

NAITSA is now part of the Deregulation
Nation. On Tuesday, NAITSA joined the Alberta
College and Technical Institute Student Executive
Council, otherwise known as ACTISEC. NAITSA
President Jeremy Coules felt it was time to
become more politically involved for the students
they represent.

"...[It's] very important for us to stop sitting on the fence and time for us to be proactive, as far as education costs and other student issues go," says Coules. A controversial education Bill (Bill 43) was a major factor for joining ACTISEC. The Bill would allow for possible dissolution of Student Unions across Alberta. NAIT President Dr. Sam Shaw had words of encouragement for NAITSA possibly joining ACTISEC, "I think whether they join or not join, it's the students' call. But again, either way they are showing true leadership."

Currently, ACTISEC represents one hundred thousand Alberta college and technical students at 14 institutions. For more information on ACTISEC visit www.thenugget.ca

GC gave NAITSA the go ahead to join ACTISEC, which will cost our student's association \$10,000, but will also give us a voice the provincial government will listen to.



Also, your student representatives of the Academic Council were voted in by your tech reps. There are five of them, and they will sit in on the meetings alongside the student chair (your VP Academic, who the students will vote in October 9th). The Academic Council is the highest decision making body here at NAIT where students have equal representation, and some really good discussions take place in these meetings that have to do with policy making (or reforming), funding for equipment for various technologies, and many other topics that affect your academic life here at NAIT. If you have any academic concerns, make sure your VP Academic is aware of them so that he or she can take them to the meetings and put them up for discussion. Have a good Thanksgiving.

Thanksgiving is comingup fast and what comes to mind? TURKEY! A lot of us are fortunate enough to have a family dinner to go to, where everything will prepared and cooked for you.

But for the rest of us, who have neither the time nor the money to visit home for this holiday, it generally becomes a date with Hungry Man Microwave Turkey Dinner. But what if you're craving genuine turkey? The instructions aren't on the side of the package like the TV dinner. For those of you who want turkey but don't know where to start, I have found a wealth of knowledge over the past week that might be useful

You can find the following information at www.kraft.ca.

- 1. Buying: Buy one pound per person. You may want to buy a fresh turkey, as opposed to frozen, to avoid days of thawing.
- 2. Thawing: Thaw turkey in unopened wrapper, breast-side up, on a tray in the refrigerator. For every four pounds of turkey, allow one day of thawing.
- 3. Preparing: REMOVE neck, excess fat, and giblets from chest cavity. Rinse cavities and outside turkey with cold water. Blot with paper towels. SEASON cavity and area under the skin with salt, pepper and

herbs. Try poultry seasoning thyme, sage or marjoram, STUFF the bird with prepared STOVETOP Stuffing Mix. Help turkey cook evenly by making it as compact as possible. Tuck the legs into the ring of skin that they were

- roasting pan and roast at 325°F for about 20 min per lb. or .5 kg. CHECK bird after indicated cooking time. Thigh juices should run clear, not pink, when pierced with a fork, and leg joint should move freely when cooked.
- Carving: Carve turkey in the kitchen, not at the dinner table. A cutting board and tray will allow you to carve without juice leaking all over. STEP 1 - Start by removing wings. STEP 2 - To remove legs, pull back leg to expose the joint while you cut. The cut through the joint. STEP 3 - Cut each breast off the turkey in a whole piece. Make an incision on either side of the breastbone and cut along ribs until breast is free. Remove any other large portions of meat still attached to the bones. The remaining carcass can be picked apart the next day for use in sandwiches or soup. Simply wrap-up in aluminum foil and refrigerate.

After all that effort, you and celebrate at McDonald's.

Thanksgiving | Enhancing Your Self-Esteem

People with high self-esteem have positive yet realistic views of themselves and their situations. They trust their own abilities, have a general sense of control in their lives, and believe that they will be able to meet most of their goals. High self-esteem means accepting yourself for who you are, and not depending excessively on the approval of others in order to feel good about yourself. People with high self-esteem take reasonable risks and do not feel they have to conform to the expectations of others. Typically people have areas where they feel confident (such as academics or social relationships) and areas where their self-esteem is not as high (such as personal appearance and athletics).

