Doks Face Rival Griffins II emi-Final Hockey Action

The Ooks' hockey club, who finished in second of the ACAC, prepare to take on the Grant MacEwan Griffins in a best-of-five semifinal series that starts tonight here at the NAIT Arena.

The men suffered a pair of disappointing losses to the Griffins to end their season and finished tied

in points with the Griffins. The over those four games. Ooks had the opportunity to finish in first, had they won the games; however, the two losses tied them with GMCC and the Ooks managed to finish second based on the tie-breaker system (the Ooks finished with one more win than the Griffins).

The Ooks now had a quarter-final bye and face the Griffins, who swept the Thunder in their quarter-final series. The Ooks have had serious trouble with the Griffins this season as the Griffins have won three out of four regular season games including both games at the NAIT Arena, one of which was the Ooks' guaranteed win night back on November 26th. The Ooks were outscored by a total of 16-12

The Ooks have excelled at home this season and, as the higher ranked team, will have home-ice advantage in the series. The Ooks will have to keep their intensity up at home as the Griffins are the second best road team in the ACAC this season.

Terry Ballard, ACAC Coach of the Year, has done an outstanding job with the Ooks. Ballard took a group consisting of many firstyear players and effectively built a brotherhood in a very short period of time. Ballard overcame serious discipline problems on his team and by the end of their regular season, the Ooks played responsibly and professionally.

The Ooks have had success on both sides of the puck and Tim Barlow has been solid in net for the Ooks this season. Tim Barlow, center Ben Stokes, forward Adam Ferrante, and defensemen Colin Johnson and Cole Fischer all received ACAC First-Team All Conference selections. The only question mark facing the team is the health of their star center Ben Stokes. Ben has not played since injuring his shoulder three weeks ago and may be out for the remainder of the season.

The Griffins match well with the Ooks both offensively and defensively. While the Ooks have relied on Barlow between the pipes, the Griffins have employed a goaltender by-committee system. The Griffins are the least penalized of all play-off teams and the Ooks may have a difficult time playing aggressively against such a passive squad. The one area that the Ooks are far superior in is their special teams. The Ooks have the league's best power-play unit, while the Griffins have the second worst.

If the Ooks can put their final regular season series behind them, they should perform well in the play-offs. The first game of the series goes tonight at 7pm at the NAIT Arena with game 2 tomorrow at Bill Hunter Arena at 8: 30pm. The third game will be played Saturday night at 7pm at the NAIT Arena.

Judging Your Behaviour, One Interview at a Time

If you have a job interview coming up, there's a good chance you might hear the following questions: "Tell me the hardest problem you've solved" or "When's the last time you dealt with a difficult customer?" or "How have you applied your school training to your work?" These questions are called Behavioural Descriptive (BD) questions because they ask you to describe your past behaviour. BD questions are asked increasingly often in interviews because your past behaviour tends to predict future behaviour. So, Mike Tyson will probably bite another ear, Jennifer Lopez will re-marry, and Donald Trump will certainly fire yet another annoying twit – possibly all on the same Fox reality TV show!

And in real reality, your ability to work part time, volunteer, and maintain honours standing at school will suggest to a future employer that you would also be able to multi-task, time-manage, and work very hard as an employee. There are other reasons, however, that BD questions are popular. BD questions force candidates out of providing generic answers - your story about your greatest success at work will be different than someone else's. Therefore, they make interviews more interesting for both interviewers and interviewees. It is also more difficult - and there is less necessity - for candidates to 1) Mention a specific situation -(how should I say this politely?) provide "creative" answers. In 2) Stress the transferable skills other words, more BD = less BS (to heck with being polite).

BD questions do, however, require more preparation than other ques- 5) Self assess - what did you tions. It is crucial to think about the job for which you've applied and


anticipate the type of behaviours they'll want to know about. For instance, if you are a CST student and you're interviewing for a software developer position, you might be expected to design programs, troubleshoot problems, assist clients, and work on a team. Therefore, you'll want to delve into your work, school, and volunteer experience and identify when you've demonstrated skills in these areas. Think of a likely question, such as, "Tell me about a time when you played a key role on a team," and then write down the situation using the following formula:

- refrain from generalities
- you employed
- 3) Describe the action you took 4) Explain the results - what hap-
- pened?
- learn? What would you do differently?

Use the acronym STARS to recall this formula when you're interviewing. People tend to be vague, not specific, about the situations they describe and forget to self assess, so try to remember these important aspects of your answer. A good interviewer might probe for more details, but it is better for you to be proactive. They'll be impressed by how you've learned from your mistakes and taken steps to improve.

The beauty of BD interviews is that they give you the rare chance to tell your story and talk about your accomplishments (and really, how many times in life do we get to do that?). If you prepare properly, you should come out of a BD interview feeling confident about yourself and your abilities. Want to know more about interviewing? 

Mid way through the ENTIRE week I had off school I made







Ooks Sweep Top-Ranked Kings To Reach The Final FOUR

A week after defeating powerhouse Lakeland Rustlers in back to back games, the Ooks again found themselves playing the role of giant-killers as they defeated the South Division champion Red Deer College Kings.

The Ooks opened their series at Red Deer on Thursday night. The Ooks began the series with high intensity and confidence and surprised many critics with an outstanding performance as they shocked the Kings 64-61.

Up by a game, the Ooks returned home to face the Kings in the second game of their best-of-three series. The crowd was, by far, the largest of the season and the fans definitely acted as a sixth man in this battle of David versus Goliath.

The action was very fast paced and both sides played very exciting ball. The Ooks continuously swapped leads with Red Deer throughout the first fifteen minutes of the first half. The Ooks then began to struggle when they were forced to sit a few key players after they had gotten themselves into foul trouble. Ooks allowed twelve unanswered points and finished the half down 35-25.

Coach Chuma Nwobosi settled his team down at half time and convinced them to keep playing their game and not give up. Those words provided much motivation for the team as the Ooks came out of the dressing room and dominated the entire second half of the game.

The Ooks incredible versatility as they were able to switch back and forth between man-to-man and zone defenses at key points in the game. The versatility of the team kept the Kings on their feet and provided confusion at times.

The turning point in the game happened near the 5-minute mark of the second half when Josh Melton was pummeled near midcourt. The foul set off emotions on both teams; however, the Ooks kept their composure and hit back to back three-point shots.

Shane Leman, who Nwobosi considers one of the best players he has ever coached, took charge of the team's offense and led them all the way back to tie the game at 55 apiece with five minutes left in the game. The Ooks continued their intensity straight through the final buzzer and won the game by a score of 61-57.

Shane Leman and Second-Team ACAC All Conference guard Mark Dorado played like champions and showed outstanding leadership and character throughout the game. Leman finished the game with 23 points, 6 rebounds, 6 assists, and was awarded player of the game.

The Ooks now turn their attention to the final four which will be held next Friday and Saturday at Grant MacEwan. The Ooks play their first game at 6:30pm Friday against the Lakeland College Rustlers. The ACAC Championship starts at 8:30pm Saturday. The Ooks will have to maintain their high intensity level and defensive versatility in order to compete against the Rustlers who are currently ranked 12th in the nation. Other teams in the final four are the host Grant MacEwan Griffins and the Concordia University College Thunder.

The Ooks host the CCAA Men's National Basketball Championship March 17th to 19th. Tournament passes are on sale now. The passes are \$25 for adults and \$15 for students. The athletics department has already sold over 1500 passes and a limited number are

WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL







Grog: Grog smash girl head.




