Police probe NAIT-area sex attacks

Edmonton city police are warning women to be on guard after 10 sexual assaults near NAIT's main campus.

The latest reported attack took place Oct. 7 at 9 a.m. while the woman, a NAIT student, was on her way to class.

"You don't know how you're going to react," said the victim Tanya, who wanted her story to be told so long as her last name was not used.

"I was on the sidewalk," said Tanya. "The guy came out from in between two buildings. He started walking towards me on the sidewalk. After he got a few feet from me, I noticed he had his hands around his crotch area."

"At that point, he opened his pants and he pulled out his penis," she said. "I froze."

"It was all very quick. He grabbed my butt and grinded himself against me."

"I pushed him off me. Then he ran back between two buildings, but he wasn't running, he was

actually like skipping. He was skipping and laughing."

She said no witnesses saw what happened. "The random part is that there was nobody around."

Police say they're looking for a person of interest in connection to the series of attacks including the latest.

He is described as slightly over six feet tall and very thin, bordering on gaunt. He's blond with short hair, no facial hair and was well dressed. He is believed to be between the ages of 20 and 30.

City police are investigating sev-

eral incidents in the area that took place between November 2004 and this month.

All other incidents are similar in nature and they all took place in the 118 Ave area.

"We're seeking everyone to be vigilant in the area," said city police Det. Dave Pelech. "We need help in trying to identify this person."

Tanya has a heart-felt message

for other women. "Keep your heads up. I'm worried we're all too comfortable. I don't think we should be paranoid, but just keep your eyes open."

Why should students contribute their time and money to this cause?

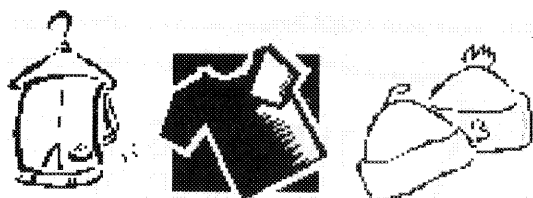
"I think that part of being part of a community is giving back," said Traci Toshack, NAIT United Way Campaign Chair. "Giving back is important because it helps our community as a whole."

The Vietnam example is an important one - the factors that came into play then still come into play with journalism now.

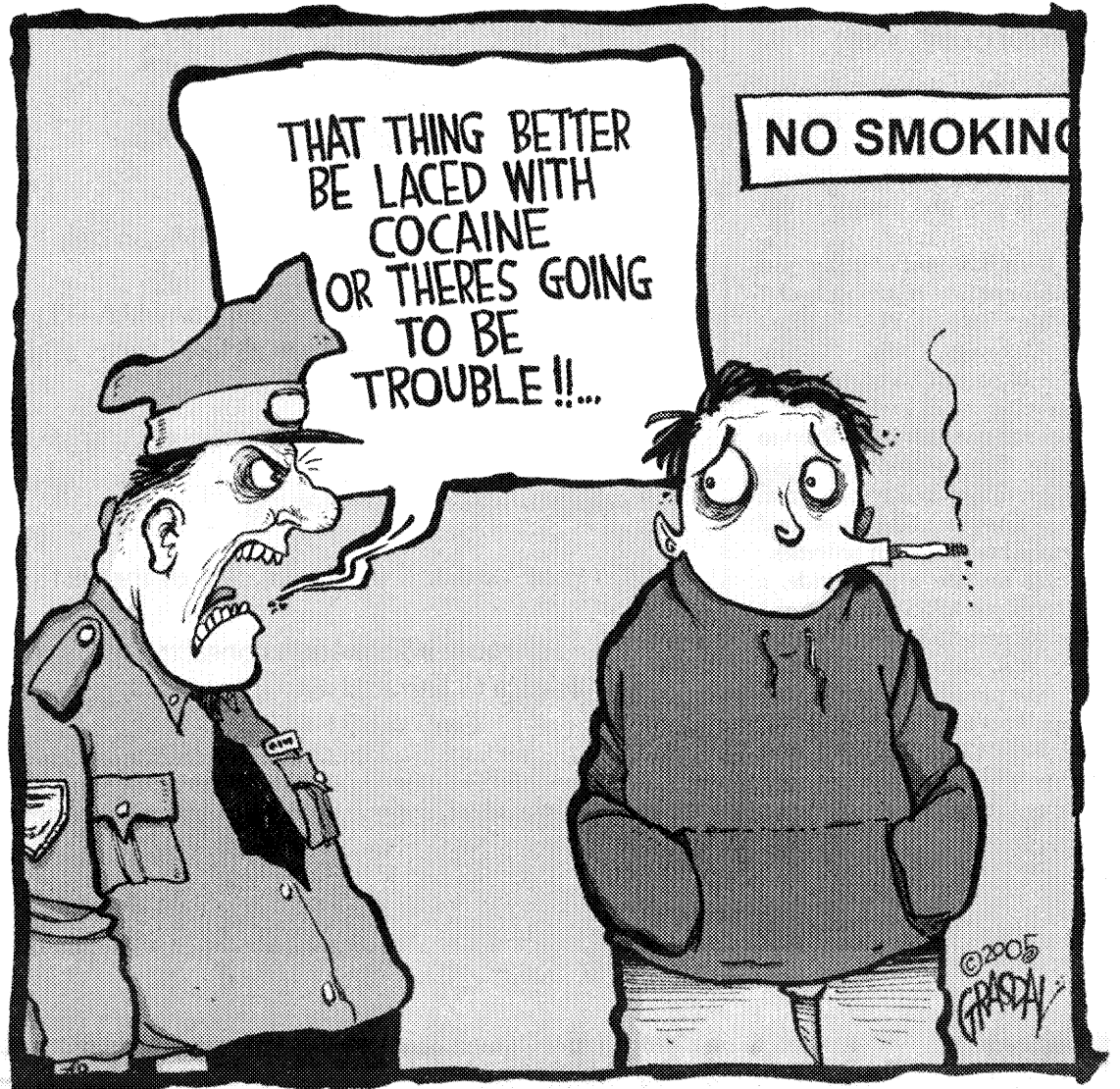
It's unfortunate when the quality of our news coverage comes into question when the coverage interferes with a media group's commercial interests.

