that was asked, and that you have used the correct units.
- Make sure to show all the steps in your work; you may get partial marks even if your answer

is not correct.

• Take the time to write legibly and make your corrections, if any, as neat as possible. Most instructors react subjectively to the appearance of papers to be graded, so let neatness work for you rather than against you

For Short Answer/Essay questions:

- Read the question twice to make sure you are clear on what the examiner is asking
- Underline key words to make sure you interpret the question correctly
- Outline your answer; consider all points
- Develop each point as it refers to the answer

For multiple choice questions:

- Anticipate answers before you look at the multiple choice selections
- Read over all of your options

 Eliminate highly implements.
- Eliminate highly implausible answers
- If you must guess, keep in mind the following tips for multiple choice exams
- Quite often lengthy or highly specific answers will be the correct choice
- Be aware of extreme words like "always", "never", "only", "must", "all", "none" and "completely". These are usually the wrong answers since there are many exceptions to rules

- Answers including the words "seldom", "generally", "most", "tend to", "usually", and "probably" are often correct
- If two answers are similar, one of them is usually correct. As well, if two answers are opposite one of them is usually correct.

Should I change my multiple choice answers?

The popular belief that "your first hunch is your best hunch" is wrong. Research has shown that changes from wrong answers to right answers are at least equal, and probably improve your test scores. However don't change your answer unless you have a convincing reason to do so. And if you know that you have changed a lot of your initial answers to wrong answers in the past, stick with your original answer.

Remember to give yourself a pat on the back for a job well done. You have likely put in long hours and pushed yourself to the limit. Physically and mentally you will need some time to unwind and recuperate. Plan something to look forward to when finals are over.







really good" (Larissa), and "Great stage presence and a very strong voice" (Ron).




Distribution Manager (\$400/month)





Cam Tait Inspires at NAITSA Awards

As the end of the school year races closer and closer, award season across many campuses is in full swing. I, along with my Nugget colleagues was invited to the 5th Annual NAITSA Awards.

Walking in, it had the typical "social event" feel. A lot of people who make way more money than me sitting close to the front, and everyone else was enjoying the spectacle of the night.

After cocktails and an incredible dinner, the event kicked off with NAITSA Admins Rita Cain and last-minute emcee Chris Chelmick cracking jokes and bombing the occasional one-liner. After regaining a bit of focus, the show was underway.

Tait graduated from NAIT Radio and Television, and soon after began working as a volunteer sports writer. His work began

to peak the interest of employers, including the Edmonton Journal for which he continues to write some twenty years later. He takes little credit for his amazing accomplishments though. Rather, he modestly downplays his story by showcasing those who helped him along the way.

In his speech to the captive NAITSA Awards audience, Mr. Tait attested his entire success to two things: support from his family, and that small group of volunteers which helped him so many years ago. We soon learned that the same group of volunteers grew, and became a number somewhere in the hundreds.

It was at that moment we were invited to take thirty seconds to think of a volunteer who changed our lives. That brief moment of silence, which felt like an eternity, showed everyone in the room just how easy it is to give a little time. Mr. Tait then broke it down.


