From our FCF President

It is very hard to believe it has already been 6 months that I have served as the Shawnee Trail FCF Chapter president. We have established a few things and we are still tweaking a few things to get them right. There is always room for improvement.

At Pow Wow we had a sponsorship issue that we need to address. For years now we have pushed sponsorship. We have pushed QUALITY sponsorship. It seems we are getting a bit laid back on this. There seems to be this prevailing idea that nobody fails an advancement test. The problem is that is true but only half. The other half is that those attempting to advance may need another opportunity to make their advancement. They may not make the "grade" or "hit the mark" the first time. Now

you may be asking yourself or saying what kind of play on words is this? Well it is not a play on words as much as an ATTITUDE! If we have the attitude we failed it tends to make any of us back off, quit, or leave the ministry of FCF. Instead as with our Heavenly Father if we fail he is good to forgive us and we continue in the race. He restores us. If a candidate does not make the grade that is part of his journey of making that particular advancement. That is his journey WITH GOD! We all need to learn to lean on our Creator and acknowledge our need for Jesus as our savior.

Now more to the issue at hand. Here in the North Texas Shawnee Trail Chapter we have always pushed sponsorship. This should never change. When we start thinking that everybody makes the grade the first time we tend not to work so hard at sponsoring. In the past I served as Buckskin rep and I will tell you there are those who made Buckskin who needed more help than they were receiving from their sponsors. As the rep I made sure they were prepared and ready. The thing is that was not my job, it was the sponsor's job. We all need to take our sponsorship very seriously and invest the time in our candidates no matter who it is — young buck or old timer (some of us old timers need more help than the young bucks). We need to help them to see what they need to work on and especially pray for that candidate. We all need to communicate with the respective Rep to see what they think our candidate needs to work on and pass that on. This is and should be a serious time of MENTORING and praying with your candidate. Not just making them physically ready but spiritually as well. Our investment in these candidates will dictate the spiritual and physical quality of our chapter as a whole. We need to lift each other up and remember you never know who God has preordained these young men to be. Your sacrifice and your "Giving and Serving" example can and should influence them to "pay it forward."

We have done very well in the past. I have had great sponsors through my advancement journey. My concern is that with the prevailing attitude. There are those who may hurt the ministry by thinking that it will be easy to make the grade and hit the mark. They then may "miss" and without proper sponsorship quit and be done. Remember if a candidate does not make it, it is not the candidate's fault. The fault lies with the sponsors! We need to be ready to tell them this as well as inform them they are not ready if they are not! That takes the sacrifice of time and involvement. Let's keep this one of the best FCF chapters in FCF!

To those who have left FCF because they have not hit the mark, I encourage you to complete your journey with God, get a good sponsor and get back into this ministry; partner with us and make the Shawnee Trail FCF Chapter even better. Help us do the work of making Christ-like lifelong servant leaders out of the boys and men God places in our path. Do everything you do as for God; give your best everyday for Him and God will do the rest.

Lee "Prospector" Fogleman Honored

Virtually every boy who has attended a Pow Wow or Winter Camp in the North Texas District knows Prospector. He always sets up his trading goods in the FCF village and boys flock by his site to trade for his treasures. At Pow Wow 2013 Prospector was presented with the 9th Outstanding FCF Service Award to be presented in this country. Below is part of the documentation that was sent in to the National FCF Committee when applying for this award for Prospector.

I would like to start by saying there is not a single boy in the North Texas District, and even many in surrounding districts, who does not know or has heard of "Prospector." When a new Ranger boy comes to his first camp-out in North Texas, part of his introduction to Royal Rangers camping is an introduction to Prospector. Lee Fogleman, at great sacrifice to him and his family, has made a ministry of trading with the boys. I have many times seen Prospector trade a rock for some treasure the boy saw in Prospector's "trading inventory." Prospector truly cares for these boys and the ministry of FCF. There is no better example to the men or the boys in and out of FCF. He truly exemplifies the meaning of our motto: "To Give and To Serve." Everyone he meets receives one of his hand-sewn pouches and hears the Gospel message that it represents. Every boy that comes to his tent to trade meets him and he shakes the hand of every boy or man and prays over them.

Lee has been a member of our FCF chapter for about 20 years. He served as vice president of the NTX Shawnee Trail Chapter for 2 years, as our Wilderness Rep for 6 years, and for the last 3 years he has served as our chapter's chaplain. In addition, he currently serves as the sectional commander for the Greenville section

and as a certified instructor. He previously served as a divisional commander.

I can't remember very many campouts that Lee missed. Whenever he is not at a camp it has been due to his health, and he is sorely missed by everyone. I truly believe his favorite place is in front of his FCF tent sharing Christ and trading with the boys.

Lee's example of the FCF Motto – to give and to serve – is the reason my sons, Matthew (current national FCF scout) and Luke, and I became members of FCF. We serve and give there today following in Prospector's footsteps. We will never be able to replace Prospector and his example to others in the FCF Motto and in leadership and mentoring the boys and men in the Royal Rangers ministry.

National Office Reporting Update

As technology advances so does Royal Rangers. Collecting of data helps us stay ahead of trends and modify our thinking to keep being effective in reaching men and boys. In keeping with this the National FCF staff have changed the reporting cycle from the calendar year to the school year to be consistent with other ministries in the Assemblies of God.

This does not seem like a big deal until you realize that we have 2 and possibly 3 events that may not get reported in this year's report. This can adversely affect our numbers. Also I noticed that we have 66 fewer active members this year compared to last year. I believe that some of you pay your dues at Family Days. If you wait this year, your membership will not show up in our required reporting for North Texas FCF for 2013 because the reporting dates will be closed before Family Days.

I am only wanting our chapter to get the credit that is due to our very fine active members. So if we do not show we are active by paying our dues then National Office is going to say our numbers are shrinking considerably and ask why? Also we have many members who never turn in Trappers Brigade points. These points are also monitored by the National Office and if we do not turn them in our chapter looks as though we never volunteer or help other boys. I know right now we show 16 members that have done 2200 hours of service according to the Presidential Volunteer Service website we are using to capture the record of these hours. The problem is we have just a couple of months to turn in hours and I know there are more boys and men who have performed service work. Please contact David Wilson, our Trappers Brigade Rep, and turn in your numbers. You can also ask about the Presidential Volunteer Service award. This online system is being utilized to make it more convenient for us all to turn in Trappers Brigade hours and to track them throughout the year in real time so we do not have to think back over the last 12 months to try to remember our volunteer hours. This is not about you, it is about how the chapter looks to the National Office. The National Office needs to know how great a chapter we really are. We have to turn in points to do that.