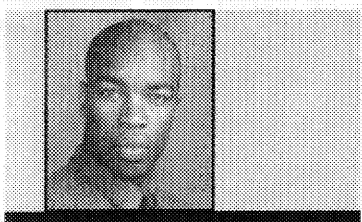

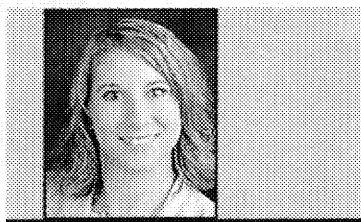
3. Was the NAIT open house a success and how did it benefit NAITSA?

Weakness - probably my spelling and grammar skills! I am terrible with that! It affects me when I write reports and updates about what I do and present to others.

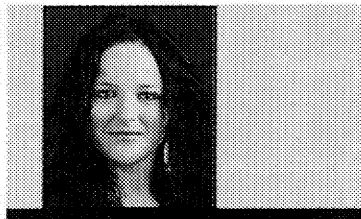

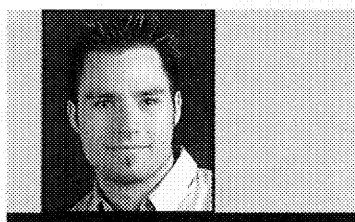
3. Was the NAIT open house a success and how did it benefit NAITSA?

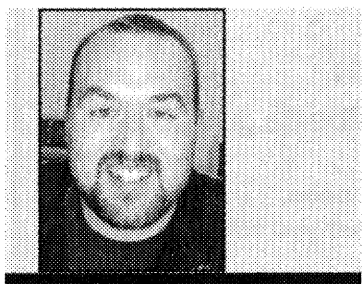

Be afraid – be very afraid

Finally, an event is coming to Edmonton that will test the ability of young adults to test their courage. Northlands is very excited about its new 11-day Halloween festival dubbed *Fright Nights*.

Thrills

Presented by Dell, Fright Nights runs Oct. 21 through Oct. 31 and promises to provide plenty of thrills and chills each and every night of the festival. "There are many events in our city that cater to children at Halloween, but Fright Nights gives a more adult-oriented scare in the name of fun," said Melanie Wilson, a volunteer director at Northlands Park. "You definitely don't want to come alone to this event."

Fright Nights is produced by Calgary based *ScreamWorks*, originated in Vancouver and has now expanded to include three haunted houses, a maniacal maze, dozens of sinister street performers, and two thrill rides.

