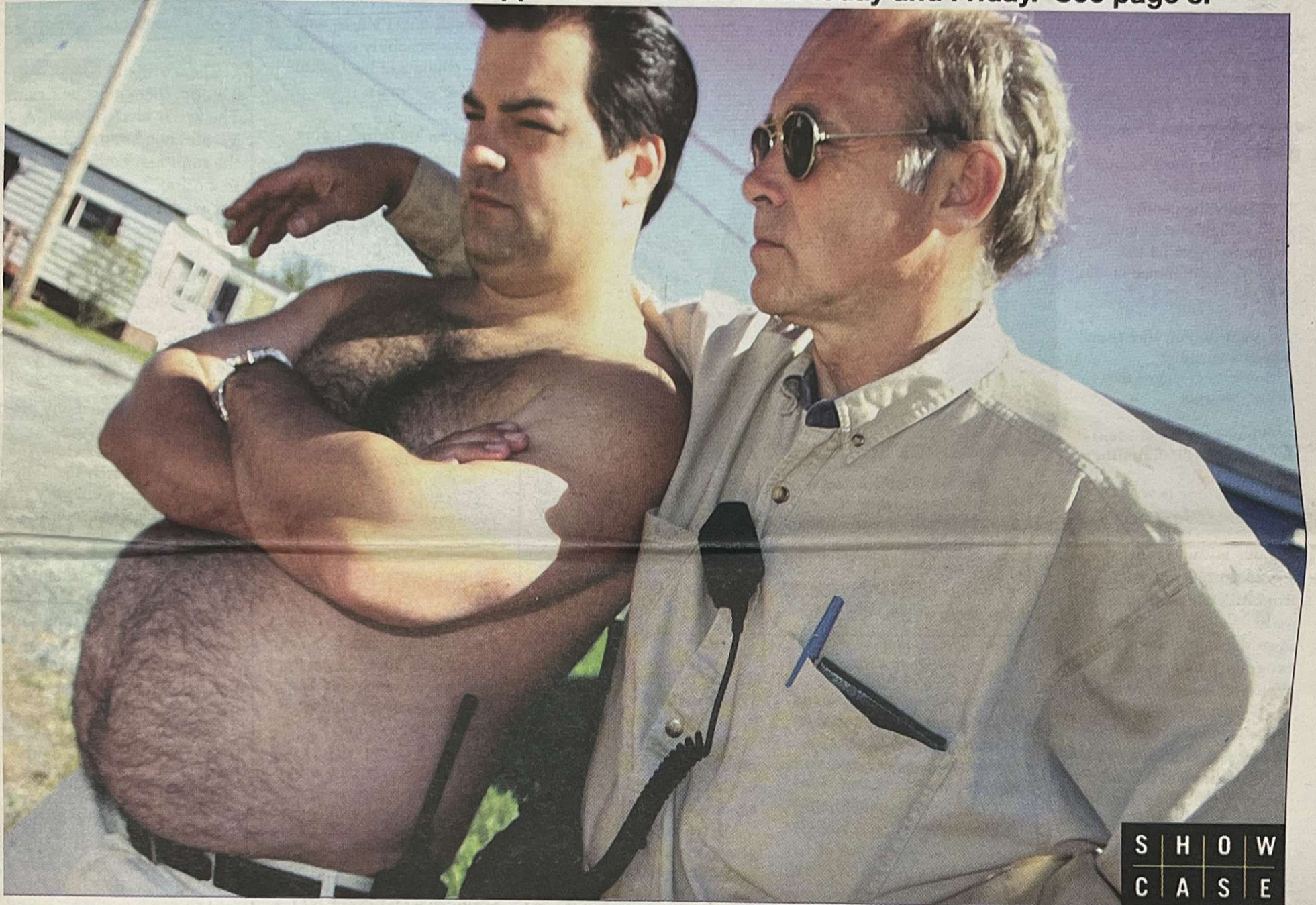

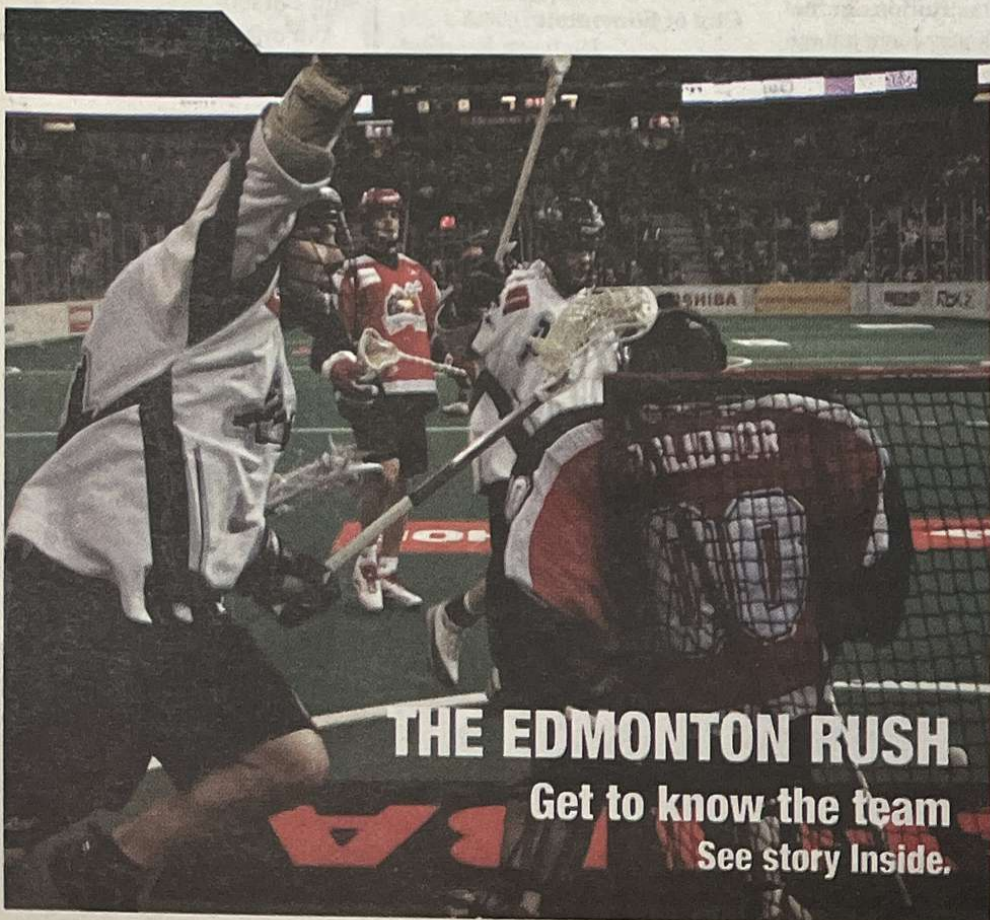

## Prez has big plans for NAIT

**What are your general responsibilities at NAIT?**

My responsibilities are to oversee the general operations of NAIT. I am a firm believer that leadership makes a difference and that people are our most valuable resource - my role is to clear the way to let staff do their jobs.

**What do you like most about your job?**

I enjoy the people - meeting the staff and students. Again, I like making a difference at NAIT.

