We are approaching a very busy time of the year in the Royal Rangers ministry. At the national level we see a number of important changes happening, including:

- Online chartering. Staring August 15 outposts will be able to log into the national Royal Rangers web site and charter their boys and leaders. Charter fees have changed slightly, with a dollar reduction in the fee for boys (\$11) and a dollar increase for leaders (\$13). The BIG new benefit of chartering is the 15% discount that outposts will receive on Royal Rangers merchandise from GPH that is ordered through the Ranger Store on the national Royal Rangers web site (http://royalrangers.ag.org). More information about this change is available later in this Signal Fire.
- New uniforms available. The new Royal Rangers utility uniforms have been shipping from GPH for a few months now. Finally GPH is also shipping the new insignia items for the uniform. You can find more information about the new uniform options, and order numbers for the new insignia items, in this brochure http://royalrangers.ag.org/programs/uniforms/. This site also has a chart that will help you order the correct size for your new uniforms.
- Sometime this fall a new Leaders Manual will become available.
- Next spring we will see the launch of the online curriculum, where we will finally be able to access all of the Royal Rangers Leaders Guides, merit reference books, etc. online.

At the district level, we are entering a period of high activity. The next thing on the district calendar is the Academy of Ranger Training (ART). This annual training event is always the weekend after Labor Day (September 11-13 this year) and is for Adventure Rangers, Expedition Rangers, and leaders. More information is available later in this Signal Fire. One notable addition this year is the LTA (Leadership Training Academy) camp-out has been opened up to leaders from Girls Ministries (GM). Girls Ministries hosts a camp-out for girls every fall at Lakeview; this is an ideal way for the GM leaders to learn how to take their girls on a fun, safe camp-out.

On September 18-19 we will be holding an FCF Adventure for the men and boys who want to join the Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship. Applications must be into Rodney Briggs, our FCF vice-president, by August 31. More information is available on the FCF web site (http://fcf.ntxrr.org/fcf-adventure/) or from Rodney at bow.breaker@yahoo.com or 817-939-9979.

Be sure to get your Ranger Kids ready for the Ranger Kids Day Camp on Saturday, September 26. A flyer is enclosed in this Signal Fire, and we will get an entire packet of information on the district web site very shortly. Last year's Day Camp was a huge success in terms of attendance and more importantly salvations; don't let your boys miss this one.

October 2-3 is our Commanders Retreat at Lakeview Camp. As leaders we need fellowship with each other, and we often can't get that when we are camping with the boys. It's been many years since we had an event like this, but they used to be well-attended which means leaders saw value in the camp. The cost is \$20 and that covers all three meals (Friday supper about 8:00 p.m., and Saturday breakfast and lunch). The lake will be open for those who want to do some fishing, and Ken Harris will open up the gun range for those who want to bring their favorite .22 or shot gun for some skeet shooting. We'll need to pitch some tents as the lodge won't be big enough to hold everyone, so bring a cot, the commanders from your outpost, and come enjoy the weekend.

FCF Family Days is October 23-25 at Lakeview Camp. This camp is for all FCF members and their family, and their guests (who do not have to be FCF members). Ladies may stay in the Ollie Henley Lodge if they wish, or **they may stay with their family in the campsite. Lots of good fun and fellowship are planned for this year's** Family Days. Check out the FCF website (http://fcf.ntxrr.org/) for more details.

The theme for this year's Winter Camp is "I am an alien." One of my sons received a t-shirt for Christmas that states on the back — "I am an alien. I am not of this world, nor do I call it home. My desires are not for earthly things that will fade, corrode or burn. I set my heart and mind on things above. My faith and hope are in God alone and I eagerly await His return for me. I'm a citizen of heaven." — based on 1 Peter 2:11, Colossians 3:1-3, 1 John 2:15-17, 1 Thessalonians 4:17, and Philippians 3:20. This will be our focus of Winter Camp — to help our Rangers realize that we are not of this world, but we are citizens of heaven as long as we accept Jesus as our Savior. A complete packet of information on Winter Camp will be mailed to all chartered leaders and all churches. Winter Camp will be held November 13-15 at Lakeview Camp.

Back to chartering for a moment. When you go online to enter your church's charter you will be required to enter the contact information for one leader, and the option for entering the information for your other leaders. PLEASE take a few minutes and complete the information for all of your leaders. Our district staff will have access to this information and we will use it to update and maintain our database of chartered leaders. We can't communicate with you if we don't know who you are and where you live. All of our district mailings go only to the leaders who have their information entered each year as part of the chartering process.