Black maze

The Black Hole haunted house deprives guests of their sight. The pitch-black maze puts the other senses into overdrive. Guests must feel their way through the halls and dead ends and hope that they can make it out alive.

Fears

At the Nuclear Nightmare haunted house, holocaust survivors will experience mankind's worst fears realized in this post-apocalyptic vision of terror and devastation.

Brave souls entering the Reaper's Remains haunted house will encounter a brush with the supernatural as they journey through the bowels of the Grim Reaper.

"People love to be a little scared sometimes," says Mike Sheppard, co-owner of *ScreamWorks*, which has built a busi-

ness on creating fear. "They love to feel that jolt of adrenalin rush. We see them coming out of the haunted houses a little shaky, but laughing and obviously thrilled.

"Different people are afraid of different things. For some people, it's that sensory deprivation of being in the dark and the fear of the unknown. For others, they're afraid of ghoulish figures and faces or being startled."

The maniacal maze is almost the size of a football field, this extensive maze will lead those who dare through twists that include frights, gruesome scenes and total darkness in a test of their nerves and navigation skills.

Stilt walkers

Daring visitors will also encounter Sinister street performers and wandering spirits out to spook and amuse them. Depending on the night that guests visit, they will see magicians, stilt walkers, fire-breathers, jugglers, and much more.

Rides include the Tilt-a-Whirl and Gravitron. The festival also included a number of ghastly midway games with a creepy twist. Mystical exhibits include tarot card readers, palm readers and fortune tellers.

Not for the faint

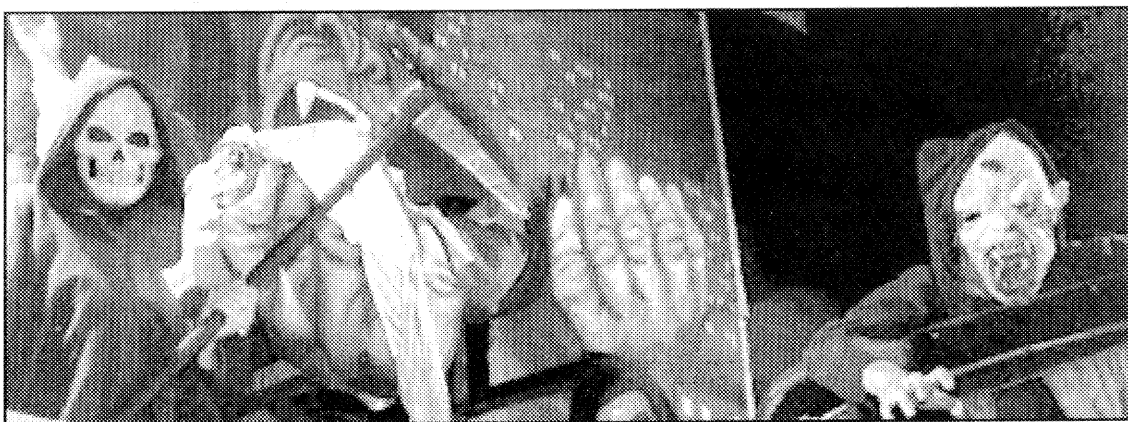
ScreamWorks cautions that Fright Nights is not for the faint at heart. Children under 12, people with heart conditions are encouraged to use discretion if attending.

Fright Nights is open 6 p.m. to 11 p.m. Sun-Thurs, 6 p.m. to midnight Fri-Sat. Double Dare Passes for Fright Nights are available in advance through 7-Eleven stores for \$27, plus GST – or through Ticketmaster. After October 20, tickets are available at the gate only, for \$18 per person.