**What do you like least about your job?**

I don't get out of the office enough.

**What more do students get from NAIT than other institutions?**

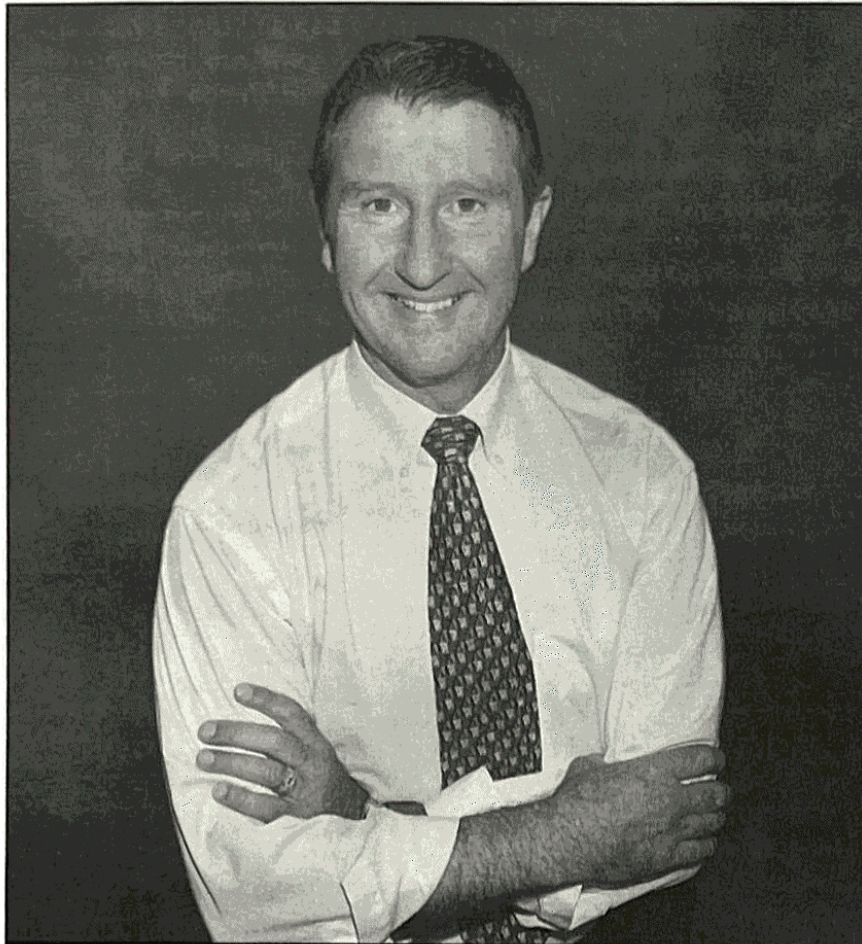
Number one is NAIT's track record of grads finding jobs - 95 per cent of students find jobs within months of graduating from their programs. Number two is we have a high retention rate of students staying in the program they first enrolled in, which shows they're satisfied with their courses. Number three is our connections to business and industry.

