LTC-Trained Transition Module Deadline

Instructors have until December 31st to get current LTC-trained leaders through the Transition Module so that they may earn the new LMA. After this date all current LTC leaders who what to earn the new LMA will need to complete the required modules for the new LMA. The Transition module is 6 hours long. Nothing less than that qualifies a LTC-trained leader for the new LMA. If you have questions about what the Transition Module consists of, check with the district training coordinator.

Jesus is missing!

What Does It Take to Earn the Leaders Medal of Achievement?

Along with the new Royal Rangers program has come a new training program -- the Leadership Training Academy (LTA). Details about the LTA are in a brochure that is available from the national Royal Rangers website (http://ag.org/royal-rangers/lta-brochure.pdf).

For Existing Commanders (those with their LMA)

If you earned your Leaders Medal of Achievement (LMA) through the Leadership Training Course, you have one of the "old" LMAs -- either a red one or a blue one. To update yourself on the new program, and to qualify to wear the new gold LMA, you need to complete the LMA Transitional Module. This module takes a minimum of 6 hours to complete, and consists of a quick look at the Ranger Basics module PLUS additional sessions on the new program. Anything less than 6 hours of training, which consists of these two parts, will NOT qualify you for the new gold LMA.

This transitions option for experienced commanders to earn the gold LMA expires December 31, 2003 (this year). After that, all commanders, whether or not you have the red or blue LMA, will have to complete all of the modules required for the LMA to earn the gold LMA.

For New Commanders (those without their LMA)

If you are a fairly new commander, you likely have not had the opportunity to earn the Leaders Medal of Achievement (LMA) yet. To earn your LMA, there is a series of modules that you need to take, starting with Ranger Basics. Here is the list of requirements for you to earn your LMA:

- Ranger Basics (8 hours)
- One of the age-specific activity modules -- RK Activities, DR/AR Activities, or ER Activities (4 hours)
- Discipleship 1 and 2 (3 hours each; 6 hours total)
- Safety and the Church (3 hours)
- Successful Outposts (4 hours)
- First Aid-CPR -- from a certified provider, e.g., Red Cross
- One of the following: LTA Camp-out or NTC (DR/AR/ER Commanders), RK Skills or RKTC (RK Commanders), or National Training Conference (all commanders)
- Any two elective modules (minimum of 2 hours each)

Once you complete that list of requirements, you will qualify to wear the gold LMA on your uniform.

A Note to Certified Instructors

Be sure you uphold the requirements set out in the LTA brochure that are summarized above. These are the national guidelines, and as a certified instructor you have agreed to abide by those guidelines. There is NO WAY for any experienced commander to qualify for the gold LMA in less than 6 hours. Be sure to stick to this guideline.

What a great time at Sarge! 226 boys came from North and South Texas to attend this years Sarge Training Academy. The newest camp, Junior Canoe Expedition, took 6 boys along a float ride down the Buffalo River in Arkansas, and they all came back. We also saw our largest number ever for the beginning camp, Discovery Adventure Camp, or DAC. This camp used to be called Pioneer Training Camp, or PTC. It had 70 Discovery Rangers for the first ever DAC and what a time they had.

Not only did these campers have a great time learning, they also had a personal experience with God. Over 100 boys received a touch from God through the Baptism in the Holy Spirit. We had commanders get healed of physical troubles, revelations through the Word that were confirming words to some. And something I haven't seen before. During the praise and worship Tuesday evening, the flood gates just opened. No one had said a word, no gestures had been made, yet there they were, boys, lots of boys, coming to the alter. Not just one or two, there were 50-60 boys that suddenly made the move to the alter. In just a matter of seconds, the seats had cleared and boys and commanders were there seeking God, falling on their face before Him, crying out to the Lord and receiving the gifts from above. God is good, and He answers the prayers of His children.

Now we're making plans for next year. June 27 – July 2, 2004 will be next years camp. If you've wanted to help but haven't been able to, talk to one of the commanders who were there this year and ask them about their experiences. Yes, there will be tales of struggles, but when they talk about the council fire services, watch how they light up talking about what God did. Start looking ahead to next years and expect more great things from God for your boys, and for the commanders who attend. Thanks to all you guys who came out and helped this year.

New Training Available for Leaders

Modules available now

Ranger Basics (8 hours) - This module is the foundational module for all new commanders will be encouraged to attend. Ranger Basics will provide a new commander with all the necessary information he/she needs to effectively lead boys in the weekly meeting.

LTA Transitional Modules (6-7 hours) - This module is for those commanders who earned their LMA under the previous LTC program. It consists of a shorter version of Ranger Basics, plus the changes to the new program. This module is available now through December 31, 2003.

LTA Camp-Out - This training module is an overnight campout that is required for those commanders working with the Discovery, Adventure, and Expedition Rangers. This module will prepare commanders to take boys camping.

Ranger Kids Skills (6 hours) - This module is for Ranger Kids commanders and will focus on the skills needed to safely take Ranger Kids on outings and field trips.

RK, **DR**/**AR**, **or ER Age-Specific Activities (4 hours)** - This module will provide group commanders ideas, skills, and safe practices to follow when working with boy outside the Outpost meeting.

Discipleship 1 and 2 (3 hours each) - This module is intended to provide commanders with in-depth training in soul winning, counseling, and discipleship issues related to ministering to boys.

Frontiersman Camping Fellowship (2 hours) - This module will introduce commanders to FCF, its mission, goals, and requirements for membership and advancement. It is designed to encourage men to become members and for them to encourage membership among their boys.

How to Start an Outpost (2 hours) - This module is for those commanders who need to know how to start Royal Rangers in their church.

Outpost Chaplain (2 hours) - This module will equip Outpost Chaplains with the skills necessary to fulfill the spiritual needs of the outpost.

Outpost Councilmen (2 hours) - This module will equip Outpost Councilmen with the skills necessary to administer the Royal Rangers program in their church.

Working with Boys with Disabilities (2 hours) - This module will help commanders effectively lead boys that are mentally and physically challenged.

Safety and the Church (3 hours) - This module will help commanders understand the most important safety issues when dealing with boys during outpost meetings, activities, and while transporting boys.

Successful Outpost (4 hours) - This module incorporates many ideas and best practices a commander can follow to create a successful outpost.

Substance and Child Abuse Prevention (3 hours) - This module introduces commanders to their life threatening aspects of substance and child abuse and how to spot boys currently living in an abusive environment

Teaching Techniques (4 hours) - This module provides commanders with techniques and ideas to effectively teach boys in or out of the outpost meeting.
