Scout / Asst. Scout Testing

Every two years (even years), North Texas selects new FCF scouts to represent the boys of the Shawnee Trail.

Do you have active FCF boys in your outpost that would like to test for Scout / Asst. Scout? This year's testing will be held at Pow Wow, however, all the paperwork for each candidate is due to the district office by March 28th. All applications and forms must be submitted by this time. Please do not hand them to an FCF staff member but send them to the district office.

The following forms must be submitted to the district office

(NTX Royal Rangers, PO Box 838, Waxahachie, TX 75168-0838).

- 1. Scout Application page 3 & 4
- 2. Personal Reference Form (3 required) page 5

Qualifications

- He must be a born again Christian and should be filled with the Holy Spirit.
- He must demonstrate an upstanding reputation and a willingness to serve the district office in an enthusiastic and responsible manner.
- He must be at least Adventure Ranger age but under the age of 18 at time of selection.
- He must be active in a local outpost.
- He should complete one full year of active FCF membership before consideration for the chapter scout.
- He must be willing to travel on behalf of the district Royal Rangers office.
- He must be able to attend chapter staff meetings and events throughout his term.
- He must practice and become proficient in all frontier skills and knowledgeable of FCF safety rules and regulations.
- He should be working toward becoming a Wilderness member or attain Wilderness status within 2 years of taking office.

Duties

The chapter scout is selected to provide leadership among other boys in FCF. He is also tasked with providing a boy's perspective of FCF to the adult leadership. His responsibilities include the following:

- Assist in planning, organizing and conducting FCF events.
- Learn from district leadership and accept responsibilities as assigned.
- Serve as a role model for other boys.
- Conduct periodic planning and information meetings consisting of the FCF boy membership within the Chapter. The meetings will be known as the "Young Buck Council." This meeting will be chaired by the scout under the supervision of a minimum of one adult FCF executive committee member The Young Buck meeting should be held at an FCF event which draws the maximum number of FCF boys. The purpose of this meeting is to allow the membership of boys to voice their opinions and feelings on any part of FCF. The scout will be responsible for the minutes of this meeting. He will distribute a copy of the minutes to the FCF executive committee not later than four (4) weeks after the meeting is held.
- Maintain an FCF outfit and wear his outfit (or outfits) at all events.
- Attend the FCF sponsored events in his chapter, territory and strive and to attend National Rendezvous.
- Attend chapter staff and Committee meetings.
- Assist in the planning and conducting of FCF events.
- Responsible for building and lighting council fires at chapter and special FCF events.

Both Boys and Leaders

- Earn the following merit awards: Church, Knife and Hawk, Archery or Black Powder.
- Participate in one additional Frontier Adventure (besides your own).
- Make, trade, or purchase a complete FCF outfit.
- · Recite from memory the FCF Pledge.
- Explain the meaning of the FCF Symbol.
- State the vision and purpose of FCF.

- Make an FCF identification staff.
- Select a frontier related craft or skill to develop.
- Select an FCF name.
- Complete the Buckskin Workbook (sent by the chapter after applying for this level).
- Be an active member in good standing for one year.

Boys Only

Earn the Bronze Medal of Achievement or one Expedition Ranger Medal.

Leaders Only

- Sponsor a boy into FCF (must be in last 3 years).
- Earn the Safety Leader Outpost Leader Advancement Level.
 - Safety and the Church module
- First Aid/CPR Course

- Complete Safety Ticket
- Earn the Trained Leader Outpost Leader Advancement Level.
 - Complete NTC or NRMC

- Complete the Trained Ticket

Get all of this done and find a sponsor. Fill out the application found online.

Send the application, with the \$35 testing fee to the District Office address on the form. Once I get an email with a scan of the application and acknowledgement of your fee, I will send you a Buckskin workbook.

PLEASE DO NOT USE SOME OLD APPLICATION YOUR GREAT GRANDFATHER OR LONG LOST UNCLE HAD. USE THE ONE ABOVE. AND DO NOT USE SOME ANCIENT WORKBOOK SOMEBODY HAD LAYING AROUND. I WILL SEND YOU THE WORKBOOK.

This is especially important for the leaders! Old Timers, we have to get this training. Trust me; NRMC is the BEST camp you will ever experience! Why do we need all this training, you ask? To show the boys that we care enough to go to training too. You are not just teaching them by standing in front of them, you are showing them that being trained is also important!


This will be the last time that FCF members can get their black powder safety card before National Rendezvous in July. Otherwise you have to follow someone around that has one and you can't load for yourself.






