NAITSA is doing what they can to both deter theft and accommodate student requests. NAITSA President Dwayne Williams has spoken to the administration about putting security tags on the computers, and while it would be an effective solution, it's also a costly solution. NAITSA and the administration are working together to find alternative solutions. "Right now, [the administration] will send a program head from class-to-class, find out what kind of extended hours the students would like, and then have a lab monitor put into that time period to help support it," said Williams. But, right now, it is only a band-aid solution.



Democracy in Action!

The last NAITSA General Council meeting took place on October 12. As always, it was a rollicking good time of school politics. Here's the play by play:

- *** Addressing issues raised from the last meeting, NAITSA said that they'd raised the issue with administration about the security issues in the HP Centre, and in the whole school. NAITSA learned from the administration that security has been rather laid back over the years, but now they're working hard to improve it. Since current security measures include lab monitors on duty, NAITSA and the administration are working to extend the lab monitor time.
- The guest speaker of the night was Mike Stefan from NAIT Athletics. He revealed that one of the goals of NAIT Athletics this year is to try to get the students more involved in NAIT Athletics. He also announced that, this year, NAIT is hosting the CCAA Championship in Basketball. That's the national championship for college basketball in Canada. Last time NAIT hosted it was 1989, and NAIT took the title that year. That happens in March. The Ooks opening night bash is happening on the 22nd. Your \$5 admission gets you a free drink at the Nest, seats to the Ooks game, and into the after party at Cowboy's. The general consensus was that the best way to get students more involved with the Ooks is through a greater amount of promotions for the games.
- And don't forget, admission to all Ooks games is free, free, free.
- The major issue of the night was student fees at the St. Albert campus. NAITSA proposed raising student fees at the St. Albert campus from \$6/ year to \$187/year. The reason-

par with all the metro-area campuses (the Main Campus, Patricia Campus, Souch Campus). After some heated debate, the motion was passed, and the increase will go into effect in the 2005/2006 school year.

- Several technologies on campus would like to see lab time extended, so students can stay after school longer to work on projects. All technologies were encouraged to come forward with what hours they'd like to see the labs remain open, and NAITSA will see what they can work out with administration.
- The Meet and Greet is happening on November 2. This is an annual event in which representatives of various bars, pubs, and event venues comes to NAIT and networks with the various technologies. Essentially, that's when the bars try to make the best possible deal they can for your technology's events this year.
- Orientation for the technologies is happening on October 18, 19, and 20. This is when NAITSA helps out the technologies by showing them how to set up events, plan events, and all that stuff. Right now, no technology can book an event until they've had at least one representative go to at least one of the three seminars. Your rep doesn't have to go to all three; just one of them. So, urge your reps to go! (Of course, it'll have happened by the time this is published, so I hope one of your reps went.)
- Coming near the end of the meeting, NAITSA announced some of their upcoming events. October 21 is the Coors Light Maxim Party in the Nest. October 23 is Family Day, where students can bring their little siblings or kids down to the campus, and there'll be activities, games, and a showing of Shrek 2. \$2 to get in. ing was to bring St. Albert up to The NAITSA Halloween party is

St. Albert Joins NAIT Family

But St. Albert is now a satellite campus of NAIT. Students from St. Albert can access all the facilites at the main campus as easily as students from Patricia Campus and Souch Campus. That being the case, it was felt on the part of NAITSA that St. Albert should be paying as as much for student fees that students at all metro-area campuses pay.

So, for the 2005/2006 school year, the student fees at the St. Albert campus will be increased from \$6 to \$187.


"The fees have to be increased because usage of our facilites has been increased," says NAITSA President Dwayne Williams. "That means more Nuggets have to be produced, those Nuggets have to be sent to [the St. Albert] campus, handbooks had to be created for that campus...next year, the cost of doing all that will break our budget, and the money will have to come from somewhere. The only options were to either raise [St. Albert's] student fees, or to distribute it throughout the main campus."

This means that St. Albert now has many of the same opportunities that the main campus has. The increased student fees go into the Endowment Fund. This NAITSA fund that a portion of the student fees go into, and every year, the interest is scraped off and given away as scholarships and bursaries. "The people at St. Albert campus have the exact same ability to access all theses scholarships that we on main campus do," said Williams.

The jump from \$6 to \$187 may seem dramatic, but Williams says it's the best way. "We have to keep in mind that all the metro campuses are paying that fee. So it's not like we could increase it by \$25 per year or something. The cost will still remain. So, either [St. Albert's] fees would have to be brought up to the same as other students, or the other students would have to make up for [St. Albert's] slight increases over time."

So, it may seem like a big jump right now, but this will ensure equality among St. Albert students and the rest of us city students in the long run.

Adge: Mountain CREST is amazing! (Beer in stomach+running= BAD) I am so glad I am not drinking TNT tonight!




You've got to have respect for any film with a kungfu fighting, femalelead cast set in psychedelic Hong Kong.


Each night also hosted a different, but equally enticing soirce



appreciation for the theatre staff and festival crew who poured their hearts and souls into making this festival what it was. You're our heroes, and we will always be in your debt.









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


New music in the fall of 2004