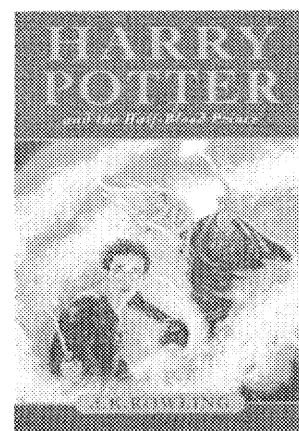

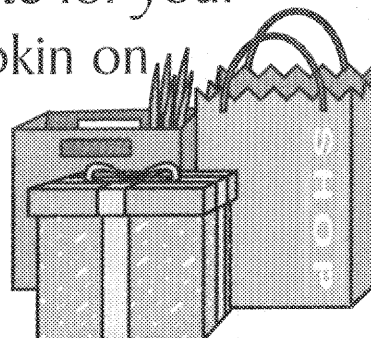

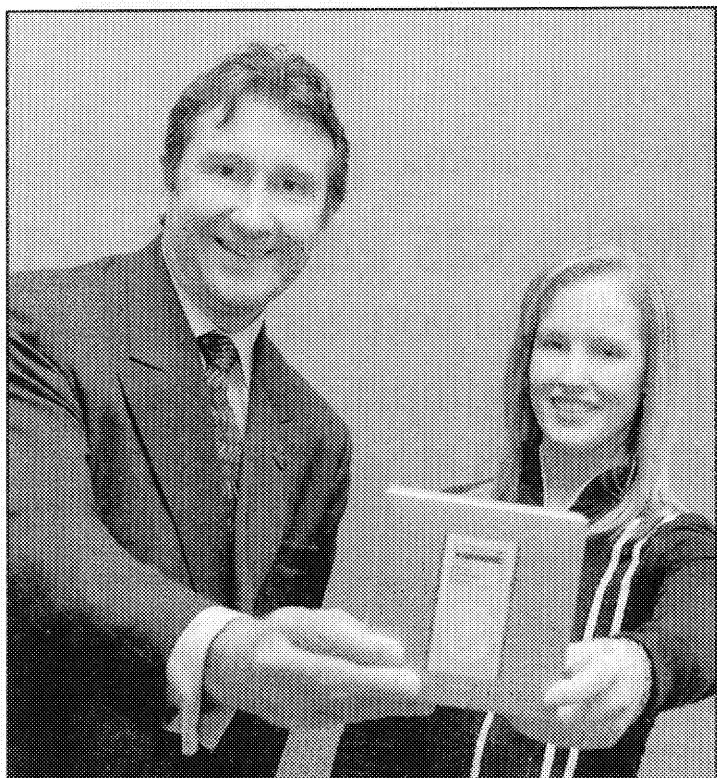
I will give Telus one more strike until I give up on them, one more and I swear they're losing me as a customer. I wonder how many other people go through this all the time?