If you look at the links we've forged there, we're second to none in the country.

**What are NAIT's plans for developing student residences?**

Our plan over the next 10 years is to look at our student infrastructure.

Having a student village will be a part of that in terms of being able to attract students from around province, around Canada and around the globe.



**Dr. Sam Shaw became president of the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology (NAIT) on October 1, 1997. He now heads up an institution that serves more than 65,000 students.**

**Nugget writer Shant Chakmakian caught up with Dr. Shaw to get his take on where NAIT is going over the next few years.**

**How do you intend to help make sure that student life plans are made and met in accordance with NAIT's expansion over the next decade?**

Clearly, working with the student association is key to that agenda - that's one of their responsibilities. We want to ensure students have access to the best academic programs and technical education in Canada. Campus life is also a priority.

We want to make sure students can enjoy a variety of activities on campus and can join various clubs. Part of our commitment to a high-quality campus life is working with

the city on the Health and Wellness Centre.

**Do you see NAIT being a model institution for the rest of Canada? Even the world? If so, how?**

We are much more robust than other technical institutions in Canada. We are amongst only a handful of technical institutions in the world and clearly have a long way to go to catch up to the MITs, which have a lot more history than we do.

**What other educational institutes do you work with and consult to make NAIT a better institution?**

In regards to business programs, we consult with Harvard and Columbia University. We also consult with various polytechnics in Canada such as BCIT, Sheridan and SAIT.

On the international scene, NAIT works with post-secondary institutions in China and the United Arab Emirates.

**How are things going to change in the next few years for the school of business?**

We're hoping that we will get approval to offer bachelor's degrees, which will provide more opportunities for both Albertans and Canadians.

Our ongoing relationship with Harvard will be positive for business students.

**Where do you see NAIT in five years?**

Certainly over the next five years NAIT will be developing the NAIT Center for Apprenticeship Technologies, which includes the NAIT Waiward Steel Centre for Steel Technologies (opening in August 2006), the NAIT Spartan Centre for Instrumentation Technology and the Centre for Millwright Technology (opening in August 2007), as well as expansion of Patricia Campus and a new campus in Grande Prairie over the next three years.

We are also looking at the construction of the Centre for Health and Wellness with the City of Edmonton.

## Candidate wins appeal

There's an old adage: after a storm, there must be a calm. The newly elected NAITSA VP Student Affairs is hopeful the coming months will be that calm.

Lars-Erik Larsen received the most votes for VP Student Affairs, but he had his victory appealed by one of his competitors on the grounds of pre-campaigning.

Pre-campaigning activities are prohibited in NAITSA elections.

Larsen has denied any pre-campaigning activities.

The appeal was held Wednesday, March 15. "The appeal process went very well," said Larsen.

Larsen was asked to answer some questions in front of a panel of students.

He says he was asked to leave once the questions were answered.

"I received a call about 45 minutes later," said Larsen. "They told me I won."

"NAITSA was very professional about it," said Larsen. "It (the appeal) was conducted in a manner where both sides were looked after."

Larsen wasn't told who launched the appeal. "Nothing was disclosed," said Larsen.

No one at NAITSA would comment on who appealed the vote.

Larsen ran against Tamara Nitz and Sam Bressette for the position.

The NAITSA student election was held March 9.

There's a basic standard of living that I think everyone should live up to. I think toilet flushing is a pretty basic, standard, civilized thing to do.

