Entering the new year, there remains the cynical belief among some that College athletics offer little excitement for the casual fan. This year, nothing could be further from the truth, as shown by the action in the NAIT Arena last weekend.

On paper, our Ooks entered with the advantage. Second place overall, and holding a prior 12-2 home victory over the visiting Vikings, the odds were in NAIT's favour. However, the continually improving Augustanians came

to the Ook barn with full intent to make up for the early-season loss.

The Augustana assault began early, thanks to the efforts of Viking Neil Spiller, who snuck past returning NAIT tender Tim Barlow within the first 1:03 of play. The Ooks would manage to retaliate eight minutes later, as Blair Rota played pick-up to give Jeff Ainsworth NAIT's first strike.

Second period action was scattered, as frustration surfaced and both sides began their penalty collections. This time, NAIT's Dustan Heintz took the lead, thanks to a setup from Rob Ziemmer and Ooks' scoring leader Andy Penny. Then came the turning point, thanks to Viking Ross Neven's breakaway. The penalties weighed against NAIT, and allowed a power play goal by Augustana's Ryan Trotter, breaking the tie and giving the visitors the edge. The Vikings' momentum provided another crushing blow, as forward Brad Trautman got credit for the unassisted goal with 2:41 remaining.

Third period, Augustana continues the slaughter, thanks to yet another early goal, this time from Darren Cameron. The

Vikings' final nail in the Ooks' casket came at the 17:47 mark, thanks to a tight squeeze past Barlow by Marcus Ryan.

By now, with only minutes left in the game, the dark cloud of a loss should have been enough to kill any hopes by our home-ice heroes, but the Ooks would refuse to go down without a fight. 48 seconds left, and a beautiful one-timer executed by Clint Atkinson thanks to setup from David Quaschnick kept hopes alive. Following face-off, Ooks Real Bourbeau and Scott McDonald almost duplicated the feat, but fell just wide of the Augustana net. After the final buzzer, the tension that consumed both sides finally materialized in the form of a centre-ice skirmish between NAIT's Bryce Mawbey and Augustana's John Heinen. Also on the rap sheet, Augustana's Rob Riddell earned a game misconduct for a slash, said to be the trigger for the post-game shenanigans.

The passion both sides demonstrated through the game served as perfect example of the desire to claim the top seat in the ACAC.

"Obviously both teams are very proud, and they have a lot of pride in what they wear on their shoulders," commented Vikings

Ready they were. The following night, NAIT and Augustana battled to a 3-3 tie, adding yet another captivating angle to this year's men's hockey season.