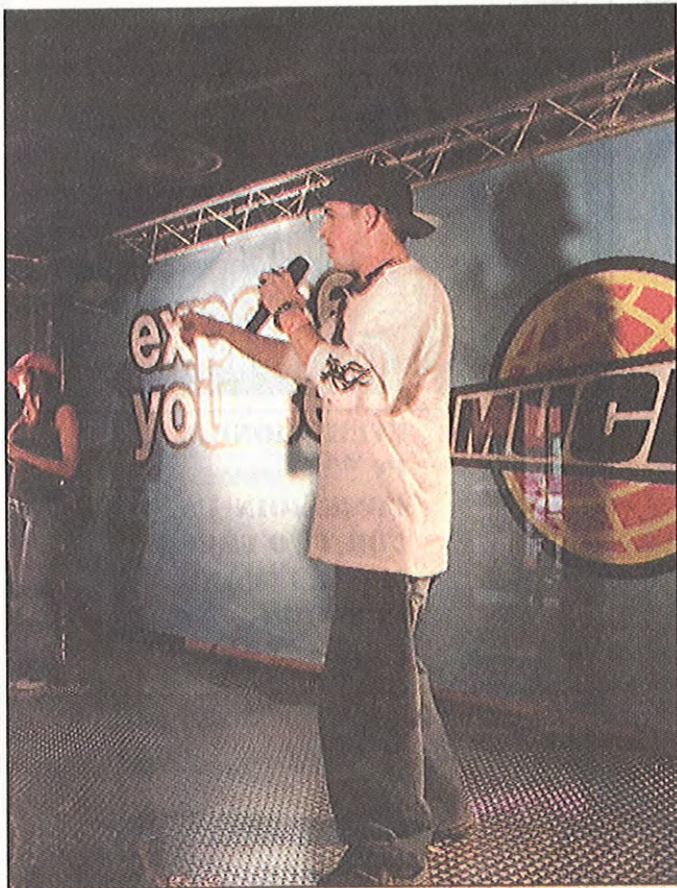

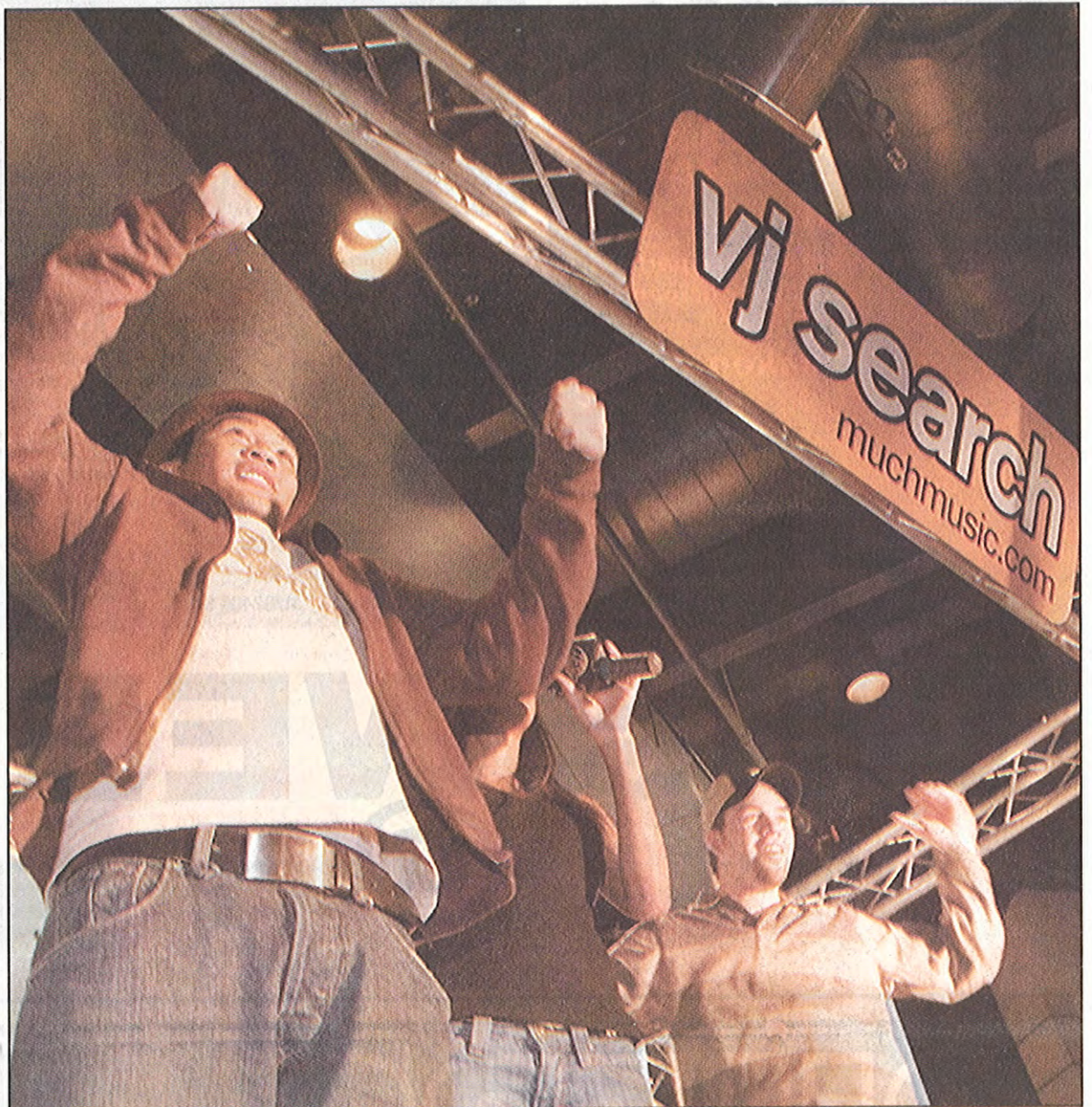

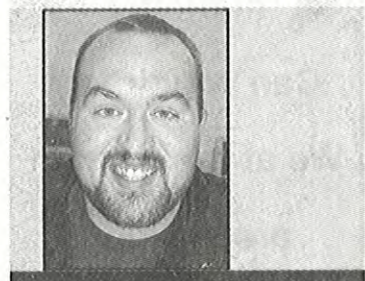

Ooks continue tradition of soccer excellence

The Ooks continue to kick butt. "NAIT traditionally makes the playoffs," said Ooks Coach Graham Wood.

