Last week an RCMP investigation revealed that the NAIT Student Association (NAITSA) executives were running an illegal activity ring though The Nest restaurant on campus.

The executive members would re-open The Nest during the wee hours of the evening allowing it to be home base for drugs, sex and gambling. "These individuals dubbed their location of illicit activity The Eagles Nest," said


the RCMP lead investigator Mr. J. Clouseau. Clouseau headed the investigation that has spanned over three years. "Let me just say this The Eagle has finally landed."

The investigation, which cost more than \$250,000.00, resulted in criminal charges being laid against three NAITSA employees, Dwayne Williams, David Veilleux and Mike Cristello.

All three have been charged under sections 92.5, 103.5 and 91.7 of the Canadian criminal code; Operating an Illegal Casino, Conspiracy Solicit Prostitution, Distribution of Illegal Substances.

The men were taken into protective custody Tuesday night but were released on bail the following morning.

"It's a disgrace. Our students trust NAITSA and these VP's abused their power," said a NAITSA spokesperson at an emergency press conference, "I assure all students that these individuals will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law."

Williams' and Veilleux's lawyers





take place in the toughest city in the world. Although the plot was simple, Max was completely awe struck with the graphic display of brutal violence in this film. This was the most violent film Max


is told that from those who do that Sin City fans with be ecstatically pleased with the directors interpretation, as Rodriguez held true to Sin City's characters, violence and ambiance.



How to Combat Exam Anxiety

Being anxious prior to exams is a closed. normal state. It motivates you to • Devise a system for practicing you lose marks even though you know you've studied and are well prepared.

HOW CAN YOU REDUCE • Learn relaxation techniques to EXAM ANXIETY?

While studying:

- rather than cramming.
- · Set study goals.
- · Build up confidence by reviewing the material frequently. Overlearning is the best insurance against going blank on an exam.
- Make sure you are "really" studying. Many students prepare for a test by reading their notes or textbooks. As you read along, you may feel that you know (understand) what the author is saying. Understanding what you are reading at the moment does NOT mean that you know it well enough to remember it for a test when the book isn't there to help
- Study actively by thinking of potential exam questions and the correct answers, and by making sure you can recite or jot down key concepts with your textbook

- stay alert and do your best. Exam rapid problem solving as part of anxiety, however, is the state of your review for the test. Being being so nervous during a test experienced at working under that you don't do your best and time pressure can help alleviate blanked out last time so I will exam anxiety.
 - Take care of yourself by eating a balanced diet, getting enough rest and exercising.
- use while studying and while taking the test, such as deep breath-· Allow yourself plenty of time. ing, progressive muscle relax-Spread review over several days ation, visualization, and positive self-talk). Counsellors at Student Counselling would be more than happy to work with you on improved stress reduction and relaxation techniques.

Prior to the test:

- If you have problems with anxiety, avoid caffeine (coffee, dark colas). Caffeine mimics and escalates the symptoms of anxiety.
- · Try not to study the same day as the exam.
- It is often helpful to go for a brisk 5 to 10 minute walk before the exam. This increases blood flow and gets you breathing deeply, thereby reducing stress.
- Arrive early enough that you can sit where you are most comfortable, get organized and avoid people who are anxious and might cause you to doubt your knowledge, but don't arrive so early that

you have a lot of time to let your stress build up.

· Do not let yourself get into a negative mindset such as "I always panic on exams" or "I blank out again". Instead think thoughts such as "I know my material", "I can stay calm and relaxed", etc.


During the test:

- Look over the questions to familiarize yourself with the test. Underline key words or phrases in the test directions. Many students with exam anxiety make errors because they don't read the question thoroughly.
- * Don't rush through the test, but work at a comfortable pace and don't worry about how far along classmates are.
- If you go blank, skip the question and go on. Find some questions you can answer.

- Sipping water or chewing gum can relieve tension for some stu-
- Regard a lapse of memory as perfectly normal; do not let it throw you into a panic. If you block on answering one question, leave it for a while and return to it later.
- Don't panic when you don't know an answer. On multiple choice eliminate options you know are incorrect and then make an educated guess. For other questions start writing what you know that is related to the question on a scrap of paper. This often triggers ideas that will help you find the answer.
- Use positive self talk. Come up with positive statements which help to keep you calm, such as "This is only one test," "I am familiar with this material," "I can do it", etc.
- Humour works to reduce stress, and to help with creative problem solving. If you are stuck, try thinking of the funniest thing that has happened to you in the last month. Another quick technique is to visualize a very relaxing place, such as a beach, and to imagine yourself at that place for 30 seconds.
- · Last but not least, don't forget to breathe. Taking 5 to 10 slow, deep breaths when you are feeling panicky doesn't take long but gets more oxygen to your brain, thereby combating stress.


