## Hot gig for NAIT grad

Getting paid to travel the world is an enviable position, but for a 21-year-old NAIT marketing grad it includes preparation, planning and pitching.

After writing to 20 warm-climate islands at random, Krista Turko recently received a contract worth \$200,000 from St. Vincent and the Grenadines to produce a promotional video for their tourism board. This Feb. 28, she'll be going there to start filming.

"I have always had a passion for travelling, which is what inspired me to seek work in a different country," said Krista.

"Through my job I have had the pleasure of being part of a crew on location in both Egypt and Costa Rica, however, we have never produced on behalf of a foreign government before," said Turko, the marketing director and senior writer for Media-Masters, who graduated from NAIT just 10 months ago.

Turko's passion fuelled the hours she spent on this project.

"I needed to find as much information as I could about the country," she said.

"I spent many hours researching, reading everything I could possibly find from budget speeches, to press releases, and even travellers' blogs on their experiences while traveling there."

As project coordinator and script writer on the promotional video, Turko is responsible for the pro-

duction meeting the expectations of St. Vincent's Ministry of Tourism. An interesting element built into the video's script is adaptability, and once the DVD is complete St. Vincent's will have a variety of ways to use this promotional tool.

"The final 30 seconds of the DVD was designed to double as a stand-alone television commercial, which could be aired anywhere. That will be up to the government.

"The first 60 seconds was designed to double as a stand-alone radio commercial, which again will be left to the good judgment of the Ministry of Tourism in St. Vincent."

Turko realized that the tourism industry is changing, and ensured that her video reflected this.

"Over the past few years I have noticed that in the travel industry there has been a definite trend toward adventure tourism and all-encompassing destinations.

"Countries are catching on quickly and trying to position themselves as diverse tourist destinations, with more to offer than the typical 'sun, sand, and beach' model. Realizing this trend and recognizing a need helped me to secure the contract with St. Vincent and the Grenadines."

Turko sees her time at NAIT as a hands-on training ground that gave her a head start.

"At NAIT, you get a real taste for the industry you are about to enter, which really helps when you get into your job. It prepares you to hit the ground running."

"I was always a self-starter, but the many projects I completed during my time in the marketing program enhanced that, I think. It was that attitude that landed me this project."

# A good sport to Africa

In December of 2006, the Nugget brought you the story of one man's efforts to make lives abroad better. NAIT Athletic Co-ordinator Peter Stenstrom had a vision, and that vision was made a reality for the first time this past Christmas.

Stenstrom returned to his home of Kenya armed with masses of sporting equipment. The equipment had no further use here in Edmonton, but was welcomed with open arms by Kenyan youth.

The trip was such a success, that it may turn into an annual or bi-annual event.

Stenstrom thoroughly enjoyed the event. "I had a plan before I went, of some of the things I wanted to do," said Stenstrom.

"For example, because it was Christmas time, there was a food hamper drive so I included a ball with it, because the hampers go to the really poor people," he said when asked how he gave away the equipment.

He wasn't alone in planning and executing his vision. "My parents had actually made a bunch of connections, and people knew that the balls were coming. So a lot of community organizations and programs had stepped forward to make requests. When I went there, the groundwork was pretty much already laid."

The list of beneficiaries of Stenstrom's work is long, including orphanages, schools, and even

community programs designed to reform drug-addled youth through sport.

"My brother-in-law runs a volleyball camp there too, so I gave him a bunch of volleyballs."

It seems that sport is healthy and thriving in the African country. Even more so now because of the help of one of NAIT's staff

members, who believes this is the start of a long tradition of friendship with our brothers and sisters across the planet. "The system can and will work if we put the effort into it."

Stenstrom would like to see this program cross-promoted with other NAIT programs and events, and encourages students and staff alike to get involved.

Stenstrom's idea to get the community involved by holding donation and fund-raising drives

has garnered local media attention. CityTV and CTV have both expressed interest in broadcasting future events, however, plans for such events are still in the developing stages.

# E-learning is coming to NAIT

E-learning is now a possibility for business students at NAIT, especially for those unable to come to campus. The first course being offered online is BLAW 161 Section WA, which is a course examining Canada's legal systems.

The course is running on a part-time basis starting Feb. 26 until June 15. In September, it will be available, along with five other courses from the business program, full-time. Another five courses will subsequently be offered in an online format in January 2008.

Helping to get things up and running are: Sam Fefferman and Ariane Arnould, both from the School of Business; Eleanor Frandsen, Dean of Technology and Curriculum Innovation (TCI); Garry Bridge, Dean of Applied Media and Information; and Steve Belenovic, also of TCI.

BLAW 161 is being offered online first since it is a basic

course required for accounting, finance, management, and marketing business diplomas. "This is not designed to be passive, but rather interactive," said Arnould.

"Teachers are always in touch with students, who will then be asked to engage in online discussions," he said.

So far, interest from students has been high, especially for those who live out of the city. They are excited by the idea of taking courses without having to leave work or home. The program has even received interest from those living overseas as well.

