RAITSA Elections

The March 13th NAITSA election was quiet, with around a 14% voting turnout from the eligible student population. However, this is an increase from the 9% voting turnout last year. This year saw 16 candidates which was also an increase from last year, when there were nine candidates.

The year 2003/04 will see the return of three current NAITSA Executive members, and the introduction of two new members.

Jeremy Coules, this year's VP Communications, will return as NAITSA President next year. Wade Babiuk will return as VP Academics and Trevor Bannert will return as VP Activities.

Jeremy Coules will be replaced by Terence Fitzgerald for the VP Communications position, and Francisco Sarango will be the newest VP Operations.

The year 2003/04 will see the return of three current NAITSA Executive members, and the introduction of two new members.

The races for the positions of VP Communications, VP Operations, and VP Activities were "yery intense", and very close. Wade Babiuk was unchallenged for the position of VP Academic.

Both Harmen Van Andel and Allison Williams were voted to the Board of Governors with overwhelming support, It will be Allison's second year on the Board of Governors.

The election party started at 5:00 pm at The Nest, and the winners were announced shortly after 7:00 pm. Cam Baker was MC of the short program, and expressed his thoughts of the positive experience he had as VP Operations, and his sadness with not joining the NAITSA Executive next year (Cam was not a candidate in the election). He introduced Chris Chelmick, NAITSA General Manager, who was in charge of managing the election, guiding the Elections Committee and Chief Returning Officer (CRO), and overseeing the counting of the votes. He, in turn, introduced the CRO, Diana Patonn.

Diana announced the winners of the election. "I am impressed with the number of candidates and the quality of the candidates," she said.

The NAITSA General Council meeting was held again on Tuesday, March 11th. NAITSA Executive is encouraging more technologies to attend the last few General Council meetings of the semester so that the quorum of 20 technologies attending will be met. The meetings will involve budget approvals.

Friday, March 14th, was an exciting day for many students and instructors from the Materials Engineering Technology. Heather Addley and Mark Koens, from InTech Supplies, Ltd., were on hand to present the 1st and 2nd year students with an Epoch 4B, a device used to detect imperfections in metals.


The Epoch 4B is on loan from InTech, so that students can learn how to use the technology currently available in the industry. Alex Hadzariga, a second year student and president of the Materials Engineering Society, believes that this will not only benefit their program, but the students as well.


Mark Koens, a graduate from

the program only two years ago, got involved in the project because of his belief that every student should have access to industry

A demonstration of the capabilities of the equipment was quick. In a matter of minutes the machine could calibrate itself and measure accurately whether it is a thin piece of metal or a large piece, and determine where there was a flaw in the metal sample. This small device is useful in manufacturing and inspection, because of its ability to detect the slightest imperfection. This is important because when metals are under pressure, a change in the material could result in a major accident.

The Epoch 4B is worth \$15,000 and weighs only 5.7 pounds. This piece of equipment is valuable to the Materials Engineering Technology because of its quick and practical applications in the classroom.



Online courses and course materials are becoming more and more common. With online materials you can work at your own pace, review, correct and repeat information if needed, get regular feedback on your performance, spend more time on difficult topics, and work at times that suit you best. Here are some tips to enhance online learning. Posture

- Pay attention to how you are sitting and whether you are experiencing discomfort.
- Make sure you are seated directly facing your computer screen with your keyboard directly in front of your monitor. Your monitor should be at least an arms length away and you should not be looking up at it.
- Keep your head balanced over your neck and shoulders. Many computer users work with their

head forward. Your head weighs about 15 pounds and can soon cause back problems if not kept in alignment.