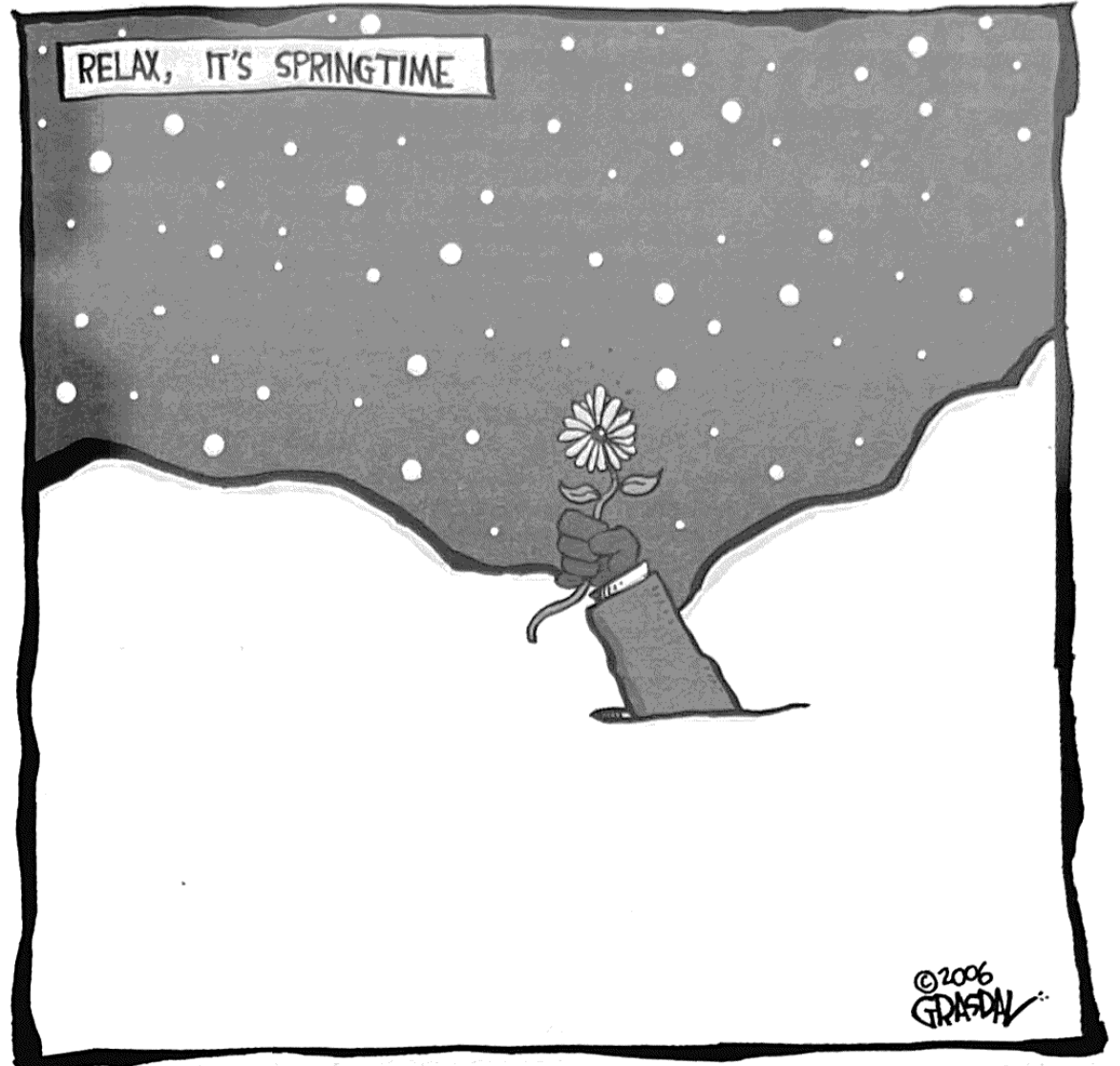

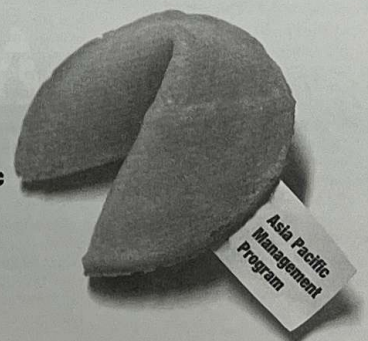

"No one stopped, they were just goin' like it was a normal day, 110 the whole way," said Dunsworth.