Said manager Kevin Jones "In my (14) seasons with NAIT, we've

made the playoffs every year except two (1999 and 2004)."

This season is no different as the Ooks clinched second in the North after an impressive 10-1 victory against hometown opponent King's College on Oct. 14.

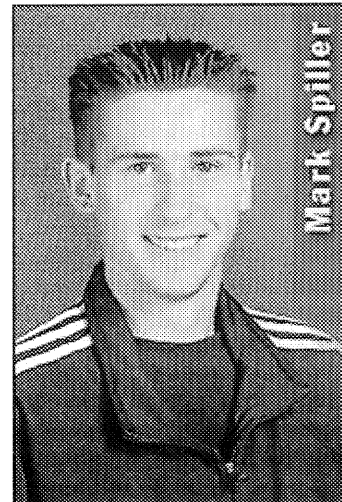

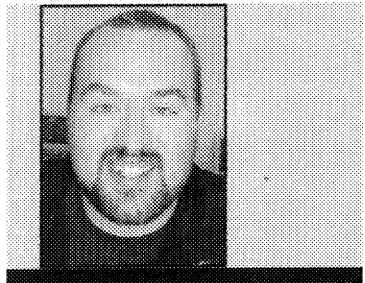

The Lady Oaks will continue to improve the women's basketball program at NAIT this year. 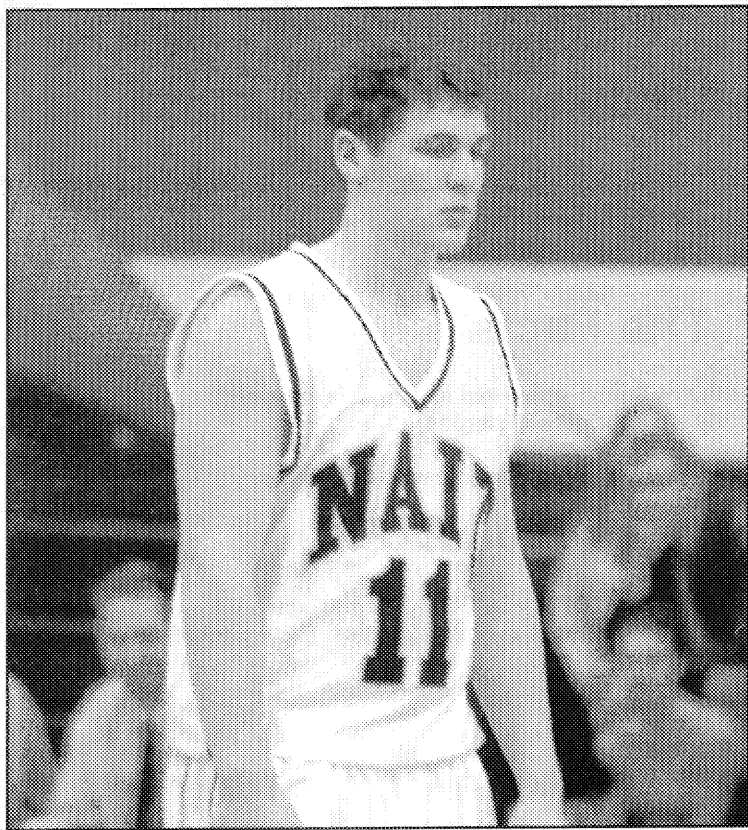

Flick offers dark vision

After Joel Schumacher's 1997 debacle *Batman and Robin*, few had hope that the Batman film franchise would ever be revived.

Riddled with silly one-liners and busy, cluttered images, the film seemed to doom a once powerful franchise.

Eight years later, Warner Brothers braved the waters and released a new film. Hiring a rising new director, the studio

was banking on fresh blood to revitalize a fledgling brand.

Were they successful? Absolutely. *Memento* director Christopher Nolan took the controls and gave fans a decidedly darker vision of the dark knight.

Focusing on character far more than the previous four films, *Batman Begins* proved to be an intelligent, visceral thriller.

By no means a perfect film, Nolan still managed to create a movie that more accurately reflected the age-old mythology of the Batman comic series (published by the venerable and underrated DC brand).

Comic based films tend to come under major scrutiny from fans that follow the story lines like a cat follows a ball of yarn. This incarnation of the 66 year old legend seems to have passed muster.

