


President's Page

There will be plenty of fire wood (already cut and stacked around the fort) and water. The fort covers about 3 acres within its walls and is built to the exact specifications of the original fort built in 1834 on the original site. We will have a general store with various goods for sale and some great prizes. I think you will greatly enjoy yourself, so make sure you make this camp! I will see you there!

Family Days

Yes! It's about time for our favorite camp, Family Days! It will be at Fort Parker in Groesbeck, Texas. Old Fort Parker is a rebuilt historic structure. It was reconstructed just like the original on or about on the same site. This is where Cynthia Ann Parker, mother of Quanah Parker, was kidnapped by Comanches after they tricked their way inside the fort and killed everyone else. The overseer of the fort, Bert Dockery, has opened his arms and given us full use of the fort and all of its facilities from Thursday October 24 to Sunday October 27. There may be visitors in camp during the day because it is a historic site and the town of Groesbeck and surrounding cities know there will be a historic camp in the fort that weekend. We will have a great speaker for our brush arbor meetings and all sorts of activities for the whole family. There will be some great prizes to be had and there will also be a general STORE

inside one of the cabins in the fort. There will be patches and also medallions for a modest fee commemorating this camp. The camp fee will be \$20 per camp or family (\$10 of that will go to the fort). There will be water and fire wood but it wouldn't hurt to bring extra wood just in case... We hope this camp will be better than last years... so don't miss it!

Basic Ranger Academy

As you may have heard... we are going to add to our Basic Ranger Training (BRT) Camp. In addition to the traditional BRT format, we will have an LTC Camp and an Advanced BRT Camp. People needed: 16 leaders

1 Camp Commander (Should be an instructor and have a good knowledge of Rangers)

1 Lt. Camp Commander (Assists Camp Commander in his duties (training spot))

1 Camp Coordinator (purchases or acquires all resources needed at camp)

1 Camp Assistant Coordinator (Assists the Camp Coordinator in his duties (training spot))

12 Camp Instructors (should be ICS trained instructors)

Registration: \$20 per person

Meals (\$3 per person per meal - 3 meals per camp = \$9)

Camp Patch (\$3 per person - patch will be same design each year with different colors)

Misc. (for items not in above categories - \$8)

Classes:

The BRT and LTC classes will include ropecraft, firecraft, toolcraft, compass, cooking, etc. The ABRT classes will consist of camping in rain, camping with pests, rope machines, making rope and constructing rope bridges, etc.

1996 FCF Quilt Block

The quilt block for the 1996 FCF quilt is enclosed in this envelope. If you do not plan to complete a block for the quilt... please return it. Lets be good stewards of our District's assets. This material is being paid for with FCF funds and if we do not get enough squares back to complete the quilt, we will have to buy more material and it's not cheap.

This year's quilt is an Irish Chain pattern. It's going to be very beautiful! You can do what ever you want with your square, embroidery your name, your family's names, fancy art work, your totems, and use any color except white. Here are the rules for this year's block:

- 1) Don't wash it.
- 2) Don't use paint pens or markers of any sort.
- 3) Use as many colors embroidery floss as you wish, except white.
- ** Embroidery floss is six strands thick. Please separate it and use only two strands when embroidering your patterns.
- 4) Leave 1/4 inch seam allowance around all four sides of your block so we will be able to put them together without messing up your design.

Please try to have your block ready by Family Days Camp, October 25-27. We need as much time as we can get to put this puppy together and quilt it for you in time for the auction at the FCF Christmas banquet.

We will have a contest at the Family Days Camp for best looking block and a prize will be awarded! So do your best and bring it to camp so you will have a chance to win a nice prize!


