Have you ever wanted to save money on Pow Wow registration? This year you'll have the chance. A special work day at the camp has been scheduled for April 1. ## **Sarge Training Academy**

June 25-30 are the dates for the 2006 Sarge Training Academy. It will include 3 camps this year: Junior Training Camp

(JTC), Junior Canoe Expedition (JCE), and Junior Training Trails (JTT). The other camps that are usually a part of Sarge Training Academy will not be offered this year due to the National Camporama. Cost will be \$125 for any of the 3 camps this year.

JTC is a 5 day camp for all Royal Rangers who have completed the 7<sup>th</sup> grade, and have completed the Camping Merit. The boy must be a member of an up-to-date chartered outpost. JTC is designed to give boys training in camping and leadership in their local outpost. JTC offers training in these specific areas: The Patrol Method, Rope Craft, Lashing, Nature Study, Tool Craft, Fire Craft, First Aid, Compass, Safety, Camp Layout, Cooking, Sanitation, Soul Winning, Junior Leaders in an Outpost, Council Fires, Model Outpost Meeting, The Advancement Trail, Camp Recreation, Backpacking, and Overnight Backpacking Trips.

JCE is a 5 day camp for Royal Rangers having completed 8<sup>th</sup> grade and successfully completed JTC. This course is designed to provide basic instruction in canoeing skills and water safety while traveling and camping on the river. Those participating in JCE will assemble on Sunday at the Lakeview Camp in Maypearl, TX, and will travel for the expedition. Once there, you will enjoy four full days of canoeing down the river, finding campsites,

and experiencing the power of God during nightly services.
While on this trip, campers have the opportunity to work on such merits as the Wildlife, Astronomy, Nature Study, and others. Graduation from JCE will be held Friday evening at Lakeview Camp.

JTT is a 5 day camp for Royal Rangers having completed 8<sup>th</sup> grade and successfully completed JTC. This course is designed to provide basic instruction in backpacking skills. Those participating in JTT will assemble on Sunday at the Lakeview Camp in Maypearl, TX, and will travel for the backpack trip. Once there, you will enjoy four full days of trail packing before the return trip. Graduation from JTT will be held with the rest of the camps Friday evening at Lakeview Camp.

All participants in JCE and JTT must be preapproved to attend these camps, and will be personally interviewed by the Camp Commander and Sarge Training Academy Program Director.

An application for Sarge is available on the district website under forms (http://ntd.royalrangers.net). In order for any single



camp to not be canceled, we need applications to be turned in by June 1. Minimum numbers for these camps will be JTC – 16, JTT – 4, JCE – 4.

This year we are looking for some skits. Your outpost will have the opportunity to present your skit at the council fire service Friday evening. All skits will have to be reviewed by Jeff Kersey before they are presented. Some skits may not be used due to number of total entrants or the content. No skit should make fun of any commander, even if he consents. Let's see some new funny skits and show our comedic side to the camp.

We will once again have Patrol flag judging. Judging will be immediately after the Saturday morning flag raising ceremony. Rules for the competition will be listed in the Pow Wow packet. We will also have the entry way competition. There were many nice and inventive campsite entry ways last year and we look for bigger and better ones this year. Rules for entry way judging can also be found in the Pow Wow packet that will be mailed to your church.

As always there will be a 36-hour prayer vigil during Pow Wow. You and your outpost will have the chance to spend time in prayer for your outpost, the district, the camp, and many other things as we lift up to God all things for His protection and direction. The schedule is divided by sections so that the entire time will be covered with prayer. Your sectional commander should contact you with times for your section and outpost.

Cost for the camp this year will be \$20 per person for chartered churches, \$30 per person for non-chartered, and will include a Royal Ranger backpack for the first 800 who pre-register. We will have Pinewood Derby races, games and activities for the afternoon, shooting ranges, entry way competition for your campsite, patrol standard judging, a concession stand, and many other activities and fun. One of the special events this year will be the creation of the North Texas District BB-gun team. This team will represent the district and compete at the National Camporama in July.

Your boys like to see your uniform change as you earn your awards and add them to your uniform. Remember WE TEACH BY EXAMPLE.

At this time I would like to talk to all commanders that want to become Certified Instructors (CI's) for the Leadership Training Academy, and all current Certified Instructors who need to renew their certifications. The Instructors Certification Seminar (ICS) will be on September 9<sup>th</sup> from 8AM until 4PM at Lakeview Camp in Maypearl TX. All the abovementioned commanders need to go to the district Royal Rangers web site and download and print off the application form. After completing this form mail it to the district office.

This seminar will teach you how to become an effective instructor, and it will provide to you some of the most up to date teaching methods used in the Leadership Training Academy today. Just a reminder you must be invited to attend the ICS, so make sure you get your application in by the dead line of May 31<sup>st</sup>.

#### Camporama 2006—The Adventure

**Exploring God's Plan for Our Lives** 

During the week of July 17-21, 2006, an estimated 7,500 boys and men from the US and many foreign countries will travel to Eagle Rock, Missouri for this once-in-a-lifetime event. All participants will enjoy a magnificent view: 1,500 acres of beautiful Ozarks scenery.

From the dawn of the early morning through

the dark star-filled night, many exciting events will capture the attention of the campers. Some will require talent and patience such as the national championship events including the Archery Competition, the Daisy Team BB Gun National Championship, and the National Pinewood Derby Championship. Other events require coordination and a strong grip like racing on the BMX or Mountain Bike course, climbing on the Rappelling Tower or the Bouldering Wall. Other events only require that you show up and have fun-like cooling off in one of our swimming pools, riding one of the hot air balloons, racing in push carts, trading patches and pins at trading posts and encampments, meeting new friends from around the US and foreign countries, visiting special displays like Light for the Lost (LFTL) and Boys and Girls Missionary Crusade (BGMC) booths and many other incredible events. Campers will enjoy an abundance of daytime activities.

