Counselling manager let go

The end of the semester is a stressful time for many students, so the recent move of The NAIT Student Counselling Centre makes little sense to some.


"We did have some indication that we would be moving," said Margaret Marean, a counsellor with The Student Counselling Centre. "It was just a management decision to put Recruitment more centralized."

The NAIT Student Counselling Centre has recently been moved from the South Lobby to HP Centre. Student Recruitment is now located in Counselling's old office space.

But this isn't the only change with Counselling in recent weeks. The manager of The Student Counselling Centre was let go after working with the school for over 25 years.

"His position was made redundant," said Marean.

A message to staff on The NAIT Portal said that Counselling was going through a transitional period and "the position of Manager Counselling



& Career Services was deemed redundant."

That message was issued by Sandy Sanderson, director of student life.

Sanderson wouldn't comment on the redundancy. "It's a personnel matter."

But Sanderson says that the recent move will benefit stu-

dents.

"Students are the focus," said Sanderson. "We're putting together a communication plan."

"The offices were moved because NAIT is concentrating on ensuring student enrolment increases. It was important for Recruitment to be better located."

"It's about helping students transition into NAIT," said Leanne McCarthy, director of student recruitment.

The move has prompted some to think that recruitment is down at NAIT, but McCarthy says this isn't the case. "We're not down, but we're not growing."

"The economy is so hot that many are choosing to work," said McCarthy.

"We're currently most of the time at capacity," said Marean, as she spoke of the demand for counselling services on campus. "Our main concern is that students find our service."

NAIT scoops reality TV show

NAIT has been chosen to host a U.S. network's new reality TV show, *The Nugget* has learned. The Fox network has forged a deal to use the school as a backdrop for a show tentatively called *Trade Ya*. "This is incredibly exciting news," said NAIT VP of International Development Al Funt.

"It will really help put the institute on the map – and show people everywhere we're world class," said Funt. "It was a long, hard negotiation with the network but we've signed a deal that will be very beneficial to both sides."

Fox network's director of new programming, Jim (Red) Kit, said the show will feature 12 NAIT students (six men and six women) who will agree to switch school programs and compete head to head.

"Basically, *Trade Ya* will see men and women switching from their current courses to less-traditional ones.

"For instance we'd like to see a woman in Culinary Arts switch programs with a guy in welding. We'll then monitor how each one succeeds in the other program. The one who scores the highest marks will be the winner."

So how is it a major network like Fox chose a school based in Edmonton as the site for a highly anticipated reality show?

"We canvassed all the major technical schools in North America," said Fox's Kit. "NAIT was the most accommodating when it came to our production schedules. The other big factors is the lower-value Canadian dollar as well as the fact you've got some top-notch film industry people there. You proved that when a good portion of the upcoming Brad Pitt film about Jesse James was shot there. We'd have been fools not to do this deal in Edmonton."

An added spin to *Trade Ya* will see the 12 students sharing accommodations 24/7 in an elaborate dormitory-style residence to be built on the main campus.

Their every move will be captured on video much in the way *Big Brother* was filmed. The eventual winner of *Trade Ya* will scoop a cool \$500,000 and have the rest of their education paid for.

Fox has already begun a pre-screening search for candidates. So what would it take to land a role in the reality show?

"Obviously students have to be very smart and versatile," Kit told the Nugget. "As well, they have to be very presentable. To be blunt, attractive people and reality TV go hand in hand."

Filming is due to begin in September and a casting call will come in two weeks.

Close shave for cancer

Five NAIT students will be in the south lobby today getting their heads shaved and raising money for the fight against cancer. Be at the south lobby today (Thursday) between 11 a.m. – 1 p.m. to help raise money to combat a disease that affects thousands of Canadian youth every year.

Among those having their heads shaved will be Carla Knight, a culinary arts student currently attending NAIT. She is

halfway to her fundraising goal of three thousand dollars and has a table set up outside the NAITSA office for last minute donations today until noon.

