

I just returned from a week-long Prayer Task Force in El Salvador. As always, God moved in mighty ways. God handpicks participants in the prayer teams. Each time we prayed for some there, some team member had experienced that problem and could relate that God is always faithful. For example, one pastor was greatly distressed because of a split in the church and personal attacks on him and his family. Several of the team members were board members that had experienced a church split. One member was a pastor's daughter and could relate to personal family attacks. Each time, we were able to assure them that when God shakes a church, a strong core will always remain. When God is finished, the latter is better than the former.

We traveled to King's Castle ministries children's camp. This camp is several hundred feet below the crest in an extinct volcano. The castles overlook a huge lake. One of the castles is known as the Prayer Fortress. Here, prayer continues 24 hours per day, seven days a week. We joined their prayer team in what was to be a 5-minute walk through prayer. An hour and a half later, we were wondering how to end the prayer time. People were waiting on us. I felt much like some of the Old Testament prophets; I had to repent for 15 - 20 minutes just to be worthy of being in that prayer team. God was so present. It was experience that will not soon be forgotten.

But you too can feel God's presence here. It is wonderful to go to some other country to pray for the people there. However, there are people here that need the same prayers. In addition to the Royal Rangers boys, there is Teen Challenge, Chi Alpha, Youth jail ministries or even your next door neighbor.

Wherever you are, find God and pray for those around you. They will win. God will win. You will win.

SARGE TRAINING ACADEMY

Sarge Training Academy offers top notch training for boys from Pioneers through Challengers (ages 9-17) by providing the resources, instruction, and counseling needed to reach their highest potential in Royal Rangers. The academy provides this opportunity by applying the self-reliant method of camping. It is important for boys to do things for themselves, to gain confidence in their abilities, and to gain satisfaction of doing something for others.

Each patrol will be assigned an area for camping and will use the patrol method for giving assignments. Patrols will prepare balanced and nutritious meals. Each patrol member will have many opportunities at cooking, fire building, and cleaning up on a rotating basis. There is no better training for boys than this kind of experience. If you want your Royal Rangers to learn more about the patrol method and building patrol spirit and pride, enroll them in the Sarge Training Academy.

PTC - <u>Commanders!!</u> Would you like for your Pioneers to go to a District Royal Rangers training camp? We have a 3 ¹/₂ day camp for them this summer. He will learn all the basic camping skills, which will help him to earn his advancements quickly. Each boy will return to his outpost excited about what he has learned at this camp. This can make a difference in your outpost. We are going to limit this camp to 64 boys. The reason is the area can only handle so many tents. The first 64 boys who turn in their application with the appropriate fees will only be able to attend this camp. Let's get them enrolled now while space is available.

AMC - This camp is designed for boys to work on their merits,

which helps them earn the Gold Medal of Achievement. Most of the required awards are offered at this camp. If your Royal Rangers need a boost in this area, this camp will be beneficial to them. You must be $10 \frac{1}{2}$ or have completed PTC to attend.

JLTC - This is a structured camp for Trailblazers or Trailrangers. Boys learn to discipline themselves to use the patrol system in getting their assigned daily projects completed. Also the camp has a Senior Guide, which is the liaison between the camp commander and the patrols.

AJTC - This is a camp for all those boys who have completed JLTC. This camp is designed to prepare boys for leadership in the outpost. Each boy will be given opportunity to instruct in one or more classes.

JTT - This camp is designed for backpacking. Boys will carry all his personal gear, food, and water over a given trail for a five-day trip. This camp is packed with fun, adventure, and excitement in the mountains of New Mexico. The mountain scenic view will be indescribable. This can be a once in a lifetime experience for a boy. Since this camp will be held at a National Park in New Mexico, all the boys attending this camp will be <u>interviewed</u> by the Camp Commander at Pow Wow.

We are needing help with this year's academy. It is going to be the largest ever. Please encourage all your Pioneers, Trailblazers, and Trail Rangers (Challengers) to mark their calendars for this exciting camp. We have a camp for everyone so encourage your boys to attend.