Grossing almost \$100 million more than the last film, fans appear to be yearning for another installment. Director Nolan has indicated that is indeed in the works and I couldn't be happier.

Batman Begins is a fine comic book film. Disregarding the previous pics in the series, this film depicts the intriguing origin story in a new way and manages

to give a psychological angle to Bruce Wayne's aggressive alter ego.

In the latter third of this film, BB's almost descends into Jerry Bruckheimer action film hysterics. Happily, one finishes viewing this movie with a sense of satisfaction, knowing that it is indeed a superior super-hero flick.

Having seen the true newt poo that is *Daredevil*, *The Hulk* and *The Punisher*, *Batman Begins* is truly a golden turd among the pile of celluloid crap. While it will never surpass Richard Donner's 1978 *Superman The Movie* as the finest comic adaptation of all time, this definitive statement of Bob Kane's comic book heroine should be the beginning of a new, exciting phase of the Batman story.

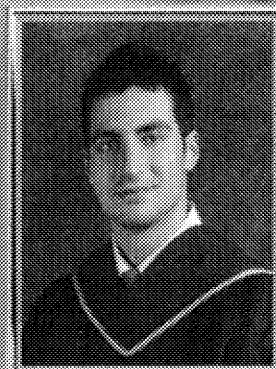
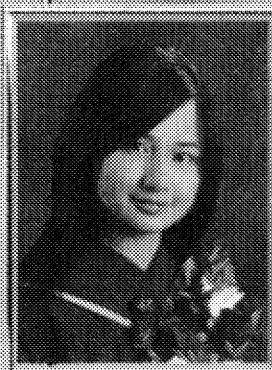

lights go down. The third and fourth singles off the disk are, Into Your Eyes and When the Lights Go Down the rest of the album is just as stacked.

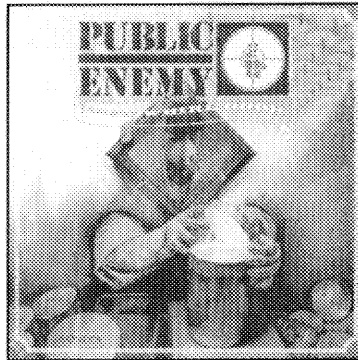

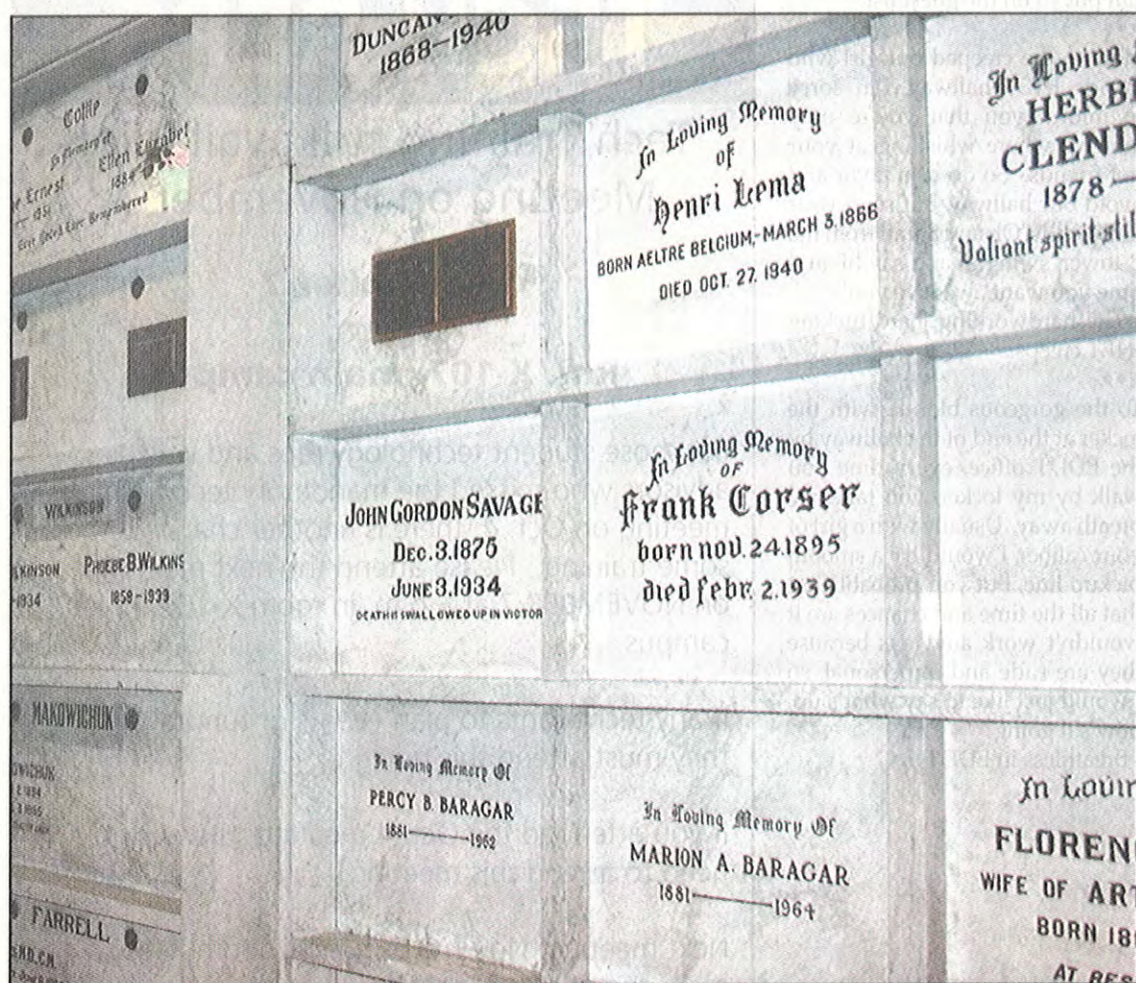
The tour ends with a brief walk and discussion down Whyte Ave.