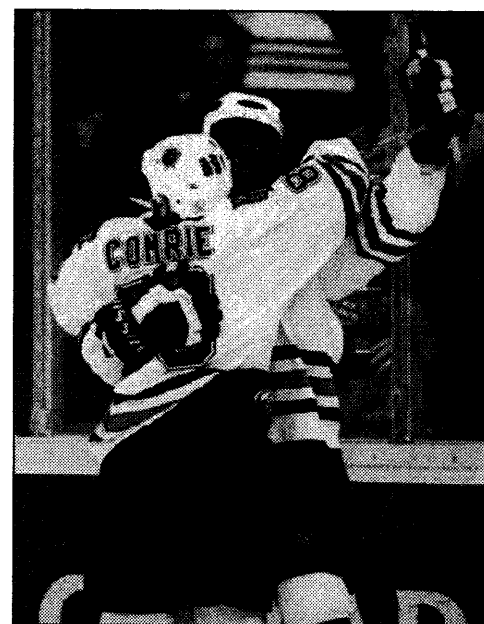

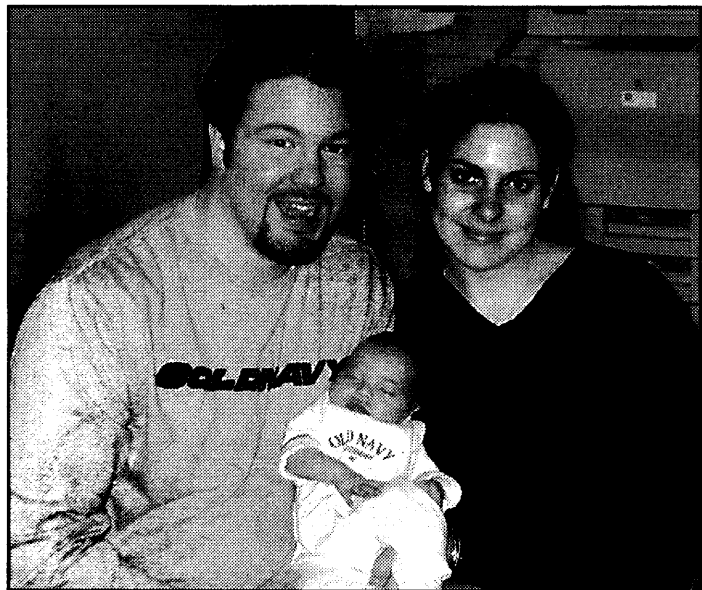

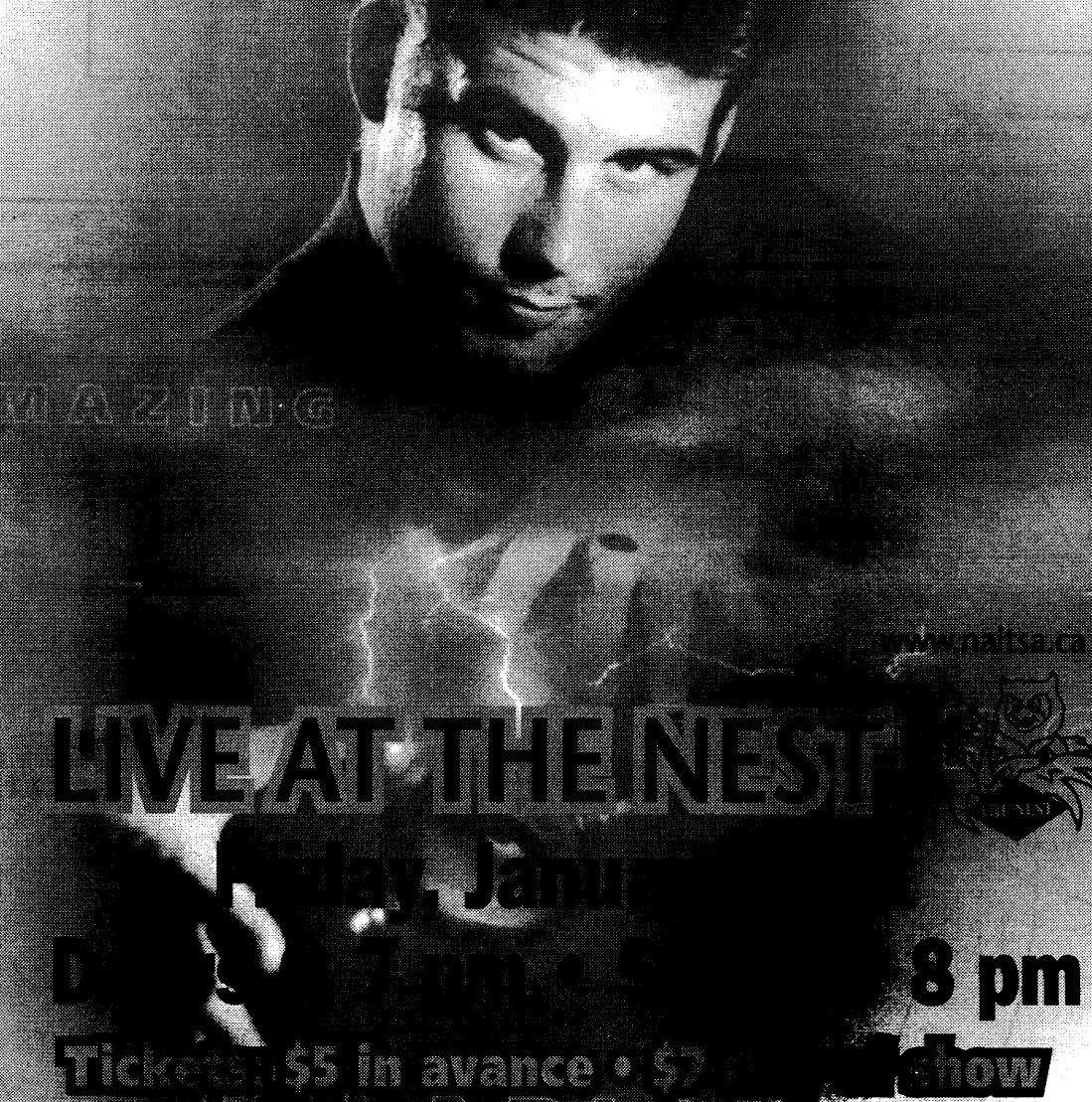

pain and returned to the line up shortly after. The biggest killer for the Ooks was the amount of fouls plaguing key players. Lorraine Stelck,