Campers will again be treated to three conveniently located full-service food stations. In addition, several snack bars will be set up throughout the encampment to encourage campers to drink plenty of liquids and prevent dehydration.

A camp hospital will be available for medical emergencies and will utilize doctors, nurses, and EMTs. Professional, full time security personnel will be on site to assist in medical and personal safety. These men represent law enforcement officers from the



Missouri State Highway Patrol, the US Marshall's office, and members of county or local law enforcement teams.

To help make this the best Camporama ever, fifteen trams will take campers to and from daily events and activities, and several large swimming pools will be available each day to cool off and have

some fun. Nearly 120,000 gallons of water fill up the four swimming pools!

Special services will be held each evening in the Amphitheater that can accommodate up to 10,000 campers for each service. The state-of-the-art stage complex houses a large, elevated projection screen at center stage to highlight the evening speaker or a special part of the service.

The Holy Spirit directs each of the evening services in a different way. The following dynamic speakers will be used of the Lord during this special event. Rev. Dave Roever, Vietnam veteran, purple heart recipient, and renowned evangelist; Rev. Randy Ruiz, renowned evangelist; Rev. Tom Green, National Director, Light for the Lost and HonorBound Ministries; and Rev. Terry Raburn, PenFlorida District Superintendent. Also, on Thursday evening, Bob Kilpatrick will minister a full concert of his inspirational and fun music. You don't want to miss a single evening service and miss out on what God will do through His Holy Spirit.

They looked a bit tired and worn yet you could see determination in their eyes. Upon closer inspection, glimpses of armor and weaponry showed through uniforms and gleamed from the lights in the room. These men were seasoned warriors. They knew what to expect from the enemy and were



Frontiersman! It is time! Time to announce the first FCF Buckskin Advancement test and ceremony for 2006! As I mentioned in the last issue of the *Signal Fire*, things will be changing this year. After much prayer, and discussion among the FCF staff, it has been decided to conduct the first ever Buckskin test and advancement ceremony at Pow Wow this year. Testing will start promptly at 9 am on Saturday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>. I expect the testing phase to end between 12-1 pm on Saturday. For those of you who are successful, the Buckskin ceremony will be held Saturday night after the council fire service.

This is your time to shine! But you must be Ready! What do you need to do to get ready for Buckskin? Several things are needed from you.

- You must have a completed application, signed by both your sponsor and your pastor, and submitted with your \$15.00 fee no later than 15 April 2006. This application must be mailed to the district office. This will allow me time to make sure that not only are you ready, but that the staff and I are ready for you at Pow Wow. The application can be found at http://ntd.royalrangers.net/ documents/forms.htm and select 2006 FCF Advancement form.
- Request the most recent copy of the Buckskin Workbook that I have available.

- 3. Practice! There will be skills testing introduced with this year's Buckskin Advancement. You must obtain a score of at least 70% in order to pass; this is a reachable goal! You will be tested on the following areas; each has 10 possible points:
  - Flint and Steel
  - Black Powder or Primitive Bow Shoot
  - Tomahawk
  - Knife
  - Outfit
  - FCF memorization
  - Trade Item
  - ID Staff
  - Workbook
- Primitive meal cooking
  I understand the task seems hard, but

  must plan ahead, I will not accept any
  applications postmarked after 15 April for this
  Buckskin testing; if your application is late, you

One word of advice, you will be asked to not only submit your trade item for evaluation, but you will asked to present it to the Wilderness Tribunal at the Buckskin Ceremony. #### What Would You Ask of Me?

In Mark 10:51 and Luke 18:41 Jesus asked blind Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus, this question: "What do you want me to do for you?" (NIV). Jesus asked the same question to James and John, the sons of Zebedee, when they came to Jesus desiring him to do whatever they asked (Mark 10:35, 36). Many people come to God with a "wish list," but do they really expect and believe God will give them what they ask?

Of course I'm not saying you can ask God to fulfill your worldly and lustful desires (James 4:3). Let's put things in proper perspective; if you are praying according to the will of the Father, why wouldn't He give you what you asked? Romans 8:32 says,

"He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?" (KJV). One example of this is when the early church was being persecuted. Acts 4:29 says the believers asked for boldness to speak the word of God. Just two verses later in verse 31 the scripture says they were filled with the Holy Ghost and spoke the word of God with boldness.

John 15:7 says, "If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you." (KJV) The word abide means to stay (in a given place, state, relation or expectancy). [Strong's Exhaustive Concordance of the Bible]. If we abide in Him and His words

are abiding (staying) in us, we will ask for those things which please God.

Matthew 7:9-11 (NIV) says, "Which of you, if his son asks for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!" James 1:17 (NIV) says, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows."

You might be thinking, "I asked God for something and I didn't get it." Although I don't know your specific situation, God does and there could be several possible reasons why you

didn't receive that particular request. They might include God has something better and more complete for you; or that giving you that particular requests might not be good for vou. A loving Father will not give his children something that is not in their best interest. We must remember that God is sovereign and knows what is best; both for us and in general. Don't let an answered prayer of "no" or "not now" keep you from asking of God. Did a parent or guardian telling you "no" when you were a child stop you from asking anything else? Remember if you are a Christian, then God is your Father and Provider. Ask of Him, and don't forget to give Him thanks.


#### **Attn: FCF Members**