Halfway through our conversation, Dunsworth went into character for a time commenting on topics as wide as *Brokeback Mountain* and the loss of the American Dream. Referring to corporate and government hierarchy, he said, "If they showed how sick and mindless the top echelons are and how there are so many people in the pit, they'd see there is no American Dream."

We actually talked for over half an hour, much of which is too ribald to print. But it was a hilarious talk. Back in reality, Dunsworth commented on his distaste for reality TV. "I can't even watch reality television. Our show is more a reflection of reality than that stuff is," said Dunsworth.

"[We] show how losers can get fucked up. Every one of us has a fault and a flaw. I like liquor, ladies and the laddies. Jim Lahey is living in the past - he's looking in the shit abyss," said Dunsworth, slipping back into character.

One of Nova Scotia's most acclaimed and well loved actors Dunsworth is makes his home in Halifax (where the Showcase series is filmed). The actor got his start doing CBC radio dramas. Later, Dunsworth would become a regular in the popular Neptune Theatre group. Eventually, he would found one of the best and longest running alternative theatre companies in Nova Scotia called Pier One Theatre.

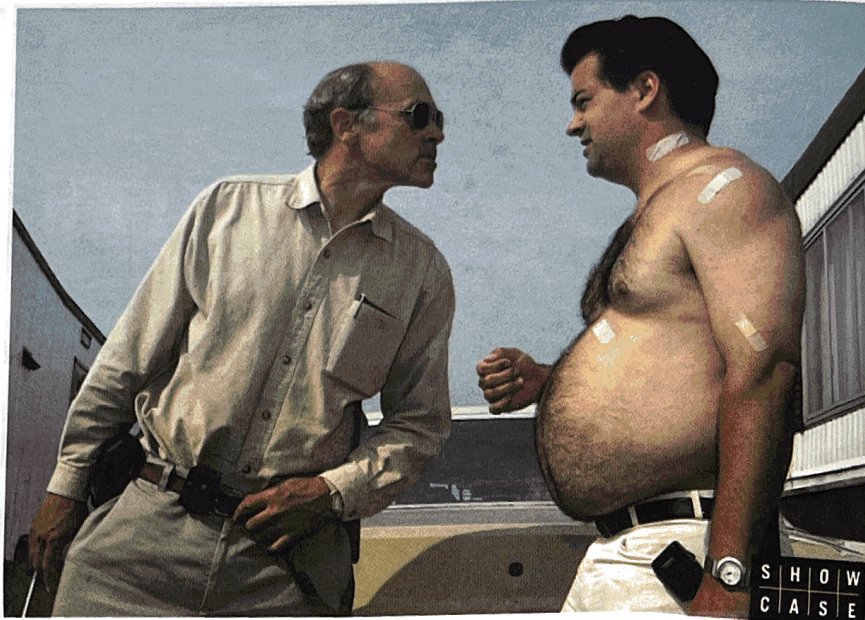
In the mid-'90s, Dunsworth played a character in a short film called *One Last Shot*. Directed by Mike Clattenburg, creator and main force behind TPB, it was in this short flick that the character Mr. Lahey was born. Dunsworth can also be seen in several television events like *Shattered City: Halifax Explosion, Blessing and Sleepmurder*.

Famous now for his foul-mouthed, alcoholic trailer park supervisor, he will be imprinted in Canadian minds for generations. Makes sense. I mean, the shit storm of press he's gotten in so many shit rags is sure to stir some shitty publicity, leading to shit fame and shit fortune.

Dunsworth's partner in crime is Patrick Roach, the shirtless companion of the belligerent Mr. Lahey. Also a native of Nova Scotia, he currently makes his home in Lawrencetown. When Roach isn't traipsing about the trailer park without his shirt, pissin' off Ricky, Julian and Bubbles, he is traveling the scenic countryside as regional sales manager for Sparkling Springs, a bottled water outfit.

But with the upcoming film and worldwide buzz building, he may not have to hock H<sub>2</sub>O much longer.

Roach first became connected to the group when he did sketch comedy with John Paul Tremblay (Julian) and Robb Wells (Ricky). The three knew each other from an involvement they had in a restaurant business, three eateries, which was eventually sold entirely to Tremblay, who still operates it. Roach shares a love of business with Wells,



having both received degrees in business from St. Mary's University.

Wells and Tremblay had known Clattenburg from high school and became friends with Roach just after graduation. Later, when Clattenburg was forming the pilot and feature length black and white film, Patrick was cast as the assistant supervisor, knocking the socks off of Clattenburg in his audition.

Patrick Roach is married and has two kids — although I'm sure they don't watch the show.