- Adjust your chair to the appropriate height. If it is not adjustable use pillows.
- Take frequent breaks to rest your eyes. Look away from the screen and into the distance or at an object several feet away for 10 seconds every 10 minutes.
- Blink often. Dry eyes can result from prolonged computer use, especially for contact lens wearers.
- Keep moving. Stretch, wiggle, and get up occasionally. Reading on-line
- Change the font (size or type) to a setting that is less tiring on your eyes
- Skim the material first to get a general idea of the main ideas.
- Familiarize yourself with the web site(s) for your course. The home page, navigation bars and frames will give you an idea of areas covered and format of the material. If there is a site map use it to get an overview of the site.
- If you have difficulty reading from a computer screen, skim the

material first then decide what parts you want to print. Printing everything will probably be overwhelming.

Some web site documents have links throughout. Instead of opening the links as you read (which will interfere with the flow of the document), read the entire document first, and then go back and decide which links might be useful.

Note Taking

- Open your word processor while online and to make your own notes, record your ideas, or cut and paste important text into the word document. (The Alt and Tab keys help you switch easily between Internet and word).
- You may want to print sections for when you cannot read online, such as when you are on the bus
- Handwriting short notes while reading online material can help with retention.
- Beware of plagiarism. When you are cutting and pasting materials that you might use in a report or the address (URL) of the site and the date you accessed it. Informa-

tion you've copied from the Web must be credited.

Keeping In Contact

The familiar face-to-face communication of the classroom is replaced by online communication when taking courses completely online. It is important to maintain contact and have a sense of belonging to a class.

- You will likely contact your instructor by e-mail when taking on-line courses. Make sure you keep in contact, and ask any questions you have about the course.
- If there is a chat-line or web page for the class, keep connected in that way. Use it to post questions or discuss concepts while reading the material.
- If there are conferences as part of your course be sure to participate

Enhancing Learning

- Find out what the course schedule is, what the course requirements are, how you will be assessed, and how you can access help if needed.
- When a technique is described an assignment make sure you note on a web page, immediately try it out to reinforce learning (i.e. if describing a window's application

do it)

- If there are review questions or self-tests try them after reading a page or two of material. Ensure that you understand the material before moving on.
- Bookmark sites you want to refer back to. Don't depend on your memory
- Have a local copy of the web pages on your hard drive to allow faster movement between web pages. There is caching software available on the web to assist with this method.
- Make a schedule. Because you may not need to attend classes and because deadlines may be flexible, online courses can be easily put aside. Web courses often require that you adhere to the course schedule for you to benefit from the course material and discussions. If there is no course schedule, make your own deadlines and schedule regular times to work on the course material.



It just so happens that your husband picked a field with a lower starting wage...there are many other programs that offer a starting wage for apprentices at what I quoted and higher.

I really like my "factual errors". I had said that apprentices get to claim EI, and most of them do. You agreed with this, I don't know what kind of error I made. As for the "four week waiting period" I don't know of anyone who doesn't have to wait for a cheque from the government.

With your concern over the Health Care premiums, I don't know what kind of coverage you have. Maybe you have a family and a bunch of kids; maybe you have vision coverage, ambulance, accidental dental care, semi-private and private hospital rooms, home nursing care and maybe

even accidental death benefits. All I know is that my plan is mandatory because I don't have comparable coverage, and I am still not covered for MANY things and I am only 1 person. \$206 to me is a great deal of money. But go ahead and pay your \$2,664 per year, because that is YOUR choice.

As for all of your other ramblings, your numbers don't jive and you have basically lost the whole point. The \$16,000 is what the government chips in for your husband to have an education, that's fine by me. They chip in around \$10,000 for me to be here.

About all of your husband's tools, I visited www.tradesecrets.org, and they stated that "beginning in the 2002 tax year, there are new tax deductions for the cost of new tools for registered apprentice vehicle mechanics." It sounds to me like he can claim the cost of buying tools to further his career and education. Check out the website, it is run by the government of Alberta

If the purpose of your article was to tell me that apprentices pay more, or are suffering from the costs of education....whatever. All students are facing tuition increases across the country. There is less funding out there for us younger people as the boomers start to age. Money is going into health care (we hope) and there isn't enough for everyone.
