Is Your Life a Puzzle or just Puzzling?

When I was a child, I used to enjoy putting together jigsaw puzzles. I still do. The challenge often kept me up until the wee hours of the morning before I gave up to go to bed. One puzzle had nearly 3,000 pieces and took about a year to complete.

When I first opened the box, I would dump the contents on a table. Some of the pieces were stuck together and others were upside down. To the casual observer, it was utter chaos. But, I had a box lid with a picture of the finished product on it. I began looking for the corner pieces; then the borders; then the common colors or designs. I would find pieces on the top that went to the bottom; on one side that belonged on the other. Gradually, some identifiable images began to appear. The more images I could see, the faster the assembly process went.

Eventually, I was staring at a nearly completed picture with the final piece in my hand. When I placed it in its proper place, the picture was complete. My challenge was accomplished.

Our lives are very similar to this story. At first, it may appear to be in disarray with no possible solution. But God has the box cover with the completed product on it. He sees the end from the beginning. He bends some pieces to become corners and smoothes the rough edges to become borders. He assembles the good characteristics to form images. We may only see chaos but GIFWMY*. He continues to put the pieces in the proper places.

We too often go to another puzzle and bring back some pieces we like. That can destroy God's puzzle. When He finds one of these pieces, He takes it out and destroys it if we let Him.

As the puzzle continues, images appear that may be doors and windows of opportunity to serve Him. We may see an assembly of similar colors or design but that do not seem to fit anything we see now. That is God's vision for us. We can't see how it will fit but God knows the end from the beginning and continues building the images. He looks to the future. That is where the work will be done. The past is gone. The present is fleeting.

Often, we think we see where God is going and try to finish the puzzle before God's time. He will build each image and show it, as we need it. We get tired and quit working on the puzzle. God says He will never leave us.

If we are missing a few pieces, is that a problem or an opportunity for God to do a miracle? God knows the outcome. God cares about us. God gives us the tools to complete the task.

Next time you are confused, look at your puzzle. Did you bring in extra pieces? Did you work beyond God's plan? Do you see His vision for your life? I have seen a vision from God for my life. Sometimes it is scary but God has the box lid with my life picture on it.

Trust Him!

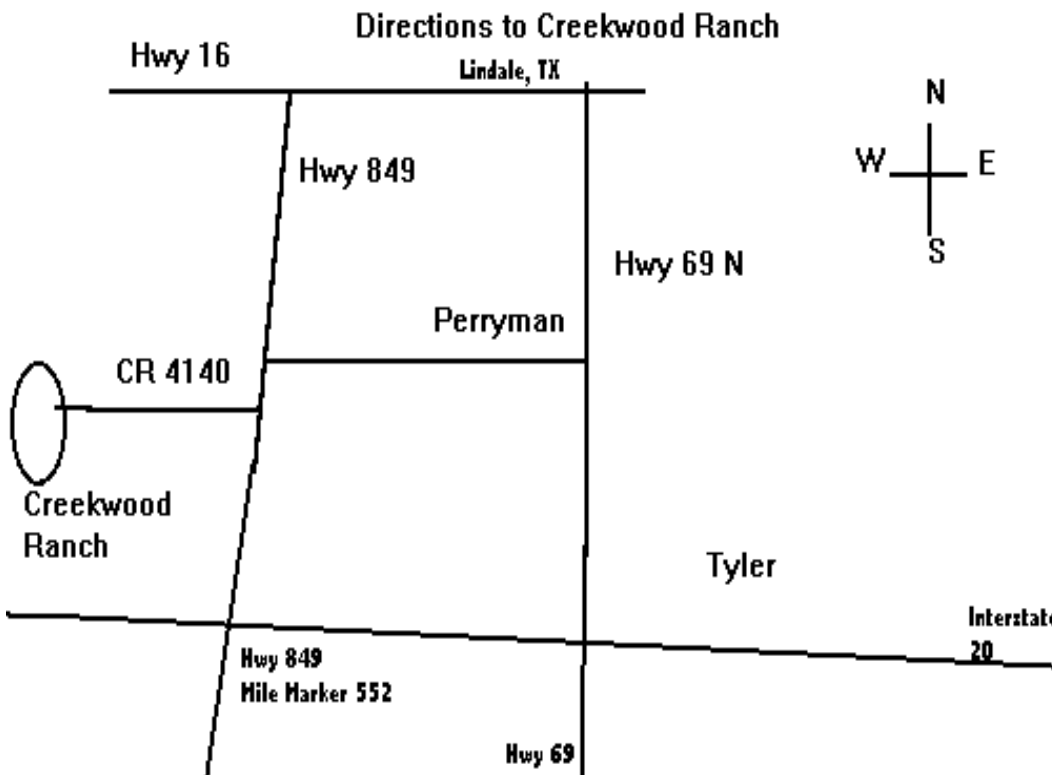
We are planning more exciting activities such as a Frisbee golf course, Ranger challenges and some advanced merit classes for the Discovery and Adventure Rangers.