Dunsworth confirmed that there could be as many as two more seasons, mentioning Clattenburg is now writing season seven. And writing is what Clattenburg does best. Amazingly, TPB contains barely any ad-libbing and usually Clattenburg writes too many scenes to fit to time, several hitting the cutting room floor. Said Dunsworth, "What 22 minutes do you keep?"

In addition to the big screen debut this summer, the Trailer Park Boys fifth season begins April 17 on Showcase. Until the mania begins, you can catch an intimate evening with Canada's sweethearts, Mr. Lahey and Randy tonight and tomorrow at the Nest. "We're gonna attempt to be interactive, anecdotal, answer questions. There'll be a little trivia and a couple of giveaways, a little drinkin'," said the man behind the persona.

Sounds like fun to me. I'll be there and so should you be. Admission is 20 clams. And no, don't actually bring clams. Tickets at NAITSA.

## NR92 breaking new ground

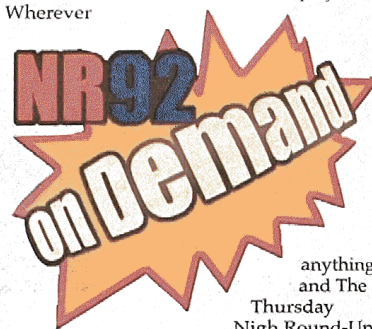

# 24 is best show on TV



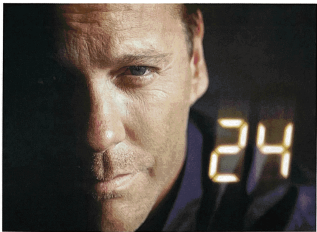

24 - Mondays on Fox and Global

Now in its fifth season, Fox Network's 24 is getting the best ratings of its TV run. A DVD smash, the suspenseful, terrorist-thwarting drama is getting better every season. And if you haven't spent an hour with this program, you are missing what is quite possibly television's finest hour — ever.

If you don't already know, 24 is named as such due to its singular structure. Each episode follows one hour in a full day. Formatted this way, each episode has stakes so high, you can taste the tension.

Driven by the electric performance of Kiefer Sutherland, the show is a unique and pulse-pounding hour of action packed thrills. Following the inner workings of the Counter-Terrorism Unit (CTU), the program follows



its characters as they deal with an imminent threat to the life and security of the American people.

While it may sound like another in a long line of flag-waving action thrillers, this is really an extremely well written program with an undercurrent of dissent towards the government it

depicts. Sutherland's Jack Bauer is a torrent of fury against those who pose a threat, and supported by a array of fascinating secondary characters, they throw protocol and politics to the wind in order to do one thing — save lives.

So far, they have averted a nuclear attack, chemical

weapons and presidential attacks, among many tactics. And while the execution hasn't always been perfect, overall each threat is illustrated in such a way to make the way it's averted — or not — pretty darn realistic.

And that is this show's greatest strength. That producer Brian Grazer

(Cinderella Man, Apollo 13), director Jon Cassar (who is Canadian by the way) and creators Joel Surnow and Robert Cochran have been able to keep the formula fresh and intense over what is now in excess of 100 episodes is a testament to its greatness.

Seriously, though, this is the best show on TV right now and unless you just have to catch America's Next Top Model or some piece of crap like that, you have no excuse to miss the finest hour, perhaps ever, on network television.

I dare not tell you any plot points as this is a dish best served fresh and hot, but I would suggest to readers to pay a visit to Blockbuster and rent the first season on DVD. While one can join the show now without too much worry, there is a back story and history to these characters. Should you follow up the three other seasons also available on disc, you'll be able to join the story fully informed and will find yourself helplessly addicted to at least one show Fox hasn't fumbled.