Lack of self-esteem is not necessarily related to lack of ability. It is often the result of focusing too much on the unrealistic expectations of others and setting unrealistic standards for performance. Self-esteem is developed as you are growing up and is affected by the messages you receive from parents and peers. We usually carry the messages we have learned as children into our adult lives. However you can improve your self-esteem at any time of your life. Just remember that change takes time and work. Be patient with yourself. Here are some strategies for enhancing your self-esteem:

- Identify your self-defeating thought patterns and work towards changing them.
- ☐ All or Nothing Thinking. "I am a total failure when my performance is not perfect".
- ☐ Magnification of Negative/ Minimization of Positive. Expecting that things always go wrong is a common attitude. A single negative detail, piece of criticism or comment colors all reality. Good things don't count nearly as much as bad ones. "She didn't say hi to me so nobody likes me". "I got five A's but the one C really shows my abilities".
- ☐ Jumping to Conclusions. Concluding things are bad without any definite evidence.
- □ Emotional Reasoning. "I feel ugly/stupid/unpopular so it must be true".
- □ Overemphasis of "Should" "Shoulds" distract Statements. us from identifying and fulfilling our own needs, abilities, interests "Should" and personal goals. statements are often perfectionistic

reflective others' expectations rather than our own.

- ☐ Labeling. Instead of saying "I made a mistake and I can learn from that", saying "I am a loser and it is all my fault."
- □ Difficulty Accepting "You like this Compliments. outfit? I think it makes me look fat."
- 2. Emphasize your strengths. Give yourself credit for everything you try. By focusing on what you can do, you credit yourself for efforts rather than emphasizing end products. Accept current limitations and learn to live with
- 3. Develop your skills. Learn and practice the skills that you feel you are lacking and would add value to your life.
- 4. Set realistic goals. Establish goals on the basis of what you can realistically achieve. Break your goals down into small steps and then work towards completing each step. To strive always for perfectionistic absolute goals such as - "Anything less than an A in school is unacceptable" - invites stress and feelings of failure.

Set realistic goals. Establish goals on the basis of what you can realistically achieve. Break your goals down into small steps and then work towards completing each step.

- 5. Take risks. Approach new experiences as opportunities to learn rather than occasions to win or lose. Expect to make mistakes as part of the process; don't be disappointed if you don't do things perfectly. Feel good about trying something new, making progress and increasing your competence. Taking risks opens up new possibilities and can increase you sense of self-acceptance.
- 6. Experience success. Seek out and put yourself in situations in which the probability of success is high. Look for projects that stretch - but don't overwhelm your abilities. Allow yourself to acknowledge and feel good about your successes.
- 7. Use Self-Talk. Stop listening to your negative inner "critic". When you notice that you are doubting or judging yourself tell yourself "stop" and substitute

more reasonable, self-accepting and supportive messages. For example, when you catch yourself expecting perfection, remind yourself that it is unrealistic for anyone to do everything perfectly.

- 8. Respect your own needs. Recognize and take care of your own needs and wants first. Identify what really fulfills you - not just what is immediately gratifying. Respecting your deeper needs will increase your sense of worth and well-being.
- 9. Solve problems. Don't avoid problems and don't stew over them. Face them, identify ways to solve them and act on your solutions. Procrastination lowers self-esteem.
- 10. Make decisions. Practice implementing making and decisions. Trust yourself to make good decisions and to deal with the consequences.
- 11. Be assertive. looking after your own needs while being respectful of the needs
- 12. Rely on your own opinion of yourself. Evaluate feedback from others, but do not rely on or put too much weight on their opinions. Depend on your own values in making decisions and deciding how you feel about yourself and what is right for you to do.
- 13. Let go ... of the past, ... of unhealthy relationships, ...of anger you are holding onto.
- 14. Love yourself. Spend some time pampering yourself and treating yourself like your own best friend. Stop comparing yourself with others and accept yourself for who you are.

And remember - there is only one person who can really improve your self-esteem - you! You have the choice to move forward or stand still, to be positive or negative, to be happy or sad. You have only one life to live and the choice of how to live it is yours. "Today is yours to make it whatever you want it to be" - H. Johnson




Soundtrack – "Bad Boys 2"






