You're sleeping in bed, the alarm goes off, you hit snooze and roll over. There's no need to rush to class, you have a parking permit, you were one of the lucky ones who met the 'special circumstances' and got that coveted, secure spot. Huh,?...that wasn't you. Then you'd better get up, and stop dreaming. The reality of finding a parking space is about to begin.

For many NAIT students, finding a spot can be a nightmare, afterall, and the number of students far outweigh the number of spaces. There are 18,300 full time students, and only 1,400 yearly permits, as for daily entry—a mere 923 spots. Hmmm, have you considered a bus pass? Full-time student Kris Bruckmann says it's the only way to go, "it's easier and I don't have to worry about having to park." Bruckmann, who is in Food and Nutrition Management, uses the bus even though he doesn't really like it, "there's a lot of standing and pushing and shoving, but it's cheaper." Computer Technology student Samantha MacDougall agrees. MacDougall says she can't afford her car, "parking, maintenance, and gas," she estimates it would cost her \$50 per week if she drove. MacDougall says the bus doesn't run when she wants it to, "if it ran when I was done, instead of just peak hours, it would be great, but..." a monthly student pass is only \$54, and you can pick it up at Campus Reads and Needs. It's easy to find your rouse, call transit information at 496 611, or go to www.takeETS.com and click away.

As simple as that sounds though, some students are still against public transit. Ronnie Morin, full time Business Administration student, says he likes to come and go as he pleases, "I don't want to wait 15 minutes to take a bus; it's more convenient to bring my car." Morin took 40 minutes to find a parking spot last Tuesday. Bryan Scriven, full time computer student says he has to drive, "because the bus service in Sherwood Park is horrible, it's about a 45 minute ride." Scriven says he usually comes early, because by noon-time spots are rare.

If you're caught up in this mess, and have struggled to find three loonies every day, there may be another solution besides the bus. Marie Essery, Parking Clerk,

says you can still get a permit for parking at the Municipal Airport—NAIT rents stalls from them to compensate for lack of parking on campus. Essery says there are about one-hundred spots left. "The cost is \$30 plus GST per month and includes a plug in (remember winter?). All the student is required to do is fill out an application form, we give them a parking permit and bus permit for the shuttle right away. The shuttle runs all day now approximately every 15 minutes starting at 6: 45 am and ending at 5:45 pm. It drops you off at the bookstore and picks you up there."

Essery says, "Parking Services tries to be fair to every student that needs parking. If you have a concern with any parking issue, please contact us at 471-7539," oh, and don't park at Kingsway Garden Mall—"they will ticket."

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

The kid that died had asthma. Which isn't that big of a deal right? Wrong! It's a big deal if







ACAC Championship run is Saturday, October 30, 2004 at Gold Stick Park in Edmonton.


