Dog on campus...and on duty!

Well, NAIT, be on the lookout for a seeing eye dog on campus. Yeah, he's a cute dog and all that,

but whatever you do, don't pet him. See, the seeing eye dog is on the job, and if you start scratching his ears, well, you are breaking his concentration. That means you could be putting someone at serious risk.

"Guide dogs are working dogs," says Ellie Shuster of the Canadian National Institute for the Blind. "So if you want to approach one, the first thing you do is ask the person he's attached to." If the

person says yes, and removes or drops the dog's harness, then it's OK. But if he doesn't, then don't push the guy. "It's absolutely up to the the owner," says Shuster.

It's absolutely imperative, though, that you not break the dog's concentration. "When you distract the dog while he's working, what you actually do is place the blind person in jeopardy," says Shuster. "Because the blind person is relying on that dog to avoid obstacles,

and to be on task, or just making sure it avoids other people. And when you distract the dog, you pull it off task and it could go anywhere. It could go across the street to talk to you." That's not good.

So, when you're around the campus and you see any seeing eye dogs, please. Be mindful, be careful, and be sure to talk to the owner first to see if it's OK to pet the dog.

Some Facts About Seeing Eye Dogs:

- Seeing eye dogs are usually German Shepherds, Labrador Retrievers, and Golden Retrievers.
- Dogs are colour blind and can't read traffic lights. So how does a dog know when to cross the street? Well, it's the owner and the dog working together. The owner will listen to sounds of the traffic, and when the owner thinks it's OK, he tell the dog to go forward. But, if it's not safe to go, then the dog won't budge. This is called "intelligent disobedience."
- The average work span for a seeing eye dog is 7 or 8 years. Retired dogs are usually kept as pets.

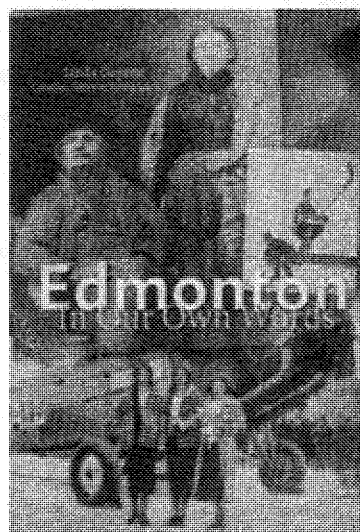

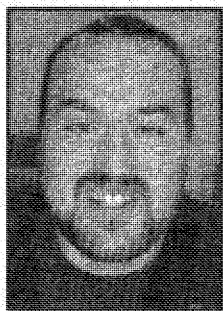

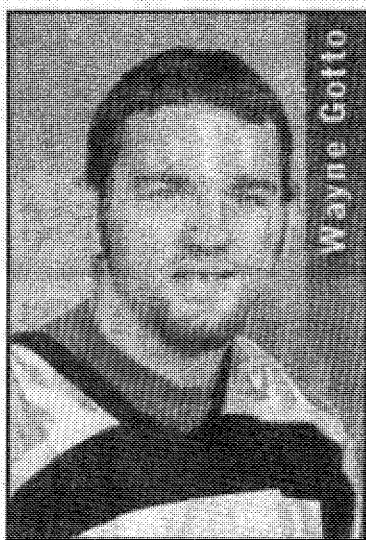
A small-town hockey player from Raymore, Saskatchewan, Wayne Gotto definitely adds character to the Oaks' hockey team.

Saturday evening was a much different story, as the Ooks began the game with an obviously cocky attitude. 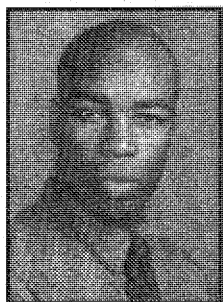

Let's not forget some of the much-desired software found in labs that are located here:

