
From Gary Bierschwale, President

Concerning Family Days

Yep. Last weekend in October it'll be this year, too. Only we've decided to do a few things differently. We, the staff, our wives, and a herd of children (mostly the Scribe's) met at the Bierschwale's and talked over a set of problems and events that had to do with Family Days and other events. October 28-30, Fri-Sun is the date (we're trying to get District approval to extend the camp over to Sunday) of the camp. Here's what we're planning.

We're camping near the Assembly area (flag poles), where there are (check it out, ladies) FLUSH TOILETS AND SHOWERS! You won't mind that too much, will you? And there's a stand of trees on the North to break the often chilly wind. As usual, there will be selected a family winner, based on a variety of "points", for primitive camping, participation, first-time to be in attendance, bringing guests, wearing proper Pioneer clothing, and scores from the games. Cost for the camp will be \$7.50 for members, \$5 for non-members, and a maximum of \$25 for each family group. Visitors who camp with your group count as part of your family. Little kids are free.

Friday, nothing is formally planned, and it's not required that you get into Pioneer clothing at all. You're welcome to if you wish, but the first order of business is to set up the homestead, so don't worry about it. Do see the Scribe, though and get your name listed so we can register you and give you your score sheet.

Saturday morning, we'll have a Family Trace, which will involve men, women, and children shooting, throwing, setting traps, making fires, etc. If you don't have a knife, hawk, or rifle, don't worry. It will be easy enough to borrow one, and the fact is, we don't really want folks running all around with firearms, not in the crowded area we will be camped in. If you don't have a wife, Young Buck, well, there's likely to be a few eligible Young Does around to choose a partner for the event, and if you need a child to round out your "family" feel free to borrow one of those, too. The whole point is to have fun, and we'll figure out who "wins" afterwards.

On Saturday, all the ladies, young and younger, who want to do so will remove to the Staff HQ building, rain or shine, and work on sewing up the FCF quilt. (This year at the banquet, we're going to have the quilt finished. The new Pres wants to tell you more about that, so I won't.) We're looking

forward to seeing some of your dandy needlework, girls. While you're quilting, men and boys will keep track of the children and head up the games and activities for the little ones. Ladies, you've put in your time doing that at he camps, and this time we want to take over. Some of the games we will be playing with the boys and girls is Corn Cob Darts, Hoop and Stick, Wheel Barrow Run, Marbles (bring your marbles and see if you can add to your poke!), Stilt Walk, Pinata's, Sack Races, Three Legged Races, and more! As you can see, *he kids and men folk will be busy, ladies! We'll keep good track of them, and probably won't let too many get lost in the woods.

At all times, we need folks who aren't doing something else to be working with their craft or trade, or making the rounds and looking at the work other folks are doing. Trading and selling are encouraged. New members should consider what they will be working on when they advance to Buckskin. Trades we lack are tinsmith, glazier, weaver, knitter, cobbler, and tanner, to name just a few. As far as I know, these slots are not presently filled, and would be wide open territory for anyone who chose those trades. I'd buy hand woven cloth for making shirts, etc. if anyone made it...and everybody needs shoes.

Saturday night will be a fellowship and potluck dinner, with songs and fun and a devotion by our speaker. The men will be cooking for the whole camp and there will probably be a cooking contest of one sort or another, details to follow. And, of course, on Sunday morning, there'll be church/Sunday School, taught by our members to each other (many of us, of course, are unday School teachers or something like that back at our home churches) so there should be no lack there. A staff member may well call you and ask for help in some area, like adult or children's games or helping with church. Please be helpful and cooperative if that should happen. We all need each other to make this camp work.

I hope to see a crowd at Family Days and my Staff and I would like to get some ideas from you of what we can do to help make future camps more fun and exciting for everyone! The camp will be open Thursday night so come when you can.


