Blood Clinic Saved Lives



NAIT staff and students have just saved 240 lives! On Friday, Sept. 24, NAIT was host to a Blood Donor Clinic put on by Canadian Blood Services. NAIT has been hosting blood donor clinics since at least 1991. Over 100 people turned out, making this one of the most successful September blood donor clinics in NAIT history. Eighty units of blood were collected, and when you realize that one unit can save three people, that means that NAIT saved 240 lives on Friday. Seventy of those who turned out were first-time

donors, and Canadian Blood Services Community Development Coordinator Enrico Sirianni says that this is part of Canadian Blood Service's current strategy. With our aging population, Sirianni stresses that younger donors are needed. "This is all about people helping people," Sirianni said.

Canadian Blood Services would like to extend their thanks to all the NAIT staff and students who participated.

The next blood clinic here at NAIT will be on Nov. 19, but don't wait until then to donate blood. You can head on down to the Canadian Blood Services Centre at 8249 - 114 Street. They are open Monday to Friday, from 8 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., then from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m.

For the most part, Edmonton seems to miss out on many of the country's artistic tours, whether it be music, special events, or fine arts. I blame Calgary. Thankfully, this isn't always the case, and once in a blue moon the city is blessed with a highly reputable show. For the next two months, four Canadian artists have been brought together to showcase their kinetic





Millie Chen of Ridgeway, Ont. has introduced two new works specifically for the exhibit. The first consists of a peaceful white room with structurally patterned eucalyptus leaves nailed to the wall, haunted by a repeating motif chosen from Bach's Goldberg Variations. The fragrant scent released by the plant is not only soothing, but hypnotic in connection with the symmetrical arrangment surronding the enclosure. The second piece, Buzz Humm, is composed of 38 boxes lined across a wall, which resemble something


anyone this has inconvenienced, but we can't make this process any faster and you only have to do this once a year. If you have any questions, please call me or e-mail me and we can set up a meeting.
