Tomorrow's the big party, but if you happen to be staying at home, I've scrounged-up a few spirits to keep you company. (Halloween brew recipes from Scott Cunningham's collection, enjoy!)

The Drunken Pumpkin:

- 1 pumpkin
- Apple cider
- Cranberry juice
- Ginger ale
- Rum

Slice off the top of the pumpkin. Scoop out seed and clean out pumpkin as thoroughly as possible. Pour roughly equal amounts of apple cider, cranberry juice cocktail, ginger ale, and rum into the pumpkin until full. Then pour liquids back out of the pumpkin and into a saucepan. Warm until just boiling. Refill the pumpkin with the liquids and serve immediately.

Samhain Cider:

- 3 oranges
- 3 teaspoons whole cloves
- 1 gallon apple cider

- 1 teaspoon cinnamon, ground
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg, ground
- 1 cinnamon stick
- 1 cup orange juice (optional)

Wash the oranges well, then stud them with the cloves. Pour the cider into a large pot and warm over low heat. Add the studded oranges, cloves, cinnamon, nutmeg, and cinnamon sticks. Let simmer uncovered for 13 minutes. Add the orange juice, if desired. Serve in mugs.

Witches Brew (one serving)

- 1 10-ounce tulip glass
- Crushed ice
- ¾ ounce of light rum
- ¾ ounce of dark rum
- ¼ ounce orange curacao
- Sweet and sour
- 2 ounces orange juice
- 2 ounces pineapple juice
- Grenadine
- Pineapple wedges (fresh if available)
- Maraschino cherries
- Toothpicks

Fill the glass with ice. Add the light rum, dark rum, curacao, sweet and sour, orange juice, and pineapple juice. Top with a dash of grenadine. To garnish, spear fresh pineapple and red cherries with a toothpick.

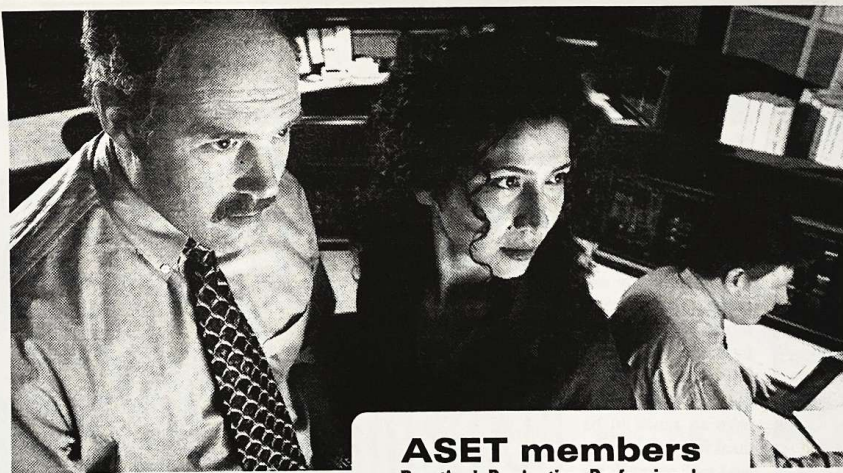

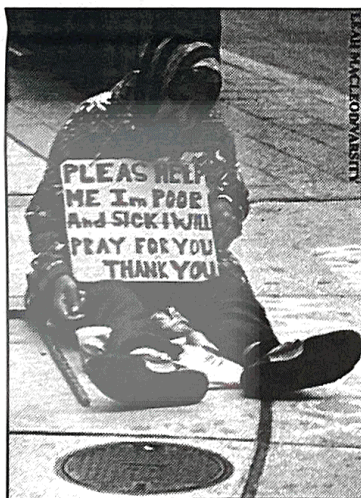

So now I have no choice but to pay the fees or have my account frozen. I guess the moral of the story is; don't trust any money you get from your educational institution.