### Sound:

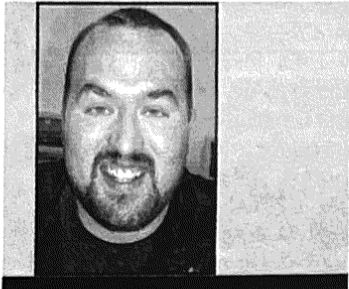

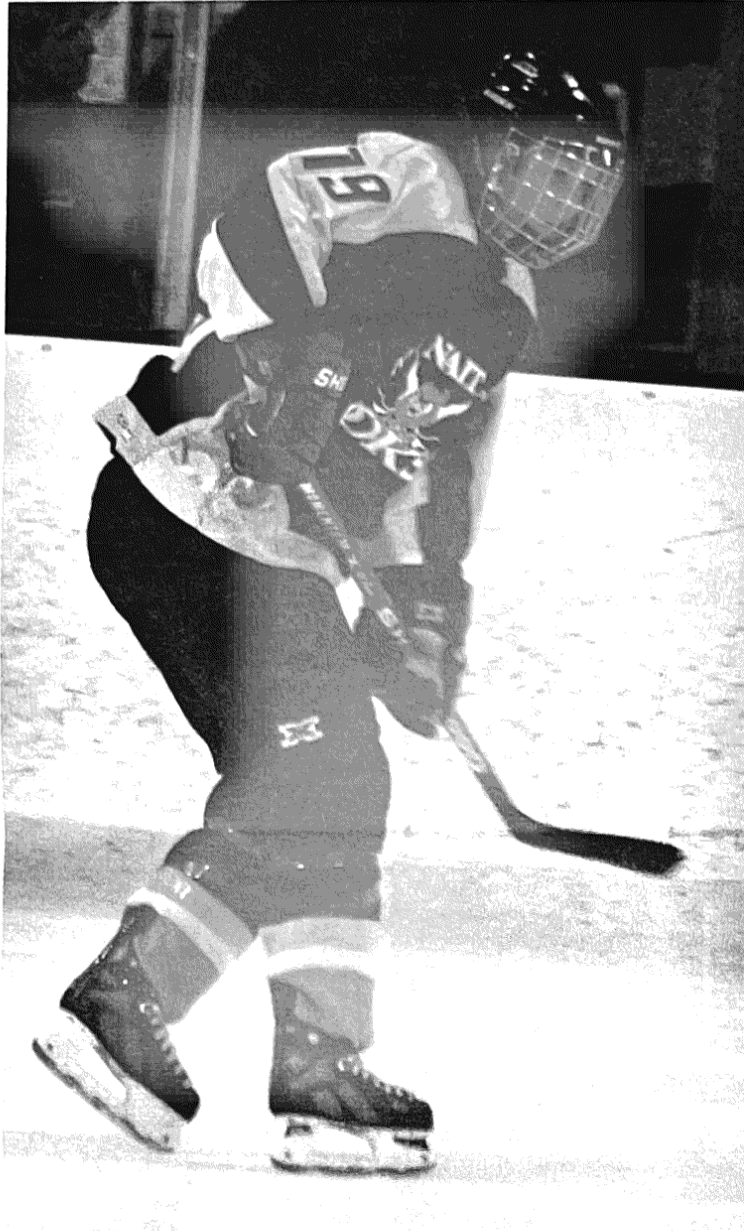

She was subsequently named to the 2002/03 ACAC All-Conference team.

In her sophomore season, the Lady Ooks was eager to make a statement in the league by proving that her

the team's success as a whole. Whenever asked about her performance, she would always point to her team saying they're the reason they won the game.

As a result, the 5'7" athlete was named assistant captain by her fellow teammates. The veteran was solid as a rock in her third season as well. Her league high 27 goals helped lead her team to a club record of 12 wins in the season and earned the team their second play-off berth in team history.

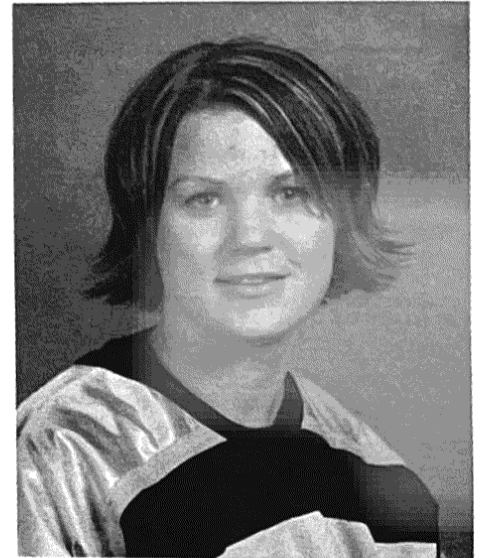
Although she finished second in the league with 35 points, league brass snubbed her in consideration for the ACAC All-Conference team.

The iron-woman's fourth and final season may just have been the best season of her career at NAIT.

Faced with a lack of depth on defense, the senior was selected as team captain and volunteered to spear-head the blue-line.

The veteran finished the season leading all ACAC defense in points with seven goals and nine assists. McDonald led her club to another club milestone as they wrapped up second in the ACAC with a 13-5-1-1 regular season record.

