Get Motivated

It is not uncommon for students to start the semester full of energy, enthusiasm and great intentions. However a month or so into their program many students feel less than motivated. Here are some tips that might help get you back on track:

- Set realistic goals that are challenging yet achievable. Try setting goals for each day and each week as well as longer-term goals. Written goals are the most effective.
- Make a daily "to-do list" a checklist of what you can realistically accomplish. Prioritize the items from most to least crucial and always work on your most important tasks first, even if they are the most difficult or the longest.

down to do homework or to study (i.e. "by the end of this hour I want to accomplish ..."). This puts you in a competitive mode and stimulates you to stay motivated and focused.

- Get into a routine. If you start setting aside the same time every afternoon or evening for studying, it will become a habit within a few weeks.
- Know your body rhythms. If you are a morning person do your most important tasks in the morning - don't force yourself to do them at 11:00 p.m.
- Evaluate how long you can realistically concentrate (no longer than 50 minutes for most people) and make sure you take breaks when you need them.
- Specify a clear-cut goal you Get started on tasks early, the want to achieve before you sit day you receive the assignment if

hold cause guilt and de-energize you; getting started right away arouses your interest and gets your creative juices flowing.

- Work on building a positive attitude. Self-statements like "I'm too lazy", "I'm a procrastinator" or "I can't do this" can become self-fulfilling prophecies. So can statements such as "I am self-motivated" and "I love to learn".
- · Visualize yourself being successful. A clear picture of what success means can keep you going when your workload seems overwhelming.
- · Don't waste energy being negative and blaming yourself or others for how much work you have or for past failures. Negative energy makes it difficult to

- Concentrate on your successes and build on them. Evaluate areas where you could have done better, learn from them and change them into future successes.
- · Surround yourself with positive, motivated people.
- Set realistic standards. Being a perfectionist can de-motivate even the brightest of students. Decide how much time and effort each assignment is worth and allocate accordingly.
- If you are feeling overwhelmed If motivation continues to be a by a project or assignment, break it into smaller parts and focus on one part at a time.
- Set rewards for accomplishing difficult tasks or getting through learn and to be creative. Put your a study period when you aren't

motivated. Most people work best with positive reinforcement but for some people it is also helpful to set penalties for failing to follow through with tasks.

Interview Fashion 101

Skirt or slacks? Sweater or blouse? Tie or no? Flashy pink or conservative grey? These aren't the questions I ask myself before a hot date, but they are questions that interviewees ask themselves. When a first impression could mean the difference between your dream job and "Would you like fries with that?" it becomes important to consider what you're wearing.

My sister Liz experienced this dilemma a few years ago. She was about to graduate and was eager to land a good job. She had been doing all of the right things - networking, cold calls, targeting help her stand out? her resume - and finally it paid off. An energy company called her up to interview her for a lucrative internship. Liz was thrilled. The internship would give her experience in four key business areas and virtually guarantee her a permanent job if she wanted it.

She competed with 50 other candidates in a complicated interview process. First the company did a series of group interviews, had the candidates write a series of tests, and then invited them all out for a meet and greet with company executives. This winnowed the group down to ten, two of which would be chosen and, happily, Liz was one of the ten chosen to interview with all of the bigwigs.

At this point, she began to worry. The first stages had been rather surreal. She had just been herself, done her best, and maintained a pretty relaxed demeanour throughout the process. Now that she was within striking distance, she started to freak out. One concern she had was her attire. So far, she had dressed pretty conservatively, wearing dark pantsuits, minimal make up, and a conventional hairstyle. But would this

Everyone had an opinion. Our dad, who was a businessman, offered to take her shopping for a skirt and a brightly coloured sweater or blouse that the interviewers would remember. Unconvinced, mainly because she didn't usually wear dresses and skirts, Liz asked for my opinion. I asked her why she resisted such an outfit. She said that she felt uncomfortable wearing a skirt, was scared that she would fidget in it, and was worried about how to cross her legs. She also didn't want to get a job based on her

appearance in a hot pink sweater.

After thinking about this, I suggested that while she should dress appropriately, she should also wear something in which she'd feel comfortable. I told her to go shopping with Dad, but to buy something that she would feel good wearing. And she did - aclassy grey pant suit. She also got the job.

Don't get me wrong. It is very important to look smashing for your interview - make sure you shave, brush your teeth, iron your shirt, polish your shoes, skip the perfume or aftershave, maybe get a hair cut, and rid your jacket or skirt of all pet hair (and shouldn't we be doing these things everyday?) - but it is also important to be yourself. Wearing something completely out of character might hamper your interview performance - which is really what matters.