"The information delivered online is exactly the same information as that delivered inside the classroom," she added. This class, and those to follow will rely on a wide variety of multimedia tools designed to be user friendly.

"The structure of the course is such that all activities are done online except for mid-terms and finals. Those will be conducted at a convenient location for the individual, where the exam can be sent to a professional willing to supervise the student."

The schedule will involve the latest version of WEBCT. "We will try to promote a weekly pace so that everyone stays on track. We don't want to lose anybody."






I'm condoning coffee). Energy drinks are banking on the desire to be alert and ready simply for accumulation of information, whether

# Wireless network being explored by Edmonton

Does the City of Edmonton need wireless? The city is trying to answer this question lately as they look at such a possibility through the NextGen group.

Currently I have the pleasure of being able to attend some meetings of this city hall committee meant to give a voice to youth as it assesses the need, costs and technologies for such a scenario. Clearly Edmonton is not the only city looking at this possibility but it is not the only one asking questions either.

Vancouver is also examining such a prospect: "City staff has determined that it is impossible to move forward with a municipal wireless at no cost to taxpayers," says an administrative report filed in that city on Jan. 2.

## Popular idea

Even though such a concept may not be free, it is a very popular idea within many municipalities.

"It is projected that US cities alone will spend more than \$3 billion in the next four years on public Wi-Fi deployments," says the same report.

Three billion over the next four years is serious dough, but why would cities want to go so far for just wireless Internet?

Well, a few things come to mind: First, it's convenient for users to go anywhere (or certain hotspots) and get access. Second, it can be used to help low-income neighbourhoods get Internet access "to bridge the digital divide." Third, it would attract tourists, and fourth it would provide more incentive to business and lower communication costs for the city itself.

So it sounds like there are a few good uses but there are also many drawbacks such as interference (anything that says 2.4 GHz can be game for messing up wireless coverage in a given radius, from door chimes to cordless phones) and legal liability. The city could be legally liable for its networks and as such could be sued when there are security issues, downtime and interference. (Not that private Internet carriers worry about that).

## Questions

Certain questions need to be asked before such an endeavour can be undertaken, such as purpose, affordability, reliability, security and the type of coverage (ubiquitous coverage or tactical locations, such as parks and public centres). So these are some of the things being looked at currently.

As many wonderful technologies as there are out there, it could be a cost disaster for the city to take on the deployment and maintenance of this service on its own.

Why do something in house when company X can do the same thing for a fraction of the cost?

On that note, this endeavour would obviously have to be outsourced to another contractor. It is clear there are no easy answers

here and still many questions, but keep in mind it is doable.

Some Canadian cities have gone ahead with this idea, such as Fredericton, N.B. and Toronto Hydro Telecom. Other cities such as Vancouver, Coquitlam, Hamil-

ton and Edmonton are exploring this enticing prospect.

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

# Artists breed fine comics

With shows like *Heroes* and *Smallville* topping the TV ratings, and movies like *Sin City* and *X-men: The Last Stand* busting the box office, it's no secret that comic book culture is gaining headway in the mainstream. There may be some of you interested in the comic medium, yet looking for stories not involving the spandex-clad and muscle-bound. Recommended below are some of the best non-superhero comic series available and it indicates their writers as well.

#### 5. Fables-Bill Willingham

Famous fairy-tale characters like Snow White and the Big Bad Wolf are re-imagined as a community of "Fables" exiled from their magical homeland into our "Mundy" world. The stories are far less whimsical than those from which the characters are taken.

It follows these characters as they try to remain hidden in their secret community in New York City. It focuses on character development and drama, with mystery, thriller and action aspects thrown in too. The series has not yet finished, but the first 51 issues are available in eight volumes.

#### 4. The Walking Dead-Robert Kirkman

This isn't your average zombie

attack story. This series follows an ever-changing group of survivors, struggling to stay alive (and sane) after the dead begin to walk the earth and eat the flesh of the living.

Pegged by the author as "a zombie movie that never ends," there are good zombie fight scenes and some scary moments, but the book focuses more on the characters and how they act in a given situation. They have to look for food and shelter, deal with their infected and insane, and keep order in a world gone to hell.

The illustrations are done in black and white, which is not only effective for the story, but also exemplifies that not all comics need to be coloured to be good.

Like Fables, the series isn't finished yet, but the first 30 issues are collected in five volumes.

#### 3. Preacher-Garth Ennis

Not a book for the squeamish or easily offended, because Preacher is dark, violent, unforgiving, sacrilegious, and a whole lot of fun. Small town southern preacher Jesse Custer becomes possessed by the supernatural spawn of an angel and a demon, and finds himself with the ability to command any mortal to do what he tells them. The series follows Custer, his ex-girlfriend, and a surly Irish vampire across America to literally find God and make him pay for the suffering of humanity.

With an HBO style (i.e. blood,

sex and cursing) mini-series in the works, this series may not be for everyone, but with a strong stomach and open mind, the nine volumes of this series can be good nasty fun.

