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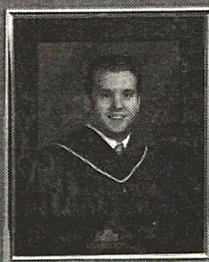
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Lost in the Stars at the Odyssium

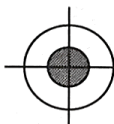

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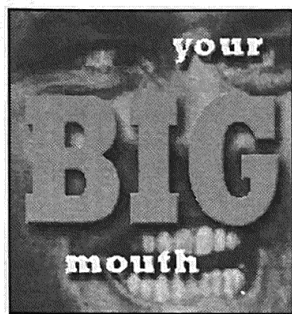

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With all the media hype about gay marriage, I thought I would put in my two cents worth.

At what point do we decide if peoples' "lifestyles" are right or wrong? That has been a conversation that has come up a few times with different people that I know. Really it all stemmed from the

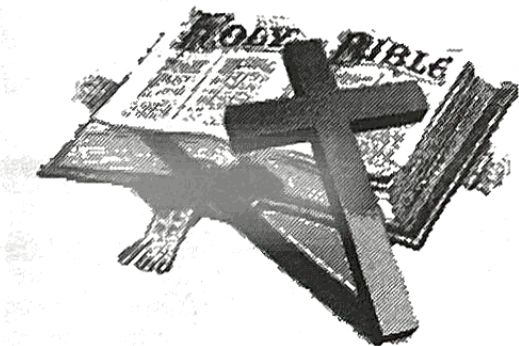

I know everyone is getting prepared for mid-terms; once again it's that time of year. But if you want to take a break for an hour or two, here are a few great ideas for you all to spend your time.

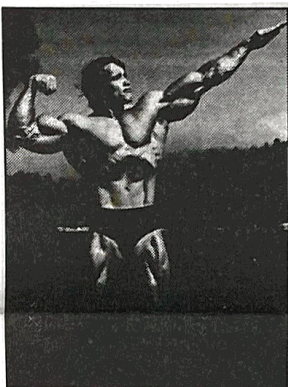

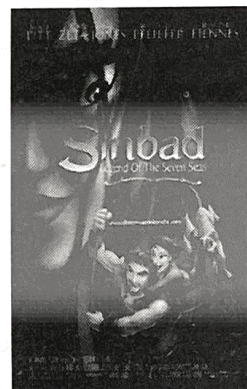

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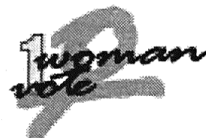

DMX "Grand Champ"

In the summer of 1998, DMX released an album called "It's Dark and Hell is Hot". The sound of the album was new to the mainstream's ears. It made everybody who was sick of hearing Puffy and Mase on the airwaves take notice, and

Barlow (self titled)

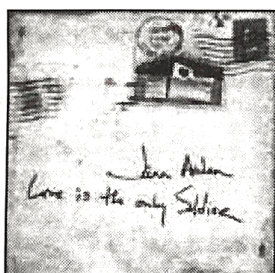

fight for jurisdiction becomes a real fight.

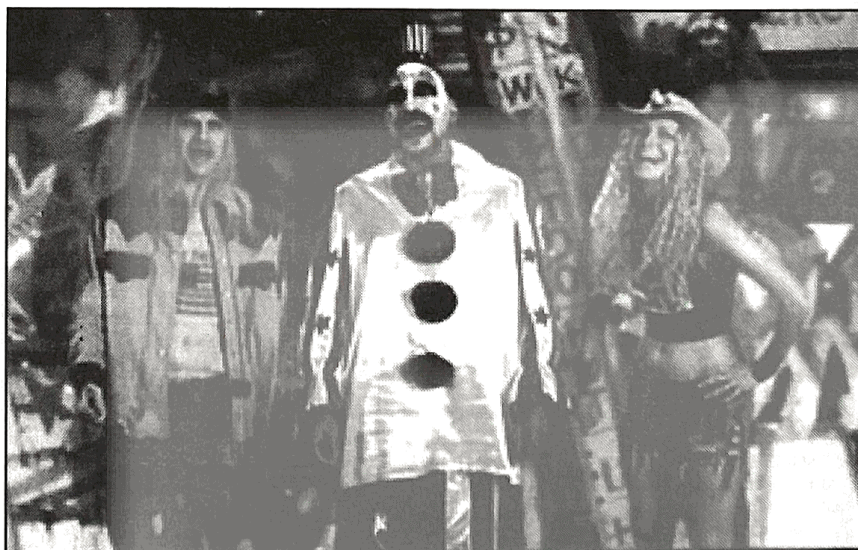

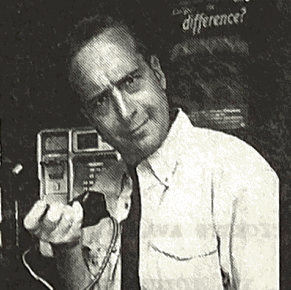

It really is no wonder insurance rates keep going

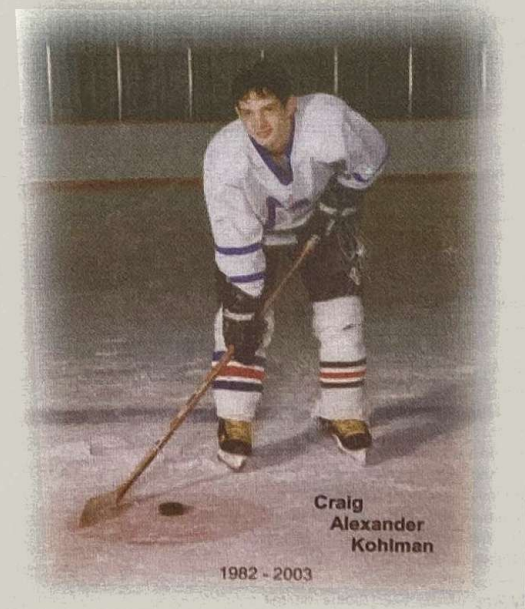