You got some

Nestled in the heart of Old Strathcona lays an upbeat Canadian Style Pub by the name of Hudsons Canadian Tap House. The unique interior is laden with Canadian art and apparel, giving one quite a significant feeling of Canadian pride. The proud to be Canadian theme is nicely completed with the rooms' wooden tables, wooden plank flooring and large fireplace.

Hudsons menu choices include the classic pub fare, however for those who want to try something a little different, try the *Spicy Sausage Sandwich* (Spolumbo sausage topped with tomatoes, pizza sauce and melted cheese on a baguette) or the *Reuben the Great* (Shaved corn beef piled



on Alberta grown rye bread). My personal favourite is the Steak Sandwich (Alberta beef), which comes in at a very low price of \$5.99 for lunch.

Drinks come in all forms at Hudsons. Obviously beer is their forte. With 12 choices on tap the selections range from Grasshopper to Guinness. Ales, Lagers, Pilsners are all available. An interesting cocktail that peaked my curiosity was the *Hudsons Paralyzer* – a mix of Tequila, Kahlua, Milk and Pepsi served over ice. The hardcore boozehounds should consider checking out Schooner Nights (Saturday), where five dollars gets you 40oz's of the golden ale.


A rare treat at any pub style restaurant is good service. Hudsons management has obviously realized this and have made a conscious effort to provide excellent service to its patrons. "You can get a beer at any pub, but what makes it taste better is the conditions under which it is served," says Tracy Rohl of the Hudsons management team.

Although a casual lunch or dinner are excellent reasons to visit Hudsons, don't be fooled when Friday and Saturday evenings roll around. The room gets jam packed with people looking to have a good time. Music, drinks and dancing ensues all night long. In fact make sure to arrive early, as there is often quite a long line up at the door on Friday and Saturday evenings.

It depends. Many couples break up after such an event as a result of a lack of trust. Others choose to stay together and work it out. It is up to the individuals and the situation.


If you decide to fall into the second category there are a few things you should ask yourself:

A Season To Remember





Swimming


2004/05 was a character building year for the swim team as the team struggled against other ACAC powerhouses. The team can be proud for never giving up and representing the school with pride.

CNCFR Busts



Garth Brooks explains, "well it's bulls and blood, it's dust and mud, it's the roar of a Sunday crowd. It's the white in his knuckles, the gold in the buckle, he'll win the next go 'round. It's boots and chaps, it's cowboy hats, it's spurs and latigo. It's the ropes and the reins, and the joy and the pain, and they call the thing rodeo."

Northlands brings the balls-to-thewall Canadian National College Finals Rodeo (CNCFR) to the Agricom this weekend, for the first time ever Edmonton. Until this year, the event was hosted by either Olds College or Lakeland Regional College campus in Vermillion.

The effort, to bring the event to Edmonton, has been spearheaded by John Windwick, Northlands Park Director Responsible for Canadian Finals Rodeo. The event has been brought to the Agricom to compliment the Alberta Farm and Ranch show that runs simultaneously with the event. "This rodeo is a perfect fit with the Alberta Farm and Ranch Show," says Windwick. "Farm families are all here, and looking for evening entertainment. It's hoped this



venue and timing offers CNCFR a much higher profile to the event."

Top college contenders will be vying for championship buckles in ten events including the six major rodeo events - bareback, saddlebronc, steer wrestling, calf roping, barrel racing, and bull riding. To compliment these events, athletes will also compete in team roping, goat tying, breakaway roping, and pole bending.

Carla Rogers, the student director of the Canadian Intercollegiate Rodeo Association, is hoping that featuring this event in a bigger spotlight will keep some of the top rodeo athletes from heading south of the border. Currently, top Canadian rodeo athletes are enticed down to the U.S. by American colleges offering full scholarships and superior training facilities.


There is a serious lack of funding for Canadian colleges to even pay rodeo entry costs and travel costs for athletes to get to the events. "It costs \$300 a weekend," says Rogers. "Considering BSE has left most of our competitors strapped for cash, there are a lot of (athletes) who can't afford it."


"It's so important to see an organization like Northlands Park taking us under their wing and helping us in this way. Being in Edmonton at the same time as the Farm and Ranch Show means so many more people are going to see our sport. See the quality of competitors, and hopefully we'll see potential sponsors sit up and take notice," say Rogers.


NAIT's own Jordie Watson, who will compete for the bareback championship this weekend, is


Where the hell is it? The battle of the bands will be held at the granddaddy of venues. The Nest. This makes for a great venue, as it is an intimate venue.