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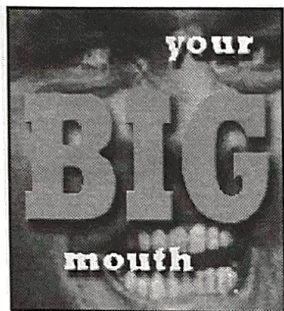

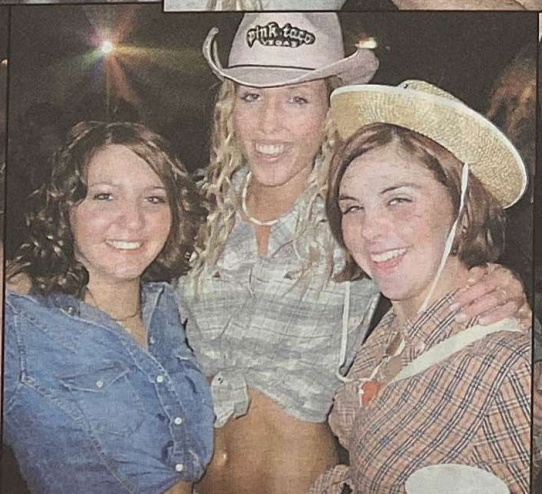



Finally, check out WWE Confidential this Saturday on Spike TV, as they will be paying tribute to Stu. 'Til next time...

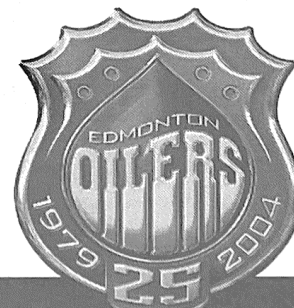

You work as a team (teamwork) to plan an event (organization) where you can raise some money. You contact the media (verbal communication, interpersonal) and although it takes a lot of time and effort (good work ethic), you are able to present the SPCA with a substantial cheque. Afterwards, you go over the entire process (analytical) and write up a report of recommendations for next year's class (written communication). See how that works? Try to put yourself in situations (working, volunteering, or even doing schoolwork) where you are able to develop these skills.

The next step is to ensure that you remember these skills when it's time to write up your resume and cover letter as well as when you get an interview. This will help separate you from all of your competition in that search for a job. We can help you with this at Career Services. Of course, you don't want to sacrifice your grades for a few new skills. The secret to avoiding this will be balance: manage your time effectively, keep ahead of your schoolwork, and know your limits. So, get involved with something! You'll have a good time, meet some new people and improve your chances of landing that great job.

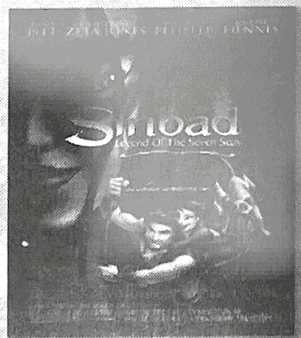

EXPLORING E-TOWN

Part 1, Whyte Avenue

Winter is coming, and it's easy at this time of year for a student to catch a case of the blues, especially if you happen to be new to the city and perhaps don't know too much about what is going on around you. Luckily, Edmonton is a big city with lots to explore,

on 82nd, called When Pigs Fly. It's a store that is full of character, and happens to be celebrating its 15th year of business this year. It carries an array of trinkets and things that you would never think to look for, but can't live without once you have found them. Another store full of trinkets of a bit of a darker nature is The Sanctuary, which is just off of Calgary Trail South and Whyte. The theme of the store is occult, but they stock many neat things to look at. This

seeds; "Pickled Pepper", which has hot pepperoni, banana peppers, pepper corns, mushrooms and a spicy sauce; and "Cornald Sausanager", which features corn, Bavarian sausage, cheddar cheese and red peppers. It's pizza like you will never experience it anywhere else. Of course, if you're scared of new things, or just in for a more traditional slice, Chicago Deep Dish Pizza has some of the best slices in town and you can find it just off of Whyte Ave, on Calgary Trail South.