#### 2. Y: The Last Man-Brian K. Vaughn

In this book, the world spirals into entropy as every male in the world is wiped out by a strange plague. Yorick Brown and his pet monkey are the only beings left on the planet with Y-chromosomes. While many guys are probably thinking how lucky this character must be, the world Vaughn creates is more dangerous than sexy.



Political groups are trying to use him, scientists need to clone him, and a group called the Amazons are trying to kill him.

Meanwhile, all he wants to do is find his girlfriend. Vaughn is one of the most prolific political writers in comics today, and this story is as full of political intrigue as it is drama and action.

This series also isn't finished, but the first 48 issues are collected in eight volumes. The book is planned to finish at issue 60.

#### 1. The Sandman-Neil Gaiman

After being imprisoned for many years, the series' protagonist Morpheus, the King of Dreams, must re-establish himself as the ruler of the "The Dreaming" (the world that personifies dreams). The story is part fantasy, part horror and entirely unique.

This award-winning book is lauded as one of the best and most important ever in comics, and holds its own when compared to other English literary works.

The art is abstract, colourful and all-around amazing, as many different artist drew the series during its 75-issue run. It's a must read.

These books only scratch the surface of sophisticated comic series available. Other titles worth mentioning are *Strangers in Paradise*, *Bone* and *American Splendour*. Not to mention all the

great graphic novels – long comics written to be read like a novel – out there too.

Each volume contains a full story, or these series volumes can be read all together, like buying every season of a TV show on DVD.

Give the first volume of any of these series a try if you're looking for some out-of-the-ordinary reading.

# Norah provides comfort food

This past weekend for the men's basketball team brought up two options. One, get swept by Concordia and pretty much kiss the playoffs goodbye, or two, win both games in the series and have room to breath.

Thursday night, the game was as intense as any good one should be. The air was tense with the playoff atmosphere but the Ooks were ready. Aris Nunez-Ruiz was the story of the game for NAIT in what coach Chuma Nwobosi termed his "coming out party."

Half time came and the Ooks had found themselves down 17 points. The Thunder pushed their lead to 22 points and it looked game over, right? Led by second-year guard Brent Vriend, NAIT launched an aggressive attack on both ends of the court and managed to trim the

lead to 10 to start the fourth quarter.

The teams traded baskets and foul shots and Arash Sharghi earned a late trip to the foul line to seal the game, and an unbelievable comeback win. The Ooks won by a score of 83-82.

There was an interesting note from this game. A crazy fan from Concordia ran and attempted to attack the referee due to a call that sent Sharghi to the foul line.

Next action is against the Augustana Vikings Saturday, Feb. 10 at NAIT.

In hockey, the men had the weekend off and the women suffered a tough 8-1 loss against SAIT.

In volleyball, the men lost Friday 3-2 against Mount Royal then 3-0 against the Cougars Saturday. The women got blanked 3-0 both nights by Mount Royal.

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# Harley-Davidson has gone hog-wild for Fairview

NAIT's Fairview Campus has something no other NAIT campus does. What is it?

It's a state-of-the-art Harley-Davidson training facility, which has earned the reputation of being Canada's No. 1 motorcycle technical training centre.

The program started in 1980, initially as a Motorcycle Certificate program. There are now three types of training available, including a motorcycle mechanic certificate, Alberta motorcycle apprenticeship training, and the Harley-Davidson program.

In 1988, the Harley-Davidson specific program started after Trevor Deely of Deely Harley-Davidson Canada (DHDC) took note of the high calibre of technicians coming from Fairview. These same technicians were in limited supply across the country.

In talking to staff, there is a strong feeling of pride in both the institution and the students.

## 'So proud'

"We are all so proud of our students and their program of study in our No. 1 facility," said Louise Gillies of administrative support.

"Our shop features in-floor exhaust, wireless computer capability, an eight-station computer lab and laptop-to-bike connections via Digital Technician for remapping of the electronic control module. Students work on the latest bikes with factory tools and factory-trained instructors," she added.

The facility is full of equipment, from whole bikes to gaskets that have been contributed from the industry. In 1993 Trev Deely donated \$700,000 of his own money to build the permanent facility.

Recently, DHDC donated 10 complete bikes with spare parts, invaluable for hands-on training.


## 'Can't teach desire'

"The average age of students in our program is in the mid-30s because most have had a previous job and have decided they want to specialize in Harleys. We can teach the technical skills, but we can't teach the desire," said Gillies.

While the majority come from Western Canada, there are "usually one or two from Saskatchewan or Manitoba, and there is always one from the Maritimes," she said. However, students can also be in their 60s due to courses designed to upgrade factory training for those with years of experience.

There are typically waiting lists and the program's popularity has warranted a travelling classroom for a one-week training program, which spends seven weeks in Ontario and five in Quebec.

This year there is a Screamin' Eagle EFI race tuner course, which has never been offered anywhere other than the Harley-Davidson Motor Company facility in Milwaukee.