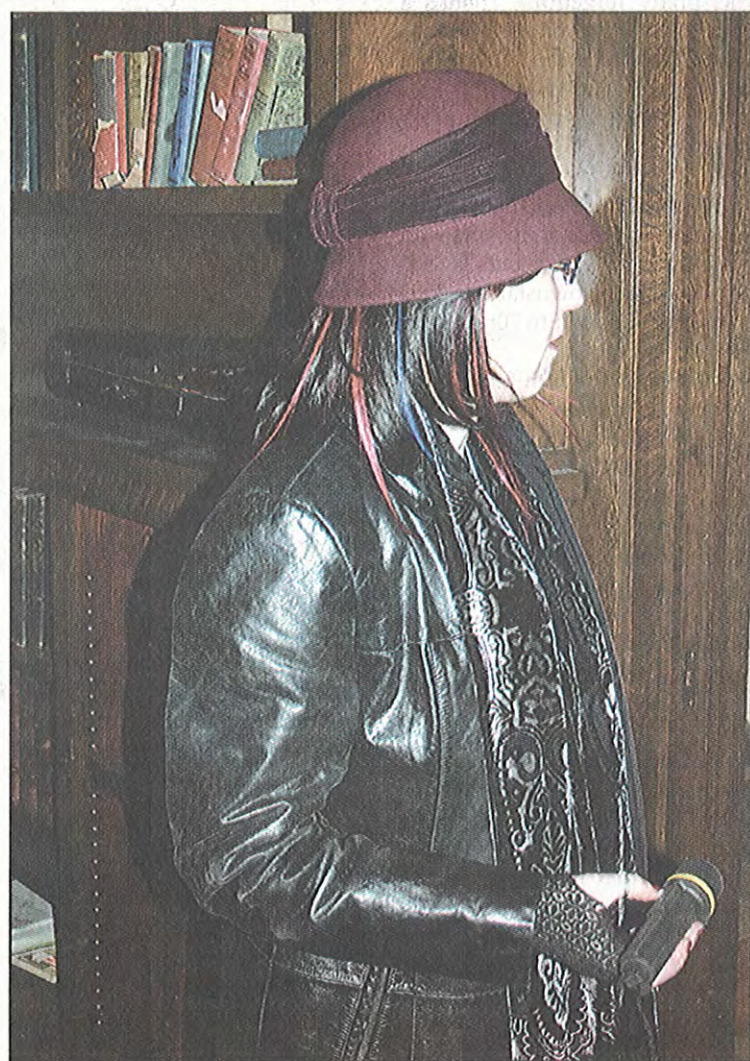