Last year, after the loss of her grandmother and uncle within a month due to the disease (stomach and bone marrow cancer respectively), Knight quickly made the decision to start raising funds and awareness for the cause. She is dedicating the head shave to the family members she has lost to cancer and will be donating her shaved hair to a local children's charity. She hopes to reach her fundraising goal by the end of the day.

"I really want to reach my goal and honestly would be disappointed otherwise. Not in the people who have been amazing and supportive, but in myself for not pulling it off," said Knight.

Mike Light and Pat Bunting are another two NAIT students affected by cancer and will be participating in the head shave. Both have had family and friends affected by the disease and are seizing the opportunity to make a difference.

"Hopefully I can spread the word more and make a louder voice for those who suffer from Cancer," said Light.

Bunting and Light have raised the majority of their funds through the landscape architectural technology program at NAIT and one of their instructors has even offered to shave his head if the pair manage to raise over a thousand dollars.

Carla invites everyone to come visit her table outside of the NAITSA office today until noon and to come watch the head shaving in the South Lobby Thursday after 12:30.

The relationship between a campus and its newspaper is unusual. What campus in their right mind would want a newspaper to be critical of their day to day operations? What campus in their right mind would welcome an independent newspaper?

Experience has shown me that any progressive campus welcomes fair criticism. How can a campus expect to improve without being challenged?

I remember when I was going to university in BC. I started getting involved with the campus newspaper – an independent newspaper. I was hanging out with the editor. We were in his office and he was writing the weekly editorial. This particular week, he was writing about pesticide use on campus. He'd been writing it for a long time. He didn't seem happy.

He let out a groan. I didn't get it. I liked his editorial, it was well-written and interesting.

"This editorial blows. No campus is perfect and it's my job to point that out every week," he said.

We went to a stuffy cocktail party a few days later. I'm not going to lie, I only went for the food. Several school officials were there, including the

president of the university.

The editor and the president went up to each other and started chatting like old buddies. I was surprised.

The president came up to me afterwards and we started talking. We sort of knew each other from a pancake breakfast.

A campus newspaper has a responsibility to serve the students and encourage positive change. I think it's safe to say that it's easier to do this when you're writing in an independent capacity.

Due to many complaints regarding tuition costs, NAIT has made some new policies to help reduce costs to students by cutting a few corners.



The Canada Revenue Agency deadline for filing taxes is April 30. What this really means is that if you owe the government money, you need to pay your balance before that date or be charged a penalty and interest.

If the government owes you money, it is another story...they aren't in a big rush to send it to you and so, if you are really

busy with finals and stressed about filing those taxes, I would recommend focusing on finishing your school work and then take care of the taxes.

As residents of Alberta, it is even more important to complete your tax return because you never know when there might be an energy rebate or "Prosperity Cheque" for those that have filed. When you file your taxes, it is important to use the tuition tax credit found on the T2202A form.

The classic animated series South Park began its tenth season on Comedy Central (in the U.S.) Wednesday night and the quirky satire shows no signs of stemming the tide of its vicious pokes at culture, religion and the cult of celebrity.

Of course, Canadian TV audiences will have to wait until fall to see the current crop of new episodes. However, those who use the Internet can download new episodes at southparkx.net. They are available through bit torrent and the creators, Matt Stone and Trey Parker, encourage free downloads of the show.



Much ballyhoo was made of the recent departure of Isaac Hayes, the voice of Chef. Hayes said he was tired of the program's negative and mostly offensive skewering of religion. Hayes is a scientologist and was offended by their spoof of the belief system in an episode called "Trapped in the Closet."

However, this show will offend everyone at one time or another. The final episode of season nine featured a menstruating Virgin Mary, offending Catholics the world over. Albeit, the episode was offensive, but every religion from Judaism to Islam gets the bumps on their birthday.

Mere days after the defection, Parker and Stone produced the season opener, entitled "The Return of Chef." In the episode, Chef leaves South Park to join the Super Adventure Club, a group of world traveling child molesters. Using

old voice clips from previous shows, the portly school cook utters racy epithets like "Hello Children! I just wanna make love — up your butt!" all with the musical intonation the character was famous for.