There are also numerous "classic" restaurants on and around the strip of Whyte Ave. The Keg is nearby, for the timeless steak dinner. There is also a place called Chianti's, that features the best pasta in town (yes, it is better than the Old Spaghetti Factory) and the perfect wine to compliment your chosen sauce. There are numerous sub, burger and donair joints, all with their own specialties, all very worth checking out. There are also several coffee bars that are worth checking out. One such place is Naked on Whyte, a cyber café with a friendly atmosphere, and over 20 computers to choose from (they are \$6 an hour). Not into the internet café idea? There's a wicked place just off of 109th Street and about 87th Ave (by the Movie Studio) called Remedy. This is one of my favourite places in the whole world to go, grab a cup of coffee, and relax. They have bar stools at the window, facing the 109th Street traffic, as well as tables to sit at, and a comfy couch and a chair at the very back of the café, complete with coffee table – the perfect place to lounge. 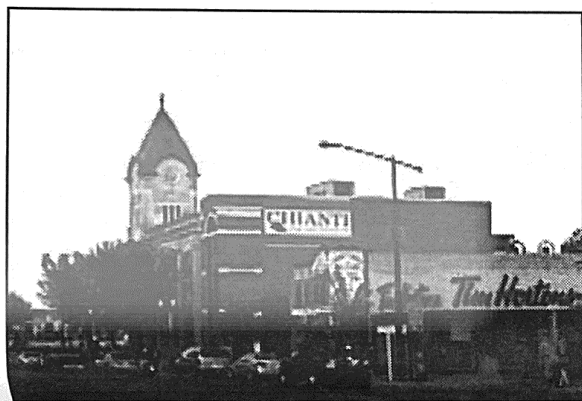
Whyte Ave and food definitely go hand in hand. I can't even begin to list the wonderful places that they have to eat or just grab a quick snack at. From elegant, to

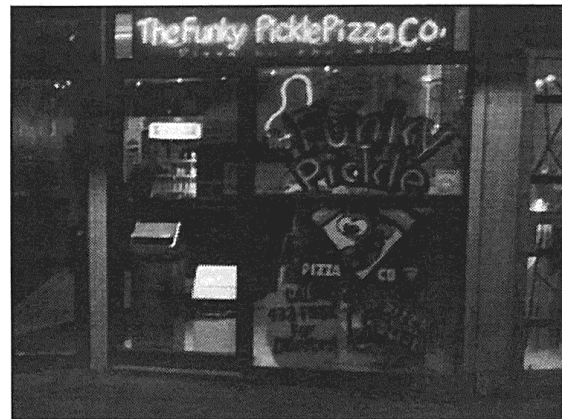
SHOPPING

Walking down 82nd Ave, as well as a few blocks in any direction, will bring you on a journey past a ton of stores, one of which is bound to have what you're looking for. One of my personal favourites is right

There are a ton of little shops in this area selling products ranging from clothes, to art supplies, or flowers to musical instruments. Whatever your need may be, chances are you can fulfill it on the Ave.

EATING

Everywhere you look on this strip of the city, food is calling your name. There is something for every occasion, whether it be a snack, meal, or a coffee you're looking for. One of the most popular places to "grab a bite" on Whyte is the Funky Pickle Pizza Co. Their menu features pizzas such as "the Funky Chicken", with chicken, snow peas, peppers, bean sprouts, and toasted sesame



your evening and early morning hours on the Ave. Want to see a live show? Blues on Whyte (the Commercial) is always a good place to go for the best Blues in Edmonton. Starz on Whyte can usually offer you a good punk/metal show at least once a week also, along with the many other pubs/bars that become venues quite often throughout the week – there is always live entertainment somewhere on Whyte Ave. There are a few pool halls, and usually somewhere to sing karaoke on any given night.

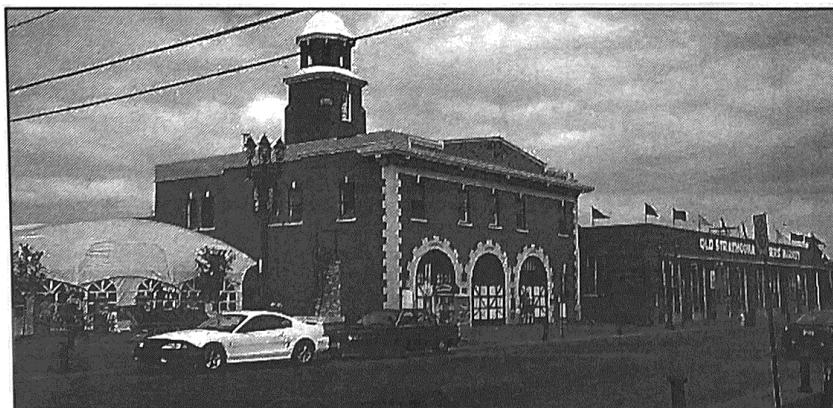
Whyte Ave is the best place in the city to bar hop because of its mix of clubs and pubs. The atmosphere in every bar you enter is different from the one before. If you are going to spend a night out here, these are some places I recommend checking out: the Iron Horse, 8101 103rd Street; Julio's Barrio, 10450 82nd Ave (the best iced and shaken drinks in town); O'Byrne's Irish Pub, 10606 82nd Ave; Squires, 10505 82nd Ave, The Black Dog, and, well... just about any bar that you pass on the street is probably worth checking out.