Her efforts were again overlooked by the league as she was again not selected for

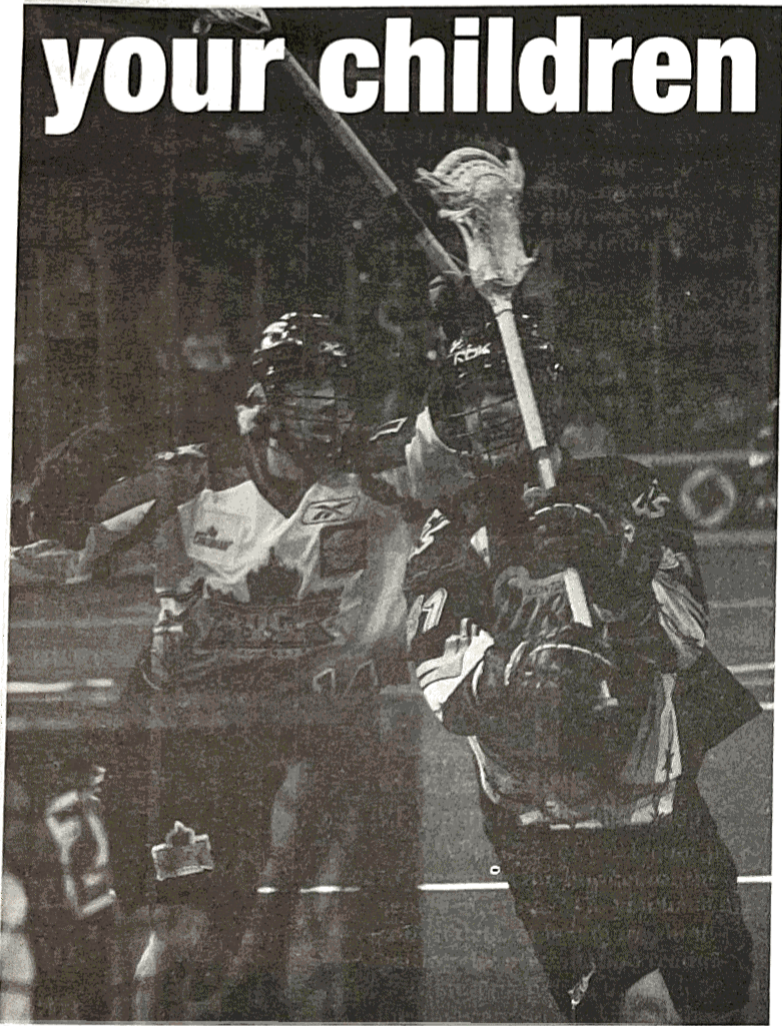
inquired about. No dice though, as Quinlan is a player that the Rush are

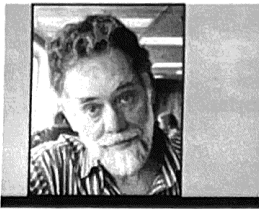

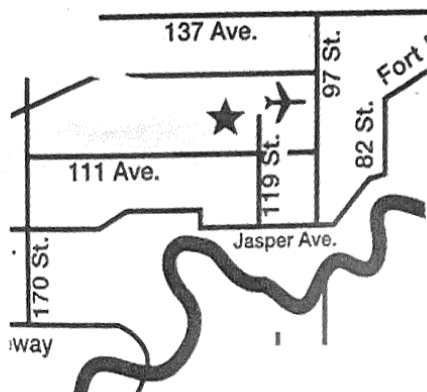

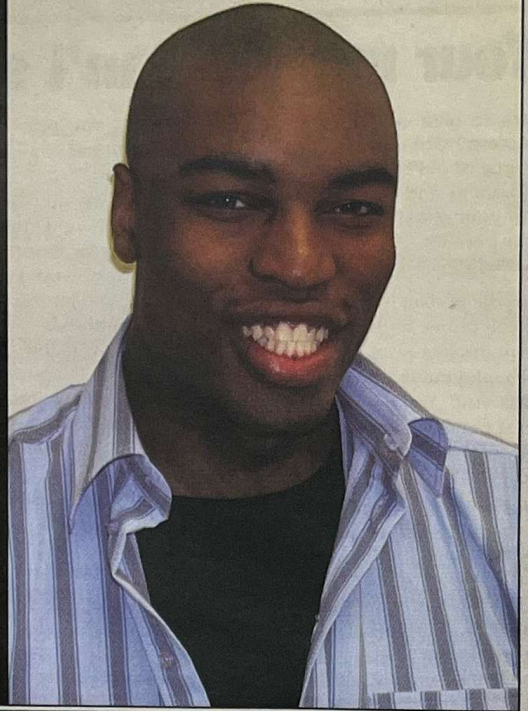