Sectional Realignment Approved for the North Texas District

This past June at District Council, a vote was taken to realign the sections in the North Texas District. The amendment was approved and starting January 1, 2003, all sections in North Texas will have new boundaries. Two sections no longer exist and 5 new sections have been added. We will now have 21 sections in North Texas.

Every section will hold elections in September and October for new presbyters. Once this has been completed, each sectional presbyter will be appointing a new sectional staff. Please work with these new staffs as they learn about their new section.

Some sections are staying the same, some are adding counties and others are losing counties.

Below is an overview of each section and the counties they represent:

Leadership Training Academy

LTA—A New Training Philosophy

The Leadership Training Academy (LTA) is a new approach to Royal Rangers training. The previous Leadership Training Course (LTC) was a closed ended training plan. Once a commander earned his or her Leader's Medal of Achievement (LMA) there was no additional classroom-type training, outside of the national training events available, where the commanders could enhance his or her skills and abilities.

The LTA has adopted a continuous training philosophy. It places training content into "modules" that commander can complete in eight hours or less. This approach gives the commander many training options to customize a training plan that meets their unique needs! The new LTA approach allows additional modules to be added as new training ideas or programs changes are incorporated into Royal Rangers. This makes the LTA a life-long commitment to training!

A major change in the LTA approach is the new training format students will experience when they take the modules. LTA modules will not require homework, exams, or major time commitments outside the module. The major highlights of this approach are:

- Quizzes, no Exams required to pass!
- On Your Own boxes, no required homework!
- Everyone who attends passes with a Council of Achievement held at the conclusion of every module!

The training listed here is just the beginning of the type of world class training that will soon be available to every commander through the LTA!

Modules Available Now

Ranger Basics (8 hours)

This module is the foundational module that all new commanders will be encouraged to attend. Ranger Basics will provide a new commander with all the necessary information he/she needs to effectively lead boys in the weekly meetings.

LMA Transitional Module (6-7 hours)

This module is for those commanders who earned their LMA under the previous LTC program. It consists of the shorter version of Ranger Basics, plus the changes to the new program. This module is available now through December 31, 2003.

Transitional LTC (24 hours—approximately)

This module adapts the current LTC content (Books I-V) to the new LTA format. This module is available now through December 31, 2003.

LTA Camp-Out

This training module is an overnight campout that is required for those commander working

with the Discovery, Adventure, and Expedition Rangers. This module will prepare commander to take boys camping.

(NTC) National Training Camp (4 day camp)

This is a camp that will focus upon the patrol system and camping skills. Taken in lieu of an LTA Campout module.

Ranger Kids Skills (6 hours)

This module is for Ranger Kids commanders and will focus on the skills needed to safely take Ranger Kids on outings and field trips.

Modules Available March 2003

Age-Specific Activities (2 hours) [Ranger Kids, Discovery Rangers, Adventure Rangers, and Expedition Rangers] This module will provide group commanders ideas, skills, and safe practices to follow when working with boys outside the Outpost meeting.

Discipleship (3 hours)

This module is intended to provide commanders within-depth training in soul winning, counseling, and discipleship issues related to ministering to boys.

Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship (2 hours)

This module will introduce commanders to FCF, its mission, goals, and requirements for membership and advancement. It is designed to encourage men to become members and for them to encourage membership among their boys.

How to Start an Outpost (2 hours)

This module is for those commanders who need to know how to start Royal Rangers in their church.

Outpost Chaplain (2 hours)

This module will equip Outpost Chaplains with the skills necessary to fulfill the spiritual needs of the outpost.

Outpost Councilmen (2 hours)

This module will equip Outpost Councilmen with the skills necessary to administer the Royal Rangers program in their church.

Physically Challenged Boys (2 hours)

This module will help commanders effectively lead boys that are physically challenged.

Safety and the Church (2 hours)

This module will help commanders understand the most important safety issues when dealing with boys during outpost meetings, activities, and while transporting boys.

Successful Outposts (5 hours)

This module incorporates many ideas and best practices a commander can follow to create a

successful outpost.

Substance and Child Abuse (3 hours)

This module introduces commanders to the life threatening aspects of substance and child abuse and how to spot boys currently living in an abusive environment.

Teaching Techniques (7 hours)

This module provides commanders an opportunity to improve their teaching skills by a “train-the-trainer” type class approach.

Trip Planning (3 hours)

This module provides commanders with the necessary skills to plan and execute a successful Royal Rangers trip.

Plans are well underway for the 2003 South Central Regional Conference. It will be held January 24-25, 2003 at the San Antonio Airport Hilton. Rev. Saturday will be full of workshops and classes to provide every commander with new ideas that can be used in the local outpost.