A final word on communication. The district Royal Rangers are attempting to use several different methods of communicating with leaders and boys throughout the district. We were one of the first districts to have a website and we continue to maintain that site at http://ntd.royalrangers.net. We also have an e-mail list that we use to send notices about upcoming events. You may join this e-mail list by sending an e-mail message to ntd-request@royalrangers.net with the words JOIN NTD in the body of the message. As I noted above we mail information out several times a year to chartered leaders and to churches in the district. And our newest method of communicating with leaders and boys in the district is Facebook. If you are on Facebook and **would like to join our discussion, search for "NTX Royal Rangers" and add us as a friend.**

A little later in this Signal Fire is information on the national training that is available this year for leaders. I encourage you to take advantage of this training, as it will make you a better leader. Next year we will be pilot testing the new National Rangers Ministry Camp in North Texas. This camp will replace the current National Training Camp (NTC). But there is still a lot of value in attending NTC this year, and if you have already attended NTC consider attending the Advanced National Training Camp (ANTC) that will be held in November at Lakeview. This will be the last ever ANTC as this camp is being phased out at the national level.

Thank you for all you do to help evangelize, equip and empower the next generation of Christlike men and lifelong servant leaders.

THERE'S NO NEED TO FEAR, UNDERDOG IS HERE!

By definition a superhero is a fictional character of unprecedented physical powers dedicated to acts of derring-do in the public interest. A distinctive costume, the ability to fly, enhanced senses, and the projection of energy bolts are all common. Others have special weapons or technology. A strong moral code and a sense of **responsibility, including a willingness to risk one's** own safety, are traits found in superheroes.

As I tried to find some superhuman strength to keep my knees from buckling under me as I approached the podium to speak about the Ranger Kids at the January Commanders Meeting, I turned **and looked out over that commanders' lodge at the** representation of many Royal Ranger commanders. Sitting there in their distinctive uniforms, were very non-fictional characters that seemed to have unprecedented physical powers, dedicated to acts of derring-do in the common interest of the preservation of Christian manhood.

I stood in awe at the many hours of service and sacrifices of time, vacations, rest and self that were reflected in the men who were there. Their strong moral code, their motivation and sense of responsibility without expectation of reward was evident in their lives and service. With the Holy Spirit's anointing, they experience enhanced spiritual awareness of the boy's lives and utilize the Holy Spirit's weapons of spiritual warfare against the enemy that is out to kill, steal and destroy our **boys.** (Although, I can't help but think that the bolt of lighting thing would come in handy sometimes!)

A superhero also has a supporting cast of recurring characters, including the hero's friends, coworkers and/or love interests. Often the hero's personal relationships are complicated by this dual life. Being one of the very few ladies in the room, I was keenly aware of the dual life, of the family time these men were giving up, and of the supporting cast of spouses, kids and friends that helped make their service possible. Heroes also have a rival enemy, and we must never lose sight of who our real enemy is in this fight.

Independent wealth or an occupation that allows for minimal supervision is also common for **superheroes. I don't know too many commanders** that are independently wealthy in the way the world judges wealth, but when you plan, and plan and plan; and pray and pray and pray; and are tired beyond imagination - and then you receive that hug, that look, that spiritual breakthrough – nothing compares.

Yeah, all I could see was a room full of Superheroes!

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

Royal Rangers on Cutting Edge with NEW Online Chartering Technology

For the first time in its 47-year history, Royal Rangers outposts will be able to charter online! The ability to charter online will start August 15th! "Online chartering is not only convenient but also will allow for the development of a number of benefits, including Ranger gear discounts. Leaders will also discover that many of the existing chartering benefits have been expanded. For example, instead of a single quarterly magazine for all boys ages 5-17, boys will receive an annual magazine called *RangersNOW*. These yearly publications are designed for specific age groups and their interests," says National Director Doug Marsh.





One of the biggest discounts offered for this chartering period is the 15% discount on Ranger specific gear. Discounts apply only to Ranger specific gear ordered online via the Ranger Superstore found on the national Royal Rangers website (http:// royalrangers.ag.org).

Everyone will now have the same charter period that runs from August 15–October 15. Assemblies of God churches do not have to charter to use Royal Rangers; however, chartering benefits only apply to churches that charter. Benefits far exceed the costs associated with chartering and are subject to change annually.

[Editor's note: Chartering has increased in the North Texas district the last two years. Let's keep up that trend; be sure to charter as soon as you can. North Texas Royal Rangers gives at least a 15% discount on district functions to members of chartered outposts.]

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2009 Academy of Ranger Training

September 11-13, 2009

Greetings to all! At our September 2009 Academy of Ranger Training (ART), we will be offering some very interesting and needed classes for older boys and commanders to attend.

All classes will be held at the Royal Rangers campground at Lakeview Camp.

Don't miss out on the following classes being offered:

Canoeing Merit

This 3-day class is for leaders and Adventure and Expedition age boys. Anyone interested in this class must have their Beginners Swimming Classification (Swimming Merit) prior to attendance. Boys will earn their green Canoeing Merit; leaders will learn how to teach this merit to their boys.

FCF Trail to the Wilderness Merits

This 3-Day class offers a great opportunity for ALL men and Adventure and Expedition Rangers to earn their Christian Service, Primitive Snares, Primitive Shelters, and Wilderness Survival Merits – the four merits required for advancement to Wilderness in the Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship.