OTHER

Although just a walk down this stretch of the city is entertainment in itself, there is so much more that Whyte Ave has to offer. In time for Halloween there is Edmonton Ghost Tours, a walk through Old Strathcona with a guide who will point out all of the historic buildings down the avenues and alleyways, and tell you stories of hauntings and the unexplained. Tours run Tuesdays to Thursdays in the month of October, last about an hour, and

river until about 1940. It features floor and balcony seating, and is an experience worth having. Also in Old Strathcona is the Walterdale Playhouse, rumoured to be one of Edmonton's most haunted buildings. It is celebrating its 45th season this year, and always has something new and interesting going on. There's also Garneau Theatre, which is off of Whyte Ave., on 109th Street. This is the place to go if you're into independent films, or flicks that aren't exactly mainstream. Another benchmark year happens for the Strathcona Farmer's Market, which celebrates its 20th year in operation in 2003. It features hundreds of booths selling things such as fruit, bread, perogies, cabbage rolls, samosas, jellies, and homemade crafts, clothes and jewellery. You can find the building at 10330 84 Ave, but the Market is only open on Saturdays from 8 am to 3 pm.

If you haven't had a chance to check out Whyte Ave yet, get on it ASAP! There is so much to do and see – even if you just walk down the street with a friend and grab an ice cream cone, I guarantee that you will have a unique experience. Whyte is a little avenue in a big city that has more soul than can be found throughout all of Edmonton. There isn't another place like it, so take advantage of it while the weather is still nice. I hope this guide helps you explore the Ave. A little bit, but there's nothing like hands-on experience. So get out there and explore, because you've only got a week until Part 2 comes out and we explore the Downtown core.

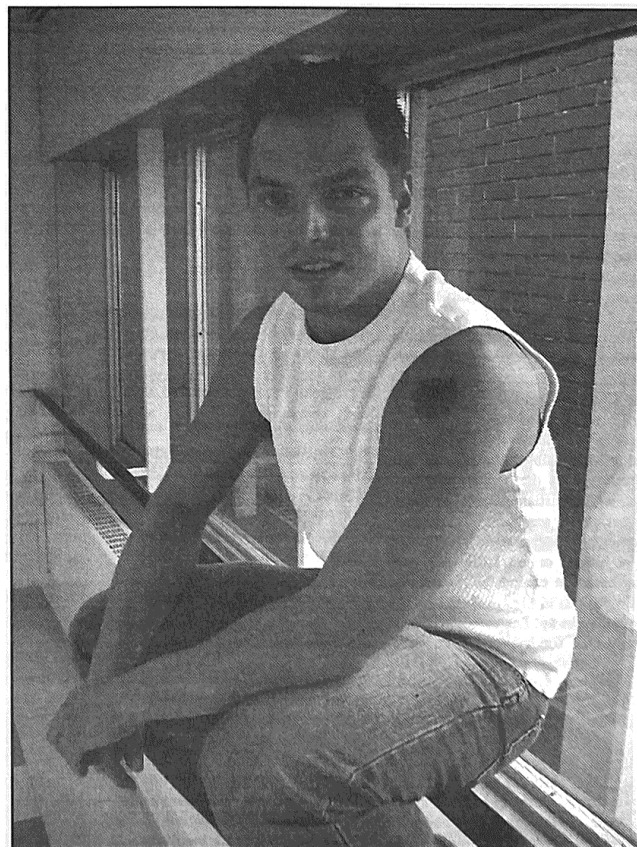