One suggestion is to think about what you'd wear on the job and then take it up a notch. For example, when I worked as a golf course landscaper, my work duds would be a t-shirt and shorts. But at the interview, I wore my

best golf shirt and a pair of tan pants, something I'd wear if I was playing the course, not mowing it. When interviewing for jobs where there's even a hint of professionalism, I wear my best pair of pants, navy blazer, and a lucky tie. Women have a bit more flexibility, but there are also more risks when it comes to the skirt length, colour of clothing, and accessories. It is usually best to err on the side of caution, but balance this by wearing something that will make you feel confident and comfortable.

In the end, it is you that matters, not your clothes. Do your best to look good, but don't worry too much about it. Spend your preparation time preparing, not primping. Once you get in the habit of dressing well for an interview, looking good becomes second nature and you can focus on wowing the interviewer with your skills and experiences. 



The NAITSA Elections are soon to be upon the institution. However not everybody knows exactly what the various positions for main campus NAITSA Executives are, let alone what they each are responsible for doing to help our fellow students have a great time at NAIT!

So here are the main campus NAITSA Positions (in no real order of importance), along with some of the duties that are listed in the bylaws and constitution:

President:

The leadership and supervision of the Vice Presidents and General Manager of NAITSA fall into this position's duties. As official representative for the Students' Association the President is responsible for attending all meetings and events on behalf of the students of NAIT.

The President must ensure that the Students' Association is always acting in the best interest of fellow NAIT students, and also sticking to the organizational goals.

VP Finance & Admin:

The acting Chief Financial Officer, the VPF&A is responsible for the financial affairs of NAITSA. This position must constantly keep updated on NAITSA's current budget and financial limits. The VP F&A also makes sure the technology clubs are remaining accountable to their fellow students, and is responsible for hiring temporary paid positions for NAITSA events and activities. The VPF&A is in charge of doing NAITSA daily deposits, as well as Technology Banking.

The VP F&A must make to least three presentations a year. One presentation at The Annual General Meeting where the VP F&A presents NAITSA Audited Financial Statements, and also presents NAITSA Yearly Budget for two readings to General Council.

NAITSA on Five

As the designated signing authority for NAITSA, this Vice President is all the acting President in the absence of the President of the Students' Association.

VP Campus Life:

As VP Campus Life, the main duties of this position entail support and administration of technology and student clubs, as well as the promotion and review of Campus Sport and Wellness.

Expect a lot of time and energy to be directed towards events and activities to which the VP has the responsibility and authority for planning. This position, while very "hands-on," is definitely one to which a large portion of social time (after school) will be devoted to events and their successful execution.

VP Student Affairs:

Vice President Student Affairs is responsible for assisting student with academic related matters. From in-class student grievances, to general gripes with the NAIT experience in general. This posi-

tion is key to NAITSA's keeping a pulse on the current issues surrounding NAIT and fellow student experiences.

The position is responsible for the generation of all NAITSA publications, along with giving direction to the NAITSA communications department. The VP Student Affairs will act in the capacity of Publisher of The Nugget (NAIT-SA's official student newspaper)

So, to those who were unsure of the duties of the NAITSA Executives before, those are the key areas of focus for the different positions. While on paper they appear fairly simple tasks, let's just say lack of sleep and latenight/early-morning meetings are common weekly occurrences!

Ooks Take Aim At Play-Offs

As the ACAC regular season comes to a close for many of our Ooks teams, all of our teams are in great position to grab a spot in the play-offs. Some teams have already clinched a play-off spot and are simply looking to improve their position, while others are in a dead heat to clinch one of the final spots left.

Our men's hockey team finds themselves three points behind the league-leading SAIT Trojans with two games at hand. The Ooks face the Concordia Thunder in a pair of games next weekend and finish off their season with two games against the GMCC Griffins. The Ooks are 1-1 against both the Thunder and Griffins so far this season. The Ooks can clinch second place with at least one win in the next two weekends; however, the Ooks will likely have to win all of their remaining games in order to clinch first place in the regular season.

The women should fulfill their goal this season of reaching the play-offs. The Lady Ooks can



The men's basketball team is four points ahead of Augustana for the





Every cabaret, every bake sale, every pub-crawl, every merchandise sale, every beer gardens, and