Black Powder Safety Course

For many years this popular and class has offered to leaders and boys (12 years of age or older) – who are FCF members – the opportunity to earn the Black Powder Shooters Card for the Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship. This also earns the boys the silver Black Powder Merit.

A minimum of 8 people is required to hold this course, so be sure to pre-register by 9/4/09 for the class to make.

Primitive Bow Making

This Saturday ONLY class will be offered to all ALL Adventure and Expedition Rangers and men. In this class you will actually be making a primitive bow for use in FCF activities.

Black Powder and Rifle Instructor Course

This is a Friday through Sunday class offered to MEN ONLY who already hold NRA Certified Status! Completion of this course will qualify you to teach the NRA black powder and rifle safety courses.

A minimum of 5 people is required to hold this class, so be sure to pre-register by August 19 for the class to make. Attendees must be approved by our district shooting sports coordinator Ken Harris.



Shotgun Instructor Course

This is a Friday through Sunday class offered to MEN ONLY who already hold NRA Certified Status. Completion of this course will qualify you to teach the NRA shotgun safety course.



A minimum of 5 people is required to hold this class, so be sure to pre-register by August 19 for the class to make. Attendees must be approved by our district shooting sports coordinator Ken Harris.

Texas Hunters Education Course

This is a Friday through Saturday evening class offered to boys 12 years old or older, plus men. This course is required by the State of Texas for anyone born on or after September 2, 1971 before you can hunt in the state. So all of our boys, and many of our leaders, need to complete this course.

A total of 10 people are required to hold this course, so be sure to pre-register by September 4 to help assure that it makes.

Leadership Training Academy (LTA) Camp-Out

This camp is for new commanders who want to learn to take a group of boys on a fun and successful campout. Through this camp you learn how to camp in an actual camp setting. Topics include campsite layout, camp safety and sanitation, fire craft, camp cooking, camp recreation and activities, rope craft, and tool craft. This is a 2-day training module that is required to earn your Leaders Medal of Achievement.

Leadership Training Academy (LTA) Camp-Out for Girls Ministries Leaders

The same training we have been providing to Royal Rangers leaders on how to take a group of boys on a fun and successful camp-out is now available to ladies who work with the Girls Ministries. Come participate in this hands-on training camp-out so you will be prepared to take your girls on the district Girls Ministries camp -out or other camps. Learn how to take your girls camping in an actual camp setting. Topics include campsite layout, camp safety and sanitation, fire craft, camp cooking, camp recreation and activities, rope craft, and tool craft.

First Aid/CPR Class

This class is offered on Saturday ONLY for all commanders who need this vital training (it is one of the requirements for the Leaders Medal of Achievement). This course is only open to boys who lack the First-Aid/ CPR to complete their Gold Medal of Achievement.

Ranger Kids Skills

This module is for Saturday ONLY. This course is ideal for any commander who works with Ranger Kids (or Girls Ministries leader who works with Rainbows, Daisies, or Prims) though it is open to any leader. This class covers the basics of how to take your boys or girls on a fun, safe, and successful day trip or hike. Topics include safety, fire craft, cooking, games, and nature crafts.

For <u>Saturday only</u> classes, please remember to check-in at registration at 8:00 a.m. sharp! Classes will begin promptly at 9:00 a.m.


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<u>Location</u>

Lakeview Camp is seven miles southwest of Waxahachie on FM66 (exit 399A from I-35E) or three miles northeast of Hwy. 157-FM66 intersection in Maypearl. Maypearl can be reached from I-35W via FM 66 (exit 8), FM 916, or U.S. 67 to Hwy 157. Look for the "Royal Rangers Entrance" banner by the highway for our entrance (we do not use the main Lakeview Camp entrance).

PathFinder Missions trips are classified by three levels of intensity, from entry level to advanced, and awarded accordingly:



The Bronze PathFinder Mission — U.S. Missions construction projects outside one's home district. (Such as Indian reservations or in urban settings.)



The Silver PathFinder Mission — Overseas projects to moderately accessible construction sites with basic conveniences. (Such as churches, Rangers camps, or orphanages.)



The Gold PathFinder Mission — Overseas construction projects to harsh, remote areas of the world where other teams are unable to go due to the tough living conditions of these assignments. (Such as packing or boating equipment and building supplies to site.)

**Boys 14 & 15 years-of-age may participate in a PathFinder Missions trip when accompanied by their legal guardian and all necessary forms have been completed and mandated insurance secured; Boys 16 & 17 years-of-age may participate without being accompanied by their legal guardian when all necessary forms have been completed and mandated insurance secured. All Gold PathFinder Missions must be pre-approved by the PathFinders Committee which reserves the right to impose additional age restrictions on select gold level projects. No one under the age of 14 may participate in a PathFinders MAPS Builders project.
