


The Computer Commons in the HP Centre is open for students 24/7.




There also the Tech Store in the HP Centre for all of your computer needs. If you need an upgrade, servicing, CD-RWs, or whatever, check them out.

## Sports Editor (\$350/month)

They are also responsible for collecting the Ook Of The Week nominations, the ACAC Stats, and reporting on upcoming NAIT sporting events. This also includes fan bus trips for away games.

## Features Editor (\$350/month)

The Features Editor is responsible for researching and writing weekly features that would appeal to the general student body.

## Photographer (\$250/month)

The photographer is responsible for finding pictures as well as taking pictures for each of the writers' articles each week. They are also responsible for looking after the film as well as the digital camera equipment and should have a working knowledge of Photoshop. It is important that the person in this position have a very flexible schedule.

## Distribution Manager

The Distribution Manager is responsible for delivering the newspaper to the various distribution boxes on Main Campus, the new HP Centre, and the Annex. They are also responsible for putting up and taking down posters on all three campuses throughout the week.

There are other duties not listed, but expected of each position. Ideal candidates would be people who are open-minded, team players, patient, and have a good

grasp of the English language. They must also like to write and have a fairly flexible schedule to attend regular weekly staff meetings and various media events.