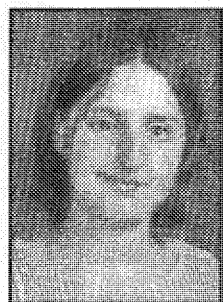

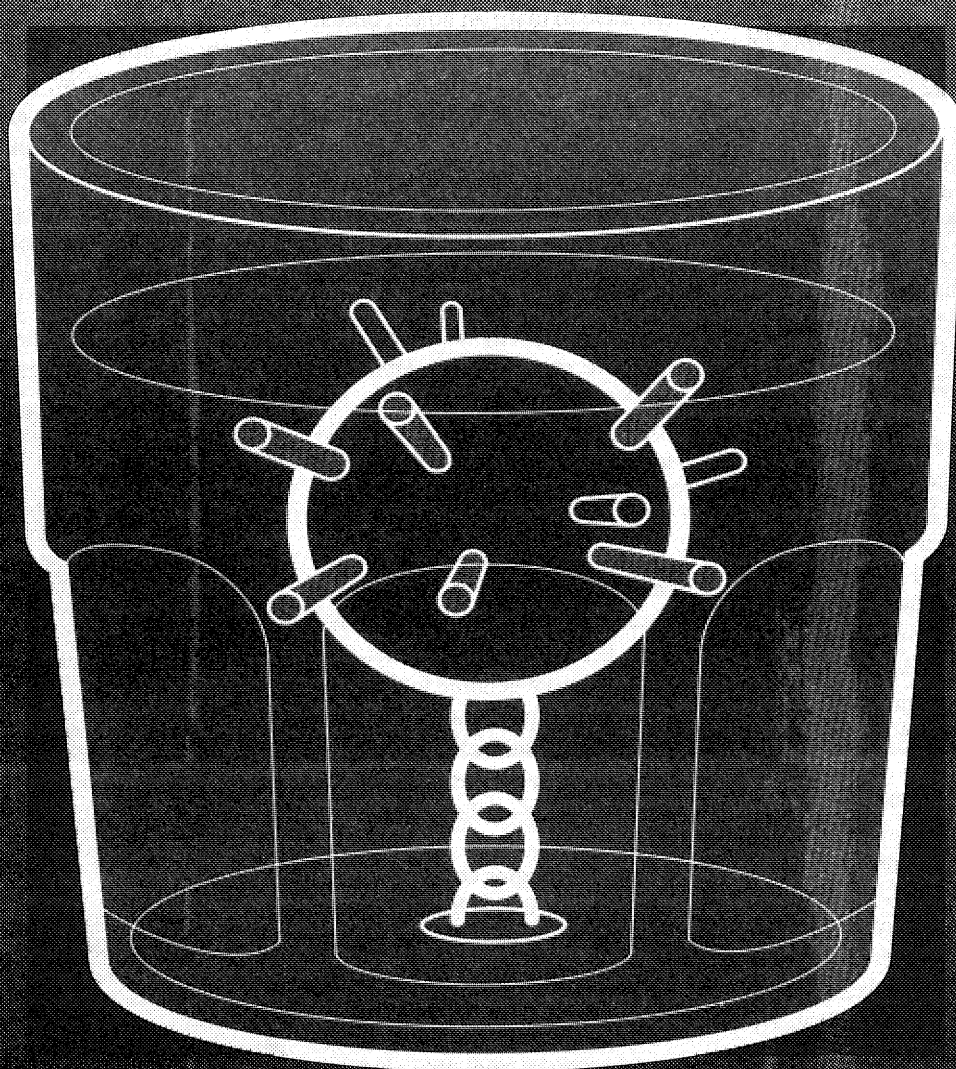

Bridget Jones: The Edge of Reason (14A)

They've done it again. Why? I'm not really sure. It certainly wasn't necessary. In a streak of merchantry intellect, Beeban Kidron and Universal Pictures combined their wallets for what surprisingly became last weekend's biggest film, *Bridget Jones: The Edge of Reason*. For some, it was a much awaited sequel to a girly favorite. I said *some*. I actually had to rent the first one the day I want to see it since I'd never before been 'enlightened' by the original. Believe me; it's not like Kill Bill. If you haven't seen the first one, don't bother seeing the second one. You'd be more out of place than President Bush at a gay pride parade.

