HOW TO COOK A SKUNK

Skunk meat is white, tender & tasty, and was a favorite delicacy of the Indians. Roast Skunk: Skin, clean and eviscerate (gut). Remove scent glands. Parboil in salted water for 15 minutes. Drain off water, then place meat in fresh water & steam until tender (about 1 hr.) Transfer to roasting pan and put in oven at 375°. Add 1 Cup of consomme', two sliced carrots & 1 teaspoon of onion juice and cook uncovered for 2 hrs. REMEMBER: REMOVE THE SCENT GLANDS. If you haven't tried it, don't knock it!!!