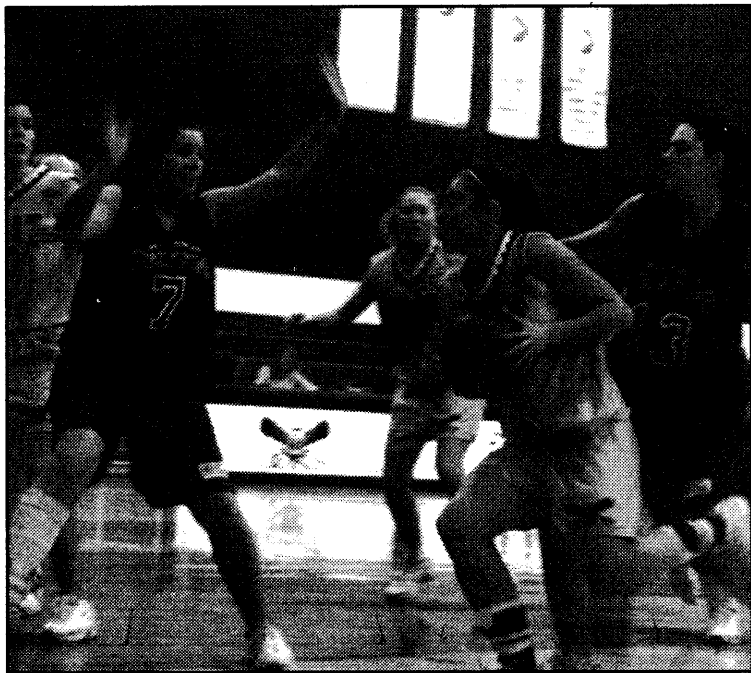

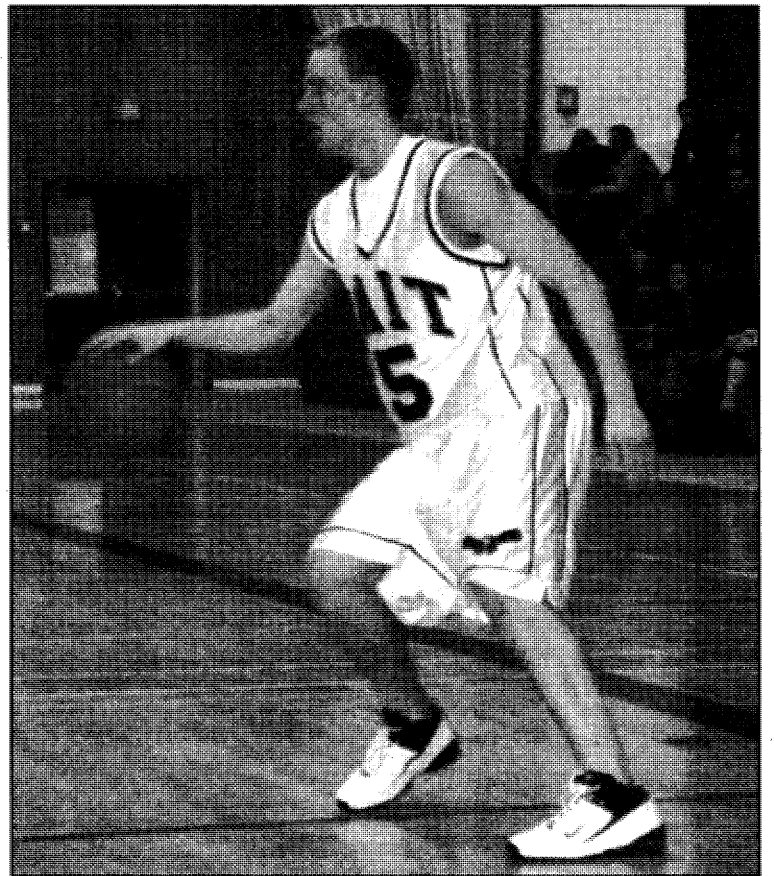