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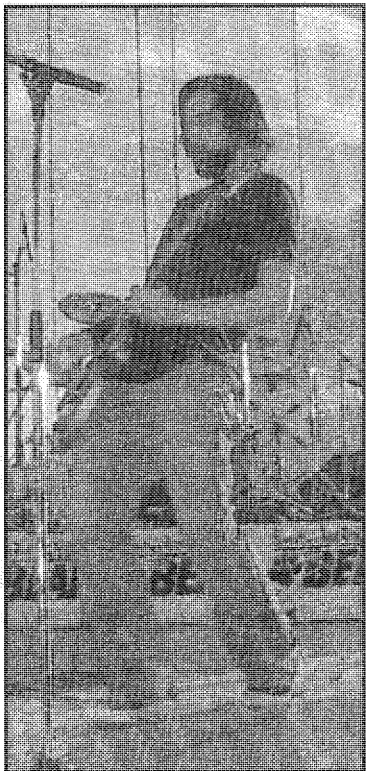

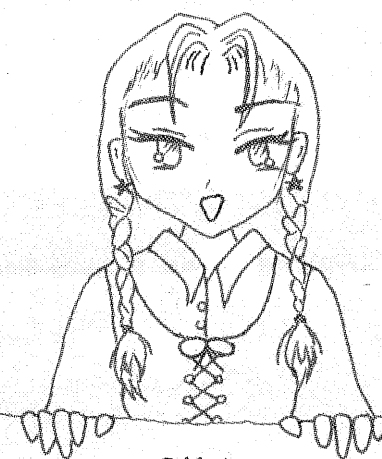

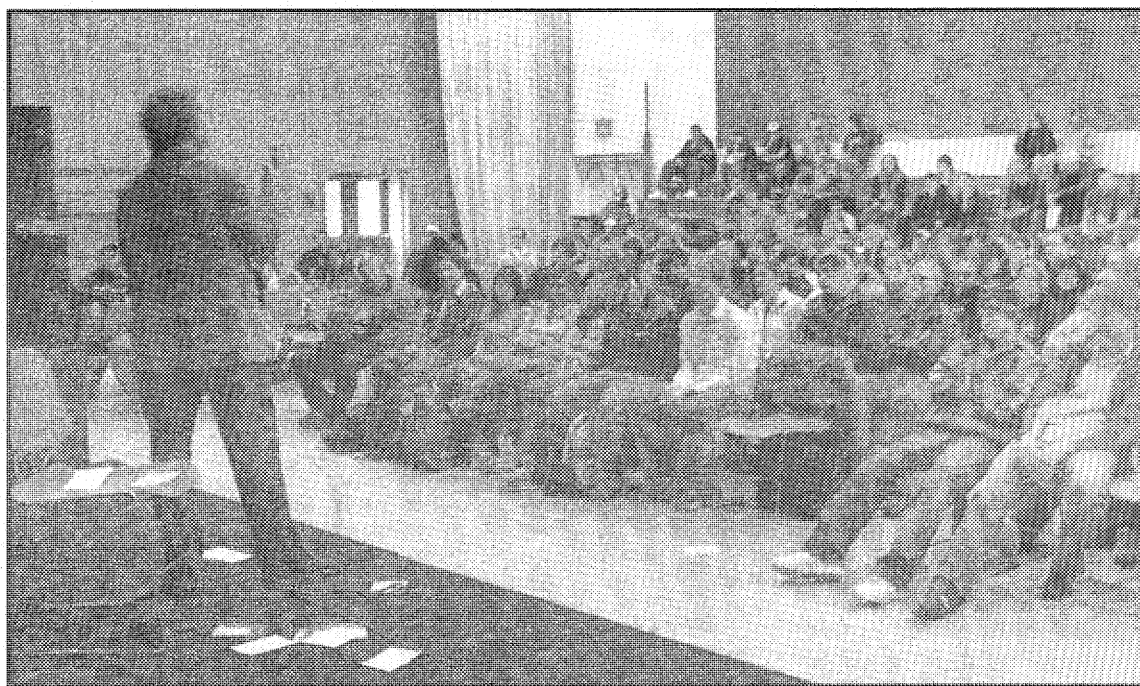
Sue Johanson sex-ucation stimulates students