Later, the group is revealed to be a metaphor for scientology and how asinine and all consuming it seems to be with Hollywood types.

South Park is a case of a controversial entertainment that has to be seen to be judged.



The rest of the album follows in typical Prince style. It's soulful disco with party filled hits that are just plain fun. The song Get On The Boat is


amongst the most rock/disco influenced tracks that scream party starter. Lolita and Love round out the rest of the album's booty shakers while two thirds of the album is slower R and B.


Leadership with wisdom

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Students to fund new arena

The worries of the Athletics Department have been settled. In a press conference held last week, the department has announced its partnership with the new WHL Edmonton Oil Kings and will start on the construction of a new arena this May.

The arena will come at a very small price to students and will require the elimination of a limited number of parking stalls.

The current, dilapidated arena will be demolished early next month, to make room for the new arena. The move will force NAIT hockey teams to play games at the Northlands Agricom next season.

The new 10,000 seat arena will be the home to the new Oil Kings as well as the new home to NAIT's men's and women's hockey teams.

The state of the art \$50 million arena will be fully student funded, raising student fees by only \$100 per semester.

As a condition of funding, NAITSA will be able to offer Oil Kings season tickets for a mere \$200 until 2030. Students will also receive a 25 per cent discount on Oilers season tickets.

This new project will necessitate the elimination of 100 stalls, just south of the arena.

The arena is expected to be completed by the end of August 2007, in time for the inaugural game of the Oil Kings.

College rodeo round-up in Edmonton

The future of Canadian rodeo is back at Northlands this weekend as the Agricom is set to host the 2006 Canadian National College Finals Rodeo (CNCFR) from March 30 to April 1.

The event will be held in Edmonton for the second straight year, but Northlands has attracted twice the competition than the event saw last year. The organizers of the event are more than happy about the explosion of talent from 50 to 100 athletes.

"Having the CNCFR at Northlands Park has meant a tremendous boost to the

entire college rodeo circuit," said Jim Leitheiser, rodeo coach at Lakeland College. "Our competitors have always looked at Northlands Park as the home of the ultimate professional rodeo - the Canadian Finals Rodeo in November. You should have seen their faces when they walked into that Northlands (Park) Arena last March and heard all of those fans cheering for them! It's been a tremendous motivator to get our college guys and gals on the rodeo circuit - just to have a shot at the finals in Edmonton."

Jeremy Harder made his mark on the Canadian college circuit five years ago. Today, Harder is on top of the country's professional ranks as the Canadian Finals Rodeo All Around Champion. Harder maintains that the college system had a big role in the development of his skills and in his enjoyed success in the sport. Harder says when it comes to rough-stock events, rising rodeo stars get a better

challenge in Canada rather than the U.S.

Athletes from 11 colleges and universities have qualified to compete in 10 events at the rodeo. The CNCFR involves six major rodeo events as well as team roping, goat tying, breakaway roping and pole bending.

Cowgirls are a big piece of the action at the CFCFR. Four of the events are exclusively female oriented and several other young women will compete in other events such as team roping.

College rodeo made a big splash in Canada last year and the event will explode even more with this year's competition. "For places like the U of A, U of C, SAIT, NAIT and Mount Royal College, we've seen more athletes stepping forward on their own this year. That means they have to pay for their own arena time, own transportation and go without coaching, but they're still representing their colleges," said Leitheiser. "They

found out about the college circuit through the publicity surrounding the CNCFR last year and they discovered it's a way to compete through the winter months when all other rodeos are on a break."

NAIT will be represented by La Crete's Edward Driedger and Devon's Tyler Gauvin. Both are entered in the Saddle Bronc event.

Infamous double-trickster teenage sisters Amber and Krista Graham have perfected their acrobatic trade for more than three years. The Marwayne sisters performed in Edmonton during the 2003 CFR and return for the feature entertainment at the 2006 CNCFR.

The rodeo action starts at 6 p.m. each night March 30, 31 and April 1. Saturday's final performance and championship crowning wraps up with a round-up party afterwards. Rodeo tickets are \$10 in advance through Ticketmaster or \$12 at the door.

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


